SKM condemns delay in releasing OFOJ salaries

SUMMIT REPORT GANGTOK, 03 APR:

Sikkim Krantikari Mor-cha today complained that employees appointed under the 'One Family, One Job' scheme have not received their salaries yet. On the same, the party has alleged that the Sikkim Democratic Front government had launched this scheme just for votes and has no intentions of following through on their commitments. The OFOJ scheme was launched in January and appointments made in the weeks that followed, it may be recalled.

An SKM delegation today submitted a onepoint memorandum to the Secretary, Finance Department, demanding that the department release the pending dues immediately.

Addressing a press conference here today, SKM Nari Morcha general secretary, Pavitra Bhandari, pointed out that the State government has extracted massive publicity from this scheme at the national and international level and still dragged its feet on releasing salaries to OFOJ beneficiaries.

SKM has demanded that the dues be deposited in the bank accounts of the employees latest by 09 April.

SDF accuses SKM of continuing violence

Sikkim Democratic Front has alleged that Sikkim Krantikari Morcha worker and resident of Lall Bazaar, Rameshwar Tamang misbehaved with SDF convenor, Sanjukta Rai today. Rameshwar Tamang allegedly grabbed Ms Rai's collar and tried to hit her.

The allegation has been made by SDF spokesperson and Lok Sabha MP, PD Rai, in a press release issued today.

In a similar incident in North Sikkim, one Democratic woman who is a single mother, was hit and abused by three SKM goons when she was going to attend an SDF meeting, he has alleged further adding that the incident will be reported to the Women's Commission.

On 02 April, two SDF vehicles led by youth president of Barfung constituency, Karma T Denzongpa, who was travelling along with his colleagues, were attacked

by around 30 SKM youth of Barfung on the middle of the road to Rabongla destroying SDF booklets, pamphlets and diaries to ashes, Mr Rai alleges. On the same date, SKM party workers came to intimidate and verbally abuse SDF volunteers and the candidate in Namcheybong, he adds.

"This begs the question - what ideology and instructions are SKM party leaders disseminating in their meetings?" the SDF spokesperson has asked.

India lost 1.1 crore jobs in 2018; 90 lakh lost in rural areas alone: civil society groups

NEW DELHI, APR 3 (PTI): India lost 1.1 crore jobs, including 90 lakh in the rural sector, in 2018 alone, claimed a "chargesheet" released on Wednesday by a group of civil society organisations on the NDA government's five-year tenure.

According to the document, released about a week before the general election starts, demonetisation in November 2016 has resulted in 35 lakh jobs being lost.

It claimed at least 75 people, including children, died of hunger across 10 states since 2015. The cause of death, it stated, was "prolonged hunger."

Also, nearly 42 of these people died because they were denied rations as their Aadhaar linkage did not function or they were not enrolled in the scheme, the chargesheet alleged. It, however, did not cite the source of its data.

The Himalayan Cleanup 2020 shortlisted for European Outdoors **Conservation Association grant**

The Integrated Mountain Initiative and Zero Waste Himalaya, which had collaborated to undertake the much-appreciated The Himalayan Cleanup in 2018, have resolved to continue and upscale their awareness programme on waste in the mountains and have proposed the Himalayan Cleanup for a funding grant by the European Conservation Outdoor Association (EOCA).

The Himalayan Cleanup 2020, it is informed, has cleared the rigorous EOCA selection criteria overseen by its scientific advisors and has been shortlisted for a grant under the mountain category.

This is the only project shortlisted from India and is now among 14 conservation projects in 16 countries and has entered the final voting round under the mountain category where all shortlisted projects are given two weeks to gather as many online votes as possible in order to secure the grant. The voting window opened on 28

March and closes on 11 April. IMI and ZWH, it may be recalled,

organised the Himalayan Cleanup in 2018 as a pan-Himalayan initiative taken to raise awareness about waste in the Indian Himalayan Region.

Accordingly, on 26 May 2018, an unprecedented 200 organisations

and more than 15,000 volunteers gathered to conduct cleanups in various areas within the 12 mountain states.

THC was also conducted in coordination with a brand audit by Global Alliance Against Incinerators to highlight the pervasiveness of plastics and to ascertain responsibility for the proliferation of problematic plastic packaging in the environment.

The trash collected was sorted, segregated and analysed.

The final waste audit report revealed that more than 97 per cent of the trash collected was plastic of which more than 60 per cent comprised of multilayered plastic waste. Single use plastics (cups, plates, spoons, forks, bags) constituted 18% while PET Bottles (packaged water and soft drinks) collected during the cleanup accounted for 9.10% of the plastic trash. Other plastic items, 5.09% and Tetrapak, 3.32% (juices and milk) made up the rest of the plastic trash.

The waste audit showed that there has been a dramatic increase in plastic waste in the mountains and that there was no place free of plastic waste.

The brand audit revealed that the top polluting brands were the multinationals Pepsi Co, Hindustan Coca Cola, Britannia Industries, Hindustanl Unilever Ltd., Nestle, Perfetti Van Malle, Bisleri International, CG Foods India

Hence, HSP shall actively support all efforts for realising such aspirations for reservation of seats and protection of culture and heritage of each ethnic group in Sikkim.

Mr Khaling also alleged today that two SDF supporters were found distributing money at Salghari under Poklok-Kamrang constituency on 27 March. SKM workers stopped them and also filed an FIR on the matter, he adds.

About the incident in which an SDF party worker was stabbed on 27 March, Mr Khaling claimed that in this case, the assailant was also an SDF worker. SDF was however misrepresenting facts by claiming that the victim had been attacked by SKM supporters.

