Incessant rain wreaks havoc in North, roads blocked in several areas

SCHOOLS IN THE DISTRICT TO REMAIN CLOSED TODAY

MANGAN, 13 SEPT:
Incessant rain for the last three days has caused havoc in North Sikkim especially in Dzongu and Lachen-Mangan constituency. Traffic at several spots has been disrupted and several landslides have been triggered.

Owing to the road and weather condition, schools in North Sikkim will also remain closed on Friday. Mangan received 150 mm

Mangan received 150 mm rainfall on 12 Sept while today the precipitation was recorded at 170 mm.

Meanwhile, the DC-North has called an emergency meeting for 10 AM on Friday to take stock of the situation and refine preparedness plans. All HoDs in the district have been directed to attend the meeting.

Roads to North Sikkim were blocked at Ambithang

near Mangan while traffic to Chungthang was blocked at Raphong Khola near Mangan where the RCC bridge has been damaged.

been damaged.

Official sources inform that the situation of the houses near Raphong Khola is very grim as the landslips in the areas have become active. The residents of the houses which are in danger have been directed to shift to safer location.

Likewise, traffic was also blocked at Mayong Chu near Naga and Wang Khola near Toong where the newly constructed Bailey Bridge was washed away few days ago. Traffic was also blocked at Reil Khola near Toong.

Similarly, landslides have been reported from several areas of Dzongu and Upper Dzongu was cut off after a conductor electricity post along with the retaining wall collapsed above Police Check Post Sangakalang.

Owing to multiple landslides on the way to Mangzing-Kashel Kotong Ward, villagers have been totally cut off. After the wall collapsed, the CC footpath of Sonam

WB govt declares half holiday for Vishwakarma puia

KOLKATA, SEP 13 (PTI): The West Bengal government Thursday declared half-day holiday on Monday on the occasion of the Vishwakarma puja that day, an order issued by the finance department said.

All state government offices, urban and rural bodies, corporations, undertakings and educational institutions and other institutions under the control of the state government, shall be closed at 2pm on Monday, the order said.

However, the offices of the registrar of assurances, the collector of stamp revenue and the state beverages corporation Ltd would not come under the purview of the order.

Viswakarma puja is generally held on September 17 every year.

GANGTOK, 13 SEPT [IPR]: Govt-e-Marketplace [GeM] National Mission was launched in the State today in the presence of Chief Secretary, AK Shrivastava, at Chintan Bhawan in Gangtok.

The CS, in his address, said that GeM is a National Public Procurement Portal which provides the facility of an online Marketplace for Central and State Government Ministries and Departments, Central & State Public Sector Undertakings, Autonomous Institutions and local bodies for procurement of commonly used goods & services. The main objective of the National Mission



of GeM is to expedite its adoption and use by Central Government Ministries, State Govt departments and their agencies. He stated that the main aim for adoption

main aim for adoption of GeM is for an efficient, transparent system which aims to cut down on the time and expenditure involved in procurement of goods and services. It is a major transformational initiative to change the mechanism of procurement from lengthy documentary procedures as is hitherto being practiced in government to quick online transactions, he added.

ened that GeM will provide an opportunity for various categories of small entrepreneurs, enterprises and service providers [such as MSEs, Start-ups, domestic manufacturing, women entrepreneurs, Self Help Groups] to come on board the GeM platform with their products and enter the level playing field shoulder to shoulder with the bigger entrepreneurs

SUMMIT REPORT KALIMPONG, 13 SEPT:

A pproximately 20 metres of road formation on NH 10 was washed away by River Teesta at 29th Mile today around 11 a.m. Incessant rainfall in Sikkim had raised the water level of River Teesta last night which was flowing above danger levels along Melli and Teesta Bridge.

and Teesta Bridge. Cracks had earlier developed in the area and this morning, one side of the road sank following which PWD workers had surrounded the area. At around 11 a.m, the surrounded area sank into the river damaging 80% of the road. Vehicles were seen plying on the narrow patch of road left.

In the meantime, one loaded truck that was trying to pass through the area got stuck owing to the closure of the highway.

Later, two JCBs and earth cutter machine were deployed to cut the wall side. Assistant Engineer, PWD, Uttam Pradhan, said about 80% of the road has been damaged.

