structures encroaching public spaces submitted to HC

List of 20 religious

GANGTOK, 28 APR:

After a Public Inter-flest Litigation was filed seeking removal of religious structures enrengious structures en-croaching public places, as many as 20 religious structures have been identified in East and South districts of Sikkim, in the first phase.

The Amicus Curiae, on High Court directions, has submitted a list of 20 religious structures situ-ated in public places.

Acting on the report of the Amicus Curiae, the division bench of the High Court of Sikkim headed by Chief Justice Satish Kumar Agnihotri and Justice Meenakshi Madan Rai directed the District Collector, East, to initiate action after issuance of notices to the concerned persons manning these institutions or places and submit a re-port as to whether these structures are unauthorised encroachments on public places or streets

within three weeks.

The list includes two monasteries, one in East district and one in South, while the rest are mandirs of which Hanuman mandirs number

the highest.

The bench has also directed the Amicus Curiae to inspect the remain-ing places in East and South as well as West and North districts within a period of four weeks and submit a report.

It may be men-tioned that, the bench had pulled up the state government for their lackadaisical approach in failing to respond to court directions in a time bound manner and imposed costs of Rs 25.000 recoverable from the of-ficers who have failed to take any initiative on the court's order.

The state government

informed the bench on 25 April, earlier this week that the fine imposed was recovered from the officers responsible for the failure to act.

SC Collegium to meet soon to reconsider Justice Joseph's name for elevation

New Delhi, Apr 28 (PTI): Chief Justice of In-dia Dipak Misra is understood to have decided to urgently convene a meeting of the Collegium to reconsider the name of the Uttarakhand High Court Chief Justice K M Joseph for elevation as a judge of the Supreme Court.

The government had on Friday returned the file to the Collegium which had recommended on January 10 Justice Joseph's name for his elevation as an apex court judge.

A Supreme Court offi-cial said it is but natural to hold the meeting of the Collegium and it will be convened as soon as pos-

However, the only question that remains is the availability of all the five judges of the Collegium as Justice Madan B Lokur, who is the mem-ber of the Collegium, was away from work on April

26 and 27 due to medical reasons.

quorum complete, the Collegium meeting will be convened immediately, the official

Justice Joseph had headed the bench that had quashed the Narendra Modi government's decision to impose Presi-dent's rule in 2016 when the Congress was in power in the hill state.

The government re-turned the Collegium's recommendation to elevate Justice Joseph seeking its reconsideration, saying the proposal was not in accordance with the top court's parameters and there was ade quate representation of Kerala in the higher judiciary from where he hails.

Justice Joseph, who will turn 60 this June, has been the Chief Justice of the Uttarakhand High Court since July 2014
He was appointed as a permanent judge of the Kerala High Court on Oc-tober 14, 2004 and had assumed charge of the Uttarakhand High Court on

July 31, 2014.

His name was recommended by the Collegium comprising Chief Justice Misra and justices J Chelameswar, Ranjan Gogoi, Madan B Lokur and

Kurian Joseph.

The Art of Distraction

Don't laugh, get scared... very scared

Then an elected leader, who has gone on to get se lected Chief Minister by his fellow MLAs, in his very first public address of consequence, claims that there were internet-like "things" in the times of the Mahabharata, it is easy to scoff at the pool that democracy offers to pick representatives from. It staggers some more when his Governor too echoes the belief and extends gubernatorial support to the claim. And before the ICT textbooks can be rewritten to include this information about a tool of communication not more than six decades old, he delivers another revelation! Now, he is questioning the evaluation by which beauty pageants select winners and serving "Indians" their most significant query: who represents the quintessential Indian form of beauty better Aishwarya Rai or Diana Hayden? There is a lot that is problematic with "beauty contests," but come on, even beauty pageants make a token claim for brains. But for the Chief Minister of Tripura, beauty is only skin-deep, and more dangerously, the Indian look has to manifest in a Hindu lady to be good enough to represent India on the global stage. His fixation with mythology as science is clearly limited to Hindu epics, or maybe that is the extent of his learning, because just about every epic from anywhere in the world has characters which communicate long distance, fly, even bend time, receive limb replacement surgeries, build grand edifices... and the list goes on, but the point being made is the same – the Right has dangerous blinkers on, and because they command democratic endorsement now, will be serving more horrors than jokes. Just laugh and mock them, and a nightmare will soon become very real.