The "chargesheet" also alleged that the NDA government has cut expenditure for Mid-Day Meals, which fell from Rs 10,523 crore in 2014-15 to Rs 9,949 crore in 2018-19, the document alleged.

The pendency of RTI requests jumped from 8.5 lakhs (2014-15) to 14.5 lakhs (in 2017-18), it claimed.

At the presser, Shankar Singh, a social activist with Mazdoor Kisan Shakti Sangathan, alleged the "real issues" such as non-payment of NREGA wages have been "submerged" by religious polarisation, politicisation of the armed forces, and warmongering.

"Political parties must commit to the People's Agenda," he demanded.

Syeda Hameed, representing the Samruddha Bharat Foundation, said, "Women, Dalits, Muslims have been targeted by powers who believe in ruling by division and dissension."

Rahul Roy, of the 2017 campaign Not in My Name, said the 2019 general election is a critical moment. "It is the biggest challenge our democracy has ever faced from the regressive forces of hate. I hope reason and truth win."


Q12. Is it possible to vote more than once by pressing the button again and again?

Invest in Learning

Because that is what education is really about

 $T^{\text{he State Government has made an ambitious commitment to revolutionise education in Sikkim}}$ starting from primary schools and building up from that. This was an initiative well-intentioned, and welcome too because it identified the beginning of schooling as the most important years of learning. For far too long, primary schools have received only token attention when human resource should have been prioritised. Hopefully, that is what the government plans in its latest move. And now the State has also put together a State University. It is unclear what will be unique about this institution or what missing component of higher education it will provide a fillip for, but there really cannot be any complaints about more places of learning and there cannot ever be too many of them so long as they are about learning and not dispensing degrees. And please, when the charter of responsibilities is passed along, don't impose employability as a criteria for the courses on offer unless they are technical and skill-imparting trainings. Make the institutions genuinely about learning and then the products will automatically become much sought after human resource for any sector they wish to join. Instill a keenness for learning, and you will have students who can adapt and pick up skills and expertise for any job that catches their fancy. Obsess over imparting employable skills and you will never succeed because the job market is huge and ever changing. The job market needs people with aptitude, not necessarily skills because those can be picked up on the job. Give the young confidence and they will be ready for the world. Obsess over school uniforms and discipline when the young should be discovering and expressing themselves more confidently in their college years and you are only producing order-takers in times which require independent thinkers.

One also hopes that the current interest in revolutionizing education is not limited to civil engineering projects. Where so much money is expended on infrastructure, not enough attention is being paid to the education that these improved infrastructures impart. Education is introduced in every speech by every party as an empowering tool and if it were really so, students from underprivileged families would not drop-out from schools in such huge numbers. The mid-day meal scheme is all very fine if it is malnutrition that the planners intended to address, but if they thought this would keep children in school, then they should have invested in teachers first, on their training next and finally on an effective monitoring system to keep them on duty. And more importantly, the planners should invest on fashioning a syllabus that is contemporary and prioritises learning, not memorising. Students drop out from school not because they cannot afford it, but because they cannot understand how education empowers them. It carries no relevance either for them or for their families. Those from underprivileged families will drop out of school and the better heeled drop out from college. More students drop out because they want to start working at improving their lives, learning by rote does not open their minds to the appreciate how education offers a way out; but, if schools encouraged students to think for themselves, analyse information and situations, they will understand what education means and then struggle to stay in school.

What this requires is not just for the syllabus to change, but also how subjects are taught in our schools, the manner in which learning is evaluated. There are those who believe that the Indian education system is the best, pointing out the achievers that our schools and colleges export. And therein lies proof of the drawbacks - the better minds still need to go out to deliver. As a nation, India produces a lot of educated people, but when it comes to thinkers and visionaries, people who give the world the next big idea, even when their nationality is Indian, they are products of education systems that are not on our shores. So yes, let's invest in infrastructure, make sure that a well-provided-for school is the vicinity of every habitation, but also simultaneously, let's invest thought into how this infrastructure can work with a syllabus and pattern that makes thinkers of the next generation, not just note-takers.

Leonardo da Vinci revisited: how a 15th century artist dissected the human machine

Leonardo da Vinci was fascinated by the human body. His disdain for painters who did not bother to learn anatomy was barely concealed in his criticisms of those who "draw their nude figures looking like wood, devoid of grace; so that you would think you were looking at a sack of walnuts rather than the human form".

His bodies envisioned something very different – living mechanics – combining ideas that he explored across many fields of investigation, including animal and human dissections.

In doing so, he anticipated many questions that now preoccupy modern scientists, from the mechanics of the human body to the possibility of a mechanical body for humans.

Leonardo was born the illegitimate son of a notary and a peasant woman. He did not attend a university and had a rather haphazard and informal education. His knowledge of the human body was self-taught and largely experiential.

Leonardo's notebooks are filled with an explosion of ideas, in treatises, sketches and jottings. One note mentioned the following:

"Have Avicenna's work on useful inventions translated; spectacles with the case, steel and fork and...., charcoal, boards, and paper, and chalk and white, and wax;... ... for glass, a saw for bones with fine teeth, a chisel, inkstand three herbs, and Agnolo Benedetto. Get a skull, nut,— mustard."

In this jumble of thoughts, we see Leonar-

do's interest in the body, one he would explore through dissection. Perhaps his most famous dissection was that of a man who claimed to be over 100 years old, at the Santa Maria Nuova hospital in Florence in 1506.

Leonardo had chatted to this man on the night he passed away: "And this old man told me, a few hours before his death, that he was over a hundred years old and he was conscious of no bodily failure, apart from weakness." After he had died, Leonardo proceeded to probe the man's corpse.