"We are working with the wall side and hoping to get traffic back to normal in few areas. Many vehicles and tourists with trains or lights to catch were stranded. Many vehicles took the Lopchu route to Siliguri," said Mr Pradhan.

Cikkim Democratic Sikkim Democratic Front has strong-ly criticised and con-demned the "irresponsible, politically motivated and frustrated" state-ment of Sikkim Krantikari Morcha. The ruling party has also extended its full support to the decisions taken by the State's administration. An SDF press release

issued by its publicity secretary, Krishna Kharel has alleged that SKM is a party without any vision or administrative knowledge and is crossing all

limits just to get votes.

The party has stated that the decision to provide arrears to the gov-ernment employees from 2016 in instalments is an administrative decision The decision was taken in the interest of govern-

ment employees, it adds.
SDF goes on to mention that budget from the Centre to the State has not been sufficient to match the rate of development in the State and various infrastructures in the State are being built from the revenue collected by the State and non-plan budget of the Centre.

On the question of SKM spokesperson, Jacob Khaling, about the revenue collected by different departments, the SDF has asked him to file an RTI on the matter since he is adept at doing so.
The party has further

called it "amusing" that the "politically motivat-ed" Mr Khaling is point-ing fingers at the eco-nomic policies of the SDF government.

On loans taken by the state government, the release mentions that the government has taken it to construct houses for

the poor people.

Mr Khaling should
study the Fiscal Responsibility and Budget Management Act before talking on this issues, the party has said. May-be SKM does not want houses to be built for the poor and is anti-poor, the release further alleges.



Battle the Bottle

Booze is a problem that the society ignores at its own peril

 \mathbf{T}^{he} festive season is upon us; a march of weeks and months which will be as much about piety as they will be about excesses, making it perhaps the right time to speak about alcoholism. And no, cops at play with breathalyzers, stopping vehicles and invit-ing drivers to blow into the equipment is not the solution. It penalizes and keeps the roads and passengers safer, yes, but it does not address the core problem. One could argue about the many levels at which such random stopping [without any apparent reason] for random checks is wrong [inconvenient in the least], but that line of argument will not find many backers in light of the fact that Gangtok roads are dangerous after dark with too many inebriated hands behind the wheels. While checking by cops might lead to some challans and avert some accidents, what remains unaddressed is the root problem – alcoholism, a condition which does not surface only on weekends or only

at night and is a 24x7 worry for too many families.

The problem of alcoholism is not talked about enough probably because it is substance abuse and HIV/ AIDS which receive funding, leading unfortunately to a situation where this condition is not as widely discussed as the scale of the problem requires. Many people tend to identify alcoholism as a traditional dispensation of the Hill People. This is an ill-informed preconception since alcoholism [as a widespread problem] could not have debuted in the hills more than half a century back or six decades at the most. Alcoholism really becomes possible with the arrival of the IMFLs [India Made Foreign Liquors] since the local brews required too much work and time to be manufactured in enough quantities to feed alcoholism on a scale that cause the kind of health and social complications which are now possible and common. It is hence wrong to begin any discussion on alcoholism by suggesting that it is a traditional weakness of the Hill People. The communities here might have allowed 'drinking', but that cannot be construed as addictive levels of drinking. The prejudice, however, because it serves so many businesses so well, has been allowed to set in and after it was ignored in the initial years [of IMFLs and other mass distilling units arriving], spread rapidly to ingrain itself in the society.

The damage wreaked by alcoholism cannot be stressed enough and media here should carry forward its success with getting the problem of substance abuse addressed and report more effectively and widely on the abuse of alcohol which is just as impairing. But the local media, when it overlooks the problem of alcoholism in the society, ends up reflecting the social acceptance of this malaise. Sikkim's indifference towards this problem will weigh heavy on its collective conscience some day. Many excuse alcoholism with the argument that the person is earning enough to indulge himself/ herself. Substance abuse, because it usually starts at a much younger age, is more scandalous also because of the petty crimes that the addicts invariably resort to finance their addictions. While there is no denying that substance abuse is a serious concern, alcoholism, because not enough seem to be taking it seriously, is even more worrying. Even if one were to keep the emotions aside, the impact alcoholism has on the economy should attract corrective action. Most people turn alcoholic in what should be the most productive years of their lives, both professionally as well as part of a family. When their faculties are compromised, as alcoholism is wont to do, their work suffers as do their families. Indifference towards this problem puts too much at risk because like with all social problems, alcoholism does not affect only the individual but has the entire family suffering. While the younger 'addict' makes the elders of the family suffer guilt pangs, an alcoholic, because in most cases they are working members of the family, end up abusing the family [because they have more 'power' but less control]. This is a social problem and requires the community to step forward and engage proactively in its battle against the bottle. Sadly, in Sikkim, even the war-cry has not been sounded yet