The Tripura CM was condemned for his latest bout of pettiness, but there are more memes and social media jokes about his than warnings. And with this response of mock and giggles, we are performing exactly as the AltRight playbook wants everyone to. When such comments surfaced initially, one could laugh at the obvious juvenility of saffron-flaunting leaders. But these comments are no longer rare, and this throws up two immediate worries - one, that such puerility, because it also has electoral endorsement will get force fed into the already distressed education system of the country and brainwash an entire generation, and two, that these are intentional distractions in which a stand-up comic subverts the public discourse while the more dangerous muscle demolishes everything that the Right does not agree with. We have already seen the ease with which the American Comic-in-Chief ties up commentators with his tweets and phone-ins while policy changes are effected to upend governmental decencies. It will not surprise if media attention in Tripura is focused so much on the idiocy being announced from public speeches that the violent eviction of political competitors receives no attention. A similar subterfuge was seen in the education sector as well when saffron-clad leaders and junior ministers made outrageous claims at around the same time that institutions were being cut at their knees and/ or being infected from the top. The Right tested the waters when they appointed jokes to outlying institutions like the FTTI and the Censor Board. They refined the power of distracting with "nationalistic lies" when JNU was attacked and now they are upping the game, infiltrating mainstream institutions and daily lives.

It is important to stop seeing the loony claims of leaders of the Right as confirmation of their foolishness. There is a much more Machiavellian plan afoot
– one that seeks to lull us with shock and comedy so that we do notice the horror that is actually being put into effect.

Rap Music's Path from Pariah to Pulitzer

endrick Lamar's Pulitzer Prize win is a maio Remarks bands 1 and 1 an its 45th birthday this August.

It's also a triumph that many, a mere decade ago, would have never predicted. As someone who teaches and studies the politics of hip-hop and rap, I was pleasantly surprised myself.

I thought of hip-hop's early years, when some

were adamant that the genre – disparaged as "por-nographic filth" – would be a flash in the pan. It was no fad, however; its music soon gained

more and more mainstream acceptance. In response, many people – from parents, to politicians to community leaders – would criticize the art form

and seek to suppress it. The story of hip-hop is one of rebellion, at-tempts at censorship and, finally, artistic accep-

RAP MEETS SUCCESS THEN RESISTANCE

Hip-hop traces its roots to the Bronx in the early 1970s. At first, rap music – with its focus on rhymed storytelling – didn't play a big role. Instead, there are at least four traditional elements of hip-hop culture: DJing, graffiti art, breakdancing and emceeing.

Today, however, rap is the most prominent feature of hip-hop culture. The central tenet of its style – rhyming over beats – can be traced back to the political poets of the Black Arts Movement, with lyricists like Gil Scott Heron using their voices as a form of resistance in the early 1970s.

Rap wouldn't receive commercial success until the Sugarhill Gang's "Rapper's Delight" (1979). Later, Kurtis Blow's "The Breaks"

(1980) also reached the the Billboard Hot 100, peaking at No. 87 and No. 4 on the Hot Hip Hop/ R&B Chart, and this was followed by the first polit ical rap song – 1982's "The Message" by Grandmas-ter Flash and the Furious Five.

While rap music often explored important issues like the trauma of poverty and addiction, the lyrics also depicted violence and veered into misogyny. As rap's popularity grew, so did criticism

– both inside and outside of the black community.

In 1993, Rev. Calvin Butts of Harlem's Abyssinian Baptist Church organized a protest against rap music in which attendees steamrolled rap albums.

We will not stand for vile, ugly, low, abusive and rough music," he said.

Meanwhile, African-American political activist

C. Delores Tucker became one of the genre's most utspoken critics.

"What do you think Dr. King would have to say

about rappers calling black women bitches and whores?" she wondered in 1996. "About rappers glorifying thugs and drug dealers and rapists? What kind of role models are those for young children living in the ghetto?"

