Petrol crosses Rs 90-mark in Mumbai, rates at all-time high across country

New Delhi, Sep 24 (PTI): Petrol Monday crossed the Rs 90-mark in Mumbai as a dip in the value of rupee and rise in international oil prices pushed rates across the country to new all-time high.

Petrol prices were hiked by 11 paise per litre and diesel by 5 paise, according to price noti-fication of state-owned oil firms.

The hike pushed pet-rol price in Delhi to Rs

82.72 per litre and diesel to Rs 74.02. In Mumbai, petrol crossed Rs 90-mark for the first time ever. The fuel now costs Rs 90.08 at Indian Oil Corp (IOC) outlets in the city while it is priced at Rs 90.17 at Hindustan Petroleum Corp Ltd (HPCL) outlets and Rs 90.14 at Bharat Petroleum Corp Ltd (BPCL) stations. India is the third larg-

HC pulls up State for failing to follow directions on compensation for Pakvong Airport affected

As the Prime Minister
Narendra Modi inaugurated the Pakyong s the Prime Minister Airport today, the High Court of Sikkim pulled up the State authorities for failing to follow its directions regarding compen-sation for those affected by the construction of the airport.

After hearing the State and petitioners, whose landed property was damaged by the construction of the airport, the single bench of Acting Chief Jus-tice Meenakshi Madan Rai pulled up the state authorities and directed them to strictly comply with the

order passed by the High Court on 30 April, earlier this year.

66 affected families had approached the High Court in 2016 stating that the affected families had not been properly compensated. According to the petitioners, their landed and toners, their landed and standing properties were damaged due to heavy construction of airport works, earth cutting on western side of the air-port and vibration due to blasting and use of other heavy machineries in the construction site.

The State Agriculture and Horticulture de-partment has only paid

India may cut oil imports to mitigate pain from high oil prices, dip in rupee

NEW DELHI, SEP 24 (PTI): India, the world's third-biggest oil importer, is considering cutting oil purchases to soften the blow from high crude oil prices and declining rupee, Indian Oil Corp (IOC) Chairman Sanjiv Singh said

State refiners are looking at optimising crude oil inventory levels without in any way affecting fuel supplies in the domestic market, he told PTI. Refiners maintain 7-8 days of in-

ventory in tankages besides carrying stocks in pipelines as well as ships in transit. They are looking at reducing these so that monthly imports of crude oil can be reduced, he said.

India is the third largest importer of crude oil and rising international crude oil prices are inflating domestic transport fuel rates in a strong demand environment. Brent, the benchmark for half of world's oil, climbed to USD 80 per barrel from USD 71 in the last

five weeks, and the Indian rupee lost ground against the dollar by 5-6 per cent during the same period, resulting in expensive crude imports.

India is 81 per cent dependent on imports to meet its oil needs.

"We had a meeting last to last Saturday (September 15) deliberate on a host of issues facing the indus-try and in that meeting, one of the options that was considered

was to reduce imports by cutting down on inventory levels," Singh said.

An important factor guiding the de

cision was also Asian Premium climbing to as high as USD 3-5 per barrel in last 3-4 months, he said.

Asian Premium is extra charge be-

ing collected by oil-cartel OPEC countries from Asian countries when selling oil in comparison to western countries.

"Reducing inventory levels and imports are being considered as temporary measures without impacting fuel

supply in the domestic mar-ket," he said. "This decision would in no way be allowed to impact supplies of petroleum products in the domestic mar-ket. Our com-

mitment to meet domestic supplies remains supreme."

Singh said the high oil prices will

in long term impact demand and so reducing imports makes sense. India imported 18.6 million tonne (MT) of crude oil in August for USD 9.8 billion

It had imported 18.1 MT of crude in the same period of 2017 for USD 6.4 billion.

During April-August, it has spent

USD 48.9 billion on import of 94.9 MT of crude compared to USD 31 billion on the import of 89.1 MT in the same period last year. Singh, however, did not say when the move will kick in saying these are ongoing discussions.

"One thing is very clear that we do not want petroleum product supplies in the domestic market to be impacted in any way," he said.

Petrol Monday crossed the Rs 90-mark in Mumbai as rates across the country touched a new high. While petrol in Delhi costs Rs 82.72 per litre, it costs Rs 90.08 in Mumbai. Diesel is priced at Rs 74.02 in Delhi and Rs 78.58 in Mumbai.

Since mid-August, the petrol price has risen by Rs 5.58 a litre and diesel by Rs 5.3 - the most in any month since the daily price revision was introduced in mid-June last year.

Former TMC general secretary arrested for sharing doctored video of CM

GANGTOK, 24 SEPT:

Former Trinamool Congress [Sikkim] general secretary, Tshering Wangchuk Lepcha was arrested this afternoon by Sadar Police on charges of forgery for purpose of harming reputation of a person or persons. He was later released on bail

It is learnt that an FIR was filed by Principal Secretary of Chief Minister's Office, RS Basnet at Sadar Thana fol-lowing which Mr Lepcha was arrested under section 469 of the IPC Mr Lencha had allegedly shared a video of Chief Minister Pawan Chamling on social media which according to the complainant harmed the reputation of the CM. It is informed that his phone has also been seized by the police.

