Mugabe ousted as ruling party chief as end nears

HARARE, NOV 19 (AFP): Zimbabwe President Rob-ert Mugabe was today facing the imminent end of his 37-year rule as the once-loyal ZANU-PF party sacked him as its leader and army generals piled pressure on him to resign.

Mugabe's grip on power was broken last week when the military took over, angered at his wife Grace's emergence as the leading candidate to succeed the 93-year-

old president.

Yesterday, tens of thousands of overjoyed demonstrators flooded the streets of Zimbabwe in peaceful celebrations marking the apparent end of his long and authoritarian rule.

Outside a ZANU-PF meeting in Harare, a delegate told AFP that Mugabe had been ousted as party chief and replaced by Emmerson Mnangag-wa, who was previously Grace Mugabe's chief rival to succeed the ageing president.

"A resolution has been adopted to recall the president and elevate Mnangagwa as the party president," said the dele-gate, who declined to be named.

Mugabe - the world's oldest head of state - re-mains national president for the time being but now faces overwhelming opposition from the generals, much of the Zimba-bwean public and from his own party.

"(Mugabe's) wife and close associates have taken advantage of his frail condition to usurp pow-er and loot state resources," party official Obert Mpofu told the ZANU-PF meeting.

Army chiefs who led the takeover were due to hold further talks with the president later today.

The two sides first met on Thursday, smiling in photographs that at-tempted to present a dignified image of the tense process of negotiating Mugabe's departure.

Veterans of the in-dependence war - who were also formerly key Mugabe allies - added their voice in support of him resigning, demand-ing that he leave office

The 82-year-old Buddhist monk also said Tibetans are not seeking in-dependence or separation from China but meaningful autonomy, and added that he "admired the European Union

The Tibetan spiritual leader appreciated the idea of the "Union of India". Citing his recent visit to Manipur where he learnt that some politicians wanted independence for the state, he said they needed to "think broadly, more holistically".

He said India and China are more than two billions of people together and though they have differences, Nalanda thoughts are not alien to

Nalanda university, the ancient seat of learning in Bihar, attracted scholars from China, Korea, Japan,



Tibet, Mongolia, Turkey, Sri Lanka, among other countries. These scholars have left records about the ambience, architecture and learning of

this unique university.

India and China can "do something for a more compassionate

world, more compassionate humanity", the Nobel Peace Prize Laureate said.

"And then India and China, at a practical level also, neither one has the ability to destroy others. Whether you like it or not, you have to live Earlier during an interaction with children at an event here organised by the Smile Foundation, the Dalai Lama said many Chinese people appreciate Tibetan scholars' knowledge of Nalanda.

He said the Nalanda school of thought, a shared heritage of India, China and Tibet, can help resolve the Tibetan crisis.

"Many Chinese Buddhists

very very eager to learn from Tibet-an masters. And, we are not seeking separation from China... I really admire the European, the EU spirit... of national sovereignty," he said.

Amid all the linguistic and cul-

tural diversity in India, it is a country
that is the "most stable, more peaceful" of the Asian nations, he said.

"Here you have east India, north
India and west India and south India
... different India, different scripts,
different India, different scripts,
different India, different scripts, different languages, but spirit of one India, which is wonderful," the Dalai

"At a meeting, someone told me that some Maipur politicians want independence (for the state). I think they need to think broadly, more holistically. Union is important.

Of course, I have no right to criticise." he said.

Making a veiled reference to the Catalan movement, he said, "In Spain, I think it was too short-sight-

"It was time to think of one Europe. And, here (in India), you already have one nation... time to think long- sighted, about the wonderful Union of India," he said.

Hailing India's ancient knowledge system, especially the one based on the Nalanda school of learning, the Tibetan spiritual leader appealed to India to lead the world in shaping an education system which will inspire students to think "outward as much as inward" and be wary of "materialistic outlook".

At the event, he also announced

that his philanthropy body will grant endowment to the Smile Foundation over the next five years.

"She is very acceptable. Very much accepted by the people," Mugabe said of Grace in a faltering in-terview to mark his 93rd birthday last February.