In other instances, the courts tried to intervene. A Florida U.S. District Court ruled that Luther Campbell and 2 Live Crew's 1989 album "As Nasty as They Wanna Be" was legally obscene, and a number of Florida record stores were banned from selling it. Members of 2 Live Crew group were later arrested for performing songs from the album in Broward County, along with store owners who continued to sell it. The 11th Circuit Court of Ap-

peals eventually overturned the ruling on the basis of freedom of speech.

A big focus of critics were anti-police lyrics, which started to appear most prominently in the late 1980s. Many described the police harassment, racial profiling and police brutality that plagued in-

ner-city neighborhoods across the country.

However, the lyrics of the group N.W.A. attracted the most attention - specifically, their song "Fuck tha Police," which directly denounced the po-lice in unequivocal terms.

Police unions denounced the song's lyrics: some departments refused to provide security during N.W.A. shows, while the FBI sent a letter to the group's label, Priority Records, calling the lyrics "discouraging and degrading to these brave, dedicated officers."

'AN INVISIBLE TV STATION' FOR BLACK PEOPLE

the most popular genre on the Billboard Hot 100.

Nonetheless, perhaps because of its reputation,

traditional venues were hesitant to embrace rap.

The Grammys have a contentious and inconsistent history with rap. The first hip-hop-themed

award was "best rap performance," presented to the rap duo DJ Jazzy Jeff and the Fresh Prince in 1989 for their song "Parents Just Don't Under-stand." However, the Grammys didn't air this award

In 1993, rap group Arrested Development was awarded the best new artist. Two years later, the Grammys recognized female hip-hop artists for the first time, with Queen Latifah and Salt-N-Pepa each winning an award. But only two rap albums have won the coveted album of the year: Lauryn Hill's "The Miseducation of Lauryn Hill," which was catgorized as a R&B album, and Southern rap duo utkast's "Speakerboxx/Love Below."

RAP GETS AN ALLY - IN THE WHITE HOUSE

Today, many of the same dynamics are at play. Police brutality is still a common theme of rap music, Kendrick Lamar's work included.

"Nigga, and we hate po-po," he raps in "Alright." "Wanna kill us dead in the street fo sho."

The criticism hasn't abated, either, On a June 29, 2015 segment of Fox News, host Geraldo Rivera criticized "Alright," arguing that "Hip-hop has done

more damage to young African Americans than racism in recent

Lamar responded by saving that "Hip-hop is not the problem."

Despite a drumbeat of criticism, hip-hop has been increasingly recognized by other mainstream award shows. Rapper Eminem and the rap group Three 6 Mafia have won Oscars. Hip-hop artists are also being voted into Rock and Roll Hall of Fame, with Tupac the most recent rapper to join the ranks. In 2017, the Kennedy Center Honors recognized rapper and actor LL Cool J, the first time they've honored a hip-hop artist.

President Barack Obama played a big role in the genre's acceptance. Even before he officially announced his candidacy for the

presidency, Obama held closed meetings with raj artists such as Ludacris to discuss youth empow

During his campaigns and two terms, rap art-ists always had his ear – he'd continue to meet with them, mention them in speeches, and even host rappers at the White House. Following Obama's election, views across the

aisle started to shift as well. In 2009, former Republican National Chairman Michael Steele tried to woo rap artists to the Republican Party. Oprah Winfrey – who had previously denounced rap music – gave her first ever in-depth interview of a rapper when she invited Jay-Z to a show that aired on Sept. 24, 2009.

Back in the 19th and 20th centuries, there were attempts to censor slave narratives; because they detailed the harsh realities of slavery in the South, critics questioned their authenticity and accuracy. Eventually, more and more recognized the value of these narratives, and the federal government dispatched writers to record the stories of surviving slaves in the 1930s.

Over the past few decades, we've seen a similar dynamic with rap music. While some have attempted to silence rap because of its raw portrayal of life in inner-city communities, people increasingly see its value. Like slave narratives, rap music has given an authentic and candid voice to the voiceless.

For his part in this tradition, Kendrick Lamar's Pulitzer Prize is well-deserved.

Why that cigarette, chocolate bar, or new handbag feels so good: how pleasure affects our brain

Every day we make a range of choices in the pursuit of pleasure: we do things that make us feel good or work in a specific job because it's rewarding or pays well. These experiences help shape our perspec-

tives on life and define our personality.