Climate change will increase deaths by suicide

Extreme heat has gripped the northern hemisphere in recent months, and the year 2018 is on track to be among the hottest ever recorded. Higher global temperatures are expected to have detrimental effects on our natural environments and our physical health, but what will they do to our mental health?

New research from an international team of scientists suggests that one of the most tangible impacts may be an increase in suicide rates.

Suicide is already among the leading causes of death worldwide. For people aged 15-55 years, it is among the top five causes of death. Worldwide nearly one million people die by suicide each year — more than all deaths from war and murder combined. Using historical temperature records from the

United States and Mexico, the researchers showed that suicide rates increased by 0.7 per cent in the U.S. and by 2.1 per cent in Mexico when the average

monthly temperatures rose by 1 C.

The researchers calculated that if global temperatures continue to rise at these rates, between now and 2050 there could be 9.000 to 40.000 additional suicides in the U.S. and Mexico alone. This is roughly equivalent to the number of additional suicides that follow an economic reces

SPIKES DURING HEAT WAVES

It has been known for a long time that suicide rates spike during heat waves. Hotter weather has been linked with higher rates of hospital admissions for self-harm, suicide and violent suicides, as well as increases in population-level psychological distress, particularly in combination with high humidity.

Another recent study, which combined the results of previous research on heat and suicide, concluded there is "a significant and positive association be tween temperature rises and incidence of suicide

Why this is remains unclear. There is a well-documented link between rising temperatures and interpersonal violence and suicide could be underod as an act of violence directed at oneself. Lisa Page, a researcher in psychology at King's College London, notes:

"While speculative, perhaps the most promis-

ing mechanism to link suicide with high temperatures is a psychological one. High temperatures have been found to lead individuals to behave in a more disinhibited, aggressive and violent manner, which might in turn result in an increased propensity for suicidal acts."

Hotter temperatures are taxing on the body. They cause an increase in the stress hormone cortisol, reduce sleep quality and disrupt people's physical activity routines. These changes can reduce well-being and increase psychological distress.

DISEASE, WATER SHORTAG-

ES. CONFLICT AND WAR

The effects of hotter temperatures on suicides are symptomatic of a much broader and more expansive problem: the impact of climate change on

Climate change will increase the frequency and severity of heat waves, droughts, storms, floods and wildfires. It will extend the range of infectious diseases such as Zika virus, malaria and Lyme disease. It will contribute to food and water shortages and fuel forced migration, conflict and war.

These events can have devastating effects on ople's health, homes and livelihoods and directly impact psychological health and well-being.

But effects are not limited to people who suffer direct losses — for example, it has been estimated that up to half of Hurricane Katrina survivors developed post-traumatic stress disorder even when they had suffered no direct physical losses.

The feelings of loss that follow catastrophic

events, including a sense of loss of safety, can erode community well-being and further mental health resilience.

BUILDING RESILIENCE THROUGH COMMUNITY

Vigorous greenhouse gas reduction strategies will reduce the chance of dangerous runaway climate change and help mitigate the worst effects of climate change on mental health, but these efforts may not be sufficient.

Installing more air conditioning units, for instance, may not significantly reduce suicide rates or mitigate the effects of extreme heat on health and well-being. Adaptation, including substantial investment in mental health services, will be essential.

Unfortunately

health services remain woefully underfunded and over-burdened in most parts of the world. While government budgets are stretched to cope with front-line disaster relief, communities will bear the burden of responding to these challenges.

Building resilience through increased social connectedness within and between communities

RESEARCH IS A MATTER OF LIFE AND DEATH

Mental health problems have diverse manifesta-tions that vary across contexts and throughout a lifetime. They are the result of long and intricate causal pathways. Climate change is not an isolated cause of suicide, but one of several factors.

Integrating these pathways into a conceptual framework — for example using systems thinking — is a crucial step toward developing public policy, practice and research that will equip us to respond to climate change.