The video on social media is of the

Chief Minister addressing a function wherein he is saying "There is develop ment in Sikkim and corruption".

However, it turns out that the video has been edited and the original video shows the CM saying "There is development in Sikkim because there is no corruption."

Speaking to media persons today,

vice convenor of Sikkim Subject Com mittee, Nawin Kiran Pradhan stated that the arrest of Tshering Wangchuk Lepcha is a black day in the history of Sikkim and violates the fundamental right of freedom of speech. He asserted that the police should take the same action against all those who have been posting doctored videos and defaming posts on social media.

"We would not like to comment on the video which is viral on social medial

we came as part of civil society irrespective of political affiliations to raise a point that Mr Lepcha was personally targeted and harassed for raising social issues," Mr Pradhan said.

He added that this action was not

against Mr Lepcha but against entire youth of Sikkim who have been speak-ing for the society. The youth will not tolerate this and will fight this issue legally, he said further adding that they have full faith in the law.

Mr Pradhan alleged that most of the doctored videos and posts have been posted by members of the ruling party and if a youth can be arrested then law should apply to everyone. He stated that this case has opened a Pandora's

Tshering Wangchuk Lepcha stated that it was really surprising that a very experienced bureaucrat has filed the case without understanding the freedom of speech and expression.

"I abide by the law and will fight le-gally. I have full faith in the law and am sure that we will win the case," he expressed. He also thanked the youth who turned out to support him.

Kedar Nath Tiwari informed that the Forest Minister, Tshering Wangdi Lep-cha had posted a doctored photograph of Bhaichung Bhutia on social media on 15 July earlier this year which he later removed. "Seeing what happened today, I have also filed a FIR under same sec tion against Tshering Wangdi Lepcha at Sadar Thana. We want the same action by the police against him. Rahul fires fresh salvo at Modi on Rafale deal

Аметні (UP), Sep 24 (PTI): Firing a fresh salvo at the prime min-ister over the Rafale jet deal, Congress president Rahul Gandhi Monday charged that the country's "chowkidar" Narendra Modi snatched money away from the poor and handed it over to industrialist Anil Ambani

Gandhi also asked the nrime minister for answers on several issues relating to the Rafale jet

"Why was the price disclosed...how was the contract giv-en to(Anil) Ambani... serious charges have been levelled by former French president Francois Hollande." he added.

Recalling that during a debate in Parliament on the Rafale deal "The prime minister could not look me in the eve. PM gives speeches but no answers... he does not have the courage to give reply."

"Under the BJP gov-ernment, the farmers and poor are crying...the present government is provided five to ten people," he said, alleging people like Anil Ambani, Vijay Mallya and Lalit Modi are getting all benefits.

The Reliance Group,

in a statement quoting Ambani's letter to Gand-hi last month, had said, "Allegations of Reliance benefitting by thousands of crores is a figment of imagination, promoted by vested interests."

French company Dassault, which is supplying the fighter jets, has entered into a joint venture with Anil Ambani-owned

its offset obligations to create business for Indi-an firms, following the Rafale deal.

Escalating his tirade against the Modi government on the Rafale issue, Rahul said the contract worth thousands of crores of rupees could have pro-vided jobs "to youth of Amethi, to engineers... it could have given employment to thousands youth...aircract with French technology would have been made in India... the nation would have benefitted from it."

Allow Students to Think

Open doors, don't spoon-feed

What Sikkim requires its schools to create are **VV** sensible citizens who can think for themselves, weigh options and make practical decisions. In these times of fake news and manufactured consent, an open mind willing to learn and analyse will be required to side-step the shackles of time-serving mediocrity. And we would all wish that for the next generation, won't we? The one place where clear thought can be honed into an instinct is the classroom – allow the education system to adopt genuinely learning-friendly practices and future generations will dazzle with their confidence and carry Sikkim forward. Don't do so, and a majority will remain hesitant and unsure, seeking out charlatans to form their beliefs, ideologies and pursuits.

If education was approached with the aim to open minds, not suppress inquisitiveness, the quality that everyone seeks to infuse into the system will become a reality. What the present system delivers, and this is a national malaise, is infectious indecisiveness. Students are not encouraged to enquire or seek clarifications and every effort is made to drill them into an army of monotony, their uniqueness and differences brushed over by soul-sapping rigour and mind-numbing routine. It is rare to find students with wide-ranging interests any more. In fact, the syllabus and pattern of education do not even allow children the space to develop any meaningful interests any more. Even when these interests are displayed at annual day functions they are mostly hobbies decided for them by the teachers or "talents" singled out by them for display. Student projects for interschool competitions are prepared by teachers and every intonation of a poetry recital for competition dictated to them. We just won't allow them to make their mistakes and learn from them or stand by their side in case assistance is required; we believe that we are serving them by hand-holding them through their years in school, college, university, and if we have the "contact", even their employment.