Consequently, problems with our ability to manage or maintain our pursuit of pleasure often lie at the root of many neu-ropsychiatric disorders such as addiction

WHAT'S GOING ON IN THE BRAIN WHEN WE EXPERIENCE PLEASURE?

Pleasure itself – that good feeling you get in response to food, sex and drugs – is driv-en by the release of a range of neurotransmitters (chemical messengers) in many parts of the brain. But dopamine release in the brain's reward system is particularly important. Dopamine release tells the brain when to expect something rewarding, modulates how rewarding it will be and drives us to seek rewarding things.

Dopamine is also important for a range of other functions such as voluntary movement and cognition. Disorders such as schizophrenia have too much dopamine release, which causes psychotic symptoms. In neurodegenerative disorders such as Parkinson's disease, the dopamine cells responsible for motor coordination

All drugs of abuse, no matter their primary mode of action, release dopamine in this system. Other rewarding experiences – sex, food, and gambling – are also associated with increases in dopamine release. Conversely, decreases in dopamine within reward systems are associated with depression, a lack of pleasure or motivation, and withdrawal.

We all experience pleasure differently as a result of individual differences in biology or neurochemistry, but also as a result of past experiences (no longer liking a food that previously made you sick), and differing social and cultural factors.
For example, musical preferences seem

to be shaped more by upbringing than by biological factors. So while some may get a greater hit of dopamine from buying a new handbag, others may get it from placing a bet on a sports match.

DECISIONS, DECISIONS, DECISIONS...

When we make decisions, some are habit-

ual and less reliant on pleasure, and some are more goal-directed. Most of us would probably love to eat ice cream for lunch every day because it tastes good, and sugar releases dopamine in reward systems But we know if we ate ice cream every



day we would put on weight, become less healthy and feel worse because of it. This knowledge takes some of the pleasure out of it and makes us less likely to want ice cream all of the time.

The cognitive processes behind goal-directed behaviour involve determining the value of the potential outcomes and forming a strategy that maximises our ability to achieve the most valuable outcome. And if we make the same decision enough times and the outcomes stay the same, our decisions become less goal-directed and more habitual in nature

But certain choices do not always lead to a positive outcome. In these cases, over time

we learn which outcome provides the best overall reward. We then guide our decisions towards this outcome, even if occasionally it does not result in a positive outcome

Gambling is a good example of how this process can become problematic. Poker machines provide a positive outcome just often enough to keep you playing, even though they are programmed so that you lose money in the long run.

WHEN DECISION-MAKING

GOES WRONG

Having issues at any point in the decision-making process can lead to pathological behaviour. Addiction is categorised by a single-minded focus on obtaining the next exposure or "hit" (be it drugs, a pokies win, sex). So much so the individual makes bad decisions in order to attain this particular outcome, even if they no longer find it that pleasurable.

We still know little of how addictive behaviours start and persist, but genetic and environmental factors can put some-one at a greater risk. For example, finding a certain drug more pleasurable (due to differing drug metabolism or an increased dopamine response) places a greater value on its use, which can lead to continued con

sumption. This may become addictive if the behaviour becomes more habitual and less

sensitive to bad outcomes and experiences. Dopamine release is essential for the rewarding response we feel toward a particular outcome and inflating the

ranting" of that experience. Because this drives continued use, dopamine release in reward systems is important for the development of addictive behaviours.

However, by placing a much greater level of value on the outcome (so it appears the best option in nearly any comparison), and accelerating habit formation (so the negative consequences of this decision are ignored), the brain warps its own decision-making capabilities. At this point, attaining the outcome in question becomes less about dopamine release and more of a subconscious drive. Therefore, statements like "just stop using drugs or doing x" are of little use.

This is why multiple approaches are required to treat addictive behaviours.

There is a quest to develop medications that adjust the neurochemical balance to weaken these habitual behaviours. Inevitably, these will require other interventions such as cognitive behavioural therapy and social support networks to help re-train the brain and improve decision-making capabilities.