ANATOMICAL MECHANICS

Leonardo's anatomical drawings show exploded and multiple views, unusual for his time but similar to modern mechanical drawings and descriptive geometry.

As he wrote: "If you wish thoroughly to know the parts of man, anatomically, you – or your eye – require to see it from different aspects, considering it from below and from above and from its sides, turning it about and seeking the origin of each member."

Leonardo was thinking outside the box. His approach connects anatomy to engineering.

His interest in machinery linked to his fascination with motion. His drawings vividly illustrate how components of machines, animals and humans are designed to move, and how motion and forces are transferred from one component to another.

Strong analogies are formed between mechanical and biological parts, such as the role of ropes and cords, and sinews and tendons.

Leonardo was fascinated by the change of form over time, whether in the processes of nature or the gradual disintegration of the human body. He found the 100 year-old man's artery, for instance: "to be dry, shrunk and withered."

Alongside this autopsy, he recorded another dissection: "of a child two years old, in which I found everything the opposite that of the old man".

Leonardo also had a lifelong interest in depicting decrepitude and the grotesque in human form. In his work, we see the contrast between robust mechanical forms and ageing bodies.

With his designs for various forms of automata – machines that operate alone by following predetermined instructions for movement – some of which witnesses suggest he brought to life, Leonardo moves from the human body, which is subject to weakness and ageing, to the wholly mechanical body.

The mechanical knight, for example, that he sketched in the Forster notebooks appears to have been designed from clockwork and geared mechanisms. It could move its arms, hands and legs, and turn its head.

Leonardo's interest in automata in a human form and replicating human bodily movement foreshadow ideas present in modern robotics.

Through Leonardo's exploration of the human body, we see his fascination with engineering, motion, anatomy and ageing, topics that still preoccupy us scientifically today.

Tea, chillies and takeaway: what food choices reveal about British Muslim identity

Pood. We all need it and we all eat it. But what does it tell us about who we are? This was one of many questions I explored in recent research focused on the evolution of

Muslim identity in the West.

Given that most British Muslims today are either migrants or the children of migrants, I wanted to understand how their identity changes, not just as it moves across continents, but also as it passes along generations. And so, along with other markers of cultural identity such as language and dress, I examined the types of food eaten by hundreds of respondents over 18 months of fieldwork conducted across the UK and Europe.

Take tea. It's a straightforward beverage that's ubiquitous in every-day British life. Yet how it's brewed matters. South Asian culture, which encompasses around two-thirds of the British Muslim population, frequently distinguishes between "Desi chai/tea" and "English tea".

Desi chai refers to equal amounts of milk and water boiled on a stove together with a teabag and sometimes flavoured with spices such as cinnamon, cardamom or ginger, whereas English tea refers to boiling water from a kettle poured onto a teabag usually with a splash of milk. First-generation South Asian migrants almost exclusively sip the former and, based on my research, often look askance at the latter. On one occasion, for example, I heard an elderly British Pakistani haughtily dismiss English tea as no more than "weak, flavoured water".

Their offspring, on the other hand, often drink both English as well as Desi chai (or, as it's sometimes called,

"masala tea") indicating the emergence of an ambidextrous cultural identity informed by ethnic roots as well as social context.

Let's take another example. The Naga pepper, cultivated in Bangladesh, is one of the hottest chillies in the world. Imran*, a young British-born Bangladeshi I interviewed, told me how a "chilli-eating competition" of sorts developed when an uncle visited his London home from Bangladesh. Both he and his father, who'd been resident in the UK for over two decades, felt obliged to participate in a display of bravado.

After two bites, Imran rushed from the room gulping copious amounts of milk to soothe his burning tongue. While his dad continued stoically on, tears streaming down his face, it was his Bangladeshi uncle who won the day. The implication in Imran's story was that his family's time in England had diminished their capacity to enjoy hot chillies - an important emblem of Bangladeshi culture. When visiting Bangladesh later that year, Imran recounted that the ladies of the village had mockingly called out: "As you're from London, we'll have to cook without chillies or you'll start crying!"

THE SOCIOLOGY OF THE PALATE

In 1979, the French sociologist Pierre Bourdieu famously argued that dominant social groups bolster their "cultural capital" by defining their tastes in opposition to the perceived uncouthness of the hoi polloi. In other words, Bourdieu argued that snobbery is socially constructed.

In my own analysis, I've introduced a new twist on his use of the word "taste" by defining it literally – with reference to the flavours felt in the mouth. Just as people's aesthetic or artistic preferences are deter-

mined in no small measure by social factors, so too are the proclivities of their gustatory glands. In other words, socialisation has a physiological dimension. I call this the sociology of the palate.

During my research, it quickly became possible to distinguish between the tastes of first-generation migrants and their British-born offspring. So pronounced did this difference become, I named it the distinction between the "old guard" and the "avant-garde". To illustrate with a generalisation: the old guard, I found, prefer oily curries and chapattis, while the avant-garde have a penchant for takeaways or other quick and easy foods such as noodles. On one occasion, I recall observing a group of young Muslims gaze in bewilderment at an elderly Indian "uncle" as he tore up a slice of pizza and dipped the pieces in his lamb karahi like naan bread.

FOOD AND SHIFTING IDENTITIES

Food, as the researchers Atsuko Ichijo and Ronald Ranta point out in a fascinating recent study, is also a symbol of national identity. Haggis, for example, often conjures images of kilts and tartan while hummus evokes Middle Eastern exoticism. Yet in 2001, the former British foreign secretary, Robin Cook, claimed that chicken tikka masala is not just the most popular but also "now a true British national dish" - winning its place alongside older classics such as bangers and mash, Yorkshire pudding or fish and chips. This tells us that even national identity, far from being static and inflexible, is a moveable feast. Human palates - and the identities they signify - evolve, chameleon-like, to reflect changing social and cultural conditions often brought into sharp relief by migration.