More and more teachers are so scared that students will "fail" them that they end up spoon-feeding them. At the other extreme are teachers who see no hope in their students so they don't get involved at all. In both scenarios, the student meets the same fate – a confidence stamped down even before it could develop. A good way to start delivering Sikkim a more confident generation would be to allow students to discover more things by themselves and in doing so, they will also discover the confidence required to think and decide for themselves later in life.

When gold prices go up, so does the cost of a dowry

...and baby girl survival rates in India fall

When world gold prices go up, fewer girl babies in India survive the first month of life, according to our new research. My colleagues and I suggest that this is linked to gold often being part of wirds and the survive in the survi bridal dowries in India - so when gold prices go up, the cost of raising girls rises and families tend to

neglect or abort them.

Dowry, a transfer at marriage from parents to daughters, is an ancient tradition thought to date back to at least 200BC, and was widely prevalent in medieval Western Eu-

rope. While it has virtually disappeared in most of the rest of the world, it persists in contemporary India - despite prohibition since 1961 - and has

hitida – despite profiliotion since 1961 – and has become increasingly common in Bangladesh, Paki-stan, and Sri Lanka. While dowry payments originally acted as a bequest to daughters that afforded them financial protection after their marriage, dowries are now often appropriated by the groom or his parents rather than retained by the bride.

Dowries impose a considerable tax on girls'

families, with estimates indicating that in South Asia it is six times the average annual household income. As a result, even though dowry is banned and can result in prosecution, families in India often start saving for dowry as soon as a girl is born.
Previous research has also suggested that dowry costs contribute to a preference among Indian par-ents for sons rather than daughters, but there is no previous causal quantitative evidence of this.

While there is no consistent time series data on dowry transactions across India, my colleagues and I analysed variation in the financial burden of dowries over more than three decades, based on fluctuation in gold prices on the world market. Gold, typically in the form of jewellery, is an integral part of dowry in India and since India imports more than 90% of its gold, fluctuations in the international price translate into fluctuations in the cost of dowr

GIRL BABIES NEGLECTED

We merged monthly data on international gold prices between 1972 and 2005 with monthly birth cohort data, and analysed whether gold price chang-

es influenced the sex ratio at birth and the survival of a newborn girl up to the age of one month. Using this large data set with more than 100,000 births, we found that in months where the gold price went up, the chances of a girl surviving through the neo-natal period were significantly lower than for boys. In fact, gold price inflation was correlated with an

improved survival chance for boys.

Between 1972 and 1985, our analysis showed a 6.3% increase in the monthly price of gold was accompanied by an increase in girl neonatal mortality of 6.4%. During the same period, there was no significant corresponding change in male neo-

natal mortality.

We also found that those women who were born in months when the gold price was increasing were shorter in adulthood. This is consistent with previous research which has established that nutritional deprivation in early life leads to lower stature in adulthood, and that some parents in India deprive girls of nutritional inputs. In this case, it could be that lower levels of breastfeeding led to girls born in months of gold inflation being shorter as adults. We found that those girls that survived carried a marker of relative neglect into adulthood, compared to boys born in months of gold price inflation.

We separated out the results for children born between 1986 and 2005, as ultrasound technology became widely available across India after the mid 1980s. My previous research showed that in this period parents shifted away from neglecting girls after birth to aborting unwanted girls before birth. For potential births after 1986,

pregnancy was accompanied by a statistically significant 0.3 percent-age point decline in the probability that a girl rather than a boy would

FOCUS ON GOLD

By one means or the other, parents seem to be reacting to gold price increases by trying to reduce the chance of having a surviving girl child. Clearly, to respond in this way parents need to be aware of changes in gold prices. Given the importance of gold in India, gold prices regularly feature in the media but people also talk frequently about gold prices and dowry costs. If Indians were not aware of the gold price fluctuations, it would be hard to find an alternative explanation of our findings.

We conducted various tests of our results, to determine how

strongly we can link these back to dowry costs. For example, it could be that gold price increases are a proxy for a decline in real income because those who want to buy gold have less money to spend on other things and this may have an impact on girl survival rates. However, after investigating these possibilities statistically, we concluded that the evidence points to dowry costs as the driver of our

One may imagine that parents react to increases in gold prices by reducing the amount of gold given in dowry while maintaining its value. But, using a rural survey containing information on dow-ry, we found that its value tends to rise more or less proportionately with gold prices, suggesting that social norms may make it hard to adjust quantities

Recent government figures from India's Census Office suggest that only 900 girls were born for every 1,000 boys between 2013 and 2015, indicating a continuing trend in the abortion of girl foetuses. This is despite persistent high economic growth and declining poverty in India over the past three

Policies to strengthen the monitoring of dowry prohibition in India are unlikely to work because social norms lead families to support tradition and to co-operate in violating the ban. But there is room for hope: the equalisation of property rights for women and rising levels of education for both men and women may slowly but spontaneously loosen the dowry tradition.

Maths quiz: a very problematic game of tennis

GIHAN MARASINGHA

Each day for a week, a tennis player is to receive a number of tennis rackets as a gift. She knows that she'll get a different number of rackets on each of the seven days and is told exactly how many she'll receive in total. Using only this information she deduces that on at least one day she'll be presented with at least ten rackets. What is the minimum total number of rackets she could receive for her to know this?

