Portfolios allocated, Govt gets working

Golay retains Sports & Youth Affairs; List of temp employees sought from **HoDs**

SUMMIT REPORT GANGTOK, 30 MAY:

Dortfolios for the new **T** Ministers was announced today, three days after they were sworn in. While Chief Minister PS Tamang [Golay] has expectedly retained Home and Finance, what has also generated some buzz is that he has also chosen to keep Sports & Youth Affairs. Mr Tamang's stint as a Minister in previous governments, it may be mentioned here, is best remembered for his stint as the Sports & Youth Affairs Minister. One of the more durable initiatives from those years is the "Search for More Bhaichungs" initiative which consistently produced ace footballers from Sikkim.

Meanwhile, a notification issued by the Raj Bhavan announces that senior SKM leader, the MLA from Shyari and Gangtok, Kunga Nima Lepcha, will be the Minister for the departments of Human Resource Development, Law & Legislative and Parliamentary Affairs, Land Revenue and Disaster Management.

His colleague in the Cabinet, second time Sangha MLA for SKM, Sonam Lama has been allocated Rural Management and Development, Panchayati Raj and Cooperative and Ecclesiastical departments.

Senior politician, Bedu Singh Panth, elected from Temi Namphing, has been given charge of Tourism & Civil Aviation and Commerce & Industries Departments.

First-time MLA, Dr Mani Kumar Sharma elected from Khamdong-Singtam, is the new Minister for Health and Social Justice departments.

The Arithang MLA Arun Upreti has been allotted Urban Development & Housing Development, Food, Civil Supplies and Consumer Affairs departments.

MLAfrom Lachen-Mangan, Samdup Lepcha, has been given the portfolio of Road & Bridges, Cultural Affairs & Heritage departments.

Lok Nath Sharma, elected from Gyalshing-Barnyak, has been allocated Food Security and Agriculture Development & Horticulture Development & Cash Crops Development, Live Stock, Fisheries and Veterinary Services and Information and Public Relations and Printing departments.

Mingma Norbu Sherpa, elected from Daramdin, is the new Minister for Energy & Power and Labour departments.

Kabi-Tingda Karma Loday Bhutia, holds charge as the new Forest, Environment & Wild Life Management, Mines, Minerals & Geology and Science and Technology Minister.

Yangthang MLA Bhim Hang Limboo has been given Water Supply & Public Health Engineering and Water Resources and River Development departments, while Sanjit Kharel, elected from Namthang-Rateypani has received Building & Housing and Transport departments.

With the portfolio allotted, the new government got down to the business of administration and in a circular issued yesterday, directed that from now onwards "pilots" will be provided only to the Chief Justice, Governor and Chief Minister in Sikkim.

The circular, issued by the chief secretary, also directs that departmental lunches and dinner will not be held at outside hotels and should be hosted at government guest houses from now on. Even chief minister's banquets will be held at Samman Bhawan, the circular adds.

Meanwhile, the Department of Personnel has also directed all Heads of Departments to submit detailed lists of all temporary employees employed in their respective departments, including those appointed recently under the One Family, One Job scheme.

The HoDs have also been directed to submit lists of all Group C and D employees on deputation from other services and departments and also all officials [Group C and D] on re-employment, and all such employees on extension of service.

The missive underlines that the direction be taken as "most urgent" and that the list. prepared in Microsoft Excel, be submitted latest by 10 June 2019 in soft and hard copies.

Modi takes oath as PM for second term, joined by Rajnath, Shah, others in cabinet



NEW DELHI, MAY 30 (PTI): Narendra Modi took over as the country's Prime Minister for a second term on Thursday after he was sworn in along with other Union ministers, including BJP president Amit Shah, Rajnath Singh, Nitin Gadkari and former foreign secretary S Jaishankar, a surprise pick.

Modi, 68, was administered the oath of office and secrecy by President Ram Nath Kovind at a glittering ceremony at the forecourt of majestic Rashtraparti Bhavan.

"Honoured to serve India!" tweeted Modi after taking the oath for the second consecutive term.

Apart from Shah, Singh, Gadkari, the other top leaders who were sworn-in as Union ministers included D V Sadananda Gowda, Nirmala Sitharaman and Ram Vilas Paswan.

Patnaik announces Rs 1,330 crore package for Bijepur

Bhubaneswar, 30 (PTI): Odisha Chief Minister Naveen Patnaik Thursday announced a Rs 1,330 crore package, including plans to provide pucca houses to 34,000 households in Bijepur Assembly constituency, from where he was elected in the recently held polls.

Apart from his home turf Hinjili in Ganjam district, Patnaik had also contested from Bijepur Assembly constituency in Bargarh district. He won both the seats.

"About 34,000 eligible households having kutcha houses in Bijepur Assembly constituency will be provided with pucca houses," an official in Chief Minister's Office said.

As part of the package, two mega pipe water schemes will be executed at an estimated cost of Rs 1,120 crore covering 8 lakh population of 505 villages of Bargarh district where Bijepur is located.

"All villages of Bijepur constituency will be provided with piped water supply with household connection in next two years," the official said.

A new mega lift irrigation project under Parbatigiri Mega Lift Scheme will be taken up in Buromunda gram panchayat with water source from river Ong at an estimated cost of Rs 48 crore. This will provide irrigation to 3,000 acres of agriculture land, he said.

