New Delhi, Dec 11 (PTI): Rahul Gandhi has been elected unopposed as Congress president, party's central election authority head Mullappally Ramachandran an-

nounced here on Monday Rahul Gandhi will collect the certificate formally declaring his ascension to the post on December 16, he told re-

The 47-year-old scion of the Nehru-Gandhi family was the lone can-didate in the fray Rahul Gandhi suc-

ceeds his mother Sonia Gandhi, who remained in

The CEA received a total of 89 nomination papers proposing Rahul Gandhi's name for the top post. All the nomination papers were found to be valid, Ramachandran said

"Since the with-drawal of date/time is over and as there is only one candidate (Ra-hul), as per Article XVII (d) of the Constitution of Indian National Congress, I hereby de-clare Shri Rahul Gandhi elected as president of the Indian National Congress," Ramachan-

dran said.
Rahul Gandhi became the vice-president of the party in January 2013.

Speaking at the press conference, the Minister conference, the Minister mentioned that AR Rahman has already given his consent to be the brand ambassador of Sikkim and that the official announcement will be made in his presence on the inaugural day of the carnival on 08 January here at Paljor Stadium.

He added that the association with AR Rahman will help the further promotion of Sikkim among national and internation-



al tourists. He informed that AR Rahman will also be conducting a grand concert in the forthcom ing months which will feature songs on Sikkim.

Driving licences not to be accepted as address proof for govt benefits anymore

he Home Depart-The Home Department has directed all HODs, DCs, SDMs, BDOs, Public Dealing Offices and Panchayats to not consider driving licence as address proof for availing any Government benefits.

In a circular issued by Chief Secretary, AK Shrivastava on 01 Dec, it is stated that the Motor Vehicles Division, Transport Department issues driving licences through Sarathi Software developed by the National Informatics Centre. In this software it is required to enter data like present and permanent address but only the present address is printed on the licence. Hence, the address reflected in the driving licence is the present address and there is possibility that the licence holder may be from outside Sikkim.

"It is learnt that driving licences issued by the Motor Vehicles Division is being used as address proof fro availing various types of Government benefits which are otherwise meant for those individuals possessing SSC/CoI/RC.
This practice will deprive the genuine indi-viduals possessing SSC/ CoI/RC which may lead to far reaching ramifications in future," the circular reads.

Pope enquires about victims of Ockhi cyclone

THIRUVANANTHAPUR-AM, DEC 11 (PTI): Pope Francis has enquired about the hardships and sufferings caused to Ker-ala's fishermen community in the Ockhi cyclone that ravaged the coastal belt on November 30, the Archbishop of the Lat-in Catholic Church said here today.

Archbishop Soosai Pakiyam said he received a phone call last Saturday from the Vatican stating that the Pope wanted to know the details of the cyclone that hit the state's coast and a brief to broadcast it through the Vatican radio.

"They also recorded a five minute long message through telephone," the Archbishop said at a march of fishermen, organised by the Latin Catholic Church here.

It was under these It was under the circumstances, Pope Francis on Sunday remembered and prayed for the victims of the cyclone, he said.

During his speech the Archbishop said it was a grave negligence on the part of authorities, whoever they may be, not to take seriously information passed by



impending cyclone and proper warning "I strongly condemn

this apathy towards the fishermen community," the Archbishop said.

"Knowingly or un-knowingly lapse had occurred. Loss of life and damage could have been less if timely action had been taken," he added.

The Archbishop wanted the state government to review the relief package announced by it, taking the views of the Church also.

The Centre and state governments should come out with a long-term comprehensive de-velopment scheme coastal people, he

CBSE notifies marking scheme for class 10, 12 examinations

New Delhi, Dec 11 (PTI): The Central Board of Secondary Education (CBSE) today notified the marking scheme for class 10 and 12 examinations scheduled in March.

The board had announced that once again the examination will be mandatory for class 10 students and will be re-introduced in 2018 academic session.

"The students can check the marking scheme on the website. The schedule of the examination will be noti-fied soon," a senior official said.

The subjects for which the marking scheme has been notified for class 10 are tified for class 10 are Mathematics, Science, Social Science, English (Communications) and English (Language and

Literature).

For class 12, the marking scheme has been notified for subjects including Accountancy, Biology, Business Studies, Chemistry, Economics, English, Hindi, Mathematics and Physics.

