Same gun used to kill Gauri and Kalburgi: Forensic report

BENGALURU, JUNE 8 (PTI): The same gun was used to kill journalist-ac-tivist Gauri Lankesh and rationalist M M Kalburgi in Karnataka, the state forensic science laboratory has confirmed in a report, sources in the SIT said.

The forensic report submitted to the Spe-cial Investigation Team probing the killing of Lankesh is part of the first chargesheet filed recently by the SIT naming K T Naveen Kumar as an accused.

This is the first official confirmation of the link between the two killings which happened after a gap of two years of each other.

Chief Minister and Minister-in-Charge for Home Department introduced the

Maintenance (Amendment) Bill, Bill No. 9 of 2018. The bill aims to amend section 2 of the Sikkim Essential Maintenance Act, 2000 and include ground

handling services in the Sik-Essential Maintenance Act, 2000 as per the direction received from Ministry of Civil Aviation, Government of India.

Mr Chamling who is also Minister-in-Charge for Land Revenue and Disaster Management Department introduced the Sikkim Regulation

of Transfer of Land (Amend-ment) Bill, Bill No. 10 of 2018 to ensure protection against alienation of the land holding of the category of the person. The bill has been introduced in view to ensure protection of the interest and land holding of the population. Accordingly, Sections 3 (A) and 3 (B) have been proposed for insertion in the Act.

Similarly, ter-in-Charge for Rural Man-agement and Development Department, SB Subedi introduced the Sikkim Panchayat (Amendment) Bill, Bill No.11 of 2018 to ensure minimum 20% representation of the BL Community who belongs to the Tribal Community of Sikkim keeping in view the principle of the proportionate reservation provided in the State Legislative Assembly. Minister-in-Charge for Law, Legal, Legisla-tive and Parliamentary Affairs, Ram Bahadur Subba proposed 300% hike in the salaries and allowances of sitting Ministers, Speakers, Deputy Speaker and Members of Legislative Assembly and said that a need has been felt to revise the salaries of

elected representatives of Sikkim Legislative Assembly in view of present price escalation and high inflation.

While tabling the

Amendment Bill for revising the salaries and allowances of Ministers, Speakers, Deputy Speaker and Members of Legislative Assembly, Mr Subba in his statement of objects and reasons said that in case of Government employees, price rise from time to time are being compensated by granting Dearness Allow-ances twice a year which has not been extended to the dignitaries and more-over, revision in salaries has also been effected in 7th Pay Commission.

He said that with the

cited objects and reasons, the State Govern-ment has deemed its expedient to enhance the existing salary rates from current financial year 2018-19.

The State Government had last hiked sal-

aries and allowances of the elected dignitaries in The present propos-al of hike in salaries and allowances of the legisla-

tors will cost additional expenditure of Rs.7.15 crore in the current financial year and Rs.8.20 crore from next financial year from the consolidated fund of the state.

However, as com-

pared to the salaries and other allowances of the sitting members of the Sikkim Legislative Assembly, the pension of ex-legislators has been hiked to 50% from existing pension drawn.

The existing pension

of ex-legislators has been hiked to Rs 15,000 per month from existing Rs 10,000 per month while those who have served as Cabinet Ministers, Speakers and Chief Ministers are proposed to get Rs 22,500 per month from the existing Rs 15,000.

The amendment bill has also proposed to insert a new provision earmarked to regulate the grant of medical al-lowances to the former legislators of Rs 2,000 per month along with

The Speaker detailed that after attaining for-



Accordingly, Section 13 and Section 50 have been proposed for amendment by way of insertion of pro-viso to sub-section (5) and of Section13 and provision to sub-section (4) of section 50 in the Panchayat Act, 1993.

Minister-in Charge for Human Re source Development Department, RB Subba introduced the Sikkim National Law University (Amendment) Bill, Bill no. 12 of 2018 which aims to enable the Department to initiate the process of establishment of Sikkim National Law University and to bring this Act into force with immediate effect.

