SIKKIM REITERATES REJECTION OF CAB

SPYF call for protest rally receives wide support

m eople}$ from different walks of life registered a strong protest against the recently amended Citizenship Act 2019 here in Gangtok on Saturday. A protest rally organized by Sikkim Progressive Youth Forum [SPYF] was joined by leaders of different political parties, social and political activists, students from colleges and universities of the State and students of North-Eastern States especially those from Assam studying in Sikkim.

Protestors in the rally, which started from Amdo Golai, carried banners and placards with slogans like 'Sikkim Rejects CAB', 'No CAB', 'We Want Quality Education Not CAB', 'Withdraw CAB', 'Solidarity with People who have Lost their Life in the Protest Against CAB, 'Stand with Assam' and others.

The rally covered Indira By-Pass Road and ended in front of District Administrative Centre [East]. The rally ended with participants burning copies of the Act to register their protest.

Sharma mentioned that the rally was mainly to protest the recently amended Citizenship Act and to demand

Inner Line Permit for Sikkim. "Everyone needs to come together on this serious issue. We are speaking in our own language and talking about our culture and tradition but there is no guarantee that our future generation will get to do so," he said.

He said that the people of Sikkim are becoming a minority in their own State and if this Act is implemented in the State then it will open the floodgates for serious influx in the State.

"We are still silent even after CAB has been passed but everyone needs to come together to protect our rights and privileges and to protect our identity as Sikkimese. We gave up our country to become a part of India. Conditions for the merger with India need to be protected," Mr Sharma asserted.

He stated that Sikkim is also standing in solidarity with the people of Assam and other parts of North

SPYF member, Shankar East where intense protests against the act are going on.

> "The statement of the Union Home Minister that Sikkim is exempted is not enough but it should be written into the act. So, we reject this act and at the same time we demand ILP in Sikkim," Mr Sharma asserted. He informed that SPYF will start a state-wide signature campaign demanding ILP for Sikkim.

> Another SPYF member, Prakash Parajuli expressed that providing Indian citizenship to people from other countries would directly affect the economy, culture, ethnicity, system and customs of the country and the State.

She appealed to people in rest of India to stand with Assam and North Eastern States.

"It might seem to be a problem of Assam at present but it is the problem of every Indian," Ms Borgohain said.

remperatures in Gang-**⊥** tok dipped to the lowest this winter hitting -2 Degree Celsius on Saturday morning. Higher reaches of Sikkim began receiving heavy snowfall on Friday causing the temperatures to drop all over the State.

Tsomgo and Nathula in East Sikkim and Lachen-Lachung in North Sikkim received heavy snowfall on Friday which continued till Saturday. Roads were also blocked in various places which received heavy snowfall.

Popular tourist destinations like Tsomgo. Nathula, Lachen, Lachung and other places were closed for vehicular traffic due to road blockades.

No permits were issued for Nathula and Tsomgo today, sources inform.

As per the report of the Meteorological Department, Gangtok, re-

perature of 5.4 Degree Celsius and the maximum temperature remained at 12.7 Degree Celsius in the last 24 hours.

Minimum temperatures across all the four districts have dropped in the last few days. As per the online weather forecast site, World Weather Forecast, the minimum temperature of Gangtok slipped to -2 Degree Celsius in the morning and the average maximum was 12 Degree Celsius today.

Namchi in South Sikkim today recorded minimum temperature of 7.5 Degree Celsius and maximum temperature of 16.3 Degree Celsius.

In North Sikkim, Mangan recorded a maximum temperature of 17.4 Degree Celsius and minimum temperature of 7.3 Degree Celsius. Similarly, Gyalshing in West Sikkim recorded minimum tempera-



ture of 8 Degree Celsius and maximum temperature of 13 Degree Celsius. The above mentioned temperatures are of the past 24 hours.

'My name is Rahul Gandhi, not Rahul Savarkar; will die, but will never apologise'

New Delhi, Dec 14 (PTI): Congress leader Rahul Gandhi on Saturday said he "will die but never apologise" for speaking the "truth" as he is a Gandhi and not a Savarkar, and asked Prime Minister Narendra Modi and his "assistant" Amit Shah instead to apologise for "destroying" the economy of the country.

Addressing the Congress' mega "Bharat Bachao Rally" at Ramlila grounds here, he took a dig at the BJP for demanding an apology for his "rape in India" remark and said, "The BJP asked me to apologise. My name is not Rahul Savarkar, it is Rahul Gandhi, and I will never apologise for speaking the truth."

"I will die, but I will not apologise for speaking the truth and nor will any Congressman do so. It is Narendra Modi and his assistant Amit Shah who have to apologise to the country for destroying India's economy," he asserted.