Bar Association lifts ceasework in Calcutta HC

KOLKATA, APR 28 (PTI): The Bar Association of the Calcutta High Court lifted month-long ceasework following the Centre's notification to appoint four more judges and a permanent chief justice, an official said.

The lawyers will resume work in the high court from Monday, Bar Association President Uttam Majumder said at a press conference here.

The ceasework at the high court, which had 2.22 lakh cases pending before it at the end of January, had commenced on February 19 to press for the appointment of more judges and a chief justice for the high court which had been headed by acting chief justices for over three years with the exception of only three months.

The Bar Association, which commands the support of majority of the lawyers, said the decision to lift the cease-work was taken unani-mously in consultation with other striking lawyers' bodies.

Today we got the notification from the Centre about the appointment of four new judges who will take over from next week. The high court will also have a permanent chief justice from next week. In the wake of these developments, we are lifting the ceasework," Majumder said.

He said three judges had been appointed by the Centre in March and with four new appointments today, the high court now has 37 judges which is a little over 50 per cent of the sanctioned strength of 72 judges.

To a question about the Bar Association's earlier decision at a general body meeting that the ceasework will continue till May 11, Majumder said, "We had asserted that the ceasework will automatically stand withdrawn if the appointment of new judges is notified in the meantime."

"We are also lifting the ceasework in the interest of general public," he added.

The previous longest strike had lasted for two months in 2002 in protest against the hike in stamp duty by the West Bengal government. It was observed across all courts in the state including the Calcutta High Court.

Students enrolling in humanities courses increased in past 3 yrs: UGC data

cording to UGC data.

"The University
Grants Commission (UGC) has stated that the total number of students en-rolled in universities and colleges in the discipline of arts, humanities, social science including lan-guages, oriental learning and area studies has increased in the last three years, a senior HRD ministry official said.

According to the data, 1.22 crore students enrolled in humanities courses across the country in 2014-15 academic session, and the number rose to 1.25 crore and 1.26 crore in 2015-16 and

2016-17 respectively.

"There is a popular perception that those who take science courses are more studious and academically sound and there has been a stigma attached to humanities courses in the society. The perception has changed now. More and more stu dents are opting for hu-manities courses and having successful careers,' the official said.

Day 3: AIIMS resident doctors continue strike

NEW DELHI, APR 28 (PTI): Healthcare services at AIIMS in Delhi remained affected for the third consecutive day today as resident doctors remained adamant that the administration suspend a senior doctor who had allegedly slapped one of their coles in front of patients and other staffers.

Routine surgeries re-mained cancelled, out-patient clinics functioned in a restricted manner and patients seeking OPD con sultation were sent back due to the strike.

Only the emergency and ICU services func-tioned. The senior doctor, who heads a department at the premier institute, has tendered a written apology for assaulting the resident doctor and proceeded on leave on the directions of an internal probe panel.

The resident doctors, who have been on the protest strike since Thursday evening, paid no heed to AIIMS Director Randeep Guleria's ap-peal to call off their strike and return to work.

The senior doctor has been sent on leave. We want the administration to suspend him. Till he is suspended we will continue our strike," a doctor partic-ipating in the strike said.

The hospital administration has put in place a contingency plan for patient-care services, as a part of which faculty-on-call in all clinical departments have to physically man the in-patient wards.

"OPD services will function on restricted basis till such a time that Only follow-up patients with prior appointment will be registered in OPD. New Patients OPD registration will be done as per availability of faculty in respective OPD as de cided by Head of Depart-ment/Unit concerned. No walk-in registration (new and old) will be done," an order issued by the ad-ministration stated.

Indian Commonwealth official wins unfair dismissal case in UK

LONDON, APR 28 (PTI):
An Indian official who
worked at the Commonwealth Secretariat in London has won an em-ployment tribunal claim that he was unlawfully forced out of his job and is entitled to thousands of pounds in damages.

Ram Venuprasad had brought the case against Commonwealth Secre-tary-General Patricia Scotland for unfairly dis-ciplining him over leaks of information to the media, which he denied responsibility for.

The 45-year-old's lawyers had argued that the former deputy head of office at the Secretar-iat had been "marked out" by Scotland after he raised concerns over her decision to spend 50,000 pounds on a garden party shortly after she had taken office in 2016.

