CBSE paper leak: Students hold protest at Jantar Mantar

New Delhi, Mar 29 (PTI): The shrill cries of 'we want justice' pierced the serene morning air at Jantar Mantar today as hundreds of students gathered here, protesting against the re-exam-ination of Class 10 Mathematics and Class 12

Economics papers. Holding placards, with slogans like 'Stop playing hit and trial with our lives' and 'It's not the students who need a retest, it's the system', the students rued how they have been left "traumatised" after hearing the news of re-examination.

Many students claimed that almost all the papers had been leaked a day before the

manded that if a reexamination is to be held, it should be held for all the subjects.

Bhavika Yadav, a Class 10 student of St Thomas School, said, "We were shocked after hearing the news of the re-examination. Why should we suffer just because a handful of students got the leaked paper before the examination?"

Her friend, Ojasvy Chamdhok, echoed similar sentiments.

"We have been under pressure right from the beginning of the session. We were relieved after giving the exam but it was just for one-

"Many of my students are worried as to how they will manage the preparation for their entrance exams along while preparing for the Board's re-examination. It seems they were not rumours, but the truth," he added.

In the wake of reports claiming paper leaks, the CBSE had announced re-examination yesterday for the two papers.



poration issues licenses to shops, hotels, restaurants, etc and at present around 12,000 trade licenses are registered under Gangtok Municipal Corporation.

The E-Trade License GMC a web based application that uses a website as the interface or front end and user can easily access the application form. It was also informed that any applicant can renew or obtain new license online through E-Trade Li-cense GMC application.

Commissioner, Mr Gyach-ho informed that in case of renewal, the existing license holders have to download an editable PDF form which will be available in the GMC

www.gmcsikkim.in website and submit the filled up form along with original and copy identification certificates for physical verification to the office from 02 to 15 Apr.

After submission of PDF form in GMC office the username and password for the user will be sent to their re-

spective e-mail ids, which can be used for logging in to the E-Trade License Portal linked with the website and the user can renew their license from 16 Apr to 31 May, 2018 which is the last date for renewing of

Existing license holder will have to upload his/her

scanned copies of passport photos, verified identification certificates, signature to renew their respective licenses and make payment online. Once the application is verified and approved by the au-thority, the user will be notified through e-mail and they

can download it from their

respective e-mail ids or online

Issues - Explaining vs Raising

And there is a difference between the two

The elections are in the horizon, still a little over a year away, but time moves fast when politicking arrives in earnest. And since that is already happening, expect all of Sikkim's few, but passionately politicized, issues to play out with campaign-decibel drum-rolls and rediscovered passions. Can we expect some explaining too? Unlikely.

This might be the Information Age, but there is still

a long ways to go before Sikkim arrives to the age of understanding. A people fed on headlines and getting issues explained in slogans, leave themselves open to easy excitability, and when arguments are thrown from political positions, reasoning gets warped by inferred intents and prejudiced aspersions; even intentional misinformation and incomplete arguments. With attention spans already shortened by easy distractions, one is left with a situation where faculties in general are not even vaguely conducive to serving better comprehension. Then there is the inherent paranoia and sentimentality which get easily teased to foist issues, which, even when vaguely argued by its promoters, snowball into complicated puzzles and are invariably mothballed away after their electioneering purpose has been served. Issues, however, rarely get resolved with such approaches, and this serves its agents well because it keeps the door ajar for easy invocation in future.

While it would be easy to dismiss these situations as political gimmicks born from 'ulterior motives', more often than not, these are situations which have been run to the ground after being born of genuine concern. In all of these, a resolution slips through the fingers because public deliberations which are required for any sensitive and emotional issue to be resolved, is left ignored. Following a projected public outcry, the matter starts getting directed by leaders, both, from the ruling as well as Opposition camps, and the public involvement, without which a result is not possible, gets sidelined.

The pursuit, once such issues enter the political rhetoric, becomes one of extending the debate and scoring points, not resolving it or even refining it and finding closure. One has seen this routine get played out too often in the past, not to cringe when a new op-portunity, like another election, stands on the brink of being similarly distracted.

When it comes to the region, most of the "issues can be boiled down to one of opportunities/ access and denial. The traditional approach to these seemingly vexed issues is to posit chauvinism or chivalry, claims and sops etc. But really, the discussions should speak more on the lines of Rights and Right. That does not happen. The politics of the issues run out of steam cyclically, without any real positions taken or informed and honest mediations offered. The lazy option of hardening positions is taken and impractical promises made even as more significant aspects remain intentionally unaddressed. What plays out then is an exchange of allegations and counters which will return again at a later date and while this might work for political speeches, the unresolved muddle does not serve the people too well.

