KOLKATA, MAR 18 (PTI): The Election Commis sion(EC) has seized Rs 54.87 lakh in cash from four persons in Jaigaon area in West Bengal's Alipurduar district so far before the Lok Sabha polls, additional Chief Electoral Officer Sanjay Basu said on Monday.

The seizures were made by the state police and flying squads, he told

The EC has also seized from various districts 59 arms, 235 am-munition, besides 6757 kg of ammonium nitrate and 2676 kilograms of gelatine stick powder from various areas of the state, where the seven-phase general elec-tions are slated to begin on April 11. It also seized 3782

litres of liquor, 366 litres of country spirit besides cough syrup, Basu said. The EC, he said,

would conduct aware ness programme or EVMs and VVPAT in all the polling booths across the state on Tuesday and the day after.

But repeated failure by RCom to comply with the promise and Ambani's personal guarantee landed him in trouble last month when the Supreme Court held him in contempt.

Thereafter, it suffered another blow when Na tional Company Law Appellate Tribunal (NCLAT) last week refused to free up Rs 260 crore tax refunds withheld by lenders saving it did not have jurisdiction to do so. Banks had opposed release of the tax

The anex court on February 20 had held Ambani guilty of contempt of court and ordered the debt-lad-en company to clear the dues to Ericsson within four weeks or face a 3-month jail term. The last date of making the payment was March 19.

In a verdict that had come as a setback to Ambani, the court on February 20 had pulled up the industrialist for his "cavalier attitude" demonstrated through the affidavit filed in the court and said any "unconditional apology" given must be rejected

"The RCom group is directed to purge the contempt of this Court by payment to Ericsson the sum of Rs 453 crore within a period of four weeks from today. In default of such payment, the Chairmen who have given undertakings to this Court will suffer three months imprisonment," the bench of Justices R F Nariman and Vineet Saran had said

It had also directed the registry of the apex court to pay Rs 118 crore deposited by the RCom group to Ericsson.

The payment made on Monday is expected to bring curtains down on the bitter and protracted face-off between Reliance Communications and Ericsson over the outstanding dues.



"We are looking for credible information and intelligence and appeal the people," KK Vyavhare, director general of income tax (investigation), told re-





Whatever happened to Skiing at Phuni?

A 'touristy' activity of much potential appears to have fallen off the priority list

North Sikkim has received some heavy snowfall this year. Speaking to the residents of Lachen and Lachung would have one believe that the March Snow was among the heaviest in living memory, the snowline having come down much lower than most winters. But human memory can play tricks and records might show otherwise, but what cannot be denied is that snowfall has sustained for longer than has been common in recent years and has been thick as well. This brings to mind an interesting experiment which had been attempted at Phuni in North Sikkim some years ago - skiing. The skiing festival, if memory serves, was organized for two consecutive vears, the first time by the Tourism Department and the next year by private tourism stakeholders. It has kind of fallen off the map since. It did not help that the intervening years saw hardly any snowfall and then the earthquake of 2011 happened and the focus was perhaps lost.

Phuni is located ahead of Lachung a few kilometers short of Yumthang valley. It is also a place frequented by tourists not just because it is en route to Yumthang, but also because it now boasts of an azure blue glacial melt lake which formed there a few years back. And while the formation of this lake presents its own set of climate-change/ global warming worries, we speak of skiing here. Skiing is definitely an activity that will do well in Sikkim and remains one of the few touristy activities which has not been explored with any real consistency even though there are some options available. Phuni was especially well-suited for this because its gentle slopes provided just enough rush to satiate the awkwardness of beginners than the more imposing skiing options at Yumthang which would thrill the better skiers but are best not attempted by tourists on a sightseeing junket. The distance and the complications involved in reaching these locations proved a hindrance earlier, but nowadays, tourists make it to Lachen and Lachung in large enough numbers to sustain a seasonal skiing industry; even add a day to their itinerary for North Sikkim.