Similarly, 29 river lift projects and about 3000 deep borewell irrigation projects will be taken up in Bijepur Assembly constituency.

Infrastructure works

including water supply, street lighting, roads, drainage, town hall, community centres, kalyan mandap, stadium, market complex, park, office buildings will be taken up in Bijepur and Barpalli notified area council

Package for each town will cost Rs 40 crore and the works will be completed within two years, sources said.

In order to provide quality power to the farmers, separate agriculture feeders totalling 60 km of 33 KV line and 125 kms of 11 KV line will be constructed. Besides, 50 new distribution transformers will also be set up to improve the voltage level.

While three RI circles will be set up at Guderpali, Talpal and Dangabahal under Gaisilet Tehsil, a new primary health centre (PHC) will be opened at Talpadar in Bijepur block, they said adding adequate number of doctors will be posted in existing health institutions in a week.

A government ITI will be set up at Bijepur and two skill development centres at Gaisilet and Barpalli.

Four new road development projects covering a length of about 80 km and a bridge project will be sanctioned to strengthen the road network in the area at a cost of about Rs 82 crore, they said. The chief minister will review the implementation of the package every two months, an official said adding Part-2 of the package including livelihood and other sectors will be announced

All lit up, Rashtrapati Bhavan hosts 8,000 guests for Modi's swearing-in ceremony

NEW DELHI, MAY 30 (PTI): As the sun set over the Rashtrapati Bhavan on Thursday, Narendra Modi and his council of ministers were sworn in for a second successive term with 8,000 people packing into the forecourt of the historic British-era presidential palace.

In a grand ceremony with overtones of a US presidential inauguration, heads of state and government, India honchos, opposition leaders, BJP members and showbiz stars rubbed shoulders as they watched President Ram Nath Kovind administer the oath of office to India's 58 new ministers.

The two-hour swearing-in ceremony of Modi government 2.0 -- which created a splash, with the prime minister powering his party to a 303 victory in the 543-member Lok Sabha, and also a spectacle -- is the largest event to be held in Rashtrapati Bhavan, officials said.

It was India's Kodak moment for the political times with grandeur and pomp, ritual and glimpses of realpolitik and

some history too.

The ceremony started at 7 pm, right on time, but the crowds had started filing in much earlier, taking their allotted seats and making conversation while millions watching the proceedings on TV and other screens speculated about who was who, who was there and who was not.

Soon, as minister after minister took oath with the president sometimes the strict teacher correcting some of them when they slipped up, dusk slipped into night and the lights came on over the panoramic Lutyenscape with the Rashtrapati Bhavan dome lit up in the trico-

Among those present were former prime minister Manmohan Singh, former president Pratibha Patil, veteran BJP leader L K Advani and even spiritual guru Jaggi Vasudev. Congress president

Rahul Gandhi, who is adamant on his decision to quit office after his party's debacle in the hustings and hasn't been seen for some days,

created a buzz when he walked in with his mother, UPA chairperson Sonia Gandhi. NDA ally Janata Dal-United chief Nitish Kumar was there too, making an entry shortly after his party announced it would not be part of the government.

The BJP was offering one cabinet berth to the ID(U) and sources said the regional party was also unhappy with the portfolio offered to it.

Wildlife Worries

The wildlife numbers might be healthy, but what about their actual health

So, a tiger has been snapped at heights hitherto thought unlikely, not because it is unheard of, but because the contiguous tracks of forest have been lost for too long. While that is good news, what is not so is the fact that deer stumble into villages along the edge of forests diseased and suffering from open sores. Sometimes, dogs set upon the sick animal and bring her down and at other times people try to care for the animal and make its final hours as comfortable as possible. Elsewhere, farmers are reporting raids by wild boars even in North Sikkim. Even the wilds along Tsomgo now have wild boar populations competing with the wildlife there for the scare resources. Parts of West and South Sikkim have been grappling with increased incidence of wild boar raids for a while now and these packs are clearly now expanding to new terrains.

These incidents are playing out due to half-cock policy interventions. It is "proper" to ban hunting, but even the half-educated know that forest dwellers and traditional hunting are allowed even when a strict hunting ban is in place. Not so in Sikkim. What should actually have been a strictly enforced ban on recreational hunting has instead banned this traditional activity altogether from Sikkim. Traditional hunting, apart from providing the much-needed protein supplement for communities living along forest belts, also played the important role of culling the sick and the weak from animal herds before they infected the rest. Accept it, no matter how good a hunter someone is, they are only good enough to bring down the weakest of the pack. Rural pragmatism also ensured that such hunting was also regulated and almost honorable in the manner it was carried out and had worked a fine arrangement to maintain the balance. But then Gangtok banned it for all of Sikkim (except the privileged for whom the laws don't apply equally). What this has resulted in is an unbalanced growth. And nature does not like that. Also, in the case of wild boars, it is not just farms that are being dug up, but even bigger, but solitary, animals like the bears being chased out of their traditional haunts. Okay, this last one is speculative, but it is not as far out as some might argue. The point being made is that while it is wonderful that Sikkim's wildlife population is supposedly growing, it is important now to find out whether it is also healthier and whether some informed decisions need to be made to ensure that better health returns to the wildlife.