Pakistan's activist Supreme Court endangers a fragile democracy

Pakistanis head to the polls to elect their next prime minister in July. Until then, though, the Supreme Court seems to be in charge of the country.

In July 2017, revelations from the Panama Papers leak spurred Pa-kistan's high court to rule that then-Prime Minister Nawaz Sharif had lied to the public about his family finances. Sharif, who maintained his innocence, was forced to resign as prime

However, he continued to lead his Pakistan Muslim League-Nawaz par-ty, or PML-N, effectively controlling Pakistan's government. Then, in Feb ruary 2018, the Supreme Court also removed him as party chairman.

Because Sharif was not "honest" or 'righteous," Chief Justice of Pakistan Saqib Nisar additionally ruled, all "orders passed, directions given and documents issued" under his leadership were officially declared null.

Sharif and his supporters accuse Pakistan's chief justice of interfering in politics and swaying the upcoming election. As a Pakistani political scientist, I fear they may be right.

JUDICIAL OVERREACH

Military coups used to be the biggest risk to Pakistani democracy. Thanks to coup d'etats in 1958, 1977 and 1999, my country has spent 33 years of its 71-year history under military rule.

To a people rightfully fearful of

interference in their political system, then, the Supreme Court's recent ac-tions are alarming. By discrediting some politicians while seemingly overlooking corrupt public officials from other parties, the judiciary is effectively influencing the outcome of

How do a nation's top judges – people sworn to defend the Constitu-- become a threat to democracy? That's the focus of my research on ju-

dicial independence in Pakistan.

In Pakistan, as in other former British colonies, the Supreme Court has the power to take what's called "suo motu" action. That means judges can rule on issues of their own volition, without any motion or complaint filed in court.

For instance, Chief Justice Nisar recently ordered a hearing on the rape and murder of a young child in Lahore, because closing that case quickly was deemed to be in the public interest.

As it happens, in recent years he has also removed the prime minister from public office twice, conducted surprise inspections at government hospitals, lambasted the media for commenting on open cases and ordered investiga tions into police violence.

Such sweeping authority creates a clash of institutions between the judiciary and other branches of government. Such competition can be detrimental to democracy. My research in several countries has found that when supreme court justices venture into political affairs, they create

It is unsurprising, then, that Chief Justice Nisar's suo motu cases over the past few months have outraged many Pakistani politicians, who say the justice is guilty of judicial overreach.

Nisar responds that he is simply following the law, adding that the 'courts are not the enemies of the

SHARIF TAKES HIS CASE TO THE 'PEOPLE'S COURT'

But to some, Nisar's timing – the lead-up to a big national election – is suspicious. So, too, is his selection of suo motu hearings: The overwhelm-ing majority of political cases added to the Supreme Court's docket since 2015 have focused on Sharif's party.

The toppled prime minister, for his

part, claims that he is the victim of a "judicial coup." At rallies across Paki-stan, Sharif tells his supporters that since he cannot run for re-election this fall, he must ask them, the "people's court," to vote for his PML-N party.

The Supreme Court has already removed one PML-N senator, and two of its ministers are under investigation for alleged contempt of court. Sharif and the PLM-N leadership cite

these cases as evidence that the party is under judicial attack. In targeting Sharif and his party.

Justice Nisar has allowed the ousted prime minister to paint themselves as the underdogs, even though the party is still in power. This has strength-ened the PML-N's position ahead of the upcoming election. Currently, it is polling above its closest rivals by about eight points.

Sharif also remains the most popular leader in the country, according

to recent surveys. CHIEF JUSTICE OR GENERAL?

Suggestions that the Pakistani military was behind Sharif's 2017 ouster have bolstered the former prime minister's claim of victimhood.

Credible analysts assert that the prime minister challenged Pakistan's generals' authority when he was in power by taking relatively noncombative approach to neighboring India and Afghanistan. Normally, the Pakistani military – whose power is so enduring that Pakistanis often call it simply the "establishment" – directs regional security.

Sharif also butted heads with Pakistan's armed forces during his 1997-1999 administration, ultimately leading to his overthrow by the military in 1999.

Since coups are no longer acceptable in Pakistan, the logic goes, this time the generals used legal action to remove Sharif.