THE SOLUTION (SPOILER ALERT)
She'll be given at least 43 rackets. Any fewer and she couldn't guarantee she would receive ten or more on any one day. For example, if the total was 42, she could receive 9 + 8 + 7 + 6 + 5 + 4 + 3 (= 42) – and not necessarily get ten in one go.

This puzzle is based on the so-called pigeonhole principle. If more than n pigeons are to be placed in n pigeonholes, then at least one pigeonhole must contain at least two pigeons.

The pigeonhole principle has striking consequences. You might wonder, for instance, how likely it is for two people in London to have the same number of hairs on their head. To make the problem interesting, we'll only consider non-bald

There are more than eight million Londoners. These are our "pigeons". We put each Londoner into a pigeonhole labelled with the number of hairs on his or her head. Humans have 100,000 head hair follicles, on average. The number of follicles are the pigeonholes. Even taking into account variance from the average and bald Londoners, there are vastly more pigeons than pigeonholes. This proves that at least two non-bald Londoners have exactly the same number of hairs

Samsung's foldable phone could soon be a reality

We rarely see a tru-ly remarkable new technology more than once a decade. Af-ter years of undelivered promises, such a tech-nology looks finally set to enter the market: the flexible computer

Imagine, a tablet display you can fold up and put in your pocket, a smart watch whose strap is the screen, or a handbag that is also a monitor and keyboard. Nokia originally called this proposed technology "Morph" back in 2008 because of the plethora of applications it would make possible. Now it looks like it will become a reality.

After nearly two decades of work, Samsung is rumoured to be getting ready for the launch of the first flexible smartphone. The company's head of mobile recently said it was "time to deliver" such a phone, and that the development process for it was "nearly concluded".

But perhaps more significantly, the Samsung Display division of the company recently said it had developed an "unbreakable smartphone panel" that had passed rigorous safe-ty testing. Even after being subjected to temperatures of 71°C and -32°C, and dropped from a height of 1.8 metres, the display showed no signs of damage and functioned normally.

This display is a flexible organic light emitting diode (OLED) panel made of an unbreakable surface with a plastic overlay window attached to it, making it simultaneously lightweight and tough as glass but a lot



more robust. Manufacturers have yearned for many years to make dis-plays with flexible, bendable properties and a paper-like feel with elec-tronic functionality. If Samsung has truly found a way to protect a flexible OLED then it has solved a major technical challenge in removing the need for the glass screens used on most other displays today.

Glass was originally needed to

actually stop displays from bending. Old-fashioned liquid crystal displays easily distorted when bent because the molecules in the liquid inside them would become misaligned. To-day's OLED screens are based on a solid layer of light-emitting material that doesn't easily distort in this way. But glass is also used to protect the organic molecules in an OLED display from being degraded by water vapour and other gases that would shorten their lifespan. Until now, encapsulating displays in flexible plastic hasn't been enough to protect them

A more advanced, better quality kind of screen known as a quantum dot light emitting diode (QLED) display can also be made flexible. These use nano-crystals to produce high-quality, pure and sharp monochromatic light. They convert the backlight into the pure basic colours without the use of filters. But encapsulating QLED displays is even harder than OLEDs and o are likely to take a lot longer to turn

INCREASING FLEXIBILITY

Samsung's flexible OLED screen is likely to be have the most basic level of flexibility, with the ability to be bent and curved without distorting the display but not completely folded. The level of flexibility might be increased as the nanotechnology in the screens improves, as the nanow ires used to carry electricity through the displays become more flexible at smaller diametres.

In the future we may eventually ee rollable displays that can be rolled up like a scroll. The most advanced type of flexible screen will be one that can be folded or even crushed like a sheet of paper and still produce

most exciting idea for creating these screens is to use new "auxtetic" ma-terials, which become thicker as they are stretched rather than thinner

These materials can absorb high energy impacts and are made of single molecules or crystals that can self-align once distorted. They are typically lightweight and would allow the creations of screens with hingelike design features that can flex sig nificantly.

In the meantime, appears that within a year we could be able to snuggle up in bed reading from a screen that we don't have to worry about damaging if we fall asleep on it. I, for one, can't wait to get my hands on this new tech.

42 arrested for cheating in constable recruitment exam

KOLKATA, SEP 24 (PTI): The West Bengal CID has arrested 42 people for allegedly adopting unfair means during written examination conducted for recruitment of police constables, a senior offi-cer said Monday.

The investigation de-partment has initiated criminal cases against all

42 of them, he said.
"We had information that candidates in different examination centres will be using improvised wireless devices, com-prising a receiver in the shape of a credit card and an earphone, during Sunday's preliminary test for constable rescruitment," the Criminal Investiga tion Department (CID) officer said.

The devices were hidden in the "sole of shoes and slippers" of candidates, he said.

"We have also seized micro earpieces from many candidates. These devices, if connected to a mobile phone, could be operated by accomplices outside the premises."

There could be a racket behind the illegal practice, the senior officer said.

"A racket could be running the operation from outside.