About hunting... Has anyone ever heard of anyone reasonably well-heeled ever get picked up for poaching in Sikkim. And yes, since even traditional hunting practices are no longer allowed in Sikkim, all hunting is poaching irrespective of those with big caliber guns and searchlights on their vehicles might say. For far too long, Sikkim has heard of only lay villagers getting rounded up for wildlife offences and the only confiscations have been primitive guns and even more primitive traps. Hunting by the well-connected was an open secret and conveniently ignored much to Sikkim's disadvantage.

And now, let's return to the wildlife and even turn the initial observation on its head. Even though few people like to admit it, with hardly any predators around, and given the fact that nearly 50% of the land in Sikkim is officially recorded as being under forest cover, the wildlife density, or at least its visibility, is not half teeming as the laws and maps would lead one to believe. The biodiversity hotspot that Sikkim is introduced as, should manifest itself in more obvious displays, on would expect. While the loss of contiguous forest belts to human encroachment could have resulted in some depletion in wildlife numbers, it is unfortunate that even areas where wildlife was abundant even till recent times, have fewer animals left. These numbers, as mentioned earlier, should have multiplied given the anti-hunting laws and absence of predators. It is also possible that the animals have been driven deeper into the forests, but even that needs to be authenticated because Sikkim is a very small state and the forests here run only so deep before they start touching a habitation on the other side. By a lay thumb rule, sightings should have been much more frequent.

And, to end with the argument this piece began with - let us have a proper wildlife census commissioned for Sikkim and along with it, also a proper, scientific study on how well the wildlife is keeping.

Female military peacekeepers left feeling overwhelmed after inadequate training

Female military peacekeepers deployed to complex UN missions often feel overwhelmed and ill-prepared when providing assistance to local women and girls who've been the victims of violence.

The UN expects female peacekeepers around the world to improve the effectiveness of missions by gaining access to members of local communities that male peacekeepers cannot reach. But my recent research in Rwanda showed that women peacekeepers need more support.

I looked at whether the kind of training women from the Rwanda Defence Force received before their deployment in mixed-gender battalions to the UN Mission in Darfur (UNAMID) and the UN Mission in South Sudan (UNMISS) was sufficient for the challenges they would face on their mission. I asked 24 Rwandan women from the military awaiting deployment and 22 who had returned from missions about their perceptions of the training they received, and how it related to the expectations and realities of working in UN and African Union (AU) peace operations.

INSUFFICIENTLY PREPARED

Women waiting to deploy felt confident that the training equipped them for all protection of civilian tasks they would be assigned. But women who'd returned from dangerous peace operations felt the pre-deployment training didn't adequately equip them. They found it especially challenging to handle complex cases where women and girls had experienced sexual violence related to conflict, were extremely traumatised, or required urgent assistance. These challenges were exacerbated by the difficulty of communicating with local woman through an interpreter – a skill that had to be learnt on the job in difficult circumstances.

A 27-year-old liaison officer, who was critical of the military training's emphasis on processes and procedures, suggested that "more information on the psychological impact violence has on

survivors" was required. She said encountering gender-based violence in camps for internally displaced people (IDP) "was not easy" and the training hadn't prepared her for sustained engagement with survivors. She added:

"When I was on the ground and reached the [IDP] camp, you find this person who was raped for two or three hours and the people around her don't want to communicate, they don't care about what happened. You get this person, you put her in touch with the NGOs, you take her to hospital, but you need to spend three or four hours with her."

The women I interviewed also felt overwhelmed by the sheer scale of the assistance local communities required in Darfur and South Sudan. One 30-year-old major who deployed as a mechanic in UNAMID said there weren't enough female peacekeepers to make a real impact.

GENDER BIASED TRAINING

While gender advisers and military observers receive specialist community engagement training, most tactical-level female peacekeepers, like their male colleagues, receive military-led training two to three months prior to deployment. Typically, the programme comprises a mixture of training sessions in the classroom and field exercises designed by both the UN and local military.

These sessions introduce theoretical concepts but don't provide practical knowledge about how people behave directly after experiencing violence, forms of trauma and post-traumatic stress disorder, and what to do during contact with survivors. Nor does the training desensitise peacekeepers in preparation for the distressing situations they're likely to witness. One 32-year-old second lieutenant reflected on what was missing:

"We study gender issues theoretically, but in the mission area, when we start putting theory into practice, there are challenges. In training, my mate acts as a refugee and I act as I'm going to help her. But that is like theatre – you can't grasp the reality well."

Gender biases also play a role. In Rwanda,

senior leaders and trainers told me that female peacekeepers naturally knew how to respond to local women's needs by dint of being the same sex. They believed women inherently possessed the required skill set, incorporating the traditional feminine traits of empathy, compassion, communication and the ability to care for vulnerable people.

There was also an assumption circulating that Rwandan women were good at providing victim assistance because of the country's own history of conflict, where some 350,000 to 500,000 women were raped during the civil war and genocide in 1994. Women awaiting deployment on peackeeping missions appeared to have internalised this stereotype, even though more than half of those I interviewed were between 18- and 23-years-old and born after 1994. This self-stereotyping resulted in a false confidence among the trainee peace-keepers that they were equipped to counsel and support traumatised women and girls.