The specially-con-vened employment trispecially-conbunal concluded that Venuprasad was unlawfully forced out of his job and the disciplinary processes used against the former senior civil servant were "seriously flawed", The

Times reported.

The ruling from the tribunal, held at the Secretariat headquarters in Marlborough House in London, came soon af-ter the Commonwealth Heads of Government Meeting (CHOGM) con-cluded on April 20.

"Despite receiving the judgment last week. I did not want to speak publicly until the conclusion of the Commonwealth Heads of Government Meeting in London," Venuprasad told the newspaper.

The Indian citizen who has lived in Brit-ain for 20 years hopes to find work at another international organisa-tion but had been told by head-hunters that the case would hinder his chances.

Venuprasad's legal team told the tribunal that when media reports highlighted Scotland's alleged "extravagant and over-zealous spending", the civil servant was blamed for the leak and suffered a campaign of "intimidation and hostility", which he said was "designed to damage his reputation and damage him psychologically". The civil servant, who

joined the Secretariat in 2001, said the tipping came when Scotland, 62, organised a ma-jor meeting for staff and caused a stir by telling the meeting that no one outside of the organisation had ever heard of her predecessor, Kamalesh Sharma, the former Indian high commissioner to the IIK

"That really did not go down well," Venuprasad recalls, claiming that Scotland a former UK Attorney-Gen-eral appeared to suggest that she was a big name who was going to raise the profile of the Secretariat.

"I spoke to her di-

rectly and frankly about comments. I told her that I thought her criticisms were very unfair as (Sharma) was not there to defend himself. I saw it as a question of common courtesy. And she did not like that," he claims.

The employment tri-bunal concluded that Venuprasad's suspension was a "breach of the secretariat's obligations" under its employment contract.

Modi, Xi to issue 'strategic guidance' to militaries to build trust

WUHAN, APR 28 (PTI):

Prime Minister Narendra Modi and Chinese President Xi Jinping have decided to issue "strategic guidance" to their militaries to strengthen com-munications and to build trust and un-derstanding, the top Indian diplomat said today, a move aimed at avoiding

a Dokalam-like situation in the future. Modi said his talks with President Xi focussed on diverse areas of India-China cooperation. "We discussed ways to give impetus to our economic ties as well as people-to-people relations." tions. Other areas we spoke about include agriculture, technology, energy urism," he said.

Briefing reporters at the end of the two-day informal summit between the two leaders in the central Chinese city today, Foreign Secretary Vijay Gokhale said the two leaders underscored the importance of maintaining peace and tranquility in all areas of the India-China border region.

"To this end, they issued strategic guidance to their respective militaries to strengthen communication in order to build trust and mutual understanding and enhance predictability and effectiveness in the management of border affairs," Gokhale said.

He said the two leaders further directed their militaries to earnestly implement various confidence building measures agreed upon between the two sides, including the principle of mu-

tual and equal security, and strengthen existing institutional arrangements and information sharing mechanisms to prevent incidents in border regions.

They also endorsed the work of the special representatives to find a fair, reasonable and mutually acceptable settlement on the boundary issue.

The two countries have so far held 20 rounds of talks to resolve the boundary dispute and worked out different mechanisms to keep peace along the 3,488-km long Line of Actual Control. His remarks assumes significance as the 'heart-to-heart' summit between Modi and Xi is being seen as an effort by India and China to rebuild trust and improve ties that were hit by the 73-day-long Doklam standoff last year.

"The two leaders were of the view that the two countries have the maturity and wisdom to handle all our differences through peaceful discussions within the context of the overall relationships and bearing in mind, we would respect each other's sensitivities, concerns and aspirations," Gokhale said. Modi and Xi underlined that as two

major countries India and China have wider and overlapping regional and global interests. They agreed on the need to strengthen strategic communication through greater consultation on all matters of common interest. "They believe that such strategic communication will have a positive influence on enhancing mutual understanding and will contribute to regional and global stability," Gokhale said. The two leaders recognised the common threat posed by terrorism and committed to cooperate further on counter-terrorism, he said.