The CID is making efforts to arrest all those involved in the racket," he added

Goods train derails in Dima Hasao district

HAFLONG, SEP 24 (PTI): A goods train derailed in Assam's Dima Hasao district Monday but there was no report of any ca-sualty, N-F Railway officials said.

All trains in the Lum-ding-Silchar hill section have been cancelled till Tuesday due to the de-railment, they said.

The goods train was going towards Silchar from Lumding when 20 wagons derailed be-tween Daotuhaja and Phiding railway station in the district at around 9.30 am, the sources said adding there was no report of any casualty in the mishap.

The proposed pact is expected to cover areas of intelligence sharing, exchange programme, sharing of best practices, cooperation in disaster mitigation besides others, an official said.

a year after a two-monthlong border stand-off be-tween the India Army and the China's People's Liberation Army at Doklam on the India-Bhutan-China tri-junction.

Prime Minister Nar-endra Modi and Chinese President Xi Jinping held an informal summit in Wuhan, China, in April this year which helped repair bilateral ties.

12,750 cases of crime against women in Assam in 2017-2018: Minister

GUWAHATI, SEP 24 (PTI): The Assam government Monday told the Assem-bly that 12,750 cases of crime against women were registered in the state in the year 2017-18.

In a written reply to a query by Congress MLA Kamalakhya Dey Purkavastha. Parliamentary Affairs Minister Chandra Mohan Patowary said in Assam 1,751 cases of rapes, 539 murders and 10,460 dowry crimes took place across the state in 2017-18.

Replying on behalf of Chief Minister Sarbanan-da Sonowal, who holds the Home portfolio, Patowary informed that in the previous financial year 1,571 rapes, 490 murders and 9,629 dow-ry related crimes were

registered in the state. In 2016, the total

number of crimes re-corded in Assam was 1,07,022, which went up to 1,11,118 in 2017, the minister said.

To a separate question of AGP MLA Ramendra Narayan Kalita, Patowary said the state has witnessed a total of 84,540 crimes related to theft, dacoity, kidnapping, sexual harassment, rape, dowry, accident and superstition till August 2018 from the time alliance government came to power in 2016.

In this period, 56 extremists have been killed, while seven secu-rity personnel also lost their lives in addition to injuries to 14 other secu-rity persons, he added.

Under-construction bridge collapses in West Bengal

KAKDWIP (WB), SEP 24 (PTI): An under-construction bridge collapsed in Kakdwip area of South 24 Parganas district on Monday, a senior official said. There has been no report of any casualty, South 24 Parganas district magistrate Y. Ratnakara Rao said.

"The incident happened on Monday morning. We are waiting for further details," the district magistrate said. A team has been rushed to the spot to look into the incident, he said.

This is the third incident of bridge collapse in the state in September. Majerhat Bridge in south Kolkata had collapsed on September 4, killing three persons and injuring 24. On September 7, an old bridge had collapsed near Siliguri in north Bengal leaving a truck driver injured.

WB govt ready to thwart **BJP-sponsored Bangla** bandh: Partha

KOLKATA, SEP 24 (PTI): West Bengal minister Partha Chatterjee Monday acused BIP of trying to foment trouble in the state by calling a 12-hour shutdown on Wednesday and said all steps will be taken to ensure normal life on the day.

Apart from issuing notification for state government employees to attend office on the bandh day and running state-operated transport system, the government will ask commercial establishments, private educational institutions tablishments. to function normally, the education minister said.

Chatterjee, who is the secretary general of the Trinamool Congress, was speaking to reporters after attending a meeting of Group of Ministers here at the state secretariat.

As in previous bandhs, a special noti-fication will be in place regarding attendance of the government employees, the minister said.

Chatterjee also said Chief Minister Mamata Banerjee was monitoring the developments in the state from Milan in Italy.

Transport Minister Suvendu Adhikary has been asked to coordinate with private bus oper-ators to run their fleet normally on the bandh day, he said.



The BJP has called a 12-hour Bengal bandh on Wednesday to pro-test the deaths of ITI student Rajesh Sarkar and third-year college student Tapas Barman at Daribhit village in Islam-pur of North Dinajpur district. Chatteriee, who ac-

cused the BJP and Sangh Parivar organisations such as Bajrang Dal and RSS of using the language of threat and coercion to enforce the bandh, called upon the people to approach the administration, if they faced distur-bances on the road.

"We will do what-

ever is needed to keep life normal," he asserted adding the government was bent on maintaining communal harmony and

amity in the state. To a question, Chat-terjee said the BJP was

resorting to the politics

of bandh as they had lost bases and suffering from frustration.

He said the government has already sus-pended the District Inspector of schools, North Dinajpur, following the incident at Islampur.

India have been on a roll after an unimpressive start against Hong Kong, with couple of one-sided victories over arch-rivals Pakistan and an equally facile one against

Bangladesh.
With a spot in Friday's final sealed, skipper Rohit Sharma may want some of his untested middle-order batsmen to get quality time in the middle against some-one of Rashid Khan's calibre.

Often in cricket, the 'Law of Averages' catches up with the best performing teams at



a critical juncture.