TRAINING PARTNERSHIPS

Rwandan female police peacekeepers I spoke to who had worked in UN missions in Darfur, South Sudan and Haiti, hadn't felt as ill-prepared as their military colleagues. According to one senior female police peacekeeper, community engagement was a big part of their day-to-day job in Rwanda and they had significant experience helping those affected by violence. Yet currently, the Rwanda National Police and the Rwanda Defence Force run separate training programmes.

To help mitigate some of the issues I've found in my research, the police and military could share good practice and develop joint pre-deployment training sessions on the implementation of the UN's protection of civilians mandate, including providing assistance to victims. At the same time, the UN, regional organisations and those countries that contribute troops to peacekeeping missions should continue to work together to strengthen their training.

What to expect from biggest ever Africa Cup of Nations tournament

The 2019 Africa Cup of Nations, popularly known as Afcon, is the biennial championship in which Africa's top men's teams compete for the gold-plated African Nation Cup trophy. The winner will hoist that trophy after the final on Friday 19 July at the Cairo International Stadium.

This tournament, organised by the Confederation of African Football (CAF), will be the 32nd edition of the competition and the first in which the format has been expanded from 16 to 24 teams. All 24 teams have now confirmed their places.

According to a recent report by Nielsen Sports, Africa is one of the most engaged football markets globally. It matches even regions like Europe and South America. This supports the CAF's decision to increase the competitiveness of the tournament.

KEY THINGS YOU NEED TO KNOW

Current title holders Cameroon were stripped of hosting rights last year due to delays with preparations and security concerns. Egypt was then selected as the host nation.

The timing of the competition is good news for fans of European teams. For the first time in the tournament's history it's being held during the European summer. This means African players who play for European clubs such as Liverpool's Sadio Mané (Senegal) and Mohamed Salah (Egypt), or Manchester City's Riyad Mahrez (Algeria) will not be withdrawn from club duty mid-season to participate in the tournament.

The 24 qualifying teams have been drawn into six groups of four

teams each:

Group A: DR Congo - Egypt - Uganda - Zimbabwe Group B: Burundi - Guinea - Madagascar - Nigeria Group C: Algeria - Kenya - Senegal - Tanzania Group D: Ivory Coast - Morocco - Namibia - South Africa Group E: Angola - Mali - Mauritania - Tunisia Group F: Benin - Cameroon - Ghana - Guinea Bissau.

The teams in each group will play in a single round robin format. After the group stage, the top two teams and the four best third teams will advance to the round of 16. The winners will advance to the quarterfinals stage, and from then on, progress to the semifinals. The semifinal losers will contest a third-place match, while semifinal winners will advance to the final.

The full schedule of fixtures can

be found on the CAF website.

Egypt is being tipped as the tournament favourite going into the competition. They have been champions of Africa more times than any other nation, and have lost only twice in their last 25 home games against African opponents. And of course they have the prolific goal-scoring machine, Mohamed Salah, who is rated as being one of the best players in the world, both on club level for Liverpool and for Egypt.

TOP 10 FACTS

- 1. Only three countries (Sudan, Egypt and Ethiopia) took part in the first tournament in February 1957 and there was no qualifying competition. Egypt won.
- 2. 2019 will be the first time the tournament features 24

- teams, after CAF decided to expand the tournament to
- enhance competitiveness.

 B. Egypt will be hosts for a record fifth time. They previously staged the Cup of Nations in 1959, 1974, 1986 and 2006, winning three of those four tournaments and finishing third in the other.
- Egypt has been the most successful nation, with seven titles, followed by Cameroon (five), Ghana (four), Nigeria (three) and the Democratic Republic of Congo and the Ivory Coast (two each).
- Madagascar, Burundi and Mauritania will be making their debuts at the tournament in 2019. Madagascar was a surprise qualifier and was among the first to qualify in October 2018, while Mauritania secured their ticket a month later with a game still to play. Burundi was definitely the biggest surprise. It currently occupies 138th spot out of 211 in the FIFA/Coca-Cola World Ranking. Twelve teams are yet to qualify for Africa's biggest football tournament, including the Central African Republic, Chad, Comoros, Djibouti, Eritrea, Eswatini, Gambia, Lesotho, São Tomé and Príncipe, Seychelles, Somalia and South Sudan.
- 6. Cameroonian striker Samuel Eto'o is the leading overall Cup of Nations scorer, notching 18 goals in six tournaments between 2000 and 2010.
- 7. Egypt goalkeeper Essam

- El-Hadary became the oldest player at 44 years and 21 days to feature in the tournament when he faced Cameroon in the 2017 final in Libreville.
- 8. Shiva N'zigou of Gabon is the youngest player to feature and score at the tournament. He was 16 years and 93 days old when he played at Afcon in 2000, scoring for his team in a 1-3 defeat against South Africa.
- 9. The tournament has been switched to being held in odd-numbered years so as not to clash with the FIFA World Cup. Afcon will also, for the first time, be held mid-year, away from the traditional January February window. This will alleviate the club-versus-country battles that have marred previous editions.
- 10. Three different trophies have been awarded during the tournament's history. This is the third trophy, with the first and second awarded to Ghana and Cameroon in 1978 and 1984 respectively. Both won the trophy three times and therefore earned the right to keep it.

The current trophy was first awarded in 2002, and Egypt won it indefinitely after completing their historic treble of titles in 2010. Unlike Ghana and Cameroon, Egypt were presented with a replica, albeit a special full size one that they were allowed to keep.