Likewise, Mr Subba who is also the Minister-in-Charge for Law, Legal, Legislative and Parliamentary Affairs Department introduced the Sikkim Regulations of Societies, Associations and other Voluntary Organizations (Amendment) Bill, Bill No.13 of 2018 to provide legislation on regulation of societies, associations and other voluntary organization. Also with a view to oversee the activities of such organiza-

tions, and also to regulate the renewal of registration, to maintain proper record of their activities and to regulate the grants or aid received from the Central or State Government under the Act, the State Government has deemed it expedient to amend section 4, 5 and 6 of the Sikkim Regulations of Societies, Associations and Others Voluntary Organizations, Act, 2008.

Lastly, the Sikkim Greenfield Air-

port, Pakyong (Settlement of Claims for Loss and Damages) Bill, Bill no. 14 of 2018 was introduced by Minister-in Charge for Tourism and Civil Aviation Department, Ugen. T. Kalburgi (77) was shot dead in his house on August 30, 2015, in Dharwad and 55-year old Lankesh on September 5, 2017 here.
The SIT members had

earlier talked about the same-gun theory but for the first time it has come out in the open to show that Kalburgi's murder was the handiwork of the

same gang.

The bullets in both cases "have been fired through a single country made pistol chambered for 7.65 mm caliber pistol cartridges," a source said quoting the report.

The report also pointed out that the scratches formed by the firing pin on the bullets tallied among themselves.

Lankesh, who was own for her strong anti-Hindutva stand, was shot dead in front of her house, triggering a nationwide outrage.

The SIT formed to investigate her murder has formally arrested Naveen Kumar of Maddur as one of the accused.

Four more persons have been arrested for allegedly plotting to kill another rationalist and writer K S Bhagawan, also a strong critic of Hindutva.

The SIT is also probing whether they have any links with the Gauri

Accept it, Sikkim discriminates on the basis of gender

Anotification has finally come out which allows Sik-kimese women married to non-Sikkimese to continue acquiring property and getting it officially registered in their names. Given the heaps of denials which continue to be served to local women, this is a major breakthrough. When it comes to equality or empower ment, this is still a very small step though, but in light of established traditions, it is a substantial course correction towards the right path. One hopes that the notification issued by the Land Revenue Department on 07 June 2018 informing the concerned authorities to process registration of property even in the names of Sikkimese women married to non-locals, sets the ball rolling to weed out all rules which deny local women their claims to identity as Sikkimese.

The ball was set rolling by 68 Sikkimese women married to non-Sikkimese who had moved the High Court of Sikkim at around this time last year challenging the discrimination women face in Sikkim because of their gender when it comes to their identity as Sikkimese

Being subjected to a different set of rules based on gender is not a new situation in Sikkim, not even of the Sikkim Succession Act of 2008 vintage which the 68 women had challenged. The traditional practice in Sikkim has been that daughters enjoy no rights to ancestral property and receive it only thanks to the grace of their fathers or the magnanimity of their brothers. There might not have been widespread denial on this count, but fact remains that they cannot still claim inheritance as a matter of right. The Sikkim Succession Act sought to correct this discrimination by extending the right to inheritance to Sikkimese women. This right however was proposed with a caveat that Sikkimese women who married non-locals could not stake any such claims. This was clearly insensitive, but was not a creation of the Act in question, but was a continuation of how the identity of Sikkimese women continues to be tied to the men in their lives - initially their fathers or grandfathers and upon marriage, their husbands. And this flows from how rules governing the issuance of Certificates of Identity are interpreted here. A COI is the document which attests a person as Sikkimese, as in a descendent of a Sikkim Subject. These are issued only to someone whose father or grandfather or brother is registered in the Sikkim Subjects Register. When it comes to women, the extant practice is to have them refresh their identity upon marriage, their continuing to be recognized as Sikkimese dependent on who they marry – if they marry a non-local, they lose their Sikkimeseness. This itself is sourced from the Sikkim Subjects Regulation and how subjecthood was granted under it and is the practice which has also led to such women losing their inheritance rights in the Sikkim Succession Act since once they cease to be Sikkimese because of who they choose to marry, land or property can no longer be registered in their name in Sikkim.