Prime Minister Modi of single-handedly "destroying" the country's economy, he said, "All of India's enemies wanted that its economy, which is its strength, should be destroyed."

"That work (of destroying the economy)

He said it is only the PM and no other opposition leader who can be seen on television.



What Boris Johnson's victory means for Britain's place in the world

With Boris Johnson's impressive election victory, one of the biggest questions in British politics will be answered: Brexit, in some form, will be done.

But what does this election victory mean for Britain's standing in the world? Who will the UK now count as its allies, and its enemies?

The manner of Brexit matters in terms of Britain's global standing. The large majority he has secured might give Johnson more room for manoeuvre in Westminster, making a softer Brexit possible. This would undoubtedly allow for smoother relations with the UK's neighbours, but a softer Brexit might also have more advantages globally.

Overseas, Brexit is viewed as a form of national self-harm by many, and a softer departure may well prevent Britain's international standing from being substantially damaged. A softer Brexit, which might involve some freedom of movement, may also allow Britain to strike a stronger bargaining position in future trade negotiations with both the EU and other nations. By remaining at least partially linked to the EU, Britain would be able to present itself in trade negotiations as part of a larger market, giving it more power and a louder voice.

US AND CHINA

Beyond Brexit, Johnson and US President Donald Trump will undoubtedly remain close, meaning the so-called "special relationship" will be publicly supported and championed. This public friendship may not make Johnson popular on the global stage, but with his majority, and a potential victory for Trump in November 2020, he may not care.

Bonhomie aside, the extent that camaraderie between Johnson and Trump will benefit Britain is more questionable. Securing a favourable post-Brexit trade deal with the US will remain very challenging.

Britain is already looking to strengthen economic and political ties with Commonwealth countries - Australia's prime minister, Scott Morrison, swiftly tweeted his congratulations to Johnson. The reality of leaning on the Commonwealth will not be as lucrative as membership of the EU, but the Conservatives are keen to draw on it none-

Specific countries, like India, will become increasingly important. An economic pow-



erhouse, the UK will want to secure a trade deal with India. But at what cost? For India, any trade deal with the UK will have to come with the promise of a relaxation of the visa requirements for Indian nationals. That pay-off may be difficult for Johnson to sell to an electorate which has been repeatedly promised a reduction in immigration and a tightening up of immigration policy from the Conservatives.

China will be another key relationship to watch in future. Relations with China have not been particularly good over the past 20 years. For example China froze investment into the UK under the coalition government following David Cameron's meeting with the Dalai Lama in 2012. Johnson's government will be looking to improve this relationship in the hope of a beneficial trade deal.

But how can this be achieved? One recent example is the Conservative government's response to the pro-democracy protests in Hong Kong. It might be expected, because of Britain's historic links with Hong Kong and Britain's desire to maintain democracy in the territory, that Johnson's Conservatives would be outspoken in their support of the democratic movements.

Instead, the Johnson government has been quiet on the violence in the territory, a response which will undoubtedly please the Chinese government. It may be that silence

is the cost of a future trade deal with China - a stance which has changed from under the leadership of Theresa May, where Jeremy Hunt was fairly outspoken on Hong Kong while foreign secretary.

WEAKENED

For a post-Brexit Britain, there will undoubtedly be some economic opportunities, but there is a cost. Outside of the EU, Britain is a much smaller power on the global stage, both economically and politically.

To secure those all-important trade deals, Britain will have to decide what pay-offs it is willing to make. For all his bluster, Johnson may have to swallow some uncomfortable truths and some uncomfortable compromises. Whether he can sell those at home is an-

The size of the Conservatives' victory will hammer the final nail in the coffin of the hopes of those in the EU, and in the UK, who wanted a reversal of Brexit. Johnson is not a popular man in Europe, but Brexit fatigue has made his European counterparts keen to work with him to get Brexit finished. While securing a trade deal with the EU by the end of December 2020 will be tricky, it is also in the EU's interest to make sure that trade remains smooth.

Bougainville has voted to become a new country, but the journey to independence is not yet over

T he Autonomous Region of Bougainville, a chain of islands that lie 959 kilometres northwest of Papua New Guinea's capital, Port Moresby, has voted unequivocally for independence.

The referendum saw 85% voter turnout during three weeks of voting, with 97.7% of voters choosing independence from Papua New Guinea over the second option, which was remaining, but with greater autonomy from PNG. As the Bougainville Referendum Commission stated, the numbers told an important story, reflecting the support for independence across genders and age groups.