SC says media report on NRC procedure disturbing

(PTI): In the backdrop of reports that a decorated former army officer has been declared a foreigner by a tribunal in Assam, the Supreme Court on Thursday asked the NRC state coordinator to ensure that fair procedure is adopted in dealing with the claims and objections on inclusion of citizens in the draft National Register of Citizens (NRC).

A vacation bench comprising Chief Justice Ranjan Gogoi and Justice Aniruddha Bose, without referring to any specific matter, said "disturbing" reports have emerged in the media regarding procedure to deal with claims and objections.

According to Assam police, Mohammad Sanaullah, a former army officer who had won a President's medal, was apprehended on Wednesday and sent to a detention camp in after a foreigners' tribunal declared him a 'foreigner'.

Family members of Sanaullah, a resident of Kolohikash village in Kamrup district,



have said they will approach the Gauhati High Court against the tribunal's order.

"There are very disturbing reports in the media. The media is not always correct but sometimes media is right also," the apex court bench told state NRC coordinator

The apex court observed this while hearing the Assam NRC matter.

He said he served the country's interests for 30 years (1987-2017), joining the force as an official of Electronic and Mechanical Engineering department and was also awarded with President's Medal in 2014.

The Congress on Thursday hit out at the BJP government over the issue, saying it shows the "high-handedness and flawed manner" in which the NRC exercise is being implemented in the northeastern state.

The draft Assam National Register of Citizens (NRC) was published on July 30, 2018 in which the names of 2.89 crore of the 3.29 crore people were included. The names of 40,70,707 people did not figure in the list. Of these, 37,59,630 names have been rejected and the remaining 2,48,077 are on hold.

BJP trying to create divide between Bengalis and non-Bengalis: Mamata



NAIHATI (WB), MAY 30 (PTI): West Bengal Chief Minister Mamata Banerjee Thursday urged the people of the country to raise their voice against the "torture of BJP" and accused the saffron party of trying to create a divide between Bengalis and non-Bengalis in the state.

"The BJP is trying to create a Bengali, non-Bengali divide in the state. They want to destroy the communal harmony in the state. I hate a party like BJP. I would urge the people of this country to raise their voice against communal divide," Banerjee said in her first political programme after her party's

debacle in the Lok Sabha elections.

Banerjee took part in a sit-in organised by her party outside the Naihati Municipality on Thursday to protest against the alleged violence perpetrated by BJP after the announcement of poll results.

"More than 400 Bengali families have been rendered homeless by goons of the BJP. I will not spare the goons," she said.

Alleging that some police officials are acting on directions from BJP leaders, she said, "We will not tolerate it. We will take action against them."

Banerjee asked par-

ty cadres to form 'Banga Janani Bahini' and 'Jai Hind Bahini' to counter the march of the BJP-RSS in the state. "These two outfits will work in all the blocks of the state and will counter the BJP and the RSS."

The TMC supremo claimed that some BJP workers had verbally abused her when she was on her way to attend the rally.

"Is this democracy?" Banerjee asked.

The BJP won 18 of the 42 Lok Sabha seats in Bengal, only four less than the TMC's 22. The remaining two seats were bagged by the Congress, while the Left Front drew a blank.

Mamata loses cool yet again over 'Jai Shri Ram' slogans

KOLKATA, MAY 30 (PTI): West Bengal Chief Minister Mamata Banerjee lost her cool on Thursday when a group of men shouted "Jai Shri Ram" as her motorcade was passing through the troubled Bhatpara area of North 24 Parganas district.

The Trinamool Congress (TMC) supremo was on her way to Naihati to participate in a sit-in against violence on her party workers after the Lok Sabha poll results.

In a video, which has gone viral on the social media, some men are seen shouting "Jai Shri Ram" as Banerjee's motorcade was passing through the Bhatpara area, a scene of violence between the BJP and the TMC since the declaration of the poll results.

The area is the stronghold of the newly-elected BJP MP Arjun Singh, who had defected to the saffron party from the TMC weeks before the Lok Sabha election. Singh defeated TMC's Dinesh Trivedi in the polls.

An infuriated Banerjee came out of her car and asked her security officials to note down the name of the men.

"What do you think of yourself? You will come from other states, stay here and abuse us? I will not tolerate this. How dare you all abuse me? All of your names and details will be noted down," she was heard saying.

After the chief minister got into her car, the men chanted "Jai Shri Ram" again, prompting her to disembark from the vehicle once more.

Later, addressing the protest programme at Naihati, Banerjee said some BJP workers came in front of her car and abused her verbally.

"Is this democracy?," she asked.

Saradha chit fund case: Cal HC grants protection from arrest to Rajeev Kumar

KOLKATA, MAY 30 (PTI): The Calcutta High Court Thursday granted protection from arrest and any coercive action till July 10 to West Bengal CID Additional Director General Rajeev Kumar in the Saradha chit fund scam case.

The vacation bench of the court granted him a month's protection from June 10, when the court will reopen after summer break, and directed Kumar to deposit his passport within 24 hours of the passing of the order.

The former Kolkata police commissioner has also been asked to cooperate with the CBI investigation into the multicrore chit fund case.

The court ordered the probe agency to send a designated officer to Kumar's residence every day at 4 pm to record his attendance.

