It may be mentioned here, senior Uttarakhand High Court Judge, Justice Vijai Kumar Bisht was elevated and transferred on 24 Oct as the new Chief Justice of Sikkim.

Earlier this month, the collegiums of three Supreme Court judges including Chief Justice of India, Ranjan Gogoi, Justice Madan B Lokur and Justice Kurian Joseph had recommended Justice Bisht's elevation.

Born in Sept 1957 in Lansdowne, Pauri Garhwal district, Justice Bishhas a law degree from the Allahabad University. He was enrolled as an advocate with the Bar Council of Uttar Pradesh in 1984 and practiced at the Allahabad High Court till Nov 2000. He was shifted to Uttarakhand High Court after the State's formation.

During his 16-year tenure at Allahabad, he served as legal advisor and standing counsel for various government departments such as the Uttar Pradesh Higher Secondary Education, Indian Railways, UP Land Development Corporation, UP Cooperative Housing Federation and Ghaziabad Development Authority.

Notably, Justice Bisht

Notably, Justice Bisht was in the division bench along with the then Chief Justice KM Joseph which quashed President's rule in Uttarakhand in Apr 2016.

## Sikkim bags 25 medals at NE Olympic Games

The first North East Olympic Games was held at Imphal in Manipur from 24-28 Oct with the participation of all eight North East States. Led by president of Sikkim Olympic Association, Kuber Bhandari, Sikkim participated in ten disciplines during the event, a press release informs.

The closing ceremony was held on 28 Oct in the presence of Deputy Chief Minister of Manipur, Y Joykumar Singh, as chief guest.

Sikkim bagged medals in various disciplines namely 1 gold, 2 silver & 3 bronze in Taekwondo, 3 silver in Wushu, 1 silver & 3 bronze in Boxing, 1 silver & 3 bronze in Karate, 2 bronze in Table Tennis, 2 bronze in Badminton, 2 bronze in Athletics, 1 bronze in Weightlifting and 1 bronze in Football. The only gold in Taekwondo was achieved by Avinash Pradhan [under 58 kg category].

With 80 gold, 48 silver and 31 bronze medals, Manipur grabbed the first position in the NE Olympic Games followed by Assam and Arunachal Pradesh in second and third positions respectively.

The Namchi Mahotsav Run will be held on 03 Nov and will include Men's Open half marathon and Namchi Marathon 10K for both men and women below 25 years of age.

The Men's Open half marathon will cover Namchi Central Park, Bhanjyang and later will culminate at Namchi Central Park. For this marathon, the participants will have to submit an entry fee of Rs 500. Entry for students with valid students' ID will however be free.

The first, second and third prize for this com-

petition is Rs 50,000, Rs 35,000 and Rs 25,000 respectively along with medal and certificates. A consolation prize of Rs 2000 and certificate will also be handed over to participants who will secure positions from 4th to 10th.

For Namchi 10K Marathon which is exclusively for Namchi-Singhithang constituency is open for both men and women below 25 years. This marathon will commence from Namchi Central Park and will run through viewpoint and then finally the runners will gather at Namchi Central Park.

The entry for this 10K marathon is free and the prize money for the same is Rs 25,000, Rs 15,000 and Rs 10,000 for both men's and women's category. The competitors who will stand from 4th to 10th positions will be awarded with certificates

and a cash prize of Rs 2000.

District Collector [South], Prabhakar Verma, informed that the registration form for the marathon will be available from 31 Oct onwards at a stall located near the fountain at Central Park in Namchi.

Further, the registration forms will also be available at SDM offices located in Jorethang and Gyalshing. Similarly, the forms can also be obtained at Sports and Youth Affairs Department, Gangtok and Mangan.



Social conflict can't end unless forces fanning it cease to exist: Tushar Gandhi

ALIGARH (UP), OCT 30 (PTI): Noted author and great-grandson of Mahatama Gandhi, Tushar Gandhi Tuesday said the social conflict cannot end unless the forces having vested interest in creating it cease to exist.

There can be no peace in the world as long as the military-armament industry continues to call the shots in global affairs, he said, adding this industry would collapse if there is peace in the world.