Let's return to Imran, the young British-born Muslim of Bangladeshi origin. Growing up, he told me he despised the overpowering smell of shutki in his home - a type of dried fish popular in Bangladeshi cuisine. But several events in his teenage years triggered an introspective journev in which he reassessed his relationship with both his faith and ethnic culture. To the delight of family elders, he began during this period not only to pray regularly but also to eat shutki. For Imran, this was a conscious choice to signal a reaffirmation of his Bangladeshi Muslim heritage.

Muaaz, another British-born Muslim of Bangladeshi ancestry I interviewed, had a different relationship with food. During the course of a religious retreat I undertook with him, he served an Italian bolognese proudly declaring he'd cooked it without using a single Asian spice. For Muaaz, unlike Imran, this was a conscious choice to signal a shift from an old continent to a new one. Both Imran and Muaaz are committed Muslims, but the practice of their faith went hand-in-hand with different forms of cultural expression.

The type of food dished up on a plate can tell us more than just the culinary preferences of the diner then. It can offer a window into human identity. And as the type of food on the plate changes – both as it shifts across continents and moves along generations – it's a reminder that identity is never fixed, but subject to the constant pushes and tugs exerted by the forces of society and culture.

Modi calls Mamata a 'speedbreaker' in path of West Bengal development

SILIGURI, APR 3 (PTI): Prime Minister Narendra Modi Wednesday made a scathing attack on West Bengal Chief Minister Mamata Banerjee describing her as a "speedbreaker" in the path of development of the state and insisted she has to go to ensure speedy development of Bengal like rest of the country.

Modi also took on the Congress over its manifesto that talks about reviewing some clauses of the Armed Forces Special Powers Act (AFSPA), saying it acts like a "shield" for the security forces in the fight against terrorists and make the soldiers vulnerable.

He also took potshots at Trinamool Congress president as well other opposition leaders for expressing doubts over Balakot airstrike to avenge Pulwama terror attack and mockingly said "more than pain felt in Rawalpindi, it was felt by Didi in Kolkata".

Modi's sharp attack on TMC chief came as he kickstarted BJP's election campaign in the West Bengal which sends 42 members to Lok Sabha, third largest after Uttar Pradesh's 80 and Maharashtra 48.

"I have not been able to ensure development of Bengal in the same speed as in the rest of the country.

"The reason for this is that in Bengal there is a speedbreaker, and this speedbreaker is known as Didi," Modi said attacking chief minister



Mamata Banerjee, who is fondly called "Didi" (elder sister).

The PM stressed that she must be voted out of power to remove any impediment in the path of prosperity of the people of Bengal.

Pleased at the turnout at his maiden rally in the state after announcement of Lok Sabha polls, he said "if I had not come here to see the huge crowd, I would not have realised that didi's boat is drowning."

Alleging that the Congress manifesto talks of reviewing AFSPA that "provides a shield to the security forces in the fight against terrorists", Modi said that the grand old party of the country "conspired" to make the soldiers vulnerable by taking this away from them.

In his no holds barred attack on TMC presi-

dent, Modi said that Banerjee has deprived the people of Bengal of getting medical benefits of upto Rs five lakhs under the 'Ayushman Bharat' scheme, by withdrawing the state's consent to it.

He said that the farmers of the state have also not been able to reap the benefits of direct transfer of money to their accounts under the 'PM Kisan Samman Yojana' owing to the "speedbreaker Didi."

Claiming that the TMC supremo is not worried about the welfare of the poor, Modi said that she thrives on the poverty of the people and her politics will end if people prosper.

"She has put brakes in the path of the development of the poor," he said.

Modi said that chitfunds have looted the poor of Bengal and were assisted by ministers in Baneriee's cabinet, her

MLAs and associates. "Didi has destroyed through her associates the poor people who invested in the chit funds,"

Claiming that Didi, Congress and the Left are on the same boat, Modi said that their designs would not succeed since their fight is with a chowkidar.

The PM said that despite several attempts by the opposition parties at scuttling his development initiatives, his government has been able to provid gas, electricity, toilets and other benefits to the people of the country.

He sought to assure tea garden workers in the Darjeeling hills and the Terai region in the foothills of Eastern Himalayas of their welfare and that closed gardens

would be reopened.

Reiterating his accusation against Banerjee and other opposition leaders, who had posed questions on the outcome of the Balakot airstrike, Modi said "Who was supposed to cry and who started crying?"

"Chot usko laga aur dard inko lagi (The hurt was there and the pain was felt here)," he said.

Modi said that more than pain felt in Rawalpindi, it was felt by didi in Kolkata.

Regarding NRC, he said that rumours are being spread by those in TMC payroll that Gorkhas will be affected by the exercise and assured that the Gorkhas will not be affected by it.

He said that the Left had not allowed the development of the state during its 34 year rule and Banerjee had done

NPF to support Congress Lok Sabha candidate in Nagaland

KOHIMA, APR 3 (PTI): Naga Peoples Front president, Dr Shurhozelie Liezietsu Wednesday said the NPF will support the Congress candidate for the lone Lok Sabha seat in Nagaland.

"In order to defeat the BIP alliance partner NDPP's candidate, the NPF party has decided to extend issue based support

to the Congress in Nagaland," Liezietsu said at the consultative meeting of the NPF Kohima Division at Central office here.