Justice Pratik Prakash Banerjee ruled that the petition will appear before a regular bench on June 12 after the court reopens following a summer vacation.

Kumar moved the Calcutta High Court Thursday, seeking quashing of the CBI notice served on him over alleged suppression of facts in the Saradha chit fund scam

The Central Bureau of Investigation (CBI) had served a notice on Kumar asking him to appear before it for assisting the investigation into the case.

The former Kolkata top cop's counsel Sudipto Moitra submitted that the CBI was seeking to put him behind bars in connection with the chit fund case, without taking recourse to proper legal procedure.

Submitting that Kumar was interrogated by the CBI for 39 hours and 45 minutes in Shillong, Moitra said the probe agency was now seeking



to take him in custody out of "vendetta".

He maintained that Kumar has neither been named as an accused nor as a witness in the seven charge sheets the probe agency has filed in the case so far.

CBI lawyer Y J Dastur submitted before the court that Kumar has prevaricating answers to the questions posed by the agency in connection with the seizure of documents by a Special Investigation Team (SIT), set up by the state government.

Dastur also said that Kumar, who was then the commissioner of Bidhannagar Police, was entrusted with day- today functioning of the SIT probing the Saradha

The CBI counsel insisted that the agency cannot be accused of malafide since he was given ample time to appear before it for assisting the probe.

Kumar, a former commissioner of the Kolkata Police, was appointed ADG, CID, by the Mamata Banerjee-led government before the Lok Sabha election.

He was, however, removed by the Election Commission during the poll process and was attached to the Home Min-

istry in New Delhi. The state government reinstated him following the withdrawal of the model code of conduct.

On May 17, the Supreme Court had withdrawn protection from arrest to Kumar, which it had granted earlier.

The apex court last week dismissed a plea of Kumar seeking extension of protection from arrest.

A vacation bench of the apex court, headed by Justice Arun Mishra, said Kumar can approach the Calcutta High Court or a trial court here for seeking relief in the case.

In January, the Centre and the state government had faced an unprecedented standoff after a CBI team, which reached the residence of Kumar for questioning, had to retreat following intervention by the Kolkata Police, of which he was the commissioner then.

Chief Minister Banerjee came out in Kumar's defence and launched a sit-in to protest in the city against the Centre's move. On February 5, the

against Kumar, while directing the former police commissioner to appear and co-operate in CBI questioning at a "neutral place". He was questioned by the CBI for nearly five days in Shillong from February 9.

Kumar, who was appointed Commissioner of Police at Bidhan Nagar Police Commissionerate in 2012, had served as the head of the state-appointed SIT, which probed the ponzi scams before the CBI took over.

Last month, the CBI had told the Supreme Court that Kumar's custodial interrogation was necessary as he was not cooperating in the probe and was "evasive" and "arrogant" in answering the queries put to him.

As part of the Rs 2,500-crore scam, the Saradha group of companies duped lakhs of customers, promising higher rates of returns on their investment, the agency said.

Similar modus operandi was adopted by other ponzi companies like Rose Valley operating in West Bengal, Odisha and northeastern states where gullible investors were duped, it added.


Advocate Dipak Jena, appearing for Das, said there was a lawyers strike in West Bengal and he may be arrested by the police for writing the post on social media.

From village cricket to World Cup for Pakistan's Shadab

(AFP): A relentless training routine and "unparalleled" commitment have taken Pakistan leg-spinner Shadab Khan from club cricket in his remote village to the World Cup in just a few short years.

The 20-year-old, already third in the world Twenty20 bowling rankings, has caught the eye of none other than Pakistan's Prime Minister Imran Khan -- who led Pakistan to their only World Cup win in 1992.

But when the prime minister singled out Shadab during a meeting with the team before they flew to England, it came as no surprise to the coaches and players who know him.

They credit his heady rise to a tireless work ethic including pre-dawn starts to fit in maximum practice.

"Shadab's commitment to cricket is unparalleled," said his former club coach Sajjad Ahmed.

"He sleeps around 9:00 pm and reaches the ground before sunrise. That's been his routine for years so that he can practise as much as possible." Shadab grew up playing cricket on the rough pitches of Mianwali district -- a farming community near the banks of the Indus River in Punjab province -- which is also home to Prime Minister Khan and fellow Pakistan Test player Misbah-ul-Haq.

In between swimming in the myriad canals bisecting the fertile fields in his hometown,



Shadab spent hours on the cricket pitch daily, where he developed his signature leg-breaks and love for batting.

"Shadab was so interested in batting that at one time he quit bowling," said Ahmed.

"But I advised him to consider becoming an all-rounder, then he would have a better chance to play top-level cricket and he complied."

The decision proved prescient. After playing for Pakistan's Under-16s, Shadab was selected for the Under-19 World Cup in Bangladesh in 2016, where he finished as Pakistan's joint-highest wicket-taker with 11.

A few months later he made his first-class debut for Pakistan A during their tour of England, taking five wickets and scoring a valuable 48 in their win over Sri Lanka A in an unofficial Test.

Later that year, he made headlines again with a match-changing 132 and figures of 4-84 and 5-82 for Pakistan A against Zimbabwe A.

After playing for Islamabad United in the 2017 Pakistan Super League, the leg-spinner enjoyed a dream international debut when he was man-of-the-match in Pakistan's T20 win over reigning world champions the West Indies in Bridgetown.