The only fig leaf offered in this clearly problematic rule is that they are allowed to continue owning the land for life or sell it. They could not, until the notification issued on Thursday, acquire new property or bequeath it to their children since their children also were no longer considered Sikkimese.

This condition imposed on women is at the crux of all the indignities imposed on them like securing unmarried certificates every six months if they wish to continue enjoying benefits exclusively meant for the Sikkimese. The case in the High Court did not receive a judgment because it transpired that the Sikkim Succession Act was never notified in Sikkim even though it has now been around as an Act for a decade. But now, with the latest notification, one hopes that the Act can also be amended to include Sikkimese women married to non-Sikkimese among those entitled to equal inheritance rights. Once that happens, at least a law will be in place awarding the right to inheritance to all Sikkimese daughters. And that right, one must add here, would have been won by daughters who were, until recently, stripped of their Sikkimese identity because they married outsiders. Accept it, there is some delicious irony in this scenario.

What the notification should also ideally trigger is a wider discussion in the public domain on gender issues, something Sikkim continues to sidestep. Gender equality, after all, requires more than governmental intervention to come about. Legislations and rules mean little if male chauvinism does not even need to be disguised in public. This is obvious in the common defence of the gender discrimination in question – "outsiders will take advantage of our innocent women if such protection of local interests is not enforced". This argument is perhaps even more offensive than the rules in practice because it refuses to acknowledge that Sikkimese women are aware enough and capable of deciding for themselves. But it also explains why such practices continue. Also, the fact that even though most women find the rules discriminatory and offensive, it was only a year back that some resolved to do something about it. Empowerment is obviously lacking when it takes this long for women to come to-

World Cup glory is Xi Jinping's dream for China

the first time, the 2018 Not for the mist unite, World Cup Finals will take place without the Chinese national team. In fact, China's World Cup record is abysmal (and I say this as a Scottish football fan). The team has qualified only once for the final stages – in 2002 when it played three games in South Korea, failed to score in any of them and was eliminated without securing a single point.

On a more positive note, losing only 4-0 to Brazil was an achievement of sorts, given that the Brazilian goal scorers were Roberto Carlos, Rivaldo, Ronaldinho and Ronaldo.

Apart from this short-lived foray into the finals, China did not enter the competition between 1930 and 1954 or between 1962 and 1978, failed to qualify for the finals in 1958 and again between 1982 and 1998 and

from 2006 to the present.

In the Asia qualifying stage of the 2018 World Cup, China received a bye into the second round where they came second in a group headed by Qatar. Following the third qualifying round. China was eliminated, having been placed in its group below among others - war-torn Syria, which is currently obliged to play "home'

XI HAS A DREAM

It is against this dismal backdrop that we must try to interpret Chinese president Xi Jinping's vision for the future of Chinese football. In 2011, Xi confessed that he had three World Cup dreams for China: to participate once again in the World Cup finals, to host the World Cup finals and to be World Cup winners

There can be little doubt that the People's Republic of China (PRC) will host the World Cup finals at some point in the not-too-distant future.
With the Summer Olympics already under China's belt and the Winter Olympics to come, the country has already shown itself to be willing and able to host sporting mega events.

The FIFA World Cup would pres-

ent greater logistical challenges than the Olympics but no more so than in Russia. China's massive cities would be happy to stage matches and, where suitable venues do not yet exist, they would be built. The Chinese team would, of course, qualify as hosts, perhaps its best chance of repeating the achievement of 2002.

But what of Xi's third dream? Here Xi and, by extension, the Chinese Football Association (CFA) face a much greater challenge. It is true that host countries have often done well. However, it has proved impossible to date to prevent a European or South American team from winning the World Cup. Although in the past there have been high hopes for an African victory, hosting the finals did not mean success for the South Afri-

Moreover, we should not forget that football has been the number one sport in most African countries throughout the period in which football's significance in China has been dwarfed by that of badminton and table tennis

A RUN ON GOAL

A further obstacle to the realisation of Xi's third dream stems from the contradictions that are inherent in

he is now the unassailable guardian.