It's a momentous event, not only because it could a new country, but also because the referendum marks an important part of a peace agreement signed almost 20 years ago. The 2001 Bougainville Peace Agreement ended the deeply divisive nine year conflict (1988-1997) that lead to the deaths of approximately 20,000 people, or about 10% of Bougainville's population.

The referendum, however, is non-binding. The ultimate outcome will be determined by a vote in Papua New Guinea's National Parliament following negotiations between the Papua New Guinean government and the Autonomous Bougainville Government.

But as former President James Tanis said to me hours after the result was announced: "we survived the war, ended the war, delivered a successful referendum, what else can now stop us from becoming a successful independent nation?"

CHINA'S INTEREST IN BOUGAINVILLE

For the broader region, an independent Bougainville has a number of implications. Firstly, it sends a strong signal for other self-determination movements across the Pacific, including in New Caledonia which will hold a second referendum for independence in 2020.

There are also geopolitical implications. The referendum has taken place during a period of heightened strategic anxiety among the Pacific's so-called traditional partners - Australia, New Zealand and the United States, as well as the United Kingdom, France and Japan.

There have long been concerns China will seek to curry influence with an independent Bougainville. As one Bougainvillean leader informed me, Chinese efforts to build relationships with Bou-



gainville's political elite have increased over the

Beijing's interest in Bougainville is two-fold: first, it is seeking to shore up diplomatic support in the Pacific Islands region, thereby reducing support for Taiwan which lost a further two Pacific allies this year. And second, to access to resources, namely fisheries and extractive minerals.

Although it will be tempting for many in Canberra, Washington and Wellington to view an independent Bougainville through the current strategic prism – adhering to narratives about debt-trap diplomacy - doing so undermines the importance of local dynamics and the resilience of Bougain-

An independent Bougainville navigating a more disordered and disruptive international environment will need nuanced grounded advice, rather than speculation.

The road ahead for Bougainville will be challenging and it will need its friends - particularly New Zealand and Australia.

The much vaunted respective "Pacific Reset" and "Pacific Step Up" policies provide entry points for the kind of genuine engagement and support

that Bougainville will require in the coming years. CELEBRATION WITH CAUTIOUS ANTICIPA-

Following the result's announcement, Papua New Guinea's Prime Minister James Marape said his government had heard the voice of Bougainvilleans, and the two governments must now develop a road map that leads to lasting political settle-

And Bougainville Referendum Commission chairman Bertie Ahern urged all sides to recognise the result and said the vote was about "your peace, your history, and your future" and reflected "the power of the pen over weapons". Acknowledging the result is non-binding, Ahern said: "the referendum is one part of that ongoing journey."

And here lies the challenge. The post-referendum period was always going to be one of celebration, cautious anticipation and the management of

As one of Bougainville's formidable women leaders told me, there are concerns about security in the post-referendum period as expectation turns to frustration if there are perceived delays in determining Bougainville's future political status.

What's more, the negotiations are likely to take a long time, since there's no deadline they're required to meet.

There are, however, critical milestones that still need to be hit first. This includes the Autonomous Bougainville Government elections, the first elections following the referendum, so will likely see intensified politicking as politicians jockey for a potential role in building an independent Bougain-

The Papua New Guinea's national elections are also scheduled for 2022. The risk in both cases is that Bougainville's future becomes a political

An independent Bougainville will face significant challenges and diverse choices.

Not least of which is Bougainville's economic security and the choices that will need to be made about the Panguna Mine, the gold and copper mine at the heart of much of the conflict, and fisheries, once the new nation's 200-mile Exclusive Economic Zone is created.

A young nation built on a past mired by the extremes of resource nationalism, Bougainville has difficult decisions to make about how it secures its economic self-reliance.

Tea growers feel pinch of Assam protests, fear less production, sales

KOLKATA, DEC 14 (PTI): Tea growers in Assam have started feeling the pinch of the ongoing protests with partial disruption in production at many gardens and sale of the crop at the Guwahati auction centre being hampered, industry insiders said on Saturday.

Transportation of the produce has also been affected due to the ongoing stir, they said.

"Though winter months are not the peak season, plucking and manufacturing operations in many gardens across the state have been affected amid widespread protest," North Eastern Tea Association adviser Bidyananda Barkakoty told PTI.

Compared to last few years, the weather condition was favourable during this December and the growers were able to produce relatively better quality tea but operations at several estates have been adversely affected by the protests, he added.

"During Tuesday's shutdown, gardens were mostly closed. Plucking activities took place on Friday but not in a fullfledged scale as many workers could not come due to lack of transport," All Assam Small Tea Growers' Association general secretary Karuna Mahnata told PTI.