Gandhi made the re-marks while delivering his keynote address at a seminar on Gandhian Perspective on Alternative Dispute Resolution at the Aligarh Muslim University here.

It is the downtrod-den, common people of the world who pay the price for the greed of power-brokers and the man-ufacturers of armaments, he said.

Referring to the inter-nal peace in the country, Gandhi said, "There are forces at work which thrive by creating internal con-flicts in the country and as long as there are political forces which gain mileage out of conflicts, the country can never be at peace." He said India will truly

become a nation when all these conflicts between different sections of the society are resolved and

society are resolved and the people work together for a common cause. Touching upon the ongoing conflict at the Sabarimala Temple in Kerala, Gandhi said it was not the real 'bhakts' (devotees) of the Sabarimala deity who are at the fore-front of this imbroglio.

It is being fuelled by those who seek political mileage out of this conflict, he said.

Calling upon the younger generation of the country to take up the challenge of resolving the internal conflicts presently plaguing the Indian society, Gandhi said it is for the youths to realise the importance of destroying the "seeds of conflict and hate".

(PTI): If you light an incense stick as part of your puja rituals, stop right now. As Delhi's air quality turned 'severe' on Tuesday, this directive was part of an advisory by a government agency which also warned peo-ple against any outdoor activity.

In the advisory, the

Centre-run System of Air Quality Forecasting And Research (SAFAR) asked Delhiites not to rely on dust masks for protection as city's air quality turned 'severe' Tuesday for the first time this season.

The overall Air Quality Index (AQI) at 3 pm was 401, falling in the 'severe' category, the highest this season, Central Pollution Control Board officials said. SAFAR recorded the

AQI at 410. An AQI between 0 and 50 is considered 'good', 51 and 100 'satisfactory', 101

"If the room has windows, close them, if the air conditioner provides a fresh air intake option then choose it, avoid burning anything such as wood, candle or even an incense," it said.

#### 700 more Eklavya schools by 2022: Oram

JAMSHEDPUR, OCT 30 (PTI): Union minister Jual Oram on Tuesday said the government is planning to start 700 more Eklavya Model Residential school (EMRS) across the country by 2022.

EMRS is a central scheme of model resi-dential schools for tribals (Scheduled Tribes) across the country which was launched in 2000.

Tribal Affairs Minis ter Oram, who was in the steel city to participate in the two-day national-level EMRS music compe tition organized by the East Singhbhum district administration at Tata Auditorium here, said the purpose was to bridge the competence gap between the tribal youths and others in all fields including higher studies and competitive examinations.

Addressing the gathering as chief guest on the occasion, Oram said currently there are 182 Eklavya schools operat-ing in the country and the government has plans to start 700 more by 2022.

The schools would be opened in blocks where tribal population was over 20,000, he said adding that 80 per cent of blocks in Jharkhand would come under the scheme.

Lauding the performance of EMRS, the minister said the students were doing well and secured first and second ranks so far as Union Public Service Commission or State Public Service Commissions

Ic Service Commissions competitive examination were concerned.

The students are, however, lagging behind in confidence in the competitive exams, he said.

"We have to inculcate

"We have to inculcate confidence among them that they are the nation-al achievers in any field whether it was sports or education and can im-prove their performances," he said.

Oram said the gov-ernment has provided pilot training to tribal vouths under the scheme and have been coaching them for professional competitions.

Appreciating Jharkhand government's efforts in organising the inaugural edition of the national level EMRS music competition successfully, the minister assured that the event will be or-

ganized every year.

#### Traffic Jammed in Gangtok

ommuting in Gangtok is comfortable only during Commuting in varigion is commuting in variety as the abreak holidays or on a Saturday immediately after a break like the one we recently enjoyed with Dasain and will get to enjoy again after Tihaar. This is so because it is only during these extended holidays that traffic flows on Gangtok roads instead of snarling. But even this reprieve is getting rare because tourist vehicles are now in close competition with the office and school jumble on the roads. The tedium of driving into Gangtok from Ranipool has become the new normal and will only get worse. And it will be getting worse not just because more people will own more vehicles or because more tourists will get attracted to Gangtok, but more so because nothing appears to be in the works by way of even planning, leave aside implementation, to improve the situation.