The president, who is feted in parts of Africa as the continent's last surviving liberation leader serving as a head of state, is in fragile health. But he previously said he would stand in elections next vear that would see him remain in power until he was nearly 100-years-old.

He became prime minister on Zimbabwe's independence from Britain in 1980 and then

president in 1987. Zimbabwe's economic output has halved since 2000 when many whiteowned farms were seized, leaving the key agricultural sector in ruins.

We Gossip So That We Don't Have to Engage

Time to change that

 R^{umours} serve only one purpose - entertainment. They titillate, scandalise, and then evaporate. In most cases, the receivers and circulators of such gossip know that no one believes the rumours and everyone partakes in it only get over the boredom with which most people appear afflicted in these lazy winter months. That said, there also appear to be a whole lot of people, who even if they don't accept rumours as true, convince themselves that there has to be a germ of truth some layers down for active imaginations to have created the dramatized versions in circulation. And then there is that whole smoke and mirrors trick that 'information' bereft of context can pull. But then again, while one can reason with the informed, there is really no defence against ignorance. Hence, at the end of the day, there is really only one way to settle a ru-mour – ignoring it. But while it is easy to ignore something when it is only whispered in street corners and closed circles, it becomes difficult to do so when they are palmed out and circulated in the public domain.

The drift should be obvious by now. Most rumours are brought into wider circulation by political parties, both ruling and opposition and the in-betweens, by way of press releases, public speeches, throwaway comments and wink-wink suggestions. Trolls, and the anonymity they hide behind, have now made it possible for nuance to be abandoned on "social media" and fling anything at the thousands of walls hoping that something sticks. Leaders, most of them new to the medium, make the mistake of engaging with agent provocateurs either by getting into arguments themselves, unleashing their online armies or issuing official denials and/or suffering an online meltdown themselves. The moment they do any of these, they give the faceless rumour-mongers credibility as representative voices because they receive response. Once this cycle begins, followers follow and the lines start getting blurred and suspicions start getting stronger.

Meanwhile, newspapers, by the very definition of their jobs, are required to allow space for public statements by public personalities. Unfortunately, the party workers who play rumours into the streets are not required to be accountable. What is worse, few demands are made of them to even be professional. Allegations are raised without even prima facie evidence and claims are made without any supporting evidence and very often condemnations issued on something that is only being gossiped. To deny them the space by way of news coverage would be unfair to the profession of journalism, but to sensationalise their statements means being even more unprofessional. It is a difficult call, but given the extremes to which claims and counter-claims swerve in the political domain, the only hope is that the readers can see through the weak fronts on their own and sift the gossip from the news.

That would be the ideal situation, but we don't live

in an ideal world.

The best defence against rumour-mongering would have been strong implementation of the Right to Information Act. If that were to happen, whenever people felt real fears or suspicions, they would be able to draft an application and exercise their right to information. But information by itself is worthless if the debate that follows is not intelligent, informed and coherent. Thus far, public debates have essentially been shouting matches with no heed paid to putting things in context or explaining the issues, much like the nightly TV newsroom debates. The people had to make do with slanging matches, but, if the people desire, things can be different now. They can inform themselves in advance and then hear out the politicians to decide whether their arguments and interpretations are sound or not. At the end of the day, the only weapon against rumours is the truth. Circulate it in the public domain and embarrass those who deal in rumours.

With teen mental health deteriorating over five years, there's a likely culprit

A round 2012, something started going wrong in the lives of teens. In just the five years between 2010 and 2015, the number of U.S. teens who felt useless and joyless - classic symptoms of depression surged 33 percent in large national surveys. Teen suicide attempts in-creased 23 percent. Even more troubling, the number of 13- to 18-year olds who committed suicide jumped 31 percent.

In a new paper published in Clinical Psychological Science, my colleagues and I found that the increases in depression, suicide attempts and suicide appeared among teens from every background - more privileged and less privileged, across all races and ethnicities and in every region of the country. All told, our analysis found that the generation of teens I call "iGen" – those born after 1995 is much more likely to experience mental health issues than their mil-lennial predecessors.