The legislation has put the state on boil as people fear that it may exacerbate the problem of illegal immigration.

Violent protests broke out in the state earlier this week with agitators engaging in pitched battles with the police, forcing the administration to impose curfew in several places.

Planters also said the Tea Board has extended the plucking time till December 19 on account of shortage and non-availability of workers.

The board had earlier asked them to shut plucking and manufacturing operations by mid-December to prevent production of inferior quality tea, according to growers.

Suspension of internet services has also affected their business.

"Due to the internet suspension and violent protests, several tea growers are apprehending that they may face difficulties to pay wages to workers as banking services might be affected. Usually, payments to labourers are made either on Friday or Saturday," Barkakoty said.

Sales of tea at the Guwahati auction centre have also been disrupted.

"Every week, around 40-45 lakh kgs of tea is sold.

But, only 15 lakh kg has been sold so far this week," Guwahati Tea Auction Buyers' Association Secretary

Dinesh Bihani said.

Barkakoty said planters are also apprehending that if the ongoing protests continue for a prolonged period, the pruning activities and other agricultural processes which usually happen during the winters might get disrupted.

Violent protests continue in Bengal, several buses, rly station torched

KOLKATA, DEC 14 (PTI) Violent agitations continued to rock parts of West Bengal for second consecutive day on Saturday as people protesting against the amended Citizenship Act set several buses on fire and torched portions of a railway station complex, officials said.

Incidents of violence were reported from Murshidabad and North 24 Paraganas districts, and rural Howrah, police said.

Angry protestors torched around 15 buses, both public and private, and blocked traffic on the arterial Kona Expressway in Howrah that connect both NH6 (Mumbai Road) and NH2 (Delhi Road) to Kolkata, the police said.

Traffic movement along the expressway came to a standstill, they

The National Highway 34, one of the main roads that connect north and south Bengal, was blocked in Murshidabad.

Buses were also set on fire there, the police

Several other roads protestors, they said.



in the district were also blocked, they said.

In Howarh district's Domjur area, the National Highway 6 was blocked as protestorsr set tyres ablaze and ransacked several vehicles, the police said.

A huge police contingent was at the spot to control the situation, they said.

Since last night, 20 shops have been set on fire in Bagnan area of Rural Howrah, an official said.

A portion of the Sankrail railway station complex in Howrah district was also set on fire in the afternoon by hundreds of

They also thrashed personnel of the Railway Police Force present at the station.

Train movements were also blocked in the Sealdah- Hasnabad section of the Eastern Railway.

The agitators staged sit-ins on the tracks at Shondaliya and Kakra Mirzapur stations of the section, a railway spokesperson said.

Train services have also come to a halt in the Howrah-Kharagpur section of the South Eastern Railway since 11 am, as protesters sat on the tracks at Sankrail, Nalpur, Mourigram and rah-Digha-Howrah Kan-

Bakranawabaz stations, said zonal spokesperson Sanjoy Ghosh.

Twenty trains, including eight express trains, have been stopped at various stations in the South Eastern zone, a railway official said.

Several trains have also been cancelled in the stretch.

RJD calls for Bihar bandh on Dec 21 in protest against citizenship law



PATNA, DEC 14 (PTI): Lalu Prasad's Rashtriya Janata Dal has given call for a Bihar bandh on December 21 in protest against the amended Citizenship Act, alleging that it has blown the Constitution to smithereens.

Tejashwi Yadav, Prasad's younger son and heir apparent, made the announcement late on Friday night, urging all political and non-political outfits having "faith in the Constitution and the principle of justice" to take part in the bandh which was initially scheduled for December 22, but was later preponed so that the police recruitment exams next Sunday were not affect-

"The Citizenship (Amendment) Bill is a black legislation that has blown the Constitution to smithereens. As a mark of protest, Rashtriya Janata Dal will organize a Bihar bandh on Sunday, December 22.

"We appeal to all secular parties, non-political outfits and common citizens who have faith in the Constitution and the principle of justice to wholeheartedly support the bandh and help us make it a success," he tweeted.

The 30-year-old leader of opposition followed it up with another tweet

"Correction: Bihar bandh will now be on Saturday, December 21 because police recruitment tests are scheduled on December 22. and nothing more than The rescheduling is be-scaremongering and aping done so that young aspirants are not inconvenienced on account of the bandh."

Founded in 1997 after which it ruled Bihar for eight more years, the RJD is known for using strong arm tactics to enforce shutdowns which bring normal life to a standstill, sometimes even resulting in violence and massive disruptions of rail and road traffic.