JUDICIAL OVERREACH ABROAD Pakistan is not the only place ques-tioning the limits of judicial intervention in the democratic process.

Bangladeshi courts used their suc notu powers to prosecute and side line a main opposition leader prior to elections in both 2008 and 2009

In Brazil, Judge Sergio Moro faced accusations of staging a judicial coup in January when he convicted former President Luiz Inácio Lula da Silva of corruption, likely disqualifying him from this year's presidential election.

Brazilian courts don't have suo

motu power. But judges there have used the judicial discretion of their civil law system to dramatically expand the scope of a nationwide bribery inquiry. Upwards of 100 congressmen and senators are now under judicial investigation.

Judges in the United States, too

have the power expand the scope of a petition to the court. A classic example is the 2010 Supreme Court case Citizens United. Nominally, the nine justices were supposed to rule on what constituted political advertising. Instead, they issued a much broader verdict on free speech and corporate money in elections.

In those countries, as in Pakistan, judges contend they are simply doing their jobs, acting as a critical constitutional check on the political system.

But in a young democracy like Pa-kistan's, the standoff between judges and the ruling party is fueling an unhealthy level of uncertainty during a campaign season. If the chief justice is not in fact staging a coup, I'm alarmed to say, it sure feels like he is. *[the writer is Ph.D. Candi-*

How Hmong Christians navigate the border tensions between China and Vietnam

Plans to open joint border checkpoints between China and Vietnam in May 2018 belie unresolved tensions in rela tions between the two countries. Despite scrapping a marine oil-drilling project in a disputed area following Chinese "threats", Hanoi maintains its claim to what it calls the "East Sea" – or what the Chinese call the South China Sea. The dispute has led to anti-Chinese sentiment in major Vietnam-

Far away from urban areas, Vietnamese citizens living in the northern border-lands are intimately connected to China. Almost the entire length of the 1,280km-long Sino-Vietnamese border is at least 500 metres above sea level, with some areas reaching 2000 metres high. These highlands are home to a number of minority groups with their own unique histories and cultures who are neither ethnic Han (Chinese) nor Kinh (Vietnamese), but live on both sides of the border.

A significant group who live in these border regions are the Hmong. There are two million Hmong in China, a million in Vietnam and up to a million more spread across Laos, Thailand and in diaspora communities in the US. Today, their shared transnational identity is based on speak-ing mutually intelligible dialects of the Hmong language, as well as sharing the

same clan surnames.

Traditionally, the Hmong have practised shifting cultivation – also known as "slash and burn" – and were highly mobile. In the 1960s, Hmong from China migrated to Vietnam during the extreme hardships

of the cultural revolution. But since the 1990s, when living conditions in China began to improve, more Hmong have been

noving back. CHINESE INVASION AND CHRISTIAN CONVERSION

In 1979, 80,000 Chinese troops crossed the border intending to "teach Viet-nam a lesson" for invading Cambodia and toppling the Chinese-backed Khmer Rouge. The war lasted just six weeks but both sides suffered high casualties combat raged through the high-

from the fighting up into the forests and mountains, but soon afterwards communities were forcibly relocated away from borderland regions, in the unabashedly-named "Move (the Hmong) down the Mountains" programme. In some areas, only those with a Chinese-sounding surname were forced to migrate downhill, while those with Vietnamese surnames

while those with Vietnamese surnames were allowed to stay.

These policies were rooted in government mistrust of Hmong transnational networks and migration, compounding a fear that their loyalties may not be with the Vietnamese state. Unfortunately, many Hmong families who were settled in low-land areas after 1979 with little fertile land or forest suffered from malnutrition

and new diseases which they had not developed resistance to.

Since the late 1980s, hundreds of thousands of Hmong in Vietnam have been converting to Protestant Christianity – a complex and remarkable phenomenon which is having a profound impact on Hmong society and ethnic politics. Researchers estimate that around a third of Hmong in Vietnam are now Christians, although this trend is not as prominent among Hmong in China or elsewhere.

Vietnamese authorities have always been extremely suspicious of Christianity, branding it a Western religion associated with their former colonial (French) and imperialist (American) invaders. Government papers and news reports routinely

accuse hostile "exter-nal forces" of inciting "elements of defection" through Hmong conversion to "create internal instability" among the highlands. As such, local officials have been guilty of brutal religious perse-cution ranging from beatings and imprisonment to confiscation of proper-ty and land, in the name of "encouraging" Hmong believers to give up their new faith.