Climate change is a daunting global public health challenge without ready solutions and we have been far too slow to take the risks seriously. We have also missed promising opportunities to use climate change as a mechanism to promote improved mental health.

There is an urgent need for research that informs our understanding of the mental health con-sequences of climate change so that we can pre-pare for the challenges ahead.

For some, it really is a matter of life or death.

Why al-Qaida is still strong 17 years after 9/11

Seventeen years ago, on Sept. 11, 2001, al-Qaida conducted the most destructive terrorist attack in history.

An unprecedented onslaught from the U.S. followed. One-third of al-Qaida's leadership was killed or captured in the following year. The group lost its safe haven in Afghanistan, including its extensive training infrastructure there. Its surviving members were on the run or in hiding. Though it took nearly 10 years, the U.S. succeeded in killing al-Qaida's founding leader, Osama bin Laden. Since 2014, al-Qaida has been overshadowed by its former ally al-Qaida in Iraq, now calling itself the Islamic State.

In other words, al-Qaida should not have survived the 17 years since

But it has, Why?

THE TIES THAT BIND Much of the credit goes to al-Qaida's

extraordinary ability to form alliances and sustain them over time and under pressure.
In my book "Why Terrorist Groups

Form International Alliances," I examine why a small number of groups,

such as al-Qaida and IS, emerge as desirable partners and succeed at developing alliance networks.

Understanding terrorist alliances is critical because terrorist organiza-tions with allies are more lethal, survive longer and are more apt to seek weap-ons of mass destruction. Though terrorist partnerships face numerous hur-dles and severing al-Qaida's alliances has been a U.S. objective for over a decade, the fact is that these counterterrorism

It was allies that enabled al-Qaida survive the immediate aftermath of 9/11. The Afghan Taliban stood by al-Qaida after the attack, refusing to surrender bin Laden and thereby precipitating the U.S. invasion of Afghanistan. Fleeing, al-Qaida was able to turn to allies in Pakistan to hide its operatives and punish the Pakistani government for capitulating to U.S. pressure to crackdown on the group.

It was alliances that helped al-Qa-ida continue to terrorize. In October 2002, for example, al-Qaida's ally in Southeast Asia, Jemaah Islamiyah brutally commemorated the first anniversary of 9/11 by bombing a bar and a nightclub in Bali, killing more than 200 people and injuring an additional 200.

And it was alliances that allowed al-Qaida to project viability. With the "prestige" that came with conducting 9/11, al-Qaida was able to forge affiliate alliances in which partners adopted its name and pledged allegiance to

Al-Qaida's first and most notorious affiliate alliance, al-Qaida in Iraq, was formed in 2004 with Jordanian jihadist Abu Musab al-Zarqawi. Using

the standing he accrued through his role in the insurgency in Iraq, Zarqa-wi then helped al-Qaida acquire its second affiliate in 2006, al-Oaida in the Islamic Maghreb. Then, in 2009, al-Qaida designated its branch in Yemen and Saudi Arabia as al-Oaida in the Arabian Peninsula. Its alliances spanned the Middle East and helped it to project power, despite the U.S. war on terrorism.

A LOWER PROFILE

While al-Qaida still sought affiliates, by 2010, it changed some aspects of the relationships.

Al-Qaida forged an alliance with al-Shabaab in Somalia, but did not initially publicly announce it or ask al-Shabaab to change its name. Bin Laden justified the shift to a less visible form of alliance as a way to prevent an increase in counterterrorism pressure or a loss of funds from the Arabian Peninsula. He privately expressed concerns that al-Qaida's name "reduces the feeling of Muslims that we belong to them, and allows the enemies to claim deceptively that they are not at war with Islam." Bin Laden's deputy, Ayman al-Zawahiri, saw the move as bin Laden capitulat-ing to members of al-Qaida who worried about "inflating the size and the growth of al-Qaida." After bin Laden's death, Zawahiri publicly announced al-Qaida's alliance with al-Shabaab, though al-Shabaab still did not adopt al-Qaida's name.