What happened so that so many more teens, in such a short period of time, would feel depressed, attempt suicide and commit suicide? After scouring several large surveys of teens for clues, I found that all of the possibilities traced back to a ma or change in teens' lives: the sudden scendance of the smartphone

ALL SIGNS POINT TO THE SCREEN ause the years between 2010 to 2015 were a period of steady economic growth and falling unemployment, it's unlikely that economic malaise was a factor. Income inequality was (and still is) an issue, but it didn't suddenly appear in the early 2010s: This gap between the rich and poor had been widening for decades. We found that the time teens spent on homework barely budged between 2010 and 2015, effectively ruling out academic pressure as a cause.

However, according to the Pew Research Center, smartphone ownership crossed the 50 percent threshold in late 2012 – right when teen depression and suicide began to increase. By



2015, 73 percent of teens had access

Not only did smartphone use and depression increase in tandem, but time spent online was linked to men-tal health issues across two different data sets. We found that teens who spent five or more hours a day onne were 71 percent more likely than those who spent only one hour a day to have at least one suicide risk factor (depression, thinking about suicide, making a suicide plan or attempting suicide). Overall, suicide risk factors rose significantly after two or more hours a day of time online.

Of course, it's possible that in-stead of time online causing depression, depression causes more time online. But three other studies show that is unlikely (at least, when viewed through social media use).

Two followed people over time, with both studies finding that spending more time on social media led to unhappiness, while unhappiness did not lead to more social media use. A third randomly assigned participants to give up Facebook for a week versus continuing their usual use. Those who avoided Facebook reported feeling less depressed at the end of the week.

The argument that depression might cause people to spend more time online doesn't also explain why depression increased so suddenly after 2012. Under that scenario, more teens became depressed for an unknown reason and then started buying smartphones, which doesn't seem too logical

WHAT'S LOST WHEN WE'RE PLUGGED IN

Even if online time doesn't directly harm mental health, it could still adversely affect it in indirect ways, especially if time online crowds out time for other activities.

For example, while conducting re-search for my book on iGen, I found that teens now spend much less time interacting with their friends in per-son. Interacting with people face to face is one of the deepest wellsprings of human happiness; without it, our moods start to suffer and depression often follows. Feeling socially isolated is also one of the major risk factors for suicide. We found that teens who spent more time than average online and less time than average with friends in person were the m likely to be depressed. Since 2012, that's what has occurred en masse: Teens have spent less time on activities known to benefit mental health (in-person social interaction) and more time on activities that may harm it (time online).

Teens are also sleeping less, and teens who spend more time on

their phones are more likely to not be getting enough sleep. Not sleep ing enough is a major risk factor for depression, so if smartphones are causing less sleep, that alone could explain why depression and suicide increased so suddenly.

Depression and suicide have many causes: Genetic predisposition, fami ly environments, bullying and trauma can all play a role. Some teens would experience mental health problems no matter what era they lived in.

But some vulnerable teens who would otherwise not have had mental health issues may have slipped into depression due to too much screen time, not enough face-to-face social interaction, inadequate sleep or a combination of all three.

It might be argued that it's too soon to recommend less screen time, given that the research isn't completely definitive. However, the downside to limiting screen time – say, to two hours a day or less – is minimal. In contrast, the downside to doing nothing – given the possible consequences of depression and suicide – seems, to me, quite high.

It's not too early to think about limiting screen time; let's hope it's not too late.

Saudi prince's power play is more than just a purge

The night of November 5 was a long one in Riyadh. Saudi authorities began a widespread crackdown aimed, on the one hand, against former economic ers and, on the other, against the chiefs of the Saudi National Guard and Saudi Royal Navy. This had the look of a political purge - but it is much bigger than that.

The first sign of how serious

this was came on November 4 with the removal of Prince Mu-taib bin Abdullah, eldest son of the late King Abdullah and head of a powerful fiefdom, the Saudi Arabian National Guard. Essentially a force of tribal recruits

from throughout Saudi Arabia, the guard's structure still bears the mark of King Abdullah, who oversaw it from its foundation in 1962 before passing it to Mutaib in 2015.