Over 18,000 schools across the country are affiliated to the CBSE. As many as 10,98,891 can-didates 6,38,865 boys and 4,60,026 girls from 10,678 schools regis-tered for the CBSE Class 12 examinations this

There was a 2.82 per cent increase in registration for the 2017 edition of the examinations, as compared to the previous year. Around 10,67,900 students - 6,21,259 boys and 4,46,641 girls - had taken it then.



How Did We Come to This?

The normalization of hate is disgusting

Muslim labourer is lynched, his brutal murder Afilmed and shared on social media because some saffron-tinted dementia is convinced that "love jihad" is somehow a bad thing. While this mad person in proud Rajasthan beats a person to death and then sets him on fire, he gets his nephew, still a minor, to shoot the brutality. A section of the media ignores the story altogether, preferring to focus instead on a comment made by a has-been Congressman on the currently all-powerful Sanghi. They probably took their cue from the Pradhan Mantri himself as he somehow managed to ignore the murder in Rajasthan to remind the people about the possible interpretations of the comment thrown at him by the Congressman. We have arrived at a sad place when hate crimes, if not inspired by then at least emboldened by the normalization of hate and distrust by the dispensation in power in the Centre, occur and play out without either shocking us enough or receiving spontaneous and unanimous condemnation from all sides. But that is not happening any time soon because every time the alt-Right feels cornered, it pulls out the boogeyman. So, the PM warns people of Pakistani designs on Gujarat by suggesting that the "padosi mulk" wants a certain Muslim Gujarati as the next CM. The suggestion is offensive in its communalism. He also invokes the Mughals while referring to the Opposition: a tasteless reference during days when the country should have been collectively mourning the 25th anniversary of the pulling down of Babri Masjid in Ayodhya. Or maybe the reference was intentionally timed this way by a party which found it fastest-selling hate in place of worship named after the first Mughal. We are increasingly allowing ourselves to become a country of easy hate and quick fearfulness; a country which does not even cringe any more when pointless deaths in the hands of the hateful few are somehow sought to be justified by false leaders.

If we had been better, then at least this week we would not have seen so much malevolence. 06 December, after all marked the 25th anniversary of that shameful winter day of 1992 in Ayodhya when an unresolved issue, older than Independent India, snow balled into the tragic demolition of Babri Masjid and pulled the entire nation into a vortex of communal violence. In the communal riots which came in its wake, at least 2,000 lives, mostly Muslims, were lost. The downward spiral continues and throws up no victors, leaving behind only victims. The episode, irrespective of what it achieved for political ambitions, left the nation scarred. It's now two and a half decades since a 1.5 lakh strong mob stormed the mosque and pulled it down. The first title suit over the disputed land [a 47 acre tract] was filed in the Allahabad High Court way back in 1950. Several other suits and petitions fol-lowed and it was only in September 2010, sixty years later, that a verdict was delivered. Closure, even if it is only legal and not emotional, however continues to evade this issue and the verdict has since been stayed by the Supreme Court. The lesson is clear - matters of faith, even when packaged in dry legalese as a title suit, are best left out of the courts. These should be left for the believers to resolve, but that again is easier said than done because when it comes to matters of faith and belief, politics monopolises the divisions and does not allow resolutions. The Babri Masjid was constructed in 1528 CE; the first officially recorded communal riots over it were in the 1850's, when, after seven years of such violence, the British fenced the area to divide the places of worship of the two faiths in question. The issue conflagrated again in 1949, when idols of Ram, Sita and Laxman were smuggled into the Babri Masjid and placed there. With the horrors of the Partition violence still fresh in everyone's minds, the Government sealed off the area. Since then, the issue has surfaced often and confrontation peaked in 1992 when the Babri Masjid structure was demolished by a mob. The destruction was a huge blow to our country's secular credentials and an oft-quoted incident used to fan passions and communal hatred by both sides. This is not an issue likely to be resolved any time soon and the latest political wind in the BJP sails appears to be to revisit different aspects inspired by the jingoistic nationalism that worked so well in 1992.

The lead up to the Babri Masiid normalized hate speech in public discourse. 25 years since, hate crimes have also become routine and commonplace. If we do not draw the line and make a stand, fear what we shall be talking about in another 25..

China's growing footprint on the globe threatens to trample the natural world

Many observers of China's escalating global program of foreign investment and infrastructure development are crossing their fingers and hoping for the best. In an ideal world, China's unbridled ambitions will improve economic growth, food security and social development in many poor nations, as

well as enriching itself.