He said the NPF took decision not to field its nominee and divide the secular votes and give advantages to the NDPP candidate. Liezietsu said the NPF was supporting

the Congress candidate as the Congress is also against the Citizenship Amendment Bill (CAB).

He said BJP president Amit Shah in his public address in Assam recently stated that if BJP comes to power it will tbe bring the Citizenship Amendment Bill at the earliest.

Mamata launches strong attack at Modi describes him as 'expiry babu'



DINHATA (WB), APR 3 (PTI): West Bengal Chief Minister Mamata Banerjee Wednesday attacked Prime Minister Narendra Modi describing him as "Expiry Babu", and strongly contested his allegations against her as being a 'speedbreaker' in the path of state's development.

West Bengal treats only 49 pc of waste water before dumping it in Ganga: NGT tres a day (mld) of waste

NEW DELHI, APR 3 (PTI): West Bengal treats only 49 per cent of the waste water before dumping it in the Ganga, the National Green Tribunal has said while directing the state government to submit quarterly report on the issue of solid waste management.

The green panel noted that about 90 per cent of municipal solid waste generated in Bengal is being dumped in the open every day in violation of statutory pollution laws.

A bench headed by NGT Chairperson Justice Adarsh Kumar Goel also noted that the state generates 1,311 million liwater and while 34 sewage treatment plants have a total installed capacity of 457 mld, their actual utilisation is only 214 mld, which is only 49 per cent.

The tribunal directed the state government to notify at least three major cities, towns and panchayats as "model cities/towns/villages" in every district within two weeks.


"The remaining cities, towns and village panchayats in the state may be made fully compliant in respect of environmental norms within one year," the bench said.

It also directed that

performance audit of all regulatory bodies may be conducted and remedial measures be taken, within six months.

During the hearing, state chief secretary Malay Kumar Dey told the tribunal that it was found that out of the 341 blocks in West Bengal, the groundwater in 81 blocks was contaminated with arsenic and in 49 blocks with fluoride.

The tribunal was informed that large tractors, diggers and trucks can be seen lined along many of the rivers in West Bengal. Indiscriminate sand mining has a devastating effect on the environment.



Lapses in dam management aggravated floods: amicus curiae report



THIRUVANANTHAPU-RAM, APR 3 (PTI): In a setback to the Kerala government, a High Court-appointed amicus curiae has pointed out that lapses in dam management had aggravated the impact of August floods which had claimed over 400 lives besides causing widespread devastation last year.

It has also recommended that an inquiry be conducted by an expert committee headed by a former Supreme Court judge.

The opposition Congress and BJP held the CPI(M)-led LDF government responsible for the loss of life and destruction and demanded the resignation of Chief Min-

ister Pinarayi Vijayan.

port, amicus curiae(friend of the court), Jacob P Alex, stated that none of the 79 dams in the southern state were operated or used for the purpose of flood control or moderation, as per the stipulations under the National Water Policy, National Disaster Management Authority guidelines on floods and similar directives.

The report, submitted to the High Court and accessed by PTI, also recommended a detailed enquiry into the floods by an independent expert committee headed by a former Supreme Court judge and a hydrologist, dam management experts and engineers as members.

The amicus curiae In the 49-page-re- was appointed by the court basedon a slew of petitions including the one submitted by 'metro-man' E Sreedharan, also the president of the Foundation for Restoration of National Values, alleging that the devastating floods was a manmade disaster.

According to the report, dams in the state had not maintained effective Flood Control Zone and the Flood Cushion, said to have been maintained, was not as mandated by the BIS report, RTIOR and Q&M Manuel.

Most of the major reservoirs were almost full before the heavy rainfall that occurred on 14-16 August, 2018 and they did not have the capacity to accommodate the additional flow generated by extreme rainfall, it said.

"Sudden release of water simultaneously from different reservoirs, during extreme rainfall aggravated the damage,"it said adding that various alerts--blue, orange and red--had been issued not in accordance with the EAP guideline.

"No proper follow-up action and effective precautionary steps (especially for evacuating people and accommodating them in safe location) were taken after issuance of Red Alert," it said.

None of the dams in the state had updated Rule Curves based on which the same were operated during the floods, it said.

The report also pointed out that the dam managers ought not to have 'solely' relied on IMD predictions for dam management and variation in the forecast or prediction cannot be counted as a justification for delayed release of water from dams.

It also suggested that the proposed enquiry panel be directed by the court to investigate various aspects including the causes of the August floods and the factors that had led to or aggravated the damage, whether the high reservoir storage and sudden release of water had worsened the deluge and so on.

There was grave lapse in the management of dams by the government, the leader added.

Murder charges should be slapped against the Chief Minister, power minister and the concerned officials," he said. According to the amicus curiae report, the August floods had claimed 433 human lives, affected 5.4 million people and displaced 1.4 million.

The total loss incurred by the state was to the tune of Rs 26,720 crore and the total recovery needs are estimated at 31,000 crore, it added.

Dismissing Kohli and AB best moment of my cricketing career, say Shreyas Gopal



JAIPUR, APR 3 (PTI): Claiming the coveted wickets of Virat Kohli and South African run-machine AB De Villiers was the best moment of my cricketing career, says young Rajasthan Royals spinner Shreyas Gopal.

The leg-spinner took 3 wickets for 12 runs in his magical four-over spell, which helped Rajasthan Royals secure their first win of the season, a seven-wicket victory over struggling Royal Challengers Bangalore on Tuesday night.

"Getting Virat Kohli and AB Villiers in same match is a dream for any youngster. It is the best moment of my cricketing career and definitely one of biggest moments of my IPL cricket," Shreyas said at the post match conference here.