Socialism with Chinese characteristics has come to mean the combination of a strong state and an in-creasingly liberal market economy, the differences between which can be seen in the relationship between the CFA and the Chinese Super League (CSL). Founded in 2004, the latter has attracted the interest of some of the richest companies in China, eager to own a football club and gain the addi-

tional benefits that this can bring.

These owners provide live football entertainment to fans whose engagement would otherwise would be restricted to watching televised games from the major European leagues – hence their investment in bringing star players from Europe and South America to play for their teams. Their primary interest is se-curing the best return for their investment - not in creating a success ful national team and thereby helping to fulfil Xi's dream.

These owners are capitalists but of a distinctly Chinese type, subject to considerably more surveillance and interference than their Western counterparts. The CFA is even more closely tied to the state, the interests of which it has a far greater obligation to serve than equivalent organisations in the West

state pressure, the CFA's latest ruling on the use of foreign players decrees that CSL teams can use three at most in a match and that the number of foreign players on the field must not exceed that of domestic players under the age of 23. The battle for the soul of Chinese football is likely to

But it's not this conflict of interests alone that threatens Xi's dream. A lucrative, entertaining national league does not guarantee a successful national team – you only have to look at England's track record to see this. Nor does a league which offers limited opportunities for local hope-fuls to play alongside foreign talent

(see Scotland, for example).

The real key may be having the capacity to select players for a national team who have experience of playing in overseas leagues in France, Spain Portugal, Germany, Belgium and elsewhere). With that in mind, the time has come perhaps for the CFA, the CSL owners and Xi to consider exporting China's football talent to fulfil the dream.

Despite strong words, the US has few options left to reverse China's gains in the South China Sea

t a top regional security forum on Saturday, At a top regional security forum on Saturday, US Defence Secretary Jim Mattis said China's recent militarisation efforts in the disputed South China Sea were intended to intimidate and coerce

Mattis told the Shangri-La Dialogue that China's actions stood in "stark contrast with the openness of [the US] strategy," and warned of "much larger consequences" if China continued its current approach.

As an "initial response", China's navy has been disinvited by the US from the upcoming 2018 Rim of the Pacific Exercise, the world's largest international naval exercise.

It is important to understand the context of the current tensions, and the strategic stakes for both China and the US.

In recent years, China has sought to bolster its control over the South China Sea, where a number of claimants have overlapping territorial claims with China, including Vietnam, the Philippines and Taiwan China's efforts have continued unabated, de

spite rising tensions and international protests. Just recently, China landed a long-range heavy bomber for the first time on an island in the disputed Paracels, and deployed anti-ship and anti-air missile systems to its outposts in the Spratly Islands.

China's air force has also stepped up its drills

and patrols in the skies over the South China Sea.

While China is not the only claimant militarising the disputed region, no one else comes remotely close to the ambition, scale and speed of China's efforts. CHINA'S STRATEGY
The South China Sea has long been covet-

ed by China (and others) due to its stra-tegic importance for trade and military power, as well as its abundant resources. According to one estimate, US\$3.4 trillion in trade passed through the South China Sea in 2016, representing 21% of the

China's goal in the South China Sea can be summarised with one word: control.

In order to achieve this, China is under-aking a coordinated, long-term effort to assert its dominance in the region, including the building of artificial islands, civil and military infrastructure, and the deployment of military ships and aircraft to the region

While politicians of other countries such as the US, Philippines and Australia espouse fiery rheto-ric to protest China's actions, Beijing is focusing on actively transforming the physical and power geography of the South China Sea.

In fact, according to the new commander of the US Indo-Pacific Command, Admiral Philip Davidson, China's efforts have been so successful that it "is now capable of controlling the South China Sea in all scenarios short of war with the US

AMERICA'S DECLINING RELEVANCE

China's efforts are hard to counter because it has employed an incremental approach to cementing its control in the South China Sea. None of its actions would individually justify a US military response that could escalate to war. In any case, the human and economic cost of such a conflict would

The inability of the US to respond effectively to China's moves has eroded its credibility in the region. It has also fed a narrative that the US is not "here to stay" in Asia. If the US is serious about countering China, then Mattis' rhetoric must be followed by action.

First, the US should clearly articulate its red lines to China and others on the kinds of activities that are unacceptable in the South China Sea. Then it must be willing to enforce such red lines, while being mindful of the risks.