The party has been going through a rough patch since the Lok Sabha polls this year wherein it put up its worst-ever performance and failed to win a single seat.

Turmoil in Chief Minister Nitish Kumar's JD(U) over supporting the Bill in Parliament, which is expected to dent his popularity among the state's Muslims, has prompted the opposition party to come out of torpor and bring itself back into the reckoning with assembly polls less than a year

Meanwhile, the BJP - the party in power at the Centre and the JD(U)'s coalition partner in Bihar - took exception to the vociferous opposition to the Bill and condemned it as "scaremongering and appeasement of Muslims".

Bihar BJP spokesman Nikhil Anand said in his reply to Yadav's tweet: "brother, please take the trouble to read the Citizenship Amendment Bill at least once, in its entirety, ask questions that may thus arise and thereafter even run a campaign for further amendments if such a need is felt. But such rants against a legislation that has already been passed by both Houses of Parliament are shameful peasement of Muslims".

Internet services suspended across Assam till Monday



Manley to McTominay: 4,000 victories for Manchester United's academy

Ccott McTominay is **S**the latest poster boy for a remarkable Manchester United academy that has produced the Busby Babes, George Best and the Class of 92, and which will provide a player to the matchday squad for the 4,000th game in succession when Everton visit on Sunday.

McTominay blooded at the age of 20 by José Mourinho in a 2-0 defeat at Arsenal in May 2017 and by the end of the following campaign had received the manager's player of the season award.

McTominay, spotted at five when he attended a development centre in Preston, is the epitome of a system that has sourced United's top five appearance makers: Ryan Giggs, Sir Bobby Charlton, Bill Foulkes, Paul Scholes and Gary Neville.

Of the 4,000 landmark, he says: "It's amazing. Whenever we were in the vouth team we had different members of staff saying to us about the consecutive matches we've had a youth player from the academy in. To get to 4,000 is incredible and a real credit to the staff who have invested so much in every player who has contributed."

The run began on 30 October 1937 in a second division game at Fulham when Tom Manley and Jackie Wassall were in a United XI that lost 1-0. During the next eight decades the nascent careers of Dennis

Viollet (1940s), Duncan Edwards (1950s), Best (1960s), Norman Whiteside (1970s), Giggs (1980s), Scholes (1990s), Paul Pogba (2000s), and Andreas Pereira (2010s) would presage them becoming first-team regulars and taking a place in the roll call of the academy's headline successes.


In this billing the Busby Babes and Class of 92 are prominent. The former were developed under Sir Matt Busby, with the manager's assistant, Jimmy Murphy, and chief scout, Joe Bishop, executing his vision.

This stellar group formed the core of the consecutive title-winners of 1955-56 and 1956-57 before eight - Roger Byrne, Mark Jones, Eddie Coleman, Edwards, Billy Whelan, Tommy Taylor, David Pegg and Geoff Bent - were killed in the Munich air disaster of 1958, with Jackie Blanchflower's career ended by the injuries he suffered.

This glittering and tragic history has informed the subsequent culture of the academy, says Nick Cox, who succeeded Nicky Butt as its head in the summer.

"If you think back

to what Sir Matt Busby tried to create, he made the point that people who pay to watch have been grafting in the factories all week," Cox says. "They're local folk, this is their one release and we have a duty to entertain and show them we're the same, but just privileged to be on the pitch. When it's local boys that con-



nection becomes even greater and more pow-

Butt, Giggs, David Beckham, Gary and Phil Neville and Scholes became known as the Class of 92 because of the role the first four of them had in the FA Youth Cup triumph of that year and their status as mainstays of Sir Alex Ferguson's stellar side in the mid-1990s to early 2000s, whose 1999 Treble triumph remains the domestic game's greatest

They were in a second wave of "Fergie Fledglings" developed under the Scot, whose commitment to youth began with the late-1980s crop that included Russell Beardsmore and Lee Martin.

Cox follows a long tradition of United talent scouts and developers. Luminaries include Bob Bishop, who discovered Best and Whiteside; Murphy, who was prominent in healing a near-broken club until Busby recovered; and Eric Harrison,

the youth team coach from 1981 until 2008.

Cox says: "What we're doing here is producing the equivalent of gold medallists and spacemen who are landing on the moon. To produce young players who are ready to play at Old Trafford is the pinnacle. We're trying to create a rich ecosystem."

Many of those who do not make it have fine careers elsewhere. Cox says: "It's kids in our first team, kids playing professional football across the country but, more importantly, kids who have been enriched by the contact they've had with us."