Suffice to say that traffic is a problem in Gangtok. The jams are becoming longer and denser and parking has emerged as a challenge for which no one has presented a practical solution. There is, after all, only so much road available to accommodate the march of vehicles which show no signs of tapering off. What also continues to hamstring Gangtok when it comes to managing its traffic is the fact that most of the solutions that consultants could offer – like wider roads or bypasses or flyovers – are not possible here. The capital will have to work with the roads it already has, at least along stretches where most of the congestion takes place. There is no scope for widening or creating alternate routes. That said, there are still some options it could explore even when it comes to road usage and also some experiments it could try out.

Let us start with the situation shared at the start of this piece. The worst congestion on Gangtok roads is in the block from around 10 a.m. till around noon, the morning office rush hour. Many commuters will disagree and insist that jams are a permanent fea-ture through the day nowadays. Let us presume for now that it is worst during office hour rush. The jams standstill again once offices give over later in the afternoon. For anyone who sees traffic as a problem, this should then be the first situation to be addressed.

One way to reduce the number of vehicles on the roads at this time would be to increase and incentivize the use of office car pools. This option is already being used to some extent in government offices. However, not all government servants travel in their own vehicles or car-pools, and many use share cabs. Further car-pooling serves only government servants, but gov-ernment offices also attract lay people coming there, and they too mostly use share taxis. What could ease congestion would be the introduction of a good public transport shuttle during the peak rush hours. Before anyone points to the city runners as a public transport service already deployed, let's accept that these are too few and too erratic in timing to be taken seriously as a solution at present. Traffic flows can be eased, and so congestion removed, with better information Better information among commuters about how frequently buses will be available. Ply enough of them on the roads during rush hours, and inform the people about the frequency, and most would prefer buses to clambering for share-taxis at the designated stops.

Of course, since office hours trigger the biggest jams, the policy makers could also consider staggering the office hours so that the rush of office-goers is also spread out instead of being bunched together. But then again, for this solution to bear any results, the work culture will have to be much more consistent than the present trend of casual timings. But if this were to work, then the arrival of lav people to offices could also be spread out by appointing timings, say to two hours after offices open, for people to meet officers.

What the planners need to also ponder on is to make the link roads, like the one flowing through Arithang to the bypass or from ICAR to 5th Mile or the Paljor Stadium Road shooting down to bypass, more motorable and convenient for people to consider by passing the gridlocked zones unless they have to necessarily suffer through them. At present, the alternates are not even close to being convenient diversions and anyone who has to reach anywhere Gangtok is forced to drive through the entire length of it. It goes without saying that if the driving surface was improved on the many feeder roads, more people would consider using them even if they were longer than that NH10 route. For instance, too many people who have the option of using the bypass don't do so because of its terrible condition. Also, since tourists cannot be kept away from Gangtok, at least the government offices need be clustered around the main town.

Of course, there are more options that could be considered, and definitely many more, much better solutions that can be attempted, but let's take these as a starting point for more ideas to be voiced to do a better job of managing Gangtok traffic.

## Terror isn't always a weapon of the weak - it can also support the powerful

People often believe that terrorism is the weapon of the weak

In other words, terrorism is practiced by marginalized groups that cannot influence government' policies through legitimate means. However, devel opments on the violent far right since the victory of

Donald Trump, I'd argue, present a different reality.

The attack at Pittsburgh's Tree of Life Synagogue, as well as the sending of pipe bombs to critics of the current administration are just the latest examples of the consistent increase in the violence on the mar-gins of the political camp currently controlling all branches of government. Because these acts were perpetrated by individuals with clear political agendas, I'd call them terrorism. While neither of these men were part of a named terrorist organization, and the synogogue shooting is being investigated as a hate crime, I'd argue that they are part of a virtual community that supported their political worldview.

The nonprofit Anti-Defamation League found

that anti-Semitic incidents in the U.S. rose by 57 percent in 2017, the largest single year increase since it started recording such statistics. My own data set documents all far-right violent incidents since 1970 - not just anti-Semitic ones - and was first published in 2012. It reveals that in 2017 the United States ex-perienced a 70 percent increase in violent attacks perpetrated in the name of far-right ideology.