Nevertheless. Hmong Christians have been growing in numbers and strength. In the 1990s, church leaders crossed the border into China in order to attend Bible

schools, since they were not allowed to study theology in Vietnam at the time. Later on, Hmong missionaries from the American diaspora would enter Vietnam via the Chinese border, illegally smuggling in Hmong-language Bibles and preaching

at church groups. SIGNS OF MORE COOPERATION

While I was conducting fieldwork in Vietnam's northern highlands in mid-2014, the latest round of South China Sea conflict erupted as a Chinese oil rig was moved into contested waters. There were omi-nous reports about an "endless stream" of Chinese troops massing near Vietnam's borders, as border crossings closed.

In a district of Lao Cai province,

Hmong church leaders were summoned to local government headquarters, perhaps expecting a stern warning against prose-lytising or even detainment. Surprisingly, however, local officials asked pastors to support the national cause by relaying information to their congregations about evacuation procedures (should China invade) and dissuading anyone from cross-ing the border. Apparently, they were even encouraged by the socialist authorities to

pray for the welfare of Vietnam.

The church groups agreed to cooperate and prayed continuously for peace over three days. When China later with-drew the oil rig and tensions deescalated in July, some Christians attributed it to divine intervention, claiming that God had sent Typhoon Rammasun to force China to back down and move out of the disputed

territory.

One unexpected consequence of the 2014 dispute was to bring some Hmong churches and Vietnamese local authorities into closer cooperation, although religious discrimination still persists in other border provinces.

In the past five years, more and more Vietnamese Hmong have been seasonally migrating to China for higher-paid work, but often end up exploited or trafficked into forced marriage. They may continue to be viewed with suspicion by the Vietnamese government for their cross-border networks and apparent lack of patriotism, but most Hmong I interviewed have no preference for Chinese subjugation either.

and charge the interest on the compensation.

After hearing both the parties the Court di-rected the NHPC Stage V pay the land compensation amounting to Rs 6,79,78,277 by 30 Apr. In case of failure to

pay within the above stip-ulated date, all necessary steps to safeguard further damages of the land will be initiated by the District Administration.

In case of failure of NHPC to pay within the stipulated date the interest as per the Land Acquisition Act, 2013 will be charged and NHPC will make good of the damages caused to the properties of the public, the court said. In order to prevent

further damages of the properties of the peo-ple and to safeguard the residents living in the properties any pondage of water will be stopped from 01 May. NHPC will not cause any further damage to the properties in case of non-payment of compensation.

The matter is listed for 30 Apr, 2018.

IT releases names of defaulters owing Rs 490 crore taxes said is in default of Rs 47.52

NEW DELHI, MAR 29 (PTI): The Income-Tax Department today released a pan-India list of 24 defaulting individuals and companies who owe about Rs 490 crore in taxes to the exchequer but have either gone untraceable or have reported

inadequate assets for payment

The department issued an advertisement as part of its name and shame defaulters policy in leading national dailies titled 'List of defaulters of

Income Tax and Corporate Tax'.
The notice, issued by a nodal office of the Principal Director General of Income Tax in Delhi, "advised" the named defaulters to pay their tax arrears immediately

The public announcement carries the identity of the firm or the individual, the name of their directors and partners, the date of incorporation of the company (date of birth in case of individuals), their Permanent Account Number (PAN) or the Tax Deduction Account Number (TAN), their last known address and business profile, the amount of tax defaulted, assessment year and the respective jurisdictional I-T authority.

These defaulting firms were in the business sectors like food processing, bullion trading, software, real estate, breweries and manufacture of ingots among others.

The maximum tax dues of

over Rs 86.27 crore are against a Delhi-based company named Ms Stock Guru, India and its partner Lokeshwar Dev and the notice said the assessee has gone untraceable and also has inadequate assets to pay the income tax.

The dues for this firm are

for the assessment years (AYs) 2009-10 and 2010-11. Some of the defaulters on the list have not paid their taxes for the assessment year 1989-90.

A Kolkata-based individual Arjun Sonkar, as per the notice, has an I-T default of over Rs 51.37 crore and is "not traceable" now. He is followed by Kishan Sharma, another individual from the West Bengal capital, who the department

crore of income tax.

The total tax default amount by 24 entities, from cities like Ahmedabad, Guwahati, Vijaywada, Nashik, Surat, Delhi, Vadodara, Kolkata and others, is about Rs 490 crore.