Ole Gunnar Solskjær was made Mourinho's successor partly because of his belief in homegrown talent. The Norwegian has proved his commitment to it, though a net summer spend of only around £80m indicates pragmatism is at work, too.

Thursday's 4-0 Europa League win over AZ Alkmaar was graced by two goals from Mason Greenwood, an 18-yearold graduate. In 2019 Solskjær has given debuts to nine other clubreared products: Tahith Chong, James Garner, Brandon Williams, Ethan Laird, Di'Shon Bernard, Dylan Levitt, Ethan Galbraith, Largie Ramazani and D'mani Mellor.

There are 12 academy players in Solskjær's squad. They have played 38% of all first-team minutes in 2019-20 and assisted or scored 31 of United's 34 goals. November's 3-1 defeat of Brighton & Hove Albion featured the Premier League's youngest lineup this term with an average age of 23 years and 350 days.

Solskjær says: "Giving young players a chance is a tradition we are very proud of. It's part of our DNA and you learn that quickly when you join the club. Young players can only surprise and impress you when you give them a chance to show their talent. The 4,000 is a milestone we are proud of and long may it contin-

A subplot of the academy narrative concerns those who did not realise their potential. Ravel Morrison is one example, a midfielder rated very highly by Ferguson but who failed to make a league appearance before leaving in January 2012.

Cox says: "Maybe his character has held him back, but he is still a Premier League footballer [at Sheffield United] and doing OK."

Cox tutored Borussia Dortmund's Iadon Sancho when both were at Watford. "I've known him since he was seven but Jadon Sancho produced Jadon Sancho," says Cox. Sancho moved from Watford to Manchester City in 2015 and United face competition from their crosstown rival in the race to attract talent. If this reflects a lack of success in the Youth Cup since 2011 or at Under-18 Premier League level for six years,

Reminded of how Phil Neville and another former United player, Robin van Persie, chose to have their sons schooled at City, he says: "We've opted to do things a very Manchester United way. Where we set ourselves aside is that we have got some amazing developers of young people - they are not coaches - who have been here for a long while: Tony Whelan, Dave Bushell, Ea-

mon Mulvey. "We can register players at nine [and] clubs are active before that trying to assemble players. There is a massive debate among Premier League clubs about what should that look like in terms of the commitment you can make to a player.

Cox may have a point, as beyond Phil Foden City have struggled to produce a first-team squad regular since Micah Richards in 2005.

McTominay describes the values United imbue. "It's about general standards: being punctual, always wearing black boots until you get to the reserve team," he says. "There are no big egos, no kids coming in wearing jewellery. If a young player is doing that in the canteen I would certainly be one to say something and the same with other boys in the first team, and the manager as well.

"You don't realise how much things like that are going to help. You think: 'This is rubbish.' Now I look back and those standards have been passed through, so everybody has the idea of what a Manchester United player should look and be like - the DNA that comes with wearing that badge."

Cox's ambition is to produce a fresh wave of talent as impressive as the Class of 92. "We have to aspire to do that, absolutely," he says. "We have to believe it's possible."

Criticism mounts on WADA decision in Russia doping case

LAUSANNE, DEC 14 (PTI): Criticism of the World Anti-Doping Agency's sanctions against Russia mushroomed with a rebuke from the U.S. Olympic and Paralympic Committee coming on the heels of the outraged resignation of a member of the WADA athlete committee.

The USOPC and British Paralympian Victoria Aggar each expressed their disagreement with WADA's decision not to issue a blanket ban on the Russians in wake of evidence that government officials doctored data that was supposed to be used to prosecute cases stemming from the country's long-running doping scandal.

Aggar, a Paralympic rower, announced her resignation from WADA's athlete committee, saying "I simply can no longer be part of an organization that places politics over principle."



Hours later at its quarterly meeting, the USOPC board debated the wisdom of sanctions that called for innocent athletes to be able to compete as neutrals at next year's Olympics, even though determining who really is innocent has been made more difficult because of the data manipulation.

"It's very difficult for us to see how justice can be served and how there will be a true deterrent versus future corruption if any of the athletes from Russia have a right to compete in Tokyo under any flag, neutral or otherwise," USOPC chair Susanne Lyons said.

"If the data truly has been corrupted ... it's very unclear how you can decide and siphon out who's been part of the doping and who has not."

Earlier in the week, the chair of the British Olympic Association called for "the fullest possible sanctions to be taken against Russia at Tokyo 2020.'

It was the same stance that a majority of the WADA athlete committee took last weekend, before WADA executives met to rubber-stamp the recommendation would allow Russians to compete as neutrals.

The decision forced Aggar's hand, and led her to release a statement saying WADA's actions "have fundamentally shaken my belief in an organization that I felt initially served a great purpose in protecting the integrity of sports."