When asked whether the issue of Jaish-e-Mohammad chief Masood Azhar was raised, he said the two leaders "did not go into specifics". China has repeatedly blocked India's bid to designate Azhar as a global terror-ist by the UN.

dia and China are major powers, with strategic and decisional autonomy and they will pursue peaceful, stable and balanced relations and such a relationship will be a positive factor for stability amidst the current global uncertainties, he said, amidst increasing protectionist moves by countries like the US.

"The developments were re-viewed from the strategic and longterm perspective. They agreed to significantly enhance efforts to build on the convergences through the estab-lished mechanisms in order to create the broadest possible platform for the future relationship," Gokhale said.

The two leaders underlined that

trade should be balanced, it should be sustainable, and that the two sides should take advantage of the comple mentarities between the two economies

Modi also mentioned the importance of balancing the trade, and the scope of the possibilities of agricul-tural exports and pharmaceutical ex-

The two sides also discussed climate change, sustainable develop-ment and food security.

Xi shared his experience in terms of the preservation of the Yangtze - China's longest river - and Modi shared his own experience on the question of the cleaning of the Ganga -

idia's longest river.

They also discussed how to promote sports between the two countries and how to strengthen tourism on the Buddhist circuit.

"They reiterated the importance of

building an open, multi-polar, pluralist and participatory global economic or-der which will enable all countries to pursue their development and contribute to the elimination of poverty and inequality in all regions of the world. They spoke of their respective efforts to contribute to the regional and global

economic development," Gokhale said.

Monsoon threatens thousands of Rohingya refugees: UN

UNITED NATIONS, APR 28 (PTI): The UN has said that lives of tens of thou-sands of Rohingya refugees hang in the balance as monsoon and cyclone sea-sons threaten their make-shift camps in Bangladesh.

According to the UN estimates, nearly 700,000 minority Rohingya Mus-lims have fled to Bangladesh to escape violence in Myanmar's Rakhine State since August 25 last year when the army launched a military crackdown.

Myanmar does not recognise Rohingya as an ethnic group and insists that they are Bangladeshi

migrants living illegally in

the country.
The United Nations migration agency -- the Inter-national Organisation for Migration (IOM) -- appealed for urgent financial support to prepare the area in south-ern Bangladesh against floods and landslides.

Without new fund-ing, tens of thousands of people in the camps, fleeing violence triggered in Myanmar last August, will be at risk, the IOM said.

"We cannot wait for funding to come in after the emergency is over and possibly preventable trag-edies have occurred," said John McCue. IOM's Senior

Operations Coordinator in Cox's Bazar. "We need to be able to act now if lives

are to be saved," he said.

Almost a million Rohingya refugees live in Cox's Bazar under tar-paulins, on steep, sandy slopes 25,000 of whom are said to be at the highest risk of landslides.

Without aid, numer-ous refugees will have to remain in these hazardous locations and hundreds of thousands of others will also be at risk if roads become impassible, blocking access to aid supplies and

medical services.
"Tarp stocks are also rapidly running out and

the IOM, which oversees shelter distribution, re-ports that by mid-May supplies will fall below critical levels," McCue said. He said that without

more funding, neither new shelters nor replace-ments would be available to those who lost homes

during storms.

He also pointed out that other risks included safe water supply systems, which if collapsed could put hundreds of thousands of refugees in jeopardy of waterborne diseases.

Only nine per cent of a USD 951 million joint agency response plan has been secured. Of that, USD 182

million allocated to provide Cox's Bazar with assistance through December 2018 is facing a shortfall of almost USD 151 million.
Aid staff on the ground

are working to improve shelters, secure key access roads and have emergency response services ready should the worst happens "but the harsh truth is that we cannot keep doing that if we do not have the funds," McCue said.

The IOM, the World Food Programme and the UN refugee agency are working alongside the working alongside the Bangladesh government and others to manage the scale of the response

Boyzone to SPLIT after 25 years... but will pay tribute to late member **Stephen Gately in final album**

hey burst onto the music They burst once and scene in 1993, making waves with their catchy songs and over-enthusiastic danc-ing. But after 25 years, Boyzone have reportedly decided to call it a day

The Irish boyband are said to be planning to pull out all the stops for their final album, which will be a poignant tribute to their late bandmate Stephen Gately who passed away in 2009

According to The Sun, the band made the decision to part ways after a series of meetings where they discussed the future of Boyzone.