Could a victory at the ballot box actually facilitate violence? Examples from other countries indicate that this may not be such a rare phenomenon. The two most brutal terrorist groups which emerged from the settlers' movement in Israel – the Jewish Under-ground in the early 1980s and the Bat-Ayin Group in the early 2000s, operated in times when right-wing governing coalitions dominated the Israeli political system. Both groups were engaged in a campaign of violence against Palestinian civilians in the West Bank in order to undermine any policies designed to promote conciliation between the two sides

Similarly, the electoral successes of European far-right parties in recent years, especially in local elections, were followed by increasing activity of related violent far-right groups and movements. The success of the AfD in Germany since 2016 was followed by acts of violence which were not seen in Germany since the times of the Nazi Party, such as the two days of violence ainst Jews and immigrants at the town of Chemnitz.

How can these trends can be explained? A re

search project which I'm currently conducting with

sachusetts Lowell tests three possible explanations.

TOLERANT AUTHORITIES

Potential perpetrators of violence may assume that the new political regime that they perceive to be supportive of their views will be more tolerant of politically motivated violence or illegal acts. These expectations are not without some basis.

Research I published in 2012 in the journal Security Studies showed that Israeli governments tended to use milder counterterrorism measures when they responded to the violence from groups that were ideologically close to them.

Similarly, studies focusing on the rise of left- and right-wing terrorism in Italy, and white supremacy groups in the American South, further confirmed that political officials are more reluctant to operate against groups which are located on their side of the political spectrum.

In the context of the U.S., individuals and groups

that adhere to far-right ideology may interpret signals from government official as acceptance of their actions – or, at least, a sign that they can expect more lenient treatment from law enforcement. The Trump adminstration's decision to focus its counterterror ism efforts on Islamic terrorism, and defund programs focusing on domestic radicalization may be one such signal. Another example is Trump's reluctance to single out and criticize far-right groups and activities. His attitude was manifested after white su-premacists marched in Charlottesville with Confederate battle flags, anti-Semitic placards and torches – activities Trump seemed loath to condemn. Lastly, conspiracy theories presented by some far-right pundits about the left's involvement in the recent sending of pipe bombs, and the president's decision to put the word "bomb" in quotation marks when addressing such incidents in his Twitter account may be read as tacit defense of such acts.

#### **EMPOWERMENT**

Another possibility we are testing is that perpetrators of violence feel empowered by Trump's electoral victory in 2016. They feel his winning the election means their actions and ideology are gaining growing public legitimacy. In other words, they feel a sense of duty to continue to be engaged in political participation to ensure the implementation of their political ideology, as well as to attain a more visible position within the political arena. Relative 'disappointment'

A third explanation is based on political scientist Ted Gurr's classical theory of relative deprivation Gurr's theory is that political violence often results from a gap between constituencies' expectations and

The reasoning here would go that the election of Trump led to high expectations in the American far right that the federal government would adopt at least some of their militant views and policy ideas. If, in the eyes of far-right activists, these expectations were not met, some of them may express their frustration via violent activities.

The difficulties of the current administration in implementing some of its immigration policies, as well as some willingness to compromise on the issue of gun legislation, may have frustrated activists who may feel the need to express their concerns via violent or illegal acts. For example, the Pittsburgh shooter felt Trump was a globalist not a nationalist, and influenced by his Jewish family and close associates.

COUNTERING THE VIOLENCE

While our study is still ongoing, some initial findings can provide insights about the applicability of the above mentioned explanations.

The fact that the rise in the level of violence occurred immediately after the 2016 elections, and the relative success of the administration in delivering on many of its election promises – the travel ban, electing two justices to the Supreme Court – indicate that empowerment rather than a sense of deprivation may be responsible for the rise in the level of violence. The fact that the violence hasn't increased since its peak in 2017 also suggests that the root causes of the violence are related more to the election results than subsequent policy developments. Moreover, the administration's reluctance to delegitimize violent manifes-

tations further enhance this sense of empowerment.