The "staying power" of Al-Qaida's allies has helped it remain a threat despite the loss of its founding leader in 2011 and the ascent of a far less capable leader. Zawahiri's rise to the helm of the group was itself the consequence of an alliance between his original Egyptian group, al-Jihad, and al-Qaida. The alliance culminated in a merger in 2001, with Zawahiri be-coming bin Laden's deputy and suc-

Zawahiri lacks bin Laden's cachet or diplomatic savvy, and his shortfalls are evident in al-Qaida's alliances. His poor handling of the strife between ji-hadist group al-Nusra in Syria and its parent organization, the Islamic State in Iraq – previously al-Qaida in Iraq and now known as the Islamic State - led to the alliance rupture between al-Qaida and its affiliate in Iraq.

Zawahiri has also struggled to manage the relationship with al-Qaida's ally in Syria, the very group that spurred the conflict between IS and

al-Oaida Al-Nusra changed its name, an effort to gain more legitimacy with-in the conflict in Syria by publicly distancing itself from al-Qaida, which left a smaller faction still allied with al-Qaida.

Al-Qaida organized a new branch, al-Qaida in the Indian subcontinent, in 2014. The branch in South Asia reflected al-Qaida's success at expanding success at expanding beyond its predominantly Arab base, particularly in Pakistan, and has allowed *turn to 05*

Most of al-Qaida's alliances have proven resilient over time. This is true despite ample reasons for its partners to abandon ties, such as the heightened counter-terrorism pressure that comes with affiliation to al-Qaida; the death of its charismatic leader; and the Islamic State's efforts to court al-Qaida allies. "I can't predict wheth-er they would discuss"

the possible change of plan to 2030, he added.

But he noted that the city, on Japan's northern island of Hokkaido, will better transport links by 2030 when the country's shinkansen bullet train will be exnded to the city.

There is also a feeling

that the 2026 Olympics may go elsewhere after

a period dominated by Asia. This year's Winter Olympics were held in South Korea, the 2022 edition is fixed for Beijing and the 2020 Sum-Games are in Tokyo.

Competing to host the Games in 2026 are Calgary in Canada, Stockholm and Graz in Austria, with Italy also putting in a multi-city bid.

Two more junior gold medals for India at shooting world c'ships

(PTI): Udhayveer Singh, all of 16, shone bright with an individual gold in the junior men's 25m pistol event after spearheading India to the team gold in the World Shooting Championships here

Thursday.
Singh shot a score of 587 (291 in precision and 296 in rapid) in the individual competition to grab the gold ahead of American Henry Lever-ett (584) and Korean Lee Jaekyoon (582).

Compatriot Vijayveer Sidhu finished fourth with a score of 581, while Rajkanwar Singh Sandhu took the 20th spot with a score of 568.

The trio's combined score of 1736 fetched the team gold for India followed by China, which totalled 1730. The bronze medal went to Team Korea, which shot a score of 1721.

In the senior com-petition, Sheeraz Sheikh was the best-placed Indian at eighth after day one of the men's skeet qualification with a score of 49.

Angad Vir Singh was 69th after shooting 47, Mairai Ahmed

(41) was further down at

The Indian comprising the trio, was 16th in the overall standings with a score of 137.

There were no med-als for India in the 25m centre fire pistol event with Gurpreet Singh managing the 10th spot with a score of 581, followed by London Olym-pics silver-medallist Vijay Kumar.

Kumar tallied 576 to end a disappointing 24th. A spot behind him was Commonwealth Games gold-medallist Anish Bhanwala, who shot the same score but had lesser inner-10s to his credit.

The team signed off fourth with a score of

India are fourth in the medals tally with nine gold, eight silver and seven bronze medals for a total of 24, making this their best performance in the Inter-national Shooting Sport Federation's showpiece.

The country has managed to clinch two Olympic quota places from the first qualifying event for Tokyo 2020 Games.

Sindhu, Prannoy lose; Srikanth sails into quarters at Japan Open

Токуо, **Sept 13 (PTI)**: Fatigue caught up with India's premier shuttler P V Sindhu as she was upstaged in straight games but Kidambi Srikanth entered quarterfinals of the USD 700,000 Japan Open here Thursday.

Sindhu was beaten by China's Gao Fangjie in the women's singles second round, her first preliminary exit in almost a year. The Indian went down fighting 18-21 19-21 in 55 minutes to the world no 14 Chinese. She had lost in the opening round at the Denmark Open last October.

Former world no.1 Srikanth, however, didn't break a sweat as he avenged his Asian Games loss to Hong Kong's Wong Wing Ki Vincent with a clinical 21-15 21-14 victory to enter the men's singles quarterfinals.