Skiing is in itself a tempting invite which few tourists will be able to refuse or bypass, and this needs to be revisited in earnest. And now that Sikkim has quite a few trained-in-adventure sports youth - look at how well paragliding in doing in Gangtok - it should be an initiative that is explored and promoted again.

So what if a compromise has been made, at least a language would have been saved.

Christchurch attacks are a stark warning of toxic political environment that allows hate to flourish

When lives are tragically cut short, it is generally easier to explain the "how" than the "why". This dark reality is all the more felt when tragedy comes at the hands of murderous intent. Explaining how 50 people came to be killed, and almost as many badly injured, in Christchurch's double mas-sacre of Muslims at prayer is heartbreaking but relatively straightforward.

As with so many mass murders in recent years, the use of an assault rifle, the ubiquitous AR15, oxymoronically referred to as "the civilian M-16",

explains how one cowardly killer could be so lethal.

It was much the same in the Pulse nightclub in Orlando three years ago, when one gunman shot dead 49 people in a crowded space and, though the motive appears very different, the same sort of military instrument of death lies behind the 58 deaths in Las Vegas a year later. An AR15 was used to shoot dead 11 worshippers in Pittsburgh's Tree of Life Synagogue last October and a similar weapon was used to kill six people in a Quebec City mosque in January 2017.

It is a credit to the peaceful nature of New Zealand society that, despite the open avail-ability of weapons like the AR15, the last time there was a mass shooting was in 1997. Prime Minister Jacinda Ardern rightly identified reform of gun laws as one of the immediate out-

comes required in response to this tragedy.

But lax gun laws are arguably the only area in which blame can be laid in New Zealand, Ardern, together with Australian Prime Minister Scott Morrison, was also right to refer to this barbaric act of cold-blooded murder of people in prayer as right wing extremist terrorism driven by Islamophobic hatred.

State and federal police in Australia have long warned that, next to the immediate threat posed by Salafi jihadi terrorism, they are most concerned about the steady rise of right-wing extremism. There has been some comfort in the recognition that the most active right wing extremist groups, and there are many, are disorganised, poorly led, and attract but small

On the face of it, then, right wing extremism in Australia is nowhere near as serious as the neo-Nazi movements of Europe or the various permutations of white supremacy and toxic nationalism that bedevil American politics. In America, it is conservatively estimated that there were 50 deaths due to terrorist attacks in 2018, almost all linked to right-wing extremism.
In 2017, it is calculated that there were 950

in 2017, it is calculated that there were 950 attacks on Muslims and mosques in Germany alone. Many of last year's attacks in America involved a common right wing extremist hatred of Islam, and a targeting of Muslims, joining a long-standing enmity towards Jews.

Almost all recent terrorist attacks have been lone-actor attacks. They are notoriously diffi-cult to predict. Whether inspired by Salafi jihadi Islamist extremism or right wing extremism, lone-actor attacks commonly feature individuals fixated on the deluded dream of going from "zero

One of the main reasons authorities struggle with identifying right wing extremist "nobodies" who post online, before they turn to violence, is that it's difficult to pick up a clear signal in the noise of a national discourse increasingly dominated by exactly the same narrative elements of

mistrust, anxiety, and a blaming of the other.

In Australia, as in Europe and America, mainstream politicians and mainstream media commentators have increasingly toyed with extremist ideas in the pursuit of populari-ty. Many have openly brandished outrageous ideas that in previous years would have been unsayable in mainstream political discourse or

commentary.

Donald Trump can be deservedly singled out for making the unspeakable the new normal in mainstream right wing politics, but he is hardly alone in this. And sadly, for all of the relative civility and stability of Australian politics, we too have now come to normalise the toxic politics of fear.

No-one put it better than The Project host

Waleed Aly in saying that Friday's terrorist attacks, although profoundly disturbing, did not come as a shocking surprise. Anyone who has been paying attention and who really cares about the well-being and security of Austra-lian society has observed the steady growth of right wing extremist and right supremacist ideas in general, and Islamophobia particular.