Such hopes are certainly timely, given the isolationism of the US Trump administra-tion, which has created an international leadership vacu-

um that China is eager to fill.

But a close look reveals that China's international agenda is far more exploitative than many realise, especially for the global environment. And the Chinese leadership's claims to be embracing "green development" are in many cases more propaganda than fact.

In an ideal world, China's unbridled ambitions will improve economic growth, food security and social development in many poor nations, as well as enriching itself.

for infrastructure expansion that will irreparably degrade much of the natural world.

China's One Belt One Road initiative alone will carve massive arrays of new roads, railroads, ports, and extractive industries such as mining logging, and oil and gas projects into at least 70 nations across Asia, Europe, and Africa.

Chinese President Xi Jinping promises that the Belt and Road initiative will be "green, low-carbon, circular and sustainable", but such a claim is profoundly divorced from reality.

As my colleagues and I recently argued in Science and Current Biology, the modern infrastructure tsunami that is largely being driven by China will open a Pandora's box of environmental crises, including large-scale deforestation, habitat fragmentation, wildlife poaching, water pollution and greenhouse gas emissions.

China's pursuit of natural resources also escalating across Latin America. In the Amazon, for example, big mining projects - many of which are feeding Chinese industries – don't just cau serious local degradation, but also promote widespread deforestation from the networks of roads bulldozed into remote areas to access the mines.

Overall, China is the most aggressive consumer of minerals on the planet, and the biggest driver of trop-

ical deforestation.

Beyond this, China is pushing to build a 5,000km railroad across South America, to make it cheaper for China to import timber, minerals, soy and other natural resources from ports along South America's Pacific coast. If it proceeds, the number of critical ecosystems that would be im-

pacted by this project is staggering.

A World Bank study of more than 3,000 overseas projects funded or operated by China revealed how it often treats poor nations as "pollution havens transferring its own environmental degradation to developing nations that are desperate for foreign investment.

Finally, much has been made of the fact that China is beginning to temper its appetite for domestic fossil-fuelled energy. It is now a leading investor in solar and wind energy, and recently delayed construction of more than 150 coal-fired electricity plants in China.

These are unquestionably pluses,

but they need to be seen in their broad context. In terms of greenhouse-gas emissions, China has exploded past every other nation. It now produces

more than twice the carbon emissions of the United States second-biggest polluter following the greatest build ing spree of coal, nuclear, and large-scale hydro projects in human history.

Despite its new post-Trump role as the world's de facto climate leader. China's overall agenda could scarcely be described as green. ICEBERG AHEAD

Some would say it's unfair to criticise China like this. They would argue that China is merely following a well-trod-den path of exploitative development previously forged by

ner nations and colonial powers.
But China is not the same as any other nation. The astounding growth and size of its economy, its dangerand size of its economy, its danger-ously single-minded vision for exploiting natural resources and land internationally, its intolerance of internal and external criticism, and its increasingly closed media and official myopia all combine to make it unique.

President Xi admits that many Chinese corporations, investors and lenders operating overseas have often acted aggressively and even illegally. But he says his government is power-less to do much about it. The most notable government response to date is a series of "green papers" containing guidelines that sound good in theory but are almost universally ignored by Chinese interests overseas.

Are Xi's assertions of powerless

ness believable? He increasingly rules China with an iron hand. Is it really impossible for China to guide and control its overseas industries, or are they simply so profitable that the government doesn't want to?

Of course, China's huge international ambitions will have some pos-itive effects, and could even be economically transformative for certain nations. But many other elements will benefit China while profoundly damaging our planet.

Why aren't Hollywood films more diverse? The international box office might be to blame

theconversation.com In 2014, a hacker group leaked confidential information from Sony Pictures Entertainment, including a controversial mail written by an unnamed producer

In the email, which went viral, the producer questioned the decision to cast Denzel Washington as the lead in "The

"I believe that the international motion-picture audience is racist – in general, pictures with an African-American lead don't play well overseas... But Sony some times seems to disregard that a picture must work well internationally to both maximize returns and reduce risk, espe cially pictures with decent-size budgets."

Many actors, activists and newspapers have

raised concerns related to diversity in Hollywood films. Several organizations, including blackfilm. com and the Geena Davis Institute, now actively monitor and promote diversity in media.