Then it was the turn of Saudi economic moguls who have influenced financial policymaking and its implementation for years. The most remarkable takedowns were those of Prince Waleed bin Talal, one of the richest men in the world and a nephew of King Salman; Ibrahim Assaf, former finance minister and father of Prince Waleed's daughter-in-law; Prince Turki bin Abdullah, the former governor of Riyadh; and Adel Fakeih, minister for conomy and planning.

Also taken into custody were Khaled al-Tu-weijri, the extremely influential advisor to King Abdullah and head of his royal court, and Amar al-Dabbagh, former head of the Saudi Arabian General Investment Authority. Business magnates were seized too, among them Saleh Kamel, Walid al-Ibrahim, and Bakr bin Laden, owner of the Saudi Bin Laden group.

Most of those arrested were prime figures in the political order under King Abdullah, with Khaled al-Tuweijri, Mutaib, and Turki among the most powerful members of the royal court. Ibra-



him Assaf and Amar al-Dabbagh were vital to economic policy. Adel Fakeih the minister of economy and planning and formerly of Health and Labour had also remained the mayor of Jeddah for five years. The notorious Jeddah floods in which scores died, occurred during his tenure

In the world of money and communications, Walid al-Ibrahim was owner of the Middle East Broadcasting Company and its subsidiary channels. Walid also launched al-Arabiya News TV, in which Abdul Aziz Bin Fahd – also a nephew of Walid and the youngest son of King Fahd - reportedly had major shares. Saleh Abdullah Kamel is an-other prominent businessman, and the chairman of Dallah Albaraka Group.

WHY NOW?

This shakeup is not just a consolidation of power by the crown prince, Mohammad bin Salman, but an act of persecution against members of King Abdullah's policymaking circle. To properly move on from the Abdullah era, the leftovers of the old order had to be scrapped, and suddenly their time was up. The removal of Mutaib Bin Abdullah is merely continuation of Mohammad bin Salman's strat egy to bring the various royals' security fiefdoms

under his direct control. The removal of former crown prince and interior minister Mohammad bin Nayef, King Salman's nephew, was only the first step.

The Saudi government has framed the arrests as an anti-corrramed the arrests as an anti-cor-ruption drive and touted them as proof it is prepared to act against even the kingdom's rich-est and most powerful figures. Even Prince Mutaib has been purportedly accused of graft in the purchase of bulletproof vests. Mohammad Bin Salman has stuck to the anti-corruption line in pub-lic, as have his lieutenants; in an interview with Bloomberg, the crown prince's advisor, Mohammad al-Sheikh, spoke of uncontrolled spending during the oil boom of 2010-2014, with US\$80-100 billion lost to inefficiency each year.

These financial habits and dealings led Saudi Arabia into a difficult situation, and at the time, Mohammad bin Salman – then "only" the defence minister - was not powerful enough to take on these influential royals and business elites. But once he became crown prince in June 2017 and saw Mohammad bin Nayef dispatched, the stage was set for a big political leap.

Bringing the state's axe down on the Abdullah

circle could fulfil an economic motive and satisfy a PR objective, raising the crown prince's profile with the Saudi populace. And for now, Mohammad bin Salman has checked any attempts by the Saudi elite to question his grand schemes of the Economic Transformation Plan and Vision 2030. Having already detained religious dissenters, the crown prince has secured the economic and business fronts in his strategy, and managed to reshape his country's security apparatuses. The way is clear, if all goes to plan, for him to take the Saudi throne.

Tejas world-class fighter jet, plays defined role: HAL chief

NEW DELHI, NOV 19 (PTI): The indigenously developed Tejas Light Combat Aircraft is a world class fighter jet and can effectively play its "defined" role in securing Indian skies, its manufacturer Hindustan Aeronautics Ltd (HAL) said today as the Indian Air Force looked at ac-quiring a fleet of foreign single-en-

HAL chairman and managing di-rector T Suvarna Raju said most of the 42 modifications in Teias sought by the IAF, including weaponisation of the aircraft, had been carried out and asserted that the production of the jet could be stepped up depending on the requirement.