Second, the US needs to renew its efforts to cooperate with allies in the region to build capacity and demonstrate a coordinated commitment to stand in the face of China's challenge.

Third, the US needs to deploy military capabil-

ities in the Indo-Pacific region, such as advanced missile systems, which would reduce the military advantages gained by China through the militarisation of the South China Sea featur

LONG-TERM CONSEQUENCES

China's tightening control over the South China Sea is worrying for a number of regional countries. For many, the shipping routes that run through the South China Sea are the bloodlines of their economies.

Moreover, the shifting balance of power will en-able Beijing to settle its territorial disputes in the region for good. Without a doubt, China is willing to use its new-found power to change the status quo in its favour, even at the expense of its weaker

Control of the South China Sea also allows Beijing to better project its military power across South-East Asia, the western Pacific and parts of Oceania. This would make it more costly for the US and its allies to take action against China, for example, in scenarios involving Taiwan.

On a higher level, China's assertive approach to the South China Sea demonstrates Beijing's increasing confidence and its willingness to flaunt international norms that it considers inconvenient or contrary to its interests.

There is little doubt China is becoming the new dominant power in Asia. Its rise has benefited mil-lions in the region and should be welcomed. But we should also be wary of Beijing's approach to terri-torial disputes and grievances if it employs military and economic intimidation and coercion.

If we want to live in a "world where big fish nei-

ther eat nor intimidate the small", then there must be consequences for countries, including China, when they flaunt international norms and seek to settle disagreements with force.

It may be too late to turn the tide in the South China Sea and reverse China's gains. No one would run such a risk. But it is not too late to impose penalties on China for further destabilising the region through its actions in the South China Sea.

The challenge is to figure out how to do that, and what we would be willing to risk to achieve it.

Rashford made the most of the absence of England captain Harry Kane as he started up front alongside Jamie Vardy, and showed what he is capable of with a fiercely struck shot from 25 yards that dipped perfectly into the top corner.

"You work on them (goals) in training every day and when one comes up in a game it's a reward," Rashford told ITV.

Rashford endured a difficult end to the season at United, scoring just four times in 2018 at club level, and suffering some stinging criticism from Jose Mourinho.

Efforts to tackle age fraud in tennis begin

New Delhi, Jun 8 (PTI): To tackle the menace of age fraud, the AITA has made it mandatory for players to submit a re-port of TW3 age verification test for registration if they do not have a birth certificate issued within one year of birth even as newly-crowned na tional champion Tejasvi Dahas has "voluntarily" withdrawn from the Under-12 category after allegations surfaced that she was overage.

Tejasvi, claimed to be 11-year old with height of 5 feet four inches, recently won the girls' Under-12 National Championship, held in Mumbai.

After receiving complaints against Tajasvi, AITA called her parents for a meeting and the outcome was that the player agreed to withdraw from the Under-12 category and is now allowed to compete only in Under-14 and Under-16 categories. However, the All India Tennis Association will not take away the title won by her. Neither it considers it a case of age fraud.

"She is a huge girl, that's the main problem. I will not say it's an age fraud issue. I will say that the parents volunteered to withdraw due to complaints. It's a fact," AITA secretary Hironmoy Chatterjee told PTI, explaining

the body's decision.

Asked if AITA tried to find the correct age of the girl, Chatterjee said, "We did not need to verify. The father of the girl said that her child looks big (growth is good) and that's why people are complaining."

"Had they contest-

ed, then we could have thought of age verifica-tion test. We asked them to put it (withdrawal from U-12) in writing and they did. Certifi-cate-wise she can still play. Since there were complaints, we had to discuss it but it did not go to that level that we had to subject her to age verification test."

AITA also recently banned Muskan from com peting in the Under-14 category as she was carrying two AITA registration cards with two different dates of birth.

Her card bearing registration number 430252, in which her date of hirth was men tioned as March 6, 2005 was suspended. In her second card, her date of March 6, 2003

CHANDIGARH, JUN 8 (PTI): Inundated with criticism from elite sportspersons, the Haryana government today decided to put on hold a notification that required athletes employed by it to deposit one-third of their earnings from commercial and profession-al commitments to the state sports council.