- 'NOT FORGOTTEN HIS ROOTS' -

But despite his success, friends and close associates said Shadab

has maintained his long hours on the practice pitch to keep his skills sharp. "I remember once we went on a tour to Lahore for a tournament and after the match all the boys would go sightseeing, but Shadab used to sleep early and would only concentrate on cricket," said long-time friend Raja Falak Sher, Shadab's first captain at club level.

"To this day his routine is the same and that has helped him rise to where he is today."

Perhaps one of Shadab's finest moments so far came at the Champions Trophy in 2017 in a showdown against arch-rivals India, where he trapped Yuvraj Singh in front of the wicket.

English umpire Richard Kettleborough was unmoved but Shadab convinced skipper Sarfaraz Ahmed to review -and was proved correct, making Shadab a hero of Pakistan's win. Gradually Shadab has also begun to make an impression in the longer format of the game, scoring three half-centuries in as many Tests in England and Ireland last year.

"Shadab has talent, passion and commitment and those traits will take him places," his former coach told AFP.

"But he has not forgotten his roots. Siddique Akbar club was his first team. He visits us when he is in the city and now he runs the club out of his own pocket.

LONDON. MAY 30 (PTI): Steve Smith and David Warner have nothing to prove but the duo will need to have "thick skin" to counter sledging and hostile crowd in the World Cup, said former Australia pacer Brett Lee.

Smith and Warner, who are returning after serving suspensions for their involvement in the infamous ball-tampering episode in South Africa in 2018, have already witnessed hostile crowd during Australia's two World Cup warm-up games.

"I don't think they have got a point to prove, they will just be happy to be back playing for Australia," Lee said.

"We saw what happened with David Warner during the IPL, the leading run scorer and the Orange Cap holder, Steven Smith got a big hundred in his first game. They have been welcomed back to the Australian cricket team with open arms and I reckon they have a shot at winning.

"(But) you have got the Barmy Army, you have got guys like Kevin Pietersen chirping at me already. They are going to cop some sledging but you need thick skin," he added. Lee said Australia are peaking just at the right time and Aaron Finch's men have it in them to win the title for the sixth time.

"We need a couple of good games back-toback, it will be phenomenal if Australia can win a sixth title, I know what it means to win a World Cup and it is the best feeling in the world," Lee said at the official tournament opening ceremony here on Wednesday.

"I think they can (win it), I am quietly confident with the Aussies, they have got a great team, a great squad, they tick every box, they bowl pretty well at the death and they field pretty well. I would never back against the Aussies, put it that way.

"It's also about peaking at the right time when you go into a World Cup. I think Australia are doing that, although we haven't played a lot of great cricket back-to-back in the last 12 months."

Australia will open their campaign against Afghanistan at Bristol on June 1.

Gas project critic Marape elected Papua New Guinea PM

PORT MORESBY, MAY 30 (AFP): Papua New Guinea lawmakers overwhelmingly elected James Marape as prime minister on Thursday -a former finance minister who resigned in protest against a massive ExxonMobil and Total gas project.

Marape won the landslide backing of members of parliament after weeks of political manoeuvring that saw eight-year prime minister Peter O'Neill resign.

"Honourable members, I now declare that the member for Tari Pori James Marape has been elected as prime minister-elect of the independent state of Papua New Guinea," said parliament speaker Job Pomat, announcing Marape's 101-8 victory.

In a Facebook post early on Thursday Marape vowed to make Papua New Guinea "the 'richest black Christian nation' on earth" and to put the "national interest ahead of personal and corporate interest." His victory is likely to spell continuity in many fields, but it could bring changes to energy policy and relations with



neighbouring Australia. One of Asia's most impoverished nations, Papua New Guinea is rich in natural resources, including large gas fields. The ExxonMobil and Total Papua LNG project, signed in April, would almost double Papua New Guinea's gas exports.

Marape -- who comes from energy-rich Hela province -- has indicated he would like to redistribute the spoils of the

with O'Neill on "work and policy related matters" as well as the lack of local "participation in our gas, oil sector" and mining industry.

Indian man dies after setting himself ablaze near White House

WASHINGTON, MAY 30 (PTI): A 33-year-old Indian man has died after reportedly setting himself ablaze near the White House, police said on Thursday.

Arnav Gupta from Bethesda in Maryland died of his burn injuries after he set himself ablaze on Wednesday at the Ellipse, a tourist-filled 52-acre public park near the White House.

Once the flames were extinguished, Gupta was rushed to a local hospital for treatment but died on Thursday morning, the United States Park Police said in a statement.

"At approximately 12:20 pm a man lit himself on fire on the Ellipse near 15th and Constitution Ave., Secret Service personnel are on scene assisting @NatlParkService and @usparkpolicepio in rendering first aid," according to a tweet by the US Secret Service.

Police said Gupta was reported missing by his family since Wednesday morning. The authorities then put out a notice asking for the public's help in finding him.

He was last seen by his family around 9:20 am Wednesday when he left his home on Cindy Lane, about 16 kms northwest of the White House, the Washington Post reported. Montgomery County Police said the family was concerned

The Washington D.C. police have taken over the investigation.

A 17-year-old girl from Alexandria, who was sightseeing with a cousin visiting from Bolivia, saw part of the incident and captured it on video. She sent it to her father, who posted it on Twitter, the paper reported.