Shikhar Dhawan (327)and skipper Rohit (269) have done the bulk of the scoring in the four matches so far with very little contribution being required from the other batsmen in the line-up.

The next highest score is Ambati Rayudu (116 runs) because he comes in at No 3.

The problem has been lack of batting time for the likes of Mahendra Singh Dho-

ni, Kedar Jadhav and Dinesh Karthik so far.

Sample this: Rohit and Shikhar have so far faced 284 and 321 deliveries respectively. The next best Rayudu has played 162 balls.

balls), Dhoni (40 balls) and Kedar (27 balls) can be found wanting if there is a top-order collapse on the big day.

Rohit had given Dhoni

an opportunity to come in at No 4 against Bangladesh and the former captain scored 33 runs. But it was a pressure-free situation.

Dhoni's achilles heel of late has been to keep the scoreboard ticking in pres-sure situations that the middle-overs throw up. If the likes of Rashid Khan

and Mujeeb ur Rahman can put pressure, it will be a good warm-up for the middle-order trio before the final match.

The Indian captain might fancy batting first in case he wins the toss, which in turn will give his team a chance to bat 50 overs instead of chas-

The Indian bowlers have been splendid on the slow Dubai International Stadium track with all the bowlers enjoying an economy rate of less than five runs per over.

The spinners have been on a roll with Yuzvendra Chahal (5 wickets at 4.61 runs over) and Kuldeep Ya day (5 wickets in 4.01 runs per over) have been tight as usual while Jasprit Bumrah (7 wickets with 3.37 runs per over) has been exceptional at the death with his yorkers.

Bhuvneshwar Kumar (6 wickets at 4.08 per over), in his comeback tournament, has also been consistent.

There is a possibility that India might rest both Bhuvneshwar and Bumrah before the summit clash to help them recharge their batteries

I'm a 'scapegoat' says sacked Sri Lanka captain Mathews

Colombo, Sept 24 (AFP): Sri Lanka's sacked skipper Angelo Mathews accused the country's cricket board Monday of blaming him solely for the island's humiliating

exit from the Asia Cup.
The 31-year-old all rounder has threatened to retire from the two shorter formats of the game after being dumped on Sunday as captain of Sri Lanka's one-day international and twenty20 teams

"I have been made the scapegoat in this entire saga of Sri Lanka's dis-mal performance against Bangladesh and Afghanistan in the Asia Cup," Mathews said in a letter to Sri Lanka Cricket.

The board said it asked Mathews to step down and allow Dinesh Chandimal to lead Sri Lanka during England's tour which begins next

The national selec tors... have requested Mathews to relinquish his duties as captain with immediate effect," the board said in a state-ment. It did not elaborate on why Mathews was sacked.

But it follows Sri Lanka's drubbing in the Asia Cup, with losses to lower-ranked Afghanistan and Bangladesh ensuring the island nation's quick exit from the competition.

Sri Lanka thumped by 137 runs against Bangladesh in their opening match of the tournament, and have now lost 30 of their 40 matches

since January 2017. Chandimal, who already captain of Sri Lanka's Test side, now takes the reins in all three formats of the game.

Sri Lanka will face England in five oneday internationals, one twenty20 and three Test matches from October 10.



ABU DHABI, SEPT 24 (PTI): Mustafizur Rahman held his nerve to bowl a fantastic final over as Bangladesh eked out a three-run win over a gutsy Afghanistan to tay afloat in the race for the Asia Cup final.

Afghanistan yet again came close to a victory against a top-Asian team but faltered at the finish line, losing plot in the last 10 overs of the chase during Sunday's match.

They needed eight runs off

the final over but experienced paceman Mustafizur conceded only four and also dismissed dangerous Rashid Khan (5).

Afghanistan looked well in control with Hashmatullah (71) and captain Asghar Afghan (39) going very strong after losing three wickets.

They stitched a 78-run part-nership for the fourth wicker but Bangladesh skipper Mashrafe Mortaza dismissed both to puncture Afghanistan hopes.

Mohammad Nabi (38) and Samiullah Shenwari (23 not out) produced a quick-fire 46run stand for the sixth wicket but that was not enough as they ended with 246 for seven, while chasing 250.

Mahmudullah (74) made it memorable match for himself. After batting well at crucial juncture, he dismissed Afghanistan opener Mohammad Shahzad (53) and also took a catch of the rival skipper.

Bangladesh now need to

beat Pakistan on Wednesday to



qualify for the summit clash.

Afghanistan bowlers could not capitalise on a dominant start upfront and allowed Bangladesh to score a competitive 249 for seven with Mahmud-ullah and Imrul Kayes repairing the innings with fighting half-centuries.

Mahmudullah and Kayes (72

not out), playing his first ODI in almost a year, shared a 128-run stand for the fifth wicket to lift their side from a precarious 87 for five after electing to bat.

in the Olympiad this year is reigning world cham-pion Magnus Carlsen and Norwegians, who fin-ished a creditable sixth last year.

"It is not necessarily always in pairs whole team that can contribute as well; so we can get goals from other areas of the team." Corominas noted.