But was the Sony producer onto something in raising concerns about the biases of moviegoers abroad? Is it possible that the lack of nonwhite and female lead characters in Hollywood films is driven, in part, by economic concerns from movie studios? Our analysis of more than 800 films sampled between 2005 and 2012 suggests the answer

WHO'S IN THE MOVIES

Research suggests that films suffer from demo graphic disparities.

In one study, researchers at the USC Annenberg School for Communication and Journalism nalyzed the demographic characteristics of over 11,000 speaking characters in hundreds of films and television series released in 2014. Approximately 75 percent of all actors involved were white. Meanwhile, 12 percent were black, 6 percent Asian, 5 percent Hispanic/Latino and 3 percent were identified as Middle Eastern or "other."

We looked at the top-grossing films each year from 2005 to 2012, using information from Box Office Mojo, IMDB, The New York Times movie reviews and Rotten Tomatoes. Our data include the 150 top films each year that were distributed domestically and abroad, excluding G-rated and ani-



Awards on diversity, saying 'The only thing that sepa rates women of color from anyone else is opportunity.

Just 28 percent of movies in our sample had a female first lead character. Only 19 percent had a onwhite first lead character.

These figures are in stark contrast to the demo

graphics of the U.S. population. According to the U.S. Census Bureau, approximately 51 percent of the U.S. is female and 35 percent is nonwhite or Hispanic.

CONSUMER TASTES

Recently, film studios have faced more intense competition from independent filmmakers, increased globalization and streaming video sources. In this environment, film studios may be inclined to supply movies with characteristics that appeal to more

consumers and increase profits.

Since international box office revenue is now more than twice as large as domestic revenue, the economic incentive for studios to cater to the preferences of international audiences is larger than ever. The top five international box office markets are China, Japan, the U.K., France and India.

Does consumer discrimination in these mar

kets explain the underrepresentation of female and nonwhite actors in Hollywood films?

We analyzed the potential gender and racial biases from the consumer side through their influence on box office revenue, both domestically and internationally. We looked at the relationship between cast demographics and theater audiences, controlling for other factors that may affect a mov-ie's success, such as production budgets, release timing, genre, critic ratings and star power

There's significant evidence that a film cast's racial diversity negatively affects international box office performance. By our estimates, a 10 percentage point increase in racial cast diversity leads to 17 percent less international revenue, even after controlling for key film characteristics. This effect disappears in the domestic market.

Similarly, adding just one nonwhite lead actor led to a 40 percent decrease in inter-

national revenue.

However, we did not find any link between gender diversity and movie reve-nue. Productions with a female lead char-acter fared as well economically outside the U.S. as those with a male lead.

INTERNATIONAL AUDIENCES

The results provide convincing evidence that studio executives have legitimate concerns about the

relationship between diversity and revenue.

The negative effects of nonwhite characters on profits could explain the racial disparity observed in Hollywood films. In that case, it could be argued that consumer prejudice leads to roles that favor white actors more, because the increased revenue

is attractive to studio executives.

Most movies make a lot more foreign reve nue than domestic revenue, but movies with diverse casts can struggle abroad, even if they are incredibly successful domestically. For example, 2012's "Think Like a Man" made US\$91.5 million in the domestic market but just \$4.5 million in the international market. "The Help," a 2011 Academy Award-winning period drama, made \$169.7 million in the domestic market compared to \$46.9 million in the international

This doesn't mean that preferences of studio executives are not at all responsible for the demo graphic disparity, but it does suggest that market forces are at least partly responsible.

Consumer tastes are a likely factor driving studios' preference of nonwhite underrepresentation in movies. The revenue implications of international audience preferences are simply too large for studios to ignore.

Coaches for disabled placed at end of trains not justified: HC

New Delhi, Dec 11 (PTI): The Delhi High Court today pulled up the Railways for placing coaches for the disabled at both ends of the train. saying there could be no justification for such a move but for "commercial interests".

The court was also annoyed with the Railways for not implementing the recommenda-tions of a committee ap-pointed by it to provide equal opportunity to ersons with disabilities to travel by trains.

A bench of Acting

Chief Justice Gita Mittal and Justice C Hari Shankar said the matter was adjourned last time for implementation of the report but nothing has been done.

There can be no justification other than commercial interest of railways for placing one coach each at the begin-ning and end of a train for disabled persons," it

"Unfortunately no timeline is placed and the counsel for railways is unable to tell when the

recommendations will be implemented. The Committee has made import-ant recommendations for giving equal oppor-tunity to persons with disabilities to travel by railways. The response is

unacceptable," it said.