The video shows smoke billowing from the lawn near a guard shack and some flames visible above parked cars.

The girl's father, Krisjan Berzins, said that his daughter saw Secret Service agents running toward him trying to extinguish the fire.

In April, authorities said a man riding a motorised wheelchair set his jacket on fire outside the White House.

He was not critically injured and was involuntarily committed for psychiatric help.

Six dead in suicide blast at Kabul military academy

KABUL, MAY 30 (AFP): At least six people were killed and six more wounded in a suicide blast outside a military academy in the Afghan capital on Thursday, an official said. The attack outside the Marshal Fahim National Defense University in western Kabul took place at the road entrance to the war college. Kabul police spokesman Firdaws Faramarz said the suicide bomber had been on foot. He blew himself up when a soldier challenged him.

"Based on initial information, six people killed, six wounded, police have reached the scene," Faramarz said.

The attacker "detonated himself before reaching his target", Faramarz added, without providing further details.

The attack happened around noon (0730 GMT), a time when students typically leave school early during the month of Ramadan. No group immediately claimed responsibility Police and security forces in and around Kabul have come under frequent attack in recent weeks, even as the US and the Taliban have held talks about a possible peace agreement.

Opened in 2005 and named after former vice president Mohammed Fahim, the Marshal Fahim academy is modelled after US and British war colleges and trains cadets destined to become officers in Afghanistan's army. A large annexe to the university is home to dozens of NATO troops who mentor the Afghan cadets. The explosion was not believed to have affected operations at that centre, which lies behind multiple layers of tight security.

Israel to hold fresh election as Prime Minister Netanyahu fails to form coalition govt

JERUSALEM, MAY 30 (PTI): Israeli lawmakers Thursday voted to dissolve Parliament and hold fresh elections after Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu failed to form a coalition before a midnight deadline, becoming the first prime minister-designate in the country's history who was unable to form a government.

In little more than six weeks since they were elected, Israeli lawmakers voted 74-45 in favour of dissolving the 21st Knesset (Israeli Parliament) and hold an unprecedented repeat general elections on September 17.

Netanyahu's remarkable victory in the April 9 polls securing him a record fifth term proved temporary in the face of a logjam between potential coalition partners over a military conscription bill governing exemptions for ultra-Orthodox Jewish seminary students.

Ahead of the vote - taken just after the Wednesday midnight deadline, Netanyahu told the Likud faction that he had not succeeded in reaching a compromise with nationalist Yisrael Beytenu leader Avigdor Liberman on the controversial haredi (ultra-Orthodox) conscription bill, and that he had also tried unsuccessfully to woo MKs from the opposition to join his government. Lieberman, a former defence minister, had made it a condition of allying with ultra-Orthodox Jewish parties that they adopt a law aimed at having ultra-Orthodox Jews serve in the military like their secular counterparts.

The bill, which the Defense Ministry drafted under Liberman's leadership, sets rising annual targets for haredi conscription in the Israeli Defence Forces.

Ultra-Orthodox Jews studying in religious seminaries are currently exempt from mandatory military service, a practice many Israelis view as unfair.

Lieberman told reporters just before the vote that Israel was going to the polls because of the "complete surrender of the Likud (ruling party) to the haredim (ultra-orthodox)".

Without Yisrael Beitenu, Netanyahu could muster support of only 60 lawmakers in the 120 member house, falling short of a majority by just one.

Netanyahu launched a diatribe against Lieberman whom he blamed for "dragging the country to unnecessary elections".

"Liberman is now part of the left. He brings down right-wing governments. Don't believe him again. I will tell you about it tomorrow. Maybe I will tell you some things you don't know," the prime minister told reporters immediately after the Knesset voted to dissolve itself.

"We'll run a sharp, clear election campaign which will bring us victory. We'll win, we'll win and the public will win," he said. "The public in Israel made a clear decision. It decided that I will be Prime Minister, that the Likud will lead the government, a right-wing government," Netanyahu said.

According to several political analysts, the impasse leading to the political crisis was borne out of personal ego clash between the two leaders and does not really

have a sound ideological ground. Netanyahu and Lieberman's

association in politics goes back some 31 years when the latter assisted the former during his tenure as the deputy foreign minister in an unofficial capacity. The move by Netanyahu's rul-

ing Likud party to dissolve the Knesset ensured that President Reuven Rivlin would not be able to call some other lawmaker to try to form a new government. Rivlin had asked Netanyahu to

form the next government after 65 lawmakers, including five of Lieberman's Yisrael Beitenu party, submitted letters of support for him. Netanyahu asked for an addi-

tional two weeks time to form the government after failing to cobble up one together during the mandated 28 days period. The extended time period was to expire at midnight on Wednesday.

Likud party had won 35 seats in the April 9 elections and the right-wing parties had together won 65 seats in the 120 member Knesset, making everyone believe that a right wing government was inevitable and easy to form. Netanyahu declared victory and started coalition negotiations immediately after the results came out, but contrary to expectations, the jubilation in the right-wing bloc proved momentary with no resolution on the military conscription bill.

He will now remain in power

until September's vote. Netanyahu, who has been premier for a total of more than 13 years, faces charges of bribery, fraud and breach of trust in connection with three cases.