It is important to note that historical dynam ics also support these insights. A study I published in 2012 shows that anti-abortion violence actually tends to increase following pro-life decisions of the Supreme Court. For example, between 1989 and 1992, a series of pro-life Supreme Court decisions upholding increased state supervision of abortion procedures empowered pro-life activists. Anti-abortion violence increased.

Coming back to today, the growing polarization of the American political system and the tendency to see elections as a zero sum game encourages each of the political parties to maximize the benefits of electoral victory. That, in turn, involves disregarding norms of cooperation and consensus building. What I would argue is that this need to exploit the fruits of victory may also encourage a few supporters of the

## Bolsonaro wins Brazil election, promises to purge leftists from country

fter the most polarized and divi-A fter the most polarized and divisive campaign in its modern history, Brazil has elected as its next president a right-wing politician who openly disdains human rights and admires ilitary dictators.

Jair Bolsonaro, a 63-year-old con-

gressman who had strong evangelical backing for his law-and-order stance on policing, support for gun rights and opposition to abortion, won 55 percent of votes. Bolsonaro's leftist competitor, Fernando Haddad, a former education minister and ex-mayor of São Paulo, received 45 percent of the roughly 100 million ballots cast.

Bolsonaro's angry, populist cam-paign rhetoric led many newspapers and public figures worldwide to declare his candidacy a threat to democracy. But 57.8 million Brazilians on Sunday showed less concern about Bolsonaro's message.

Haddad, his opponent, joined Bra-zil's presidential race less than a month before the first round of voting. The Workers Party, which has run Brazil since 2002, tapped Haddad to replace front-runner Inacio Lula de Silva, a wildly popular former president jailed on corruption charges in July. Haddad was unable to retain Lula's lead.

### BRAZIL'S POLITICS OF DIS-ILLUSIONMENT

Bolsonaro's victory will likely worsen an already acute crisis in Brazil, the second-most populous nation in the Western Hemisphere.

Once a rising star in the developing world, Brazil has been mired in severe recession and political turmoil since 2015. Hundreds of politicians, including former President Lula, have been arrested and jailed in a judicial investigation that has exposed corruption at

the highest levels of government.

That corruption has consequences: A survey conducted in August by the Brazilian Institute of Public Opinion and Statistics showed that only 25 percent of citizens trusted their federal government and 18 percent trusted Congress.

In such circumstances, Bolsona-



didate was predictable – and not just because Bolsonaro had maintained a clear lead in the polls ever since Lula withdrew in September.

When voters don't believe in their politicians or government institutions, candidates who tap into voter disdain for the political system can find suc-cess. In my scholarly research on de-mocratization, this is what I call the "politics of disillusionment."

This phenomenon helped conservative outsiders to win in the United States, Italy and Hungary. Now, disillusionment in Brazil has

handed victory to a right-wing populist who promises to purge the country of his leftist opponents.

"Either they go overseas, or they go to jail," he told a huge crowd in São Paulo in one of his last appearances be-Sunday's vote.

INFLAMMATORY RHETORIC

AND MILITARISM

Bolsonaro has been in Congress for three decades. But to harness popular rage against the system, his campaign offered an outsider's scathing critique of Brazilian society.

In response to rampant political corruption and extreme violence in Brazil, Bolsonaro defended military dictator-ships like the one that ran Brazil from 1964 to 1985. The only problem with

Brazil's former authoritarian leaders, Bolsonaro said, was that they "tortured

rather than killed" dissenters.

Critics say his adulation of the military raises serious doubts about the fu-

ture of Brazil's 33-year-old democracy.

Bolsonaro, a former army captain, regularly uses homophobic, misogynistic and racist rhetoric against large swaths of Brazil's population. He has said that he would "never allow" his chil-dren to get romantically involved with a black person and that he was "incapable

of loving a homosexual son."

Bolsonaro also once told a fellow congressional representative that she "did not deserve to be raped" by him because she was "terrible and ugly." His candidacy was met by outrage

#### and mass protest by women. THE PRESIDENT-ELECT'S

AMBIGUOUS POLICY AGENDA
Beyond his inflammatory rhetoric, Bolsonaro has offered few specifics about

how he would govern Brazil.