A senior I-T Department official said the public list is aimed to make people aware so that they can help the department in nabbing these de-faulters, if they have any information about them.

The notice also carried a disclaimer that the "entries in the list are specific to the tax arrear/assessment year men-tioned and the tax defaulter's address, business, shareholding and management may have

It added that the amount of default "shall further increase" after due interest is levied on

The department has carried out this exercise over the last few years and had named 96 such entities which have huge tax liabilities on them but they have either gone non-traceable or have shown no assets for recovery.

The Central Board of Direct

Taxes (CBDT), the policy-making body of the I-T department, had few years back adopted the strategy of bringing out the names of chronic defaulters in public domain and had also begun posting these names on its official website.

I am sorry: says regretful, tearful Smith

ful Steve Smith today took full responsibility for the ball-tampering scandal in South Africa that has left his reputation in tatters, saying he is absolutely gutted right now and would regret the incident for the rest of his life.

The 28-year-old, who has been banned for a year by Crick-et Australia and stripped of captaincy, broke down repeatedly in a five-minute press conference after his arrival from South Africa today.

"As captain of the Australian cricket team, I take full responsibility. I made a serious error of judgement and now I understand the consequences. It was a failure of my leadership," a devastated Smith said, trying hard to keep his composure in a packed press conference.

"I will do everything I can to make up for my mistake and the damage it has caused. If any good can come through this, if there can be a lesson to others, I hope I can be a force for change. I know I will regret this for the rest of my life. I am absolutely gutted," he added.
Smith, along with his depu

ty David Warner, were handed similar bans for their role in plotting the episode during the



third Test against South Africa in Cape Town.

Opener Cameron Bancroft,

who was entrusted with the task of tampering the ball with a sand paper before he was caught on camera, has been handed a ninemonth suspension.
"I hope in time, I can earn

back respect and forgiveness. I have been so privileged and honoured to captain the Australian cricket team. Cricket is the greatest game in the world. It has been my life and I hope it can be again. I am sorry and absolutely devastated,"

Smith refused to blame any of the other players involved, saying he can only blame himself at the moment.

"Good people make mis-takes. I have made a big mistake by allowing this to happen. It was a huge error of judgement on my part and I am sorry. To my knowledge this is the first time I have seen this happened. I can assure you it will never be happening again," he said.

"I don't blame anyone. I am the captain of the Australian team, I take responsibility of what happened last Saturday in Cape Town," he added.

Before being escorted out, Smith hoped that his fate serves as a warning to anybody trying to attempt any wrongdoing.

"... (when) you think about making a questionable decision you should think about people who will be affected. You are affecting your parents and to see my old man's pain (breaks down)," he said.

"(To see) My mum it hurts. I can't remember what I was saying. I just want to say sorry for the pain I have caused to the Australian public. I am truly sorry," he concluded fighting back sobs.

Warner apologises, says he put stain on game he loves

SYDNEY, MAR 29 (PTI): Banned Australian opener David Warner today apologised for his role in the ball-tam-pering scandal, saying he put a "stain on the game he loved as a boy".

Warner has been identified

as the chief plotter of the infamous incident in South Africa, leading to one-year bans on him and captain Steve Smith. Both the players were also barred from this year's IPL.

"To cricket fans in Australia and all over the world: I am currently on my way back to Sydney. Mistakes have been made which have damaged cricket," Warner, who was Australia's vice-captain posted on social media.

"I apologise for my part and take responsibility for it. I understand the distress this has caused the sport and its fans. Its a stain on the game we all love and I have loved



since I was a boy."

The 31-year-old Warner. who can still play club cricket,

"I need to take a deep breath and spend time with my family, friends and trusted advisers. You will hear from me in a few days," he added.

Following Cricket Australia's investigation into the scandal, it has come to light that Smith and Cameron Bancroft knew what they were getting into but it was Warner who developed the "plan to attempt to artificially alter the condition of the ball".

Bancroft, who has been handed a nine-month suspension, was caught on camera pulling out sand paper to tamper the ball.

The CA has also made it clear that while Smith still has a chance to captain Australia one year after the end of his ban, Warner will never be considered for a leadership role.

The dangerous opener has been charged for instructing

"a junior player to carry out a plan to take steps to attempt to artificially alter the condition

of the ball using sandpaper".