The seventh-seeded Indian, who won a silver at the Commonwealth Games, will face Korea's Lee Dong Keun next.

However, it was curtains for the other In-dian in the men's draw, HS Prannov, as he went down to giant-killer Anthony Sinisuka Ginting.

The world no.10 Indonesian defeated for-midable Japanese Kento Momota and Olympic champion Chen Long at the Asian Games.

Sindhu, who has endured a hectic BWF sea-son reaching five finals including three majors at CWG, World Champi-onship and Asian Games, seemed mentally drained as errors crept into her

US House bans eating of dogs and cats

LALIT K JHA WASHINGTON, SEP 13 (PTI): A resolution has been passed in the US House of Representatives asking countries like China, South Korea, Vietnam and India to end the slaughter of dogs and cats for human consumption, saying there is no place for such practises in a

In a non-controversial voice vote, the US house also passed a bill to ban American people from slaughtering dogs and cats for human consumption.

compassionate society.

The Dog and Cat Meat Trade Prohibition Act, 2018, imposes a fine of USD 5,000 (over Rs 3,50,000) for each violation.

In another resolution. the house has urged all countries including China. South Korea and India to end the dog and cat meat trade.

"Dogs and cats are meant for companion-ship and recreation. Tragically, more than 10 million dogs are killed for human consumption every year in China," said Congresswoman Claudia Tenney.

"There is no place in our compassionate so-ciety for these practices. This bill is a reflection of America's values, and sends a strong message to all nations that we will not stand for this inhumane and cruel treat-

ment," she said.

The act was sponsored by Republican Vern
Buchanan and Democratic Alcee Hastings, both of Florida.

"Dogs and cats pro-vide love and companionship to millions of people and should not be slaughtered and sold as food." Buchanan said.

The resolution urg es the governments of China, South Korea, Vietnam, Thailand, the Philippines, Indonesia, Cambodia, Laos, India, and all other nations to adopt and enforce laws banning the dog and cat meat trade.

Consumption of dog meat is common in some parts of the Northeast India mostly Nagaland, Mizoram and Manipur.

It also urges these countries to increase their efforts to prevent any leather or fur by-products of such trade from entering interna-tional markets and use their food safety laws to crack down on the sale of

dog and cat's meat.
The bill amends the Animal Welfare Act. It affirms the US commitment to the protection of animals and to advancing the progress of animal protection around the world, she said.

In addition, the bill prohibits people from knowingly transporting, possessing, buying, sell-ing, or donating: a dog or cat to be slaughtered for human consumption, or dog or cat parts for human consumption, setting a maximum fine of USD 5,000 for violations.

"More than half the households in America have a dog or cat as part of their family. We should send a clear message that slaughtering these be-loved animals for food is unacceptable and will be punished," Congressman Vern Buchanan said.

The animal welfare organisation, the Animal Wellness Action (AWC) also welcomed the passage of the two legislations.

"The dog meat trade claiming 30 million lives a year is the world's largest form of dog exploitation said Marty Irby, AWC executive director at Animal Wellness Action.
The dog meat trade is

widespread in South Korea, where meat traders slaughter and kill millions of dogs for the table after they are raised on thousands of "farms." In China, dog meat butchers gather up street dogs and and kill them.

Suu Kyi says handling of Rohingya could have been better

HANOI, SEP 13 (AP): In the face of global condemnation. Mvanmar's condemnation, Myanmar's leader and Nobel Peace Prize laureate Aung San Suu Kyi on Thursday said that the handling of Rohingva Muslims, 700,000 of whom have fled to Bangladesh amid a brutal military campaign, could have been better, but still defended security forces from charges of civilian

Myanmar's army is accused of mass rape, killings and setting fire to thousands of homes in the aftermath of an August 2017 attack by Rohingya militants on security outposts.

A report issued two weeks ago by a specially appointed UN human rights team recommended prosecuting senior Myanmar commanders for genocide and other crimes.

There are of course ways in which with hindsight I think the situation could have been handled better," Suu Kyi said, responding to questions during a one-on-one discussion at the World Economic Forum's regional meeting in Hanoi.

She still defended Myanmar security forces, saying that all groups in west-ern Rakhine state had to be protected.

"We have to be fair to all sides." Suu Kyi said. "The rule of law must apply to everyone. We cannot choose and pick."