"I have asked for the relevant file of Sports Department to be shown to . me & the notification dated April 30th to be put on hold till further orders, Chief Minister M L Khat-

"We are proud of the contribution by our sportsperson & I assure them of a just consideration of all issues affecting them," he added.

His intervention came after athletes reacted sharply to the notification issued by Principal Secretary (Sports and Youth Department), Ashok Khemka.

"One-third of the income earned by the sportsperson from professional sports or com-mercial endorsements will be deposited with the Haryana State Sports Council. The money shall be used for the development of sports in the State," it stated.

Khemka had hit the headlines during his stint as head of land registration department by alleging irregularities in land deals involving Robert Vadra a few years ago.

'NASA rover finds building blocks of life on Mars'

Curiosity rover has discovered potential building blocks of life in an ancient martian lakebed, advancing the case for possible life, past or even present, on the red planet, the US space agency said.

The new findings published in the journal Science describe "tough" organic molecules in three-billion-year-old sedimenta-ry rocks near the surface, as well as seasonal variations in the levels of methane in the atmosphere.

Organic molecules contain carbon and hydrogen, and also may include oxygen, nitrogen and other elements. While commonly associated with life, organic molecules also can be created by non-biological processes and are not necessarily indicators of life.

These findings are a good sign for future missions exploring the planet's surface and subsurface,

NASA said in a statement. 'With these new findings, Mars is telling us to stay the course and keep searching for evidence of life," said Thomas Zurbuchen, associate administrator for the Scince Mission Directorate at NASA Headquarters here.



"I am confident that our ongoing and planned missions will unlock even more breathtaking discoveries on the red planet," Zurbuchen said.

"Curiosity has not determined the source of the organic molecules," said Jen Eigenbrode of NA-SA's Goddard Space Flight Center

"Whether it holds a record of ancient life, was food for life, or has existed in the absence of life, or-

ganic matter in martian materials holds chemical clues to planetary

Although the surface of Mars is inhospitable today, there is clear evidence that in the distant past, the martian climate allowed liquid water - an essential ingredient for life as we know it - to pool at the surface, NASA said.

Data from Curiosity reveals that billions of years ago, a water

lake inside Gale Crater held all the ingredients necessary for life, including chemical building blocks and energy sources, it said.

"The martian surface is exposed to radiation from space. Both radiation and harsh chemicals break down organic matter," said Eigenbrode. "Finding ancient organic mol-

ecules in the top five centimeters of rock that was deposited when Mars may have been habitable,

bodes well for us to learn the story of organic molecules on Mars vith future missions that will drill deeper," he said.

Scientists also discovered seasonal variations in methane the martian atmosphere over the course of nearly three Mars years, which is almost six Earth years. This variation was detected by Curiosity's Sample Analysis at Mars (SAM) instrument suite.

Water-rock chemistry might have generated the methane, but scientists cannot rule out the possibility of biological origins. Methane previously had been detected in Mars' atmosphere in large, unpredictable plumes.

This new result shows that low levels of methane within Gale Crater repeatedly peak in warm, summer months and drop in the winter every year, NASA said.

"This is the first time we have seen something repeatable in the methane story, so it offers us a handle in understanding it," said Chris Webster of NASA's Jet Propulsion Laboratory (JPL) in California.

To identify organic material in the martian soil, Curiosity drilled into sedimentary rocks known as mudstone from four areas in Gale Crater. This mudstone gradually formed billions of years ago from silt that accumulated at the bottom of the ancient lake. The rock sam-ples were analysed by SAM, which uses an oven to heat the samples (500 degrees Celsius) to release organic molecules from the powdered rock.

SAM measured small organic molecules that came off the mudstone sample - fragments of larger organic molecules that do not va-

pourise easily.

Some of these fragments contain sulphur, which could have helped preserve them in the same way sulphur is used to make car tires more durable, according to Eigenbrode.

The results also indicate organic carbon concentrations on the order of 10 parts per million or more. This is close to the amount observed in martian meteorites and about 100 times greater than prior detections of organic carbon on Mars' surface.