"Tejas is a four-and-half genera-tion world class fighter jet. There is

no doubt about it. We can improve its various parameters. We are proud of Tejas. Every Indian will be proud of it. We will ensure enhancement in its quality and performance," Raju told PTI in an interview TI in an interview.

His remarks came amidst views in the IAF that the Tejas aircraft was not enough to maintain its combat readiness and it needed to quickly procure a fleet of foreign single en-gine fighters to deal with any possible security challenges facing the country in the backdrop of the dwindling size of its fighter fleet.

The IAF believes it has to have a wide mix of aircraft to maintain an operational edge over its adversaries.

The IAF has placed an order for 40 Tejas and is likely to seal a con-

tract "very soon" with HAL for an other 83 aircraft. However, Raju said HAL was looking at supplying higher numbers, adding that it was ready to carry out further upgrades, modification and improvements on the jet "very quickly"

The HAL CMD said the four-andhalf generation Tejas would be able to deliver what is expected of it, insisting that the lifespan of the jet would be a minimum of 30 years just like any other frontline combat aircraft.

The combat jets are classified under various generations depending on their avionics, capability and weapons systems.

The current fleet of fighter jets

with the IAF range from three-and-half generation to fourth generation.

Rejecting criticism of a delay in the delivery of the jet to the IAF, the head of the state-run aerospace behemoth said HAL was ready to "significantly speed up" the delivery of the 83 jets as the public sector entity was investing Rs 1,300 crore to aug ment the existing infrastructure for manufacturing the aircraft.

"If I know the numbers, the investments can go (up). Rate of production can be increased to any extent. It de pends on what cost economics you are looking at. I can create capacity for any number," Raju said.

Currently, HAL has the capacity to produce eight aircraft annually and Raju said it would go up to 24 aircraft per year by 2021. "Another way to speed up produc

tion is not by HAL investment but by encouraging the vendors, the local Indian industry to supply us with the major components," he said, adding HAL was giving contracts to L&T, WhAM and two other firms to supply the main components of the aircraft such as the front fuselage, centre fu-selage, rear fuselage and wings.

"So this process will make us the integrator," he said.

Asked about questions being

raised on the endurance, weaponisation and other key parameters of Tejas, Raju suggested that any comparison between Tejas and Gripen (Sweden) or F-16 (US) was unfair as Tejas was manufactured following a defined role and specific requirements of the IAF.

Abusing SC/ST person over phone in public place an offence: SC

New Delhi, Nov 19 (PTI): The Supreme Court has ruled that using castiest remarks over phone in a public place against the Sched-uled Caste and Scheduled Tribe category amount to criminal offence warranting a jail of a maximum five years.

The apex court refused to stay the criminal proceedings and quash an FIR lodged against a person, who allegedly used expletive and derogatory casteist remarks over phone to a woman belonging to the SC/ST category.

Chelameswar and S Abdul Nazeer declined to interfere with the August 17 order of the Allahabad High Court which had rejected a plea of a Uttar Pradesh seeking quashing of the FIR lodged against him by the woman. It dismissed his plea saying he

A bench of Justices J

has to prove during the trial that he had not talked to the woman over phone from a public place.

Advocate Vivek Vishnoi, appearing for the accused, said that at the time of conversation both then woman and his client were in

different cities and it could not be stated that it was in public view He said that section 3(1)(s) of

SC/ST Act relates to a person, who abuses any member of a SC or ST by caste name in any place "within public view".

"In this case, both persons were in different cities and the conversation took over phone which can't be said to be in a public view. This was a private conversation. The apex court had already settled what 'public view' means in its earlier verdict of 2008," he said.

Vishnoi said the issue involved

in the petition was that whether a private conversation on mobile phone between two individuals can come within the ambit of expression "within public view".

He said that by no stretch of

imagination, a private conversation between two indviduals on mobile phone can come within the ambit of expression "within public view" and that the charges framed against the petitioner need to be quashed.