"Any wicket is a big wicket but obviously these two are big names so it feels that much more better. But I feel I shouldn't be getting ahead of myself and stay calm," he added.

The 25-year-old said that it was hard to devise a plan against batsmen of Kohli and De Villiers' stature.

"Honestly, I feel it is hard to plan a dismissal for batsmen like them (Kohli and De Villiers). You just need to be able to bowl your best ball and try and hit the best area on that particular wicket. It is all based on the situation," Gopal said.

"When you land on the ground you obviously do your homework. What pal said.

the type of ground is, how the wicket is reacting, how the opposition has been playing. So for example (Krishnappa) Gowtham bowling three of his overs in powerplay felt like a good idea at that moment."

The youngster said he was keen to learn from more experienced cricketers in the team, including captain Ajinkya Rahane and Steve Smith.

"In between overs I just go to Ajju Bhai (Rahane), Jos (Buttler) or Smith and have a couple of words and try to understand what they think about the game because they have a lot of experience."

Asked about his side leaking runs in the death overs, Gopal said it was part and parcel of the game and the entire bowling unit should take responsibility and lift the team.

"In this cricket (T20) you will definitely be hit for boundaries depending on the kind of overs you are bowling. Look at Jofra (Archer), he is bowling two overs in the powerplay and then bowling back in the death overs. So he is bowling hardest overs in the game," he said.

MHA issues show cause notice to wife of Mamata's nephew for giving false info for OCI, PAN cards

NEW DELHI, APR 3 (PTI): A show cause notice has been served on Rujira Naroola, wife of West Bengal Chief Minister Mamata Banerjee's nephew Abhishek Banerjee, for allegedly making false representation and concealing material facts while submitting documents before the competent authorities to get her Overseas Citizen of India (OCI) and PAN cards, officials said Wednesday.

In the notice, the home ministry said discrepancies have been detected in the declaration of Naroola's nationality and father's name in separate applications for PIO card, conversion of Person of Indian Origin (PIO) to OCI card and PAN card and hence her registration as OCI card holder is liable for cancellation in public interest.

Naroola, an Indian-origin Thai national, has been asked to reply within 15 days as to why she had made false representations and concealed facts. The show cause notice was served by the home ministry on March 29, an official said.

She was issued PIO card by the Indian embassy in Bangkok on January 8, 2010, mentioning Niphon Naroola as her father in the card. She later applied for conversion of her PIO card to OCI card at the office of FRRO, Kolkata, on November 8, 2017, submitting certificate of her marriage to Abhishek Banerjee, issued in Kolkata on February 3, 2013, as one of the supporting documents. However, she mentioned Gursharan Singh Ahuja, resident of Rajouri Garden, New Delhi, as her father in the marriage certificate.

Abhishek is a Trinamol Congress MP from West Bengal. The central government has also learnt that Naroola had applied for PAN card on November 14, 2009, by filling Form 49A without intimating her real status as a Thai national holding OCI card and mentioning Gursharan Singh Ahuja as her father, another official said.

According to the home ministry, Rujira was required to fill Form 49A to get PAN by declaring herself as a foreigner holding OCI card.

However, as per her Form 49A application, she obtained PAN card as an Indian citizen.

"The central government has examined the matter and noticed discrepancies mentioned above and is prima facie of the opinion that registration of Ms Rujira Naroola as an OCI card holder is liable for cancellation in the interest of general public under sub-clauses (a) & (e) of Section 7D of the Citizenship Act, 1965," the ministry said.

Book brings alive genius of KL Saigal

NEW DELHI, APR 3 (PTI): The genius of KL Saigal, his timeless compositions and the golden era of Indian cinema have been brought alive in a book on the legendary singer.

Kundan: Saigal's Life & Music, authored by documentary filmmaker and former DDG of Doordarshan Sharad Dutt, has been transcreated in English by Jyoti Sabharwal of Stellar Publishers. Dutt won the National Award (Swarna Kamal for best book on cinema) in 2005 for the original book in Hindi.

The book will be released on April 4, the 115th birth anniversary of Saigal. Archival records, rare photographs and posters of Saigal's films in this tome, give insightful glimpses, and beckon collectors and connoisseurs.

Dutt says he wanted to cogitate

as to what was that luring quality in Saigal's music - the classical facet or the popular element.

It was a resplendent blend of both these components. For chaste classical renditions tend to be dry, given its dalliance with mind and intellect. And mere popularity is jugglery of transitory pleasure that doesn't last, he says.

According to Dutt, the litmus test of any artistic endeavour lies in the fact that even with a classical base, it invades the realm of popularity and enchants the masses.

This was the warp and weft of Saigal's craft that immortalised his songs. At one end, he impressed the maestros, and at the other, captivated a commoner on the street. That is why his music continues to resonate and remembered with much veneration.

"His unqualified devotion to the ragas and rhythm had entwined the pathos in such a mesmeric manner that it gently stirred emotions evoking sadness and melancholia became his hallmark, he says.

A unique voice and singing style that could not possibly be emulated, and an acting prowess that complemented the gifted throat, earned Saigal a distinct place in the annals of Indian cinema.

A bilingual actor, he commenced his cinematic sojourn with New Theatres, and touched the zenith with Devdas in 1935, that was to become an all-time classic.

With each successive venture President, Dharti Mata, Street Singer, Zindagi, Bhakt Surdas , Tansen, Shahjahan, et al - he

kept soaring to reach the skies. With the release of his maiden Bengali film Didi, he captured the

hearts of Bengal's cognoscenti. And his songs in Bangla received approbation of Rabindranath Tagore.