Some of the molecules identified include thiophenes, benzene, toluene, and small carbon chains, such as propane or butene

Wuhan consensus between Modi and Xi to be reflected in SCO summit: Indian envov

BEIJING, JUN 8 (PTI): The consensus reached between Prime Minister Narendra Modi and Chinese President Xi Jinping in Wuhan would be reflected at the Qingdao summit of the Shanghai Cooperation Organisa tion, India's envoy to Chi-na Gautam Bambawale has said on the eve of the meeting tomorrow.

Modi would attend

the two-day summit of the eight-member SCO in the estern Chinese city of

Qingdao.
This is the first summit of the organisation after the admission of India and Pakistan as full members last year.

During his stay in Qingdao, Modi will also hold several bilateral meetings with the lead-ers of the SCO member countries including Xi.

"The focus on of SCO members is in the areas of security cooperation, countering terrorism, economic development as well as cultural exchange," Bambawale told state-run China Daily and China Global Television Network (CGTN).

"We will continue to expand our cooperation in these areas. India will work with the other

member countries in this direction," he said. The SCO members include China, Russia, India, Pakistan, Kazakhstan, Kyrgyzstan, Tajikistan and Uzbekistan

said that India would take part in the SCO enthusiastically.
Bambawale highlighted the consensus reached between Modi and Xi at their informal summit at the Chinese city of Wuhan in April and said it would be reflected at the Qingdao summit. He said the two leaders reached consensus in two areas.

The first was that India and China are partners in progress and development.

"Second there are many more commonalties between India and China, many more areas where we cooperate with each other than where we differ with each oth-er," he said.

"Obviously, between any two countries, in-cluding India and China, there are some areas which we do not see eye to eye, where we have our own opinions. But the two leaders decided to work on the areas where we have common approaches. We will see that in Qingdao summit,"

On India-China security cooperation in view of their differences on the border, he said, "India and China must work together in the security area too".

"We might have our differences in terms of where our border lies. We don't have a final resolution of India-China border. But I think it is very important for India and China to ensure that peace and tranquillity is maintained in the India, China border areas," Bambawale said.

Reincarnation of Dalai Lama should be chosen by Tibetans: US

WASHINGTON, JUN 8 (PTI): Tibetans should choose Buddhist lamas, including the Dalai Lama, as per their beliefs and without interference, the Trump administration has said in an apparent reference to China's intervention

In its latest Tibet negotiations report sent to the Congress, the Trump administration said it was concerned by the Chinese government's interference in the selection,

education and veneration of Tibetan Buddhist religious leaders. "The US government believes that respect for Tibetan Buddhists' universal human right of religious freedom dictates that the succession or identification of Tibetan Buddhist lamas, including the Dalai Lama, should occur without interference, in a manner consistent with their beliefs," said the report signed by Assistant Secretary of State for Legisla-tive Affairs Mary K Waters.

The US continues to urge the Chinese Government to revise its poli-cies in Tibetan areas that have cre-



ated tensions, respect and preserve the distinct religious, linguistic and cultural identity of the Tibetan people and permit Tibetans to express their grievances freely, publicly, peacefully and without fear of retri-

ution, it said.
China says that the successor to the Dalai Lama must be chosen according to the religious rituals and historical conventions as well as the backing from the ruling Communist

The report calls upon the Chinese authorities to allow diplomats, journalists, tourists and others to have unrestricted access to Tibetan

It urges the Chinese Government to respect the human rights and fundamental freedoms of all the people in China, including the freedom of

country, including one's own.

Noting that the Chinese governnt officials and the Dalai Lama or his representatives have not met in formal negotiations since 2010, the report said the US continued to encourage both sides to engage in meaningful and direct dialogue, without preconditions, to lead to a settlement that resolves differences.

The US government remains concerned by the lack of meaningful autonomy for Tibetans within China, ongoing violations and abuses of the human rights of Tibetans in China and efforts by Chinese authorities to eliminate the distinct religious, linguistic and cultural identity of Tibet-ans, the report said.