He skipped presidential debates
and avoided tough questions about whether he would make economic and political reforms to help get Brazil out of its three-year-long crisis.

To tackle record-high crime, the president-elect has said he will ease gun laws and reduce the age of crim-inal responsibility from 18 to 16. He is a staunch proponent of restarting the death penalty in Brazil, saying he would "voli nteer to kill those on death row" himself

Brazil has the world's third-largest prison population. Sixty-four percent

of those incarcerated are black.

Bolsonaro also wants to end affirmative action at Brazilian public uni-

He considers abortion to be mur der. The procedure is banned in Brazil, but in recent years women's groups have been pushing to liberalize abortion laws. That is unlikely to happen under Bolsonaro.

Some analysts have suggested that Congress may rein in Bolsonaro's more radical tendencies. But evidence from the United States and elsewhere suggests that in the politics of disillusion presidents who campaign as extremist govern as extremists.

Bolsonaro takes office on Jan. 1.

Brazil's political institutions, already weakened by corruption and public outrage, will face great pressure to show that they can withstand the new president's populist ambitions and militaristic instincts. It is a daunting challenge for Brazil's

ing and, I fear, faltering democracy.

ministry said.

It added that suitable action will be taken on complaints once such guidelines are in existence.

had Chaturvedi sought copies of corre-spondences from the Personnel Ministry related to a plea filed by him on July 15 last year with the president's secretariat.

The president's office forwarded it to the Per-

sonnel Ministry on July 27.

The plea was filed by Chaturvedi invoking Section 6 of the CVC Act that empowers the president to refer cases of allegation of misconduct against the CVC for enquiry by Supreme Court,

The secretariat had forwarded the application to the Personnel Ministry for necessary action.

Chaturvedi had alleged that the CVC closed cases of corruption involving senior function-aries in Delhi's All India Institute of Medical Sciences (AIIMS).

Chaturvedi, who has sought probe against Central Vigilance Commissioner KV Chowdary, had sent documents, running into almost 1,000 pages, in support of his claim to the office of the president.

He shared the details of seven cases with the president's secretariat. These include one on his alleged victimisation while was chief vigilance officer (CVO) at AIIMS.

Chaturvedi served as the CVO, that acts as the distant arm of the CVC to check corruption, at AIIMS from July 2012 to August 2014.

He has brought various corruption cases to the notice of the CBI during his tenure. The CBI, after a detailed probe, recommended departmental action in four cases, naming officers and senior faculty members, which were closed by the CVC, reveal documents accessed by Chaturvedi through an RTI.

Chaturvedi then anroached the president's office for taking necessary action against the CVC.

## Two policemen, DD cameraman killed in Naxal attack in Chattisgarh

RAIPUR, OCT 29 (PTI): Two policemen and a cameraperson of Doordar-shan were killed and two others were injured in a Maoist attack on Tuesday in poll-bound Chhattis-garhs Dantewada district.

The incident took place at around 11 am in a forest area near Nilawaya vil-lage, around 450 kms from here, Deputy Inspector General (anti-naxal opera-tions) Sundarraj P told PTI.

The maoists ambushed a squad of local police which was carrying out patrolling on motor cycles from Sameli camp towards Nilawaya on Tuesday morning, he said.

of Doordarshan was travelling for election-related news coverage at the same time and was caught in the cross-fire, he said.

In the attack, Sub Inspector Rudra Pratap Singh, Assistant Constable Mangalu and DD News Cameraman Achyutanand Sahu were killed. Sundarrai said.

Advising people to take precautionary measures, the DC asked them not to panic or create panic.



NEW YORK, OCT 30 (PTI): In wake of the IL&FS crisis, efforts are underway by the Indian government, RBI as well as SBI to try and stabilise the system very quick-ly , and things are likely to return to normal in a couple of weeks, SBI Chairman Rajnish Kumar said here.

Kumar said that the Infrastructure Leasing and Financial Services (IL&FS) was a unique institution operating in the infrastructure financing

and construction space.