The USOPC's Athletes Advisory Council was among those supporting

"WADA's decision to ignore the majority of its own Athlete Committee ... is out of touch and the current sanctions will not be enough to cause significant change in Russia," the AAC said in a statement.

In an interview with The Associated Press on Thursday, WADA compliance chairman Jonathan Taylor said disallowing the Russian flag and its Olympic officials from the Tokyo Games, but not barring all its athletes, "was the appropriate line to draw.

ISTANBUL, DEC 14 (AFP): Arsenal's Mesut Ozil, a German footballer of Turkish origin, expressed support for

Uighurs in Xinjiang and criticised Muslim countries for their failure to speak up for them. "Korans are being

burnt... Mosques are being shut down ... Muslim schools are being banned ... Religious scholars are being killed one by one ... Brothers are forcefully being sent to camps," Ozil wrote in Turkish on his Twitter account.

"The Muslims are silent. Their voice is not heard," he wrote on a background of a blue field with a white crescent moon, the flag of what Uighur separatists call East Turkestan.

China has faced growing international condemnation for setting up a vast network of camps in Xinjiang aimed at homogenising the Uighur population to reflect China's majority Han culture.

Rights groups and experts say more than one million Uighurs and people of other mostly Muslim ethnic minorities have been rounded up in

the camps in the tightly-controlled region. After initially denying the camps existed, China describes them as vocational schools aimed at dampening the allure of

violence. Turkey, which takes its name from Turkic people who migrated from central Asia, is home to an Uighur community and has regularly raised concerns about the situation in Xinjiang.

Islamist extremism and

In his tweet, Ozil said Western states and media had kept the Uighur issue on their agenda and added: "what will be remembered years later would not be the torture by the tyrants but the silence of their Muslim brothers."

Arsenal moved to distance themselves from Ozil's comments in a bid to limit fallout in China. where the club has numerous commercial in-

terests.

"The content published is Ozil's personal opinion," the club said in a Chinese language post Saturday on its official account on the Twitter-like Weibo platform.

"As a football club, Arsenal has always adhered to the principle of not involving itself in politics."

But a few angry fans called for a ban on airing Arsenal games featuring

"I hope they ban Ozil's matches and business activities (in China)," wrote one Weibo user.

Another Chinese fan

said she "cried last night" after reading the post, which the star had also uploaded to Instagram.

"For over a decade, I've worn an Arsenal jersey with Ozil's number. It will never be worn again," she wrote on Wei-

Will not tolerate Iran's bad behaviour: US Defense Secretary

WASHINGTON, DEC 14 **(PTI):** The United States will not tolerate Iran's bad behaviour and it is focussed on internationalising the response to Iran's aggression by encouraging increased burden sharing and cooperation among its allies and partners, US Defense Secretary Mark Esper said on Friday.

"We are focussed on internationalising the response to Iran's aggression by encouraging increased burden sharing and cooperation among our allies and partners," Esper said during his appearance at the Council on Foreign Relations (CFR) think-tank.

Iran, he alleged, continued with its malign influence and widespread destabilising activities across the Middle East.

Its efforts had increased in recent months as it attacked targets in Saudi Arabia, disrupted commercial shipping through the Strait of Hormuz, shot down a US in international airspace and provided support to proxies, including the Houthis, Hezbollah and Shia militia groups in Iraq, Esper charged.

To address these threats, since May, nearly 14,000 US military personnel were deployed to the region to further enhance deterrence and demonstrate its commitment to allies and partners, he said, while asserting that these forces were not intended to signal an escalation, but rather to "buttress our efforts at deterrence".

The International Maritime Security Constructs, which protects freedom of navigation in the Persian Gulf and Gulf of Oman, includes contributions from the United Kingdom, Australia, Albania, Saudi Arabia, the United Arab Emirates and Bahrain, Esper said.

The more nascent international integrated air missile defence effort, led by Saudi Ara-

unmanned aerial vehicle bia, aimed to increase security by protecting critical infrastructure throughout the region, he added.

> "Through these actions, we are sending a clear message to Iran that the international community will not tolerate its bad behaviour," Esper said.

> In the Middle East, he said, the United States must remain committed to supporting a regional constellation of strategic partners to ensure the enduring defeat of the ISIS, while deterring Iran's acts of aggression.

> "In Syria and Iraq, the United States has achieved great success, working alongside our partner forces to destroy ISIS's physical caliphate and liberate millions of people living under its barbaric rule. This includes the successful operations that resulted in the death of ISIS's founder and leader Bakr al-Baghdadi as well as one of his top deputies," Esper said.