An artiste, nonpareil in past or future, he became a legend in his lifetime. His repertoire in varied genres of songs, ghazals, bhajans, as also in other modes of classical style enthralled the masses, as these renditions made them laugh and cry.

A film career that merely lasted 15 years, he performed in just about 36 films and rendered about 185 songs in Hindi, Urdu, Persian, Punjabi, Bangla and Tamil, thus proving the dictum that it is not the extensiveness but the intensity of those renderings that bequeaths the mantle of immortality.

Brunei introduces stoning to death for gay sex, adultery

BANDAR SERI BEGAWAN (BRUNEI), APR 3 (AFP): Brunei on Wednesday introduced harsh new sharia laws, including death by stoning for adultery and gay sex, despite a storm of global criticism from politicians, celebrities and rights groups.

The tough penal code in the tiny country on tropical Borneo island -ruled by the all-powerful Sultan Hassanal Bolkiah -- fully came into force following years of delays.

The laws, which also include amputation of hands and feet for thieves, make Brunei the first place in East or Southeast Asia to have a sharia penal code at the national level, joining several mostly Middle Eastern countries such as Saudi Arabia.

Rape and robbery are also punishable by death under the code and many of the new laws, such as capital punishment for insulting the Prophet Mohammed, apply to non-Muslims as well as Muslims.

The decision to push ahead with the punishments has sparked alarm around the world, with the United Nations labelling them "cruel and inhumane" and celebrities, led by actor George Clooney and pop star Elton John, calling for Brunei-owned hotels to be boycotted.

In a public address to mark a special date in the Muslim calendar, the sultan called for stron-



ger Islamic teachings but did not mention the new penal code.

"I want to see Islamic teachings in this country grow stronger," he said in the nationally televised speech at a convention centre near the capital Bandar Seri Begawan.

The sultan, who has been on the throne for over five decades, also insisted that Brunei was a "fair" country and the environment for visitors was "safe and harmonious".

Government officials later confirmed the laws had entered into force.

The sharia laws have triggered worldwide condemnation, and Phil Robertson, deputy Asia director at Human Rights Watch, described the code as "barbaric to the core, imposing archaic punishments for acts that shouldn't even be crimes".

The European Union said in a statement that some of the new punishments "amount to torture, acts of cruel, inhuman or degrading treatment".

They are particularly upsetting for the country's small lesbian, gay, bisexual and transgender (LGBT) community. Before the new laws, sex between men was already illegal in Brunei and punishable with up to 10 years in jail.

ISLAMABAD, APR 3 (PTI): tate Company, a Ka-Pakistan's top anti-graft body on Wednesday recovered Rs 60 crore in the fake accounts case from prime suspect Younas Kudwavi, who is believed to be a business partner of former president Asif Ali Zardari, according to a media report.

The National Accountability Bureau's (NAB) Rawalpindi chapter recovered Rs 60 crore from Kudwavi. Geo News reported, citing sources.

The NAB has also presented its interim challan before the accountability court - approved earlier by its executive board.

Kudwavi is facing the charge of issuing illegal allotment letter on properties registered for a temple and library.

Quoting sources, it said that Kudwavi is a business partner of former president Zardari in the Park Lane Esrachi-based real estate firm co-owned by Zardari and his son Bilawal Bhutto Zardari.

The Federal Investigation Agency (FIA) was investigating 32 people, including Zardari, his sister Faryal Talpur, Omni Group chairman Anwar Majeed, in relation to money laundering through fictitious bank accounts.

Zardari's close aide Hussain Lawai was arrested in July last year in connection with the probe. His other close aide and Omni Group chairman Anwar Majeed and his son, Abdul Ghani, were arrested by FIA in August 2018.

Last month, Zardari and Bilawal appeared before the NAB, which questioned them on corruption charges. They appeared before the NAB in connection with an alleged loan obtained by the Park Lane Estate Company. The NAB has claimed in the case that a piece of land belonging to the Punjab forest department was illegally transferred to the company by some government officials.

The Supreme Court

in September 2018 constituted a joint investigation team to probe the fake accounts case. The IIT had filed its report and also recommended a directive for NAB to conduct a thorough inquiry. In January 2019, the Su-

preme Court had referred the JIT report to NAB to launch its probe and complete it within two months.

On March 15, a banking court in Karachi approved the NAB chairman's petition and transferred the money laundering case to an accountability court in Islamabad for trial.

S Korean ship detained for violating UN sanctions: Seoul

SEOUL, APRIL 3 (AFP): A South Korean ship has been detained for six months on suspicion of violating UN sanctions against the nuclear-armed Seoul's foreign ministry said Wednesday.

Pyongyang is sanctioned over its weapons programme under multiple UN Security Council resolutions, which include curbs on shipments of oil and fuel to the isolated regime.

But the North has been seeking to get around the measures, with a recent UN report saying that Pyongyang was securing deliveries of fuel through ship-toship transfers in interna-

Seoul's foreign ministry said a South Korean ship and three others had been detained in the country, suspected ident Moon Jae-in has timately broke down.

of undermining the economic measures against the North.

"This is the first time a South Korean vessel has been detained for allegedly violating UN sanctions," a ministry official told AFP.

The ship -- held in the southern port of Busan since last October -- is suspected of carrying out an illicit ship-toship transfer of oil to a North Korean tanker, according to the Yonhap News Agency.

If it is found to have made the transfer, the South Korean vessel would likely be blacklisted by the UN, Yonhap reported.

The foreign ministry official did not explain the delay in the authorities making the detention public.