The observations came on a PIL initiated by the bench itself on the issue of a visually-impaired man missing his M.Phil entrance exam as he could not board a reserved compartment of a train since it was locked from inside.

The court had appointed former General Manager of Indian Railways Sarabjit Arjan Singh an amicus curiae (friend of the court) to assist it as he had written an article giving suggestions to make railways a disabled-friendly network.

The court granted the last opportunity to the railways to place a time-line for implementation of the recommendations and also asked it to form a helpline for disabled

"It was due to such behaviour by the rail-

blind student who was unable to board the train happened," the bench said and added that the assessment of placement of coaches for disabled was required to be done.

The court said in ost of the stations, these two coaches will be at the end of the platform which completely lack accessibility.

It sought the pres-ence of an officer of the rank of executive director of railways before it on December 21.

The bench had earlier said that despite con-stitutional guarantee of equality before law, the harsh reality was that disabled persons do not any substantive equality.

US, S Korea, Japan start missiletracking drill

The trilateral drill comes less than two weeks after Pyongyang test-fired a new inter continental ballistic missile (ICBM) and declared it had achieved nuclear statehood, escalating statehood, escalating global alarm over its

weapons push.

The two-day exercise the sixth since June last year -- kicked off in waters near the Korean peninsula and Japan, ul's defence ministry

"During the drill. Aegis warships from each country will simulate detecting and tracking down potential ballistic missiles from the North

and sharing information," it said in a statement.

Two US ships are taking part, with one each from the two Asian

countries.

Both South Korea and Japan have rity alliances with the US, although their own relationship is marred by disputes over history and territory.

Seoul staged their biggest-ever joint air drill last week in a show of force against Pyongyang, which is subject to multi-ple sets of UN sanctions over its ballistic missile and nuclear weapons programmes.

Tension flared anew in the flashpoint pen-insula after the No-vember 29 launch of the Hwasong-15 ICBM, which the North claimed could deliver a "su-per-large heavy war-head" anywhere on the

US mainland.

Many analysts suggest that the rocket is capable of reaching the US mainland but voiced scepticism that Pyongyang has mastered the advanced technology needed to allow the rock et to survive re-entry to the Earth's atmosphere.

Last month's launch was the first test of any kind since September 15, and quashed hopes that the North may have held back in order to open the door to a negotiated solution to the nuclear standoff.

The North's leader Kim Jong-Un has traded threats of war and personal insults with US President Donald Trump, heightening fears of another war on the penin-sula once devastated by the 1950-53 Korean War.

In its case against Dar, the NAB has alleged that the accused has acquired assets and pecuniary interests/resources in his own name and/or in the name of his dependants of an approximate amount of Rs 831.678 million.

Dar is in London since October and has been seeking treatment of an undefined heart complication at a Harley Street hospital.

The former minister's counsel submitted Dar's new medical reports in the court and pleaded not to declare his client a proclaimed absconder.

NAB special prosecutor Imran Shafique opposed the plea saying that the reports presented before the court differ from each other.

Judge Mohammad Bashir, who had reserved the order last week, refused to accept Dar's new report and declared him as an absconder".

The court then adjourned the hearing till December 14.

Dar was relieved of his duties last month after he requested leave for

dian border troops' tres-pass into China's Dong Lang (Dokalam) area in our national interest, on just grounds and with restraint," Wang was quot-ed as saying by the Foreign Ministry which posted an English version of his speech on its website. Through diplomatic

means, we engaged with the Indian side and it withdrew its equipment nd personnel," Wang said

for the first-time outlining China's approach to ties with India following the Dokalam standoff as well as Beijing's policy in the second tenure of President Xi Jinping. "This demonstrates

not only the value and emphasis we put on relations with India but also our sincerity and sense of responsibility in maintaining regional peace and stability," he said.

Putin, who was welcomed by Syrian President Bashar al- Assad

said the troops had helped the Syrian army crush the "most battle-ready group of international terrorists," ap-parently referring to the Islamic State group.

"Our homeland thanks you, my friends," Putin said. "Have a safe trip. I thank you for your service. Putin and Assad were

pictured smiling and shaking hands.

Putin made the stopover at the base in Lat-akia province, a regime stronghold, on his way to Egypt where he arrived later today. Putin said last month

that efforts to end the war were entering a "new stage" as the focus shifted from military intervetion to political reform.

More than 340,000 people have been killed since the conflict broke out in March 2011 with protests against Assad' rule that sparked a brutal