It is an engineering, procurement and contor, holding assets as well as its finances - it was a 3-in-1, Kumar said, adding that whether it is banks or non-banking financial companies (NBFCs), if they are in infrastructure financing, they have faced trouble in India. Infrastructure.

wake of the IL&FS crisis, the SBI stepped up in a big way.

This is how we are

trying to stabilise the system and tackle the situation. RBI has announced measures around improving liquidity for NBFCs. The government, RBI and SBI - all of us are trying that the system stabilises very quickly.

I believe it is a matter of time - a couple of weeks when things return to normal, he said.

IL&FS and its subsidiaries have defaulted on several debt repayments recently due to liquidity crisis. It needs an imme diate capital infusion of Rs 3,000 crore and is also planning a Rs 4,500-crore rights issue.

The company as of March 2018 owed over Rs 91,000 crore to banks and other creditors. On October 1, the government superseded the board of IL&FS and appointed a new board, with banker Uday Kotak as its executive chairman.

On the Insolvency and Bankruptcy Code, introduced in 2016, Kumar

said he considers it the most significant reform that the current government has carried out. It's a new law, a new

process. So obviously, there are some hiccups because there are issues around how the provisions of the code are interpreted," he said.

It is very hard for the existing promoters to believe that there is a law and a real threat of them losing control of the business. It's never happened in India in the past. That's where the fight is, but this was very badly needed, he said.

He said, going for-

ward, the litigation will come down and the resolution will happen within the time frame of 180-270 days.

For this process to succeed, it is important that cases are referred at the earliest sign of trou ble. Definitely there's a paradigm shift in the creditor-debtor relationship in India, he added.

He said as a potential weapon, the Insolvency and Bankruptcy Code works very well, but we have to be careful before we exercise it. The threat works much better than the actual resolution.

"President Trump was honoured by Prime Min-ister Modi's invitation for him to be Chief Guest of India's Republic Day on January 26, 2019 but is unable to participate due to scheduling constraints," a White House spokesperson told PTI on Monday, when asked about Trump's decision on Modi's invitation.

It is said that the annual address to both Houses of the US Congress by Trump is likely to be around the time India will celebrate its Republic Day. The SOTU is mally delivered in the last week of January or first week of February.

The spokesperson said that the US President and enjoy a strong per sonal rapport and Trump is committed to deepening

the India-US relationship.
"The President enjoys a strong personal rapport with Prime Minister Modi developed through two meetings and several phone calls and remains commit ted to deepening the US-In-dia strategic partnership, the spokesperson said.

"The President very much looks forward to meeting Prime Minister Modi again at the earliest

opportunity," the White House spokesperson said. Modi and Trump are scheduled to attend the G-20 Summit in Argentina

## Sri Lanka braces for protest over PM's sacking

Sri Lanka on Tuesday braced for a protest called by ousted prime minister Ranil Wickremesinghe's party against what it said was a "coup" by President Maithripala Sirisena which has triggered a political crisis in the country.

Sri Lanka, a Bud-dhist-majority nation in the Indian Ocean, was plunged into chaos on Friday when President Siris-ena sacked Prime Minis-ter Wickremesinghe in a surprise move. He also suspended parliament in an apparent bid to shore up support for newly appointed Prime Minister Mahinda Rajapaksa. Sirisena is under in-

creasing political and diplomatic pressure to reconvene parliament and resolve the . constitutional crisis.

Wickremesinghe's



United National Party (UNP) is set to hold a protest on Tuesday in the capital, Colombo.

"We are calling upon all sections of the society who believe in democracy and rule of law to gather and protest," Champika Ranawaka, a

former minister said.

Mangala Samaraweera. the ex-finance minister un-der Wickremesinghe said, "This was a constitutional coup and it is our duty to rotect democracy and overeignty of people".

Speaker Karu Jayasur-

iva urged the president to let Wickremesinghe prove his majority support on the parliament floor.

The supporters of Rajapaksa, a former presi-dent, are confident that he would be able to prove majority support on the parliament floor as they are sure that members of Wickremesinghe's UNP would defect

"We are waiting for more UNP members to join us. We have the numbers," Lakshman Yapa Abeywardena, a Rajapaksa lovalist, said.