They have seen the numerous attacks on Muslims and Jews at prayer and worried about the day when the murderous violence that has plagued the northern hemisphere will visit the southern hemisphere. But more than that, they have worried about the singling-out of migrants, and in particular asylum seekers, African youth and Muslims as pawns to be played with in the cynical politics of fear.

cynical politics of fear.

Scott Morrison is right to say these problems have been with us for many years. But he would do better to point out that our downward trajectory sharply accelerated after John Howard's "dark victory" of 2001. The unwinnable election was won on the back of the arrival of asylum seekers on the MV Tampa in August followed by the September 11 attacks, and at the artise of labs Howard and the Liberal Lare. the price of John Howard and the Liberal par-ty embracing the white supremacist extremist politics of Pauline Hanson.

Both major parties, it must be said, suc-cumbed to the lure of giving focus groups and pollsters the tough language and inhumane policies the public appeared to demand and reward. We are now beginning to see the true price that we have paid with the demonising of those arriving by boat seeking asylum, or looking too dark-skinned, or appearing too re-

The result has been such a cacophony of hateful rhetoric that it has been hard for those tasked with spotting the emergence of violent extremism to separate it from all the back-ground noise of extremism.

There are, of course lessons to be learned. Authorities need to do better. We can begin with a national database of hate crimes, with standard definitions and robust data collection. Clearly, we need to pay attention to hateful extremism if we are to prevent violent ex-

But ultimately, we need to address the permissive political environment that allows such hateful extremism to be promulgated so openly. The onus is on commentators and political leaders alike. They cannot change the past, but they will determine the future.

It's unclear how many videos actually exist of the creepy-looking mask apparently telling chil-dren to harm themselves, or to what extent they

while some experts suggest anxious adults in-cluding celebrities are driving fear through their uncritical social media sharing, police and school alerts have emphasized the importance of parents being aware of the impact that technology has on

children.

So, while the Momo challenge may not be as big an issue as it was made to be on social media. big an issue as it was made to be on social media, it has raised the issue of the role of technology in children's lives — from the very young to the older child. What is the impact on children when they are frightened by media, or when they view violence?

ADULT SUPERVISION AND INTERACTION

Children understand and process more as they age. But they still require adult supervision and interaction with their use of technology, both at home and in the classroom, in order to help them under-stand the themes and meanings and how stories re-late to them or the lives of other children globally.

Adults need to provide space and time for children to talk and share openly about what they are engaging with, what their friends are saying or

what they are watching when unsupervised.
Parents and teachers can also teach children the importance of breaks from technology to socialize in real life, play and explore. Children should be supported and encouraged to go outside and experience the wonders and silence of nature and to exercise to help keep their hearts healthy and minds

happy. EFFECTS OF FRIGHTENING MEDIA

Fear is an emotional flight or fight response due to an actual or imagined threat. Children don't have



the cognitive ability to separate fantasy from reality. It is not until five or six years of age that children gain a strong understanding of the difference between real and pretend.

The effects of children being frightened by media can include:

Anxiety: Children can develop symptoms of anxiety from watching a video that scares them. The experience is stored in the amygdala, the part of the brain which stores emotions, causing memories of the video to elicit scared and anxious emotions. Young children do not have the life experiences to put videos that scare them into perspective.

Media violence can introduce fears in childhood that continue into adulthood. One study, "Tales from the Screen: Enduring Fright Reactions to Scary Media,"

found that more than 90 per cent of the study's participants, reported a fearful reaction to media during their childhood or adolescence. Over one-quarter of those students who had had fearful reactions continued to experience a "residual anxiety" years lat-

Sleep disturbances: There is evidence suggesting that violent media exposure, as well as media-viewing at night, can be detrimental to a child's quality of sleep. Sleep difficulties can create physiological issues for children including weight prob-lems, cardiovascular issues, learning difficulties, behaviour problems and mental health issues.