All the three indicted players have also been ordered to undertake 100 hours of voluntary service in community

However, CA has cleared coach Darren Lehmann of any wrongdoing, insisting that he was not aware of the plan hatched by the trio.

Malala returns to Pak for the first time since Taliban attack

visibly emotional Nobel Laure-ate Malala Yousafzai returned to Pakistan today, saying that she had dreamed about re-turning home every day for the last five years since she was airlifted to Britain after being shot in the head by the Taliban

militants in 2012.

Hours after her arrival here, the famed human rights activist met Prime Minister Shahid Khaqan Abbasi at his office here along with some other officials, the ruling Pakistan Muslim League-Nawaz (PML-N) tweeted.

"I have dreamed of return-ing to Pakistan for the past five years," 20-year-old Malala said

with tears in her eyes.

"Whether I was in a plane or driving in a car in streets of London, I dreamed of being in Islamabad and Karachi but it was not true But finally I am here and very happy," she said.

She said she had a great desire to move freely in Pakistan.

Malala said that she was working on the education of children and wants empowernent of women in Pakistan.

'Today, I am very happy that, after five-and-a-half years, I have set foot on the soil of my nation again," she said in

"I am now 20 years old, but I have seen a lot over the course of my life. From grow-



ing up in Swat - it was such a beautiful place - to then seeing terrorism and extremism from 2007 till 2009. And then seeing how many difficulties women and girls face in our society, and how we can fight against those challenges," she said.

"And then being attacked, leaving my country...Every-thing was happening itself, I could not control anything. If it was my call, I would never have left my country. The doctors performed surgery on me and saved my life. But then for further treatment I had to go out and continue my educa-tion there. But it was always my dream that I return to Pakistan," she added.

Malala left Pakistan after she was shot in the head by the Taliban militants in 2012 for campaigning for female educa-tion in Swat Valley. The young activist not only survived the bullet wound in her head but

won the Noble Peace prize in

Prime Minister Abbasi in a warm welcome address said he was happy that a daughter of the nation has come to her motherland. "It is your home. Now you are not an ordinary citizen, your security is our responsibility," he said.

He said the entire world gave honour and respect to Malala and Pakistan would also give her the kind of re-

spect she deserves. Abbasi told the Nobel laureate that Pakistan defeated militants after a difficult war since her departure. He said Pakistan has become safe as terrorism has been uprooted.

Malala was dressed in Pakistani shalwar kameez and dupatta and accompanied by her mother and father.

"Pakistan welcomes 'Gul Makai' to her home. We are proud of you. #malala-comeshome," Foreign Office spokesperson Muhammad Faisal tweeted earlier today.

Due to security reasons, her four day-visit and her entire itinerary is being kept secret.

CEO of Malala Fund is also

with her and she is expected to participate in the 'Meet the Malala' programme in Pakistan.

It is not known if she will travel to her native Swat where she lived and was attacked while returning from a school in October 2012 when she was

Severely wounded, Malala was taken by helicopter from one military hospital in Paki-stan to another, where doctors placed her in a medically induced coma so an air ambulance could fly her to Britain for treatment.
After she was attacked, the

Taliban released a statement saying that they would target her again if she survived.

At age 17, Malala became the youngest recipient of the Nobel Peace Prize in 2014 for her education advocacy. She shared the prize with India's social activist Kailash Satyarthi.

Unable to return to Pakistan after her recovery, Malala moved to Britain, setting up the Malala Fund and supporting local education advocacy groups with a focus on Pakistan, Nigeria, Jordan, Syria and

Kenya.
She is currently studying at

Oxford University.

The United Nations Secretary-General, Antonio Guterres, appointed her as UN Messenger of Peace to promote girls education in April



WHO appeals for contributions for health services to Rohingya

NEW DELHI, MAR 29 (PTI): The WHO has urged the international community to contribute generously to enable appropriate health services to the 1.3 million "highly vulnerable" Rohingyas in Bangladesh's Cox's Ba-zar as the refugees face "grave" risks to their lives and health in view of the coming rainy season.

This is one of the "biggest" humanitarian crisis in recent times, the WHO's South East Asia Regional Director, Poo-nam Khetrapal Singh, said at a meeting of partners in Dhaka.

"No single agency or the Bangladesh govern-ment alone can meet the massive health needs of such a large population group. The Rohingya population are settled in an area that is prone to cyclone, and a terrain that would be flooded as soon as rains begin," the official said.