"Myself and Lanzarote had scored quite a goals between us (in the last ISL season) and ultimately it is because of the style of play we had. The idea is to recreate that as much as possible this year," he added.

FC Goa winger Mandar Rao Dessai, who will be with the side for the fifth season, said he was being helped by foreign and senior players.

Their assistant coach Jesus

Tato said it was important for the players to retain their style

of play.
"We have to improve on some things. Last season we scored a lot of goals, but conceded lot of goals also. This season we will try to improve our defence line and not con-

cede so many goals," Tato said. FC Goa would begin their campaign against North East United on October 1.

Trump's latest tariffs on China begin to bite

WASHINGTON, SEP 24 (AFP): President Donald Trump's latest round of punitive tariffs on China took effect on Monday, adding 200 billion in Chinese imports to the esca-lating trade war that is clouding the global economic horizon

The new attack on Beijing brings the amount of goods hit by duties to more than 250 billion, roughly half of Chinese exports to the United States, and increasingly consumers will feel the pain in their wallets directly.

Trump has hit 12 per-

cent of total US imports this year alone.

Defiant in the face of

increasing fears about the impact to the US economy, Trump has threatened to go after 100 percent of imports from China if the country refuses to change policies he says harm US industry, particularly the theft of American technology. "These

practices plainly constitute a grave threat to the long-term health and prosperity of the United States econohe said in announcing the tariffs last week.

"We are going to win it," his Secretary of State Mike Pompeo told "Fox News Sunday." "We're going to get an outcome which forces China to behave in a way that if you want to be a power -- a global power -- transparency, rule of law, you don't steal intellectual property." Beijing has



promised to strike back on Monday with duties on 60 billion in American goods, bringing the total to 110 billion, nearly everything China buys from the United States.

But Trump warned he could ramp up to "phase three," slapping tariffs on approximately 267 billion of additional imports, or the entirety of the goods the US buys from China.

Dialogue between the world's two biggest economies appears severed. Beijing cancelled the visit of a Chinese negotiating team expect-ed September 27-28 in Washington, The Wall Street Journal said.

Previous talks in late August were ineffective.

In that context, the International Monetary Fund has warned about the potential for "significant economic costs," including slower growth.

"Should the escala-

tion go further, the economic costs for both countries and around the world will quickly add up," IMF spokesman Ger-ry Rice said last week.

Meanwhile, Fitch Ratings has cut its growth estimates for China and the world for 2019.

"Protectionist US trade policies have now reached the point where reached the point where they are materially af-fecting what remains a strong global growth outlook," Fitch said in a report Friday.

The latest round of Chinese imports will face 10 percent tariffs through the end of the year, and then the rate will jump to 25 percent.

A broad swath of products are on the hit list, including billions in Chinese-made voice data receivers, computer memory modules, automatic data processors, and accessories for office equipment such as copiers and banknote dispensers -- instantly making widely used goods more expensive.

However, following complaints from thoufollowing sands of US firms -- including cluding powerhouses like Apple and Walmart - 300 product lines were dropped from the target

The products spared also include smartwatch-es and Bluetooth devices, like the iPhone and Fitbit, child safety products such as high chairs, car seats and playpens, and certain health-and-safety products such as bicycle helmets, US officials said.

The removal of smartwatches and wireless headphones represents a win for tech giant Apple, just days after it unveiled its latest smartwatch and three new iPhones as part of a bid to fight back after slipping to third place among smartphone

Rohingya crisis: UN has 'no right to interfere' says Myanmar army chief

YANGON, SEP 24 (AFP): Myan mar's army chief said the United Nations had no right to interfere in the sovereignty of the country a week after a UN probe called for him and other top generals to be prosecuted for "genocide" against the Rohingya minority.

The defiant response is the army chief's first public reaction since a UN fact-finding mission urged the Security Council to refer Myanmar's top military brass to the International Criminal Court (ICC).

No country, organisation or group has the "right to interfere in and make decisions over sovereignty of a country," Senior General Min Aung Hlaing told troops in a speech Sunday, according to the

military-run newspaper Myawady. "Talks to meddle in internal affairs (cause) misunderstanding."

UN investigators went into hor-rific detail about the atrocities allegedly committed by army troops last year in their clearance opera-tions against the Rohingya, which forced more than 700,000 of the stateless Muslims to flee over the



border into Bangladesh.

Troops, often aided by ethnic Rakhine mobs, committed murder, rape, arson and torture, employing unfathomable levels of violence and with a total disregard for hu-

man life, they concluded.

The military has denied near ly all wrongdoing, justifying its crackdown as a legitimate means of rooting out Rohingya militants.

Myanmar's civilian ment, led by Aung San Suu Kyi, had already rejected the report's find-ing as "one-sided" and "flawed"

and dismissed a separate decision at the criminal court that found it had jurisdiction over the crisis.

Suu Kyi's civilian government shares power with the still mighty army, which has retained control over a quarter of parliamenta-ry seats and three key ministries since the nation emerged from di-

rect junta-rule in 2011.

The UN team also criticised the Nobel Laureate's government for "acts and omissions" that had 'contributed to the commission of atrocity crimes".