The US believes the Chinese government must address these concerns to create conditions for a sustainable settlement, which is es ential to the long-term stability of the region, it said.

"The US government has maintained close contact with Tibetan re-

expressed its concerns regarding Chinese government actions in bilat eral, multilateral and public venues,

According to the report, the Department of State maintains close contact with a wide range of religious, cultural and political leaders of the Tibetan people, including Ti-betans in the US, China, India, Nepal

and around the world.

Last year, the Chinese foreign ministry said the successor to the Dharamshala-based 14th Dalai Lama must be chosen according to the religious rituals and historical conventions, including drawing of lots from the Golden Urn in front of the Shakyamuni (Buddha) statue at the Jokhang Temple in Lhasa, followed by the mandatory approval from the ruling Communist Party of China.

Since he fled Tibet in 1959 to escape from the Chinese occupation, the Dalai Lama, 82, has been keeping Chi-na on tenterhooks about his successor.



Officials in Guatemala have admitted that they were slow to warn the public of the danger posed by the eruption of the country's Volcano of Fire. At least 109 people were killed when Volcan de Fuego erupted last Sunday, sending gas and rocks hurtling down the mountain at high speed, enveloping several villages. Seismologists warned there was a possibility of pyroclastic flows eight hours before the main eruption - one of the deadliest in 500 years - but the national disaster agency Conred failed to impose mandatory evacuation orders.

Would invite Kim to White House if Singapore talks go well: Trump

WASHINGTON, JUN 8 (PTI): US President Donald Trump today said he would consider inviting North Korean leader Kim Jong-un to the White House if their Singapore summit on Tuesday goes well but made it clear that he is ready to "walk away" from the meeting if his goals were not achieved.

The US and its regional

allies want to see North Ko-rea give up its nuclear weapons.
Trump and Kim will meet

on Sentosa, a smaller island off the coast of Singapore's

main island. The June 12 summit would represent the first ever meet-ing between a North Korean leader and a sitting US president.

Trump made the remarks after meeting Japanese Prime Minister Shinzo Abe at the White House to discuss the June 12 summit. Abe's visit is part of a flurry of diplomatic activity in the run-up to the summit, as countries try to ensure their interests are not overlooked.

"Maybe we'll start with the White House," he told reporters after he was asked whether he would invite the North Korean leader to the White House or his Mar-a-lago resort in Florida.

He said it was possible an agreement to end the Korean War could be reached, though he called that "the easy part" of the

"It's what happens after that that is real-



ly important," he told reporters.

He, however, made it clear that he was ready to "walk away" from the meeting if his goals were not achieved.

"I am totally prepared to walk. It could happen. Maybe it won't be necessary. I hope it won't be necessary to walk, because I really believe that Kim Jong-un wants to do something that is going to be great for his people, and also great for his family, and great for himself," Trump said.
"I am totally prepared to walk away. I did

it once before. You have to be able to walk

away.

"If you're not going to be able to walk we didn't walk away from the horrible Iran deal that was signed, and if you look at what's happened, since I signed that deal, Iran and in all fairness, I say it with great respect for the people of Iran, but Iran is acting a lot differently. They're no longer looking so much to the Mediterranean." he

Iran, he said, is no longer looking so much to what was going on in Syria, Yemen and other places.

"They're a much different country over the last three months. And again, I say that with hope that maybe something can happen," said the US President.

About Kim's personal letter delivered to Trump by the North Korean leader's top aide last week, the President said, "The letter was just a greeting. It was really very nice. Perhaps I can

get approval to put it out. It was warm letter, a very nice letter".

"I appreciated it very much, and nothing other than. 'We look forward to seeing you and we look forward to the summit, and hopefully, some wonderful things will work

out. So it was really very warm, very nice.
We appreciated it," Trump said.
US Secretary of State Mike Pompeo,
speaking later at the White House, said Kim had indicated to him personally that he was willing to denuclearise - although it is not clear if that means North Korea is coming closer to the US vision of what that entails. Earlier, Trump said he did not think preparation was essential for his meeting with the North Korean leader. "I think I'm very well prepared. I don't

think I have to prepare very much. It's about attitude, it's about willingness to get things done," he said.