The "research successes" will be "applied to further bolstering up the reliable strategic nuclear deterrent" of North Korea, the spokesman added.

The statement did not provide further details on the test.

WASHINGTON, DEC 14 (PTI): US President Donald Trump on Friday said it was unfair that he was being impeached as he had done no wrong and the country under him was doing quite good.

"It's not fair that I'm being Impeached when I've done absolutely nothing wrong!," Trump said in a tweet on Friday night as a key Congressional committee, earlier in the day, approved the two articles of impeachment against him.

impeachment against Trump now moves to the House of Representatives, where the opposition Democratic Party enjoys a majority. Once passed by the House, the trial for impeachment would 100-member US Senate. where Trump's Republi-

can party has a majority. "The Radical Left, Do Nothing Democrats have become the Party of Hate. They are so bad for our Country!,"

Trump said in his tweet.

Earlier in the day, he described the impeachment as a hoax and politically motivated.

"The impeachment

started a long time ago, probably before I came down the escalator with the future First Lady. It started a long time ago," Trump told reporters earlier in the day at the White House

"It is a witch hunt. It is a sham. It is a hoax. Nothing was done wrong. Zero was done wrong. I think it is a horrible thing to be using the tool of impeachment, which is supposed to be used in an emergency. And it would seem many, many, many years apart," he assert-

Malaysian PM again hints he could stay on beyond 2020

DOHA, DEC 14 (AFP): Malaysia's 94-year-old Prime Minister Mahathir Mohamad again raised the prospect on Saturday that he could stay in office beyond 2020, declining to give a definitive pledge to step down.

Mahathir returned to power last year after dealing a historic election defeat to the corruption-plagued coalition that he once led and which had been in power for six decades.

Mahathir led Malaysia for more than two decades before his retirement in 2003 which paved the way for the leadership of now disgraced former prime minister Najib Razak.

"We had a vision to become a fully developed country by 2020. Unfortunately, after I stepped down, the leadership took a different course, different policies. And that caused the target not to be achieved in 2020," Mahathir said at the Doha Forum event in the Qatari capital.

"What we have settled for is we will still try, but we have moved the accomplishment date to between 2025 and 2030.

"I have promised that I would step down once I have resolved

some of the major problems that have been left by the previous government. I promised that I will step down if a leadership candidate has been named by the coalition."

Anwar Ibrahim, seen as the likely successor to Mahathir, has previously said that he expects to take office by May 2020, but Mahathir has publicly contradicted him several times.

And on Thursday, Anwar was questioned by police over allegations he sexually assaulted a male former aide, the latest such scandal to hit his to ruler, Crown Prince Mohammed bin Sal-



Sahir Ludhianvi was a paradoxical man: Javed Akhtar



NEW DELHI, DEC 14 (PTI): Known for speaking truth to power through his poetry and his radical attitude when it came to fighting for what was right, Sahir Ludhianvi was an entirely different person in his private life, poet-lyricist Javed Akhtar said here Saturday.

"He was a very paradoxical man, I can't say a more boring thing about him if I say he was a good man. When he was good he could be good beyond limits and same goes for when he was angry with somebody. It was like a pendulum with him," Akhtar said at a session during the ongoing Jashn-e-Rekhta festival.

The poet, who was the only son of a rich landlord, stayed with his mother after her divorce during early childhood and led a life of poverty before becoming a successful poet and lyricist.

Akhtar said that it was wrong to think that such a successful poet must have led an easy life considering the suffering he had gone

"Do you think a man who led a relaxed life, the one with money and comfort would name his book 'talkhiyan' (bitterness)? It is not possible. His life was full of bitterness and sadness and it remained with him till his last days," the 74-year-old lyr-

imagine the kind of effect his mother had on him, he added.

Reminiscing an incident at Ludhianvi's Versova home in Mumbai, Akhtar said that he had never seen such a mother-son relationship before or after the poet, who died in

At one of their drinking sessions, Ludhianvi commented on the political situation and everyone agreed to his opinion.

"He thanked everyone and in middle of the conversation he walked to the other end of the house to his mother's room, narrated the entire incident to her, told her how everyone appreciated his point of view and then came back," Akhtar remembered with an evident

This was a 45-year-old successful poet who could admonish ministers, fight with directors, producers, music directors and sought approval of his mother for the smallest thing, he added.

"He had these two different sides to him. He was not one man, there were several men inside him," the lyricist said.

Ludhianvi was known as the "people's poet" as his writings reflected their loves, sufferings, angst and joy. He also worked extensively as a film song lyricist for close to three