Fresh sexual assault allegation against Justice Kavanaugh

WASHINGTON, SEP 24 (PTI): A new sexual assault allegation has surfaced against Justice Brett Kavanaugh and is being investigated by the Senate Democrats, a media report claimed Sunday, a development that can further complicate the confirmation process of President Donald Trump's Supreme Court nominee.

Justice Kavanaugh, who is al-

ready facing at least one publicly known similar charge, was quick to deny the latest allegation, which dates back to his time as freshman at the Yale University in the 1980s.

Justice Kavanaugh and the ac-

cuser of the first allegation against him, Christine Blasey Ford, are scheduled to testify before the Senate Judiciary Committee on



"This alleged event from 35 years ago did not happen. The people who knew me then know that this did not happen and have said so. This is a smear, plain and simple," Justice Kavanaugh said a statement issued through the White House.

"I look forward to testifying on Thursday about the truth, and defending my good name -- and the reputation for character and integrity I have spent a lifetime building -- against these last-minute allegations," the Supreme Court nominee said after The New Yorker maga zine published the latest allegation of sexual assault against him

The alleged sexual assault dat-ed back to the 1983-84 academic school year, when Justice Kavanaugh was a freshman at Yale Univer-sity, The New Yorker said, adding that at least two Senate Democrats were investigating the allegation.

The magazine identified the

woman as Deborah Ramirez (53). She attended Yale with Justice Kavanaugh, where she studied sociology and psychology, the mag-azine said. Later, she spent years working for an organisation that supports the victims of domestic ence, it added.

Maldives opposition leader wins presidential poll

COLOMBO, SEP 24 (AFP): Opposition leader Ibrahim Mo-hamed Solih won the Maldives' presiden-tial election, results showed Monday, a surprise defeat for President Abdulla Yameen, following a campaign observers said was rigged in the strongman's favour.

Results released by the Elections

nission

Monday morning showed Solih had secured 58.3 per cent of the popular vote.

Celebrations broke out across the tropical archipelago with opposition supporters carrying yellow flags of Solih's Maldivian Democratic Party (MDP) and dancing on the streets. There was no response from Yameen after the results were anno inced.

Solih had the backing of a united opposition trying to oust Yameen but struggled for visibility with the electorate, with the local media fearful of falling afoul of heavy-handed decrees

and reporting restrictions.

There were also no other candidates at Sunday's election held with all key dissidents either in jail or exile.

Earlier in the night, Solih had called on Yameen to concede defeat once the tally showed he had an unassailable lead. 'I call on Yameen to respect the

will of the people and bring about a peaceful, smooth transfer of power," he said on television.

He also urged the incumbent to

mediately release scores of political prisoners.

Yameen, who was widely tipped to retain power, had jailed or forced into exist almost all of his main rivals. Before the polls opened, police raided the campaign headquarters of Party (MDP) and searched the build-ing for several hours in a bid to stop what they called "illegal activities".



There were no arrests.

Mohamed Nasheed, the head of the MDP, said the vote would "bring the country back to the democratic

Yameen would have no option but to concede defeat, said Nasheed, who was elected president of a new-ly-democratic Maldives in 2008 but

iy-democratic Maldives in 2008 but currently lives in exile.

"He will not have people around him who will support him to fight on and stay," he told AFP.

The polls were closely watched by regional rivals India and China, by regional rivals India and China, who are jostling to influence Indian Ocean nations. The European Union and United States, meanwhile, have threatened sanctions if the vote is not free and fair.

Many voters across the Indian Ocean archipelago said they stood in line for over five hours to cast their ballots, while expatriate Maldivians voted in neighbouring Sri Lanka and

The Elections Commission said balloting was extended by three hours until 7:00 pm (1400 GMT) because of technical glitches suffered by tablet computers containing elec-toral rolls, with officials using manu-al systems to verify voters' identities.

An election official said the deadline was also extended due to a heavy voter turnout, which was later de-clared at 88 per cent.

Yameen voted minutes after the

polling booths opened in the capital

sition campaign ef-forts had been frus-trated by a media crackdown and police harassment

Some 2,62,000 people in the archi-pelago -- famed for its white beaches and eligible to vote in an election from which independent international monitors have been barred.

Only a handful of foreign media were allowed in to cover the poll.

The Asian Network for Free Elections, a foreign monitoring group that was denied access to the Maldives, said the campaign had been heavily tilted in favour of 59-year-old Yameen. The government has used "vague-

worded laws to silence dissent and to intimidate and imprison critics", some of whom have been assaulted and even murdered, according to Human Rights Watch.

Before the election, there were rnings that Yameen could try to do n to power at all costs.

In February he declared a state of



"It is an interesting time. The way we consume entertainment is evolv ing. But I don't see digital completely taking over feature film industry as such. There will be a dent in the number of films being made for the screen and the amount of content made for digital," he said. "That gap will increase but fea-

ture film won't go away completely. The kind of films made for the screen will change. The small-mid range films will definitely gravitate towards the digital while the big-ticket tentpole films will draw the audiences to theatres," the director added.