The lawyer further said that the complainant has made some vague allegations regarding land sale transactions but no specific aver-

ments were made which may prima-facie show that offence of cheating and intimidation were made out.

The bench, however, refused to agree with the contenton and said it was only in trial that accused could prove if he was talking on phone in public view or not.

The high court had on August 17 dismissed his plea for quashing of FIR and stay of criminal pro-ceedings against him saying it was not advisable to adjudge whether the case shall ultimately end in conviction or not.

"Only a prima facie satisfaction

of the court about the existence of sufficient ground to proceed in the matter is required," the high court had said while relying on various apex court verdicts. The high court had also said

that it cannot be persuaded to have a pre-trial before the actual trial begins and the perusal of FIR and material collected by the police on the basis of which the charge sheet was filed "makes out a prima facie case against the accused at this stage and there appear to be sufficient ground" for proceeding against him.

Chances of confirmation of wait list tickets during holidays now high: study

New Delhi, Nov 19 (PTI):
Have a wait listed ticket for your next trip during holidays? Not to worry, you might just be able to make it on a confirmed

A study by a popular travel portal has said that while the cancellation of wait list tickets was as high as 25.5 per cent during the Diwali of 2015 because of non-confirmation, the number has been stable at 18 per cent in 2016 and 2017.

This in effect means that more wait listed passengers have been able to travel with confirmed tickets than before.

A study by RailYatri, an

online travel community that has 10 million monthly active users, said that for the Dehradun- Howrah Doon Express the confirmation rate increased by over 20 per cent during the period, for Mumbai CST-How-rah Superfast Mail (Via Gaya) increased by 11 per cent, Pune-Jammu Tawi Jhelum Express by over 12 per cent and Bangalore-Danapur Sanghamitra Superfast Express by more

than five per cent.

Even the the average waiting list has gone down con-siderably from last year. For example, the wait list of the Kota-Patna Express has come down to 735 from 813, while of Ahmedabad-Haridwar Yoga Express has decreased from 731 to 717.

Similarly, the waiting list of the Mumbai-Darbhanga Pawan Express has come down from 800 to 769.

"Every year during Diwa-li, there is a huge demand for train tickets and many end up with wait listed tickets and uncertain travel plans. However, this year it is heartening to see that fewer people had to cancel their tickets. It is definitely a good trend," said Manish Rathi, Co-founder and CEO RailYatri.

Both, officials of the rail ministry as well as Rathi, cred-it the trend to addition of new trains and extra coaches which have helped accommodate the

"The Diwali rush this year was nicely managed by adding special trains at the right time and on the right route," said Rathi

During 2015-2017, rail-ways has introduced 152 new trains, and special trains have made as many as 64,840 trips during the holiday season.

This means that the number of seats available for passengers has also increased.

Ayana bags maiden half marathon gold, Legese wins men's race

NEW DELHI, NOV 19 (PTI): Ethiopia's current woman world athlete of the year Almaz Ayana clinched gold while compatriot Berhanu Legese won the men's event in the Delhi Half Marathon on Sunday as thousands of Delhiites turned up despite

concerns of air pollution.

Ayana, who set the 10,000m world record while winning the gold in Rio Olympics, transferred her stunning form on track to road race as she clocked one hour, seven minutes and 11 seconds to emerge champion in her maiden half marathon race.

Ethiopians ran away with all three top positions as Ayana's compatriots Ababel Yeshaneh and Netsanet Gudeta were second and third in the elite women's race, clocking 1:07:19 and 1:07:24 respectively to cover the 21.097km distance.

Defending Worknesh Degefa was fifth in 1:08:09.

In the men's elite race, 2015 winner Legese bagged the gold in 59 minutes and 46 seconds while another Ethiopian Anadamlak Belihu was second in 59:51. Leonard Korir of United States was third in 59:52. Reiging world marathon champion Geoffrey Kirui of Kenya finished sixth in 1:00.04.

Ayana and Legese, how-ever, could not break the course records of 1:06:54 and 59:06 respectively, which still stand in the names of Mary Keitany (2009) of Kenya and Guye Adola (2014) of



Both Ayana and Legese pocketed identical as winners' prize money.