"The risk of outbreak of life threatening water and vector borne diseases under such conditions is huge," Singh said.

Coordinating work of over a 100 part-ners along with the Ministry of Health, Bangladesh, the World Health Organisation (WHO) has facilitated a contingency plan for the rainy season and coordinated a simulation around it.

The plan aims to en sure continuity of health services during rains and floods to minimise the risk of disease and deaths among the affect-ed population, a WHO statement said.

Two Koreas agree to hold summit on April 27

SEOUL, MAR 29 (AFP): The two Koreas today set a date for a rare inter-Korean summit, following a high-level meeting that was held days after the nuclear-armed North's leader Kim Jong Un made his international debut with a surprise trip to China.

"According to the will of both leaders, the South and North agreed to hold the '2018 South-North summit' on April 27 at the South's Peace House in Panmunjom," said a joint press statement, read out in turn by both

delegations' leaders.

The meeting between Kim Jong Un, leader of nuclear-armed North Ko-rea, and the South's President Moon Jae-in will be only the third of its kind, and will be followed by landmark talks with US President Donald Trump which could come as ear-

ly as May.

The venue will make Kim the first North Korean leader to set foot in the South since the end of the Korean War -- although according to Pyongyang's official accounts, during the conflict his grandfather and predecessor Kim Il Sung went several times to Seoul, which twice fell to his forces.

Another round of working-level talks next Wednesday will discuss issues including protocol and security.

BEIJING, MAR 29 (PTI): China today commended Nepal's new Left Alliance government for adopting an independent and balanced policy towards its neighbours.

The Left Alliance of the CPN-UML, led by K P Sharma Oli and CPN-Maoist Centre, led by Prachanda, had in December secured 174 seats in the 275-member Parliament in the



historic provincial and parliamentary polls.

Known for his pro-China stance, 65-year-old Oli was elected as the prime minister.

He had earlier served as the Nepal's prime minister from 2015 to 2016 during which Kathman du's ties with New Delhi had To a question about Oli's assertion to follow independent and balanced foreign policy, Lu said China "commend the Nepali government's commitment towards independent foreign

China also "support Nepal developing friendly and positive relations with its neighbours," Lu added.

Oli, who had publicly criticised New Delhi for interfering in Nepal's internal matters and accused it of toppling his government, after his sweeping poll vic-tory said his party would forge a partnership with India to move forward the country towards the path of economic prosperity.

Egypt's Sisi re-elected withnearly 92% of votes

SHARKAWY CAIRO, MAR 29 (PTI): Egyptian President Abdel Fattah al-Sisi has been re-elected for a second term with a sweeping majority, garnering nearly 92 per cent of the total otes, media reports said

According to early estimates, more than 23 million Egyptians voted for the 63-year-old Field Marshal in the three-day presidential election.

His sole challenger, the little-known centrist politician and al Ghad narty chief Moussa Mo-Moussa, is estimated to have obtained 3 per cent of the vote

Vote counting started after polling stations closed yesterday.



According to non-of-ficial figures, 21,088,295 people voted for Sisi in polling stations across Egypt. The official results will be announced on April 2.
Sisi posted photos of

voters participating in the polls and praised them on facebook for the huge turnout late yesterday.

"The voice of the masses of Egyptians will remain a witness doubt - that the will of our nation is prevailing with a force that does not know weakness," Sisi

"The scenes of the Egyptians outside the polling stations will remain a matter of honour and pride for me and hard evidence of the greatness of our nation." he added.

According to the official results of the vote count released by the general election committee in Aswan governorate, Sisi received 254,940 votes against Moussa's 9.563 votes.

In Sidi Gaber in Alexandria governorate, Sisi won 83,631 votes against 2,474 votes for his rival.

The number of eligible voters who cast their ballots stood at 95,486, with 86,112 valid votes registered, it said.

Alexandria governor-ate has more than 3.8 million eligible voters.

In the Nile Delta governorate of Gharbiya, Sisi obtained 90 per cent of votes, with a turnout of more than 50 per cent, state news agency MENA reported, citing preliminary results.

About 60 million people were eligible to vote in the election which was held in 13,687 polling stations across the country and under the supervision of 18.678 judges from various judicial bodies and authorities.

Police and army per-sonnel maintained a tight vigil near the polling stations to ensure that no untoward incident happens.

Sisi overthrew Is-nist president Molamist president hammed Morsi in 2013 following mass protests against his rule. He was elected for a four-year presidential term in 2014.