Wickremesinghe has said that he still commands the majority. However, he suffered a setback after four lawmakers from his party, who had pledged allegiance to him in the public, took a U-turn and accepted ministerial positions in the Rajapaksa government.
"We have the majority

despite four of them joining Rajapaksa," Ranjith Madduma Bandara, an ex-minister, said.

Speaker Jayasuriya has called for a meeting of all party leaders to assess the current political situbers had written to him calling for reconvening of

Jayasuriya has insisted that the issue needs to be settled within parliament.

The crisis turned deadly Sunday when the bodyguard of a former cabinet minister fired on a crowd. killing at least one person and wounding two others.

Wickremesinghe on Monday he had obtain the signatures of 126 MPs calling for parliament to be returned immediately to end the political standoff.

Both camps are working to secure their numbers in parliament.

Rajapaksa's tenure as president was marred by allegations of authoritarianism, corruption and human rights abuses, especially against the country's Tamil minority.

He was defeated at the

2015 presidential elections when Wickremesinghe and Sirisena formed an unlikely coalition, and their gov ernment initiated several Rajapaksa-era crimes.

## More body parts found from crashed Indonesian jet

Jakarta, Oct 30 (AFP): Indonesian search teams Tuesday recovered more remains at the site of a crashed Lion Air jet that plunged into the sea with 189 people aboard, as a report said it had suffered instrument malfunc-

tion the day before. The Boeing-737 MAX, which went into service just months ago, crashed into the Java Sea moments after it had asked to return to Jakarta on Monday. Flight JT 610 sped up

as it suddenly lost altitude and then vanished from radar 13 minutes after take-off, with authorities saying witnesses saw the jet plunge into the water.

Dozens of divers are

taking part in the recov-

Search teams have filled ten body bags with limbs and other human remains, Muhammad Syaunational search and rescue agency told Metro TV, savng they will be taken to Ja-carta for identification and DNA testing.

The remains of a baby

were among those found, according to national deputy police chief Ari Dono nanto.

Another 14 bags filled with debris have also been collected. Shoes, items of clothing and a wallet are among

"We are prioritising nding the main wreckage of the plane using five war ships equipped with sonar to detect metal un-derwater," said Yusuf Latif, spokesman of the Indonesian search and rescue

agency. Both the cockpit voice recorder and the flight data recorder -- which could be key pieces of evidence -- are still missing.

The plane had been en route to Pangkal Pinang city, a jumping off point for beach-and-sun seeking tourists on nearby Belitung island, when it dropped out of contact around 6:30 am (2330 GMT).

Lion Air said the plane ad only gone into service in August.

The pilot and co-pi-lot had more than 11,000 hours of flying time between them and had undergone recent medical checkups and drug testing, it added.

On Monday, Lion Air chief Edward Sirait acknowledged the plane had an unspecified technical issue fixed in Bali before it was

flown back to Jakarta, calling it "normal procedure".

A technical logbook detailed an "unreliable" airspeed reading instrument on the Bali-Jakarta flight on Sunday and different altitude readings on the captain and first ferent altitude readin officer's instruments, according to the BBC.

Copies of several Lion Air technical documents have been circulating on social media, but they could not be immediately

confirmed as authentic. The company did not return phones calls seek-ing comment.

Boeing suspended release of the 737 MAX just days before its first com-mercial delivery last year due to an engine issue, according to airline safety

and product review site airlineratings.com. It said the engines

were a product of a joint were venture been ased General as's Sa between US-eneral Electric and France's Safran Aircraft Engines. Lion Air, Indonesia's biggest budget airline which has been engaged in huge expansion, an-nounced earlier this year it

was buying 50 Boeing 737 MAX 10 jets for 6.24 billion. Indonesia's air trav-el industry is booming,

with the number of domestic passengers growpast decade, but it has acquired a reputation for poor regulation and its airlines had previously been banned from US and European airspace.

Lion has been involved a number of incidents including a fatal 2004 crash and a collision between two Lion Air planes at Jakarta's Soekarno-Hatta airport.