The newspaper reports Ronan Keating, Keith Duffy, Mikey Graham and Shane Lynch, will release their final album to coincide with their 25th anniversary and embark on a goodbye tour before throwing in the towel for good.

The Love Me for a Reason hitmakers previously said they enlisted the help of Ed Sheeran and Sam Smith to write their tracks for their album, which will be released in September.

The rumours of their split

comes nine years after Stephen died from natural causes aged just 33, leaving fans around the world devastated.

Shane previously spoke about his heartache, during



his stint on Celebrity Big

Brother earlier this year.
He said: "He was 33 when he died. When that happened, we were in the middle of making a new album. And at that point we were like, 'What do we do? Do we call it a day? Is there no more Boyzone? Is that it?' But every time we got to-gether as a group, the four of us came together, it was very apparent that he was alive. when we came together. Because that was our bubble. He's so there. So we'll always be five. regardless of visually what you see. He will always be there."

Born in Dublin, Gately ioined Boyzone in 1993 after answering an advert to audition for Ireland's first boyband. The group achieved international fame as well as six UK

including Words, No No.1s -Matter What, All That Matters To Me and You Needed Me. The band officially split in

2000, but have frequently got back together for landmark tours - including the Back Again...No Matter What tour in 2009 - which was the last time

they'd perform as a five-piece.

The band also reunited in 2013 to celebrate their 20th anniversary with a tour and new releases. Shane previously talk-ed about the upcoming tour

this year on ITV's Lorraine in May 2017.

He said: "We can't let it go. I love the boys, I love being with them. I love my musical side of the world and we just have to work everything out."

I lost my virginity through rape: Amy Schumer

Actor and stand-up comic Amy Schum-er has revealed that she was raped by a former boyfriend, someone she "really

trusted", when she was young.

The 36-year-old actor opened up about the experience to media mogul Oprah Winfrey and said her comic skits often reflected her life story where she would say if a woman is asleep, one can-not asssume to have the consent to en-gage in a sexual act with her.

"When we hear about rape when we're children, and we're being warned about it, it's about a guy popping out from a bush... and some villain. They don't say it's probably gonna be a guy you know really well. It could be your husband. It could be your friend. And so you think, when that happens you, you say, 'OK, this isn't someone I want to see rotting in a ail cell, but what he did to me was wrong, and I didn't consent.

"And for me. I lost my virginity while I was asleep. And that's not OK. So, in my



stand-up I would say, 'If she's asleep, that's a no.' Just hoping that a couple guys would see that and it would be met in that moment, like, 'This is a no. I heard that some where" Schumer said, according to Jezebel.

The "I Feel Pretty" actor said when she confronted her then boyfriend about her sexual assault, "The first thing he said was, 'I thought you knew.' I didn't say anything yet, and he says, 'I thought you knew.'"

To this Winfrey said, "What's interestng about that is that you then were feeli ad for how he would feel the next day."

The actor said she loved him and it was her training as a woman that she did want to "get angry" as it pushed peo-

ple away.
"There's sort of no place for that anbecause he felt so bad and he was so wor-ried. And I just tried to push my anger down," she added.

Schumer said she and her boyfriend ventually started having consens but pointed out that it does not negate the initial assault.

When Winfrey asked her how she would sum up the incident in retrospect, the actor paused and replied, "I personally feel like I lost my virginity through rape. I didn't consent. We hadn't discussed it. We weren't there in our relationship. We weren't at that moment. And we talked about things.

Seconds later, another woman approaches the table with a sign reading, "Fur Scum." The women are seen chanting, "Gigi Hadid. Shame on you!" as their signs are wrestled away from them and they're ush-ered off the premises by security. The video shows Hadid briefly looking up at the women's signs when they begin chanting before looking toward the crowd and back down at the table until the

nmotion is over.

The video then cuts to moments later when Hadid is escorted away from the stage to compose herself. According to fans who were there, Hadid returns minutes later to continue her signing. However, almost immediately after her return, the model was approached by protesters again, leading security to cancel the event.