Suu Kvi said the situation was complicated by the myriad ethnic minorities in the area, some of which are at risk of disappearing entirely and which include not just the Muslims and Rakhine Buddhists.

Although the violence in Rakhine state has eased, Myanmar has to deal with its aftermath, especially the repatriation of the Muslim Rohingya who fled and the underlying causes of tension that makes them targets of discrimination and repression in overwhelmingly Buddhist Myanmar. Suu Kyi said that Myanmar is pre-

pared to take those who fled back, but

their return has been complicated by the fact that two governments are involved.

Aid workers say conditions for a safe and orderly return of the refugees have not been met.

Suu Kyi also rejected criticism over the show-trial conviction last week of two Reuters news agency reporters who helped expose extrajudicial killings of 10 Rohingya men and boys.

The reporters were both sentenced to seven years' imprisonment on charges of possessing state secrets.

IIS Vice President Mike Pence is among those who have condemned the verdicts and called for the journalists'

"The case has been held in open

court," Suu Kyi said.

"If anyone feels there has been a miscarriage of justice I would like them to point it out.'

"They were not jailed because they were journalists. They were jailed be-cause ... the court has decided they have broken the Official Secrets Act," she

Suu Kyi noted that the two can appeal their sentences.

The lawyers for the journalists have said they will do whatever they can to get their clients freed.

The two men testified that they had been framed by the police. The case has drawn worldwide attention as an example of how democratic reforms


in long-isolated Myanmar have stalled under Suu Kyi's civilian government,

which took power in 2016.

Phil Robertson, deputy Asia director for Human Rights Watch, said that Suu Kyi was mistaken in saying the case was handled in accordance with the "rule of law."

"She fails to understand that real 'rule of law' means respect for evidence presented in court, actions brought based on clearly defined and propor-tionate laws, and independence of the judiciary from influence by the govern ment or security forces," he said in a

"On all these counts, the trial of the Reuters journalists failed the test.'



PARIS, SEP 13 (AFP): The migrant hero nicknamed "Spiderman" for saving a child hanging off a bal-cony by scaling a Paris apartment block with his bare hands has become a French citizen, according to a government decree.

Nimble 22-year-old moudou Gassama from Mali was granted a fast-track to French nationality and a job in the fire service after the daring rescue in May.

'This act of great bravery exemplifies the values which help unite our national community, such as courage, selflessness, altruism and taking care of the most vulnerable," said the official docu-ment published Wednesday.

Gassama, who had been in France illegally, was catapulted to global fame by the extraordinary feat captured in footage seen by millions on social media.

The video showed the former construction worker jumping from one floor to the next, hauling himself up with impressive athleticism towards the four-year-old boy dangling above.

He was congratulated in per-



son by President Emmanuel Macron two days later and also met Mali's President Ibrahim Boubacar Keita in the capital of the West African country.

Gassama arrived in France in September 2017 after travelling the perilous Mediterranean migrant route and found a job in the construction industry despite not

having the right to work.

He has received international acclaim for his bravery but activ-

ists have accused the French government of "hypocrisy", pointing to its treatment of other migrants.

In August a controversial asylum and immigration bill was signed into French law, designed to accelerate asylum procedures by cutting the maximum processing time. The new law was passed de spite opposition on the left which decried an effort to limit arrivals while the far right saw the measure as not going far enough.



Bohemian Rhapsody will be released in the UK on October 24 and in the US on November 2.


Lady Gaga's former manager Troy Carter sued by Scooter Braun after he 'tried to hide' \$10million loan

But now Troy Carter is being sued by Justin Bieber's manager Scooter Braun for failing to repay a \$10million loan, according to TMZ.

The 45-year-old music mogul instead 'tried to hide the money' he owed, according to the gossip site on Wednesday.

Carter, who managed Gaga's career from 2007-2013, was apparently loaned the money in 2016 to tide his company over during a legal dispute, to be paid back at its conclusion. The website's sources claim 'Carter was arbitrating a dispute with his ex-client, Gaga.'



Carter fired back at Braun's claims, saving he 'never borrowed money from Scooter, according to TMZ, but instead was purchasing his old management company back from Braun, who offered him a discount. Carter also claimed Scooter had essentially extorted him when he 'threatened to sue him for fraud if he didn't pay