South Korean

sought to engage the North to bring it to the negotiating table, dangling economic carrots before it in the form of inter-Korean projects -- many of which would violate the current sanctions rules if implemented. Questions were also raised over whether it had undermined the measures by providing supplies to set up an inter-Korean liaison office north of the border.

Last year three South Korean firms caught importing millions of dollars worth of coal and iron from the North in 2017.

Malaysia ex-PM Najib to go on trial for corruption

KUALA LUMPUR, APR 3 (AFP): Malaysia's disgraced former leader Najib Razak will go on a fraction of the money trial Wednesday over a allegedly stolen from multi-billion-dollar fi- 1MDB, and hundreds of nancial scandal that con- millions of dollars are betributed to his long-ruling coalition's downfall last year and sent shockwaves around the world.

The 65-year-old will face the first of several trials over his alleged involvement in the looting of sovereign wealth fund 1MDB, a state investment vehicle established to develop the economy of the Southeast Asian nation.

The former premier and his cronies are accused of plundering billions of dollars from the fund and spending it on everything from high-end real estate to artworks in a fraud that stretched around the world.

He had been tipped to win another term in office easily last year and extend his coalition's six-decade stranglehold on power, only to be soundly defeated by his former boss, Mahathir Mohamad, who rode a wave of public anger to the premiership.

In the months that followed, once-dormant investigations into 1MDB were relaunched and Najib was hit with dozens of corruption charges linked to the scandal.

In Wednesday's trial, due to start at 2:00 pm, Najib will face seven charges of corruption and money laundering over the alleged theft of some 42 million ringgit

(USD 10.3 million) from SRC International, a former 1MDB unit. It is only lieved to have ended up in Najib's accounts alone. He has denied any

wrongdoing. Najib was initially due to stand trial in Feb-

ruary, but appeals by his defence team over procedural matters saw his case put on hold until a iudge last week ruled the trial should finally proceed. While many of his cohorts have been caught and charged in Malaysian courts, the alleged mastermind behind the 1MDB scandal, playboy financier Jho Low, is still at large.

Local media reported the former premier made a bid on Monday to delay his trial yet again, although this failed.

Cynthia Gabriel, head of the non-profit group The Centre to Combat Corruption and Cronyism, told AFP that Malaysians had been waiting "too long" for the trial to begin. "The multiple delays are so obvious and deliberate, it's a way of pushing the trials further," she said.

"It's apparent that the former ousted PM, isn't quite ready to sit in the dock and face trial, be cross-examined, and get embarrassed." Fahmi Reza, a graphic artist who was slapped with a jail term and fined for depicting Najib in a caricature as a sinister clown, said it was the ex-premier's turn to "face justice".

Trump says '100pc' ready to shut down Mexico border

Washington, Apr 3 (AFP): President Donald Trump said Tuesday he is "100 per cent" prepared to close down the US-Mexico border, warning Congress and Central American governments to take action to stem the flow of migrants into the country. Delays were already rising at several key border crossings as Trump ratcheted up pressure on Democrats in Congress to toughen US laws against illegal immigrants, threatening to hurt the US economy in the name of border security. "It is a national emergency on the border," Trump said. If Mexico does not

stop migrants from transiting across its territory, and if Congress does not act, he said, "the border's going to be closed, 100 per cent." "Sure it's going to have a negative impact on the economy," he said. "Security is more important to me than trade."

Trump said Democrats were blocking reforms for political reasons but could fix the problem "in 45 minutes." He was not specific, but Homeland Security Secretary Kirstjen Nielsen has asked Congress to give border officials the power to forcibly repatriate Central American illegal immigrants, including children who arrived alone, back to their

The threat to close the border, which handled some USD612 billion worth of trade in 2018, sent shivers through the economy, and drew

countries.

warnings from allies of the president. "Closing down the border would have potentially catastrophic economic impact on our country, and I would hope we would not be doing that sort of thing," Senate Majority Leader Mitch Mc-Connell said.

His call was backed by the Chamber of Commerce, which said in a statement that while it backed immigration reform, closing the border "would inflict severe economic harm on American families, workers, farmers and manufacturers across the United States."

Homeland Security officials said they were preparing for the possibility of a shutdown of at least some border entry points as they divert staff to deal with the flood of migrants from Guatemala, Honduras and El Salvador, expected to hit nearly 100,000 a month. Nielsen cut short an official trip to Europe to return for meetings early Tuesday on the border crisis, and on Monday **Acting Defense Secretary** Patrick Shanahan said he would be meeting Nielsen and Secretary of State Mike Pompeo on the crisis.

Officials said facilities for handling the migrants -- who for the moment cannot be sent back after they cross the border and request asylum -- are overtaxed and understaffed, creating hazardous conditions.

"We are in a full blown emergency. The are on the table right now," a senior Homeland Security official, who declined to be named, told journalists Tuesday.

"The volume of vulnerable populations that's arriving is unsustainable... The humanitarian situation cannot be ignored and the security situation cannot be ignored." Trump said Mexican officials had reacted to his threat to close the border last week by clamping down on the caravans of migrants fleeing poverty and violence in the three Central American countries.

Mexico "made a big step over the past two days," he said, adding that they would have to continue if they don't want the border closed.

He also defended his decision to cut off "hundreds of millions of dollars" in US aid to the three countries, accusing them of arranging the caravans of migrants.

The three "don't do anything for us," he said.

On Monday, Nielsen ordered an "emergency surge" of personnel to deal with the situation, including moving 750 staff to areas of the border where the migrants arrive. Many were being diverted from official ports, leading to slowdowns in processing arriving visitors and commercial vehicles.