Ayana, who will turn 26 on Tuesday, was running in her debut half marathon though it was the second road race of her career (after 10km race in Angola in

"I was a bit nervous and confused, not knowing what to do, whether to follow other runners and to take the lead. The course was very good but the chilly weather created some problem," she said after the race.

"Also, when the paceset-ter dropped out, I was a bit confused and could not find

(she can't speak English) created problems. I could have run a faster time,

Basically a track runner, Ayana, who also won a 10,000m gold in the London World Championships in August, said he may consider coming back to Delhi in future

races and I would prefer to run on tracks. But I think I will come back here," she added.

"It is not easy to run road

For Legese, the course in Delhi was not new for him as he had won two years back

also.
"I knew the course as I was here in 2015, and so it helps. Initially, I thought of running ahead of the pack after 15km but I did that after the 20km mark," he said, adding that he will come back next year.

In fact, all the top three Indian men finishers -- and even fourth -- bettered the earlier course record of 1:04.00.

The men's and women's winners among the Indians pocketed an identical Rs 3 lakh each while the second and third place finishers will be richer by Rs 2.5 lakh and

Rs 1.75 lakh each.
Besides that, the three men's podium finishers shared Rs 2 lakh among men's themselves for bettering the course record.

Suriya, the sister of Lakshmanan, got an addi-tional Rs 2 lakh for bettering the course record.

Meanwhile, tens of thousands of runners braved the chilly weather -- around 15 degree Celcius when the men's elite race started at 6:40am -- and turned out on Delhi roads despite the health warnings just a few days ago.

Besides participating in the elite category, runners also took part in four categories of Great Delhi Run. Timed 10K Run, Senior Citizens Run and Champions with Disability Run.

The pollution level in the city though has got better after the early morning rain on Saturday.

Before the race, the or-

ganisers have claimed that around 35,000 runners will take part in it. Around 30,000 had taken part in the race in 2015, while 34,000 took part last year, according to race organisers, Procam International.

Harry Styles has been officially confirmed to perform at the 2017 Victoria's Secret Fashion Show, after main act Katy Perry's visa was denied. Ed Razek, executive pro-

ducer of the annual event and the lingerie company's chief creative officer, said in a statement on Saturday that the male singer signed on months ago.

"Also appearing Grammy award-winning artist Miguel, Tony award-winning star of Hamilton Leslie Odom Jr., and Chinese sensation Jane Zhang," he said. "We are incredibly thrilled to have them with us."

In early October, rumors

swirled that both Styles and ex Taylor Swift would per-form at the Victoria's Secret show after Swift fans circulated what many believed to be a press release from the Shanghai Culture, Radio, Film and Television Administra-



tion Bureau that stated that the singers had been issued administrative licenses to perform four songs in Shanghai on November 20-the

date of the event.

A couple of weeks ago, Perry was rumored to be a performer after a letter that she appeared to have sent requesting permission to perform in China was posted by the Chinese press and also circulated on Twitter.

Perry was initially informed that she'd be able to was initially in-

gain access but that the decision was reversed after the Chinese government found out about her wearing a sunflower dress and a Taiwanese flag at a 2015 concert in Taipei, which China had per-ceived as a show of support for Taiwanese anti-China protesters. Perry and Victoria's Secret have not commented.

Several models who were set to take part in the Victoria's Secret Fashion Show were also denied entry to China. Gigi Hadid was supposed to return to the runway and announced earlier this week she wouldn't be able to make it to the country. She did not provide a reason Her statement comes months after a video of her squinting purposely was criticized on Chinese social networks and spurred accusations of racism. Gigi apologized on China's site Weibo, saying, "I have learned to be very careful of how my actions can come off or be portrayed, and I'm hopeful you'll accept my apology."

Her sister Bella Hadid was granted a visa and will be walking the Victoria's Se-cret Fashion Show runway for the second time.

She and several other models who did make it to China for the event, including Victoria's Secret Angels Alessandra Ambrosio and Candice Swanepoel, posted pics upon their arrival.