Violent and aggressive behaviour: Children who regularly view media violence are more likely to display aggressive behaviour and have a decreased

emotional response to violence and injury. They may become more forgiving of violence, view the world as a hostile place or have less empathy for vic-

STRATEGIES FOR CAREGIVERS

Limit screentime for children: The Canadian Pedi-atrics Society recommends children under two years old should have no screen time and children from ages two to five years old should have less than o hour a day.

Help your children pick media that is age-appro-priate, by using parental rating guides. Understand your child's developmental level and how media may impact them: for example, preschoolers are more likely to be scared by visual images that look quite frightening as opposed to things that could be actually harmful yet appear more neutral.

Provide safety guidelines for watching videos on

line and explain the importance of reading the title and description of what the video is about. This is especially important for children aged around eight to 10 years of age, who want and can be provided with some autonomy.

Keep internet use in common family spaces where

you can easily monitor what children are watching and if frightening or violent images are unexpectedly viewed discuss the content with your child and help them work through any fears or worries they may

IF YOUR CHILD DOES SEE FRIGHTENING CONTENT

Respect your child's feelings. Communicate with our child and explain how what they are feeling is understandable. Help them to manage the fear. Teach simple med-

itation techniques for before bed such as counting breaths to stop fears from impacting their sleep.

Rationalize their fear. A simple explanation such "bugs will never grow larger than a human" can go

There are 40.08 lakh people whose names have been left out of the complete draft of the register after including the names of 2.9 crore people out of a total 3.3 crore applicants.

The system of 'D' (dubious or doubtful) voters was introduced in 1997 by the Election

which prepared a list by incorporating names of those who could not pro-vide evidence in favour of their Indian nationality. It does not exist anywhere else in the country.

'D' voters were not allowed to vote in the 2014 general elections too.

"Currently, we have 1.2 lakh 'D' voters in the electoral rolls as per the last revision. The rolls are being updated con-tinuously and the list will be finalised on the last date of nomination. Therefore, it will be separate for all the different phases," Sahu said. The existing draft roll

was published on Seper 15, 2018 and the final roll was released on

Bru refugees living in Tripura

AIZAWL, MAR 18 (PTI): A total of 15 ter polling stations are being set up in Mamit district Mizoram exclusively for Bru community voters living in relief camps

Of the 15 temporary stations, nine would be for Bru voters of Mamit district and three each for Lunglei and Kolasib districts Mizoram, state Chief Electoral Officer Ashish Kundra said Monday.

A little over 12,000 Bru voters who originally hail from the three districts but now stay in six relief camps in the neighbouring state would exercise their franchise for the lone Lok Sabha seat in Mizoram on April 11.

Thousands of Bru community people had been lodged in the six relief camps in North Tripura district since late 1997 after they fled from Mizoram in the wake of a communal tension.

They would vote the temporary polling stations being erected at Kanhmun village near Tripura border Kundra

The Bru voters had cast their votes at the temporary polling stations at Kanhmun village during the Mizoram As-sembly election held on November 28 last year.

The NGO Coordina-

brella organisation of major civil societies and student bodies, had earlier threatened to launch agitation if temporary polling stations for the Brus were set up.
The organisation was

of the opinion that those living outside Mizoram should not be allowed to vote in the state.

Appealing to the civil societies not to harden their stance, the CEO said launching a stir is a democratic right but thwarting the voting, also a democratic pro cess, by agitation should be avoided.

AGARTALA, MAR 18 (PTI): The Indigenous Nationalist Party of Twipra (INPT), a region-al tribal party of Tripura, Monday announced can-didates for both the Lok Sabha seats in the state. The INPT decided to

declare its candidates after its talks for seat sharing with the opposition Congress failed, party president Bijoy Kumar Hrangkhawl said.

Hrangkhawl, an insurgent turned politi-cian, said INPT leaders met Congress president Rahul Gandhi recently in New Delhi and signed a memorandum of understanding for joint fight against the BJP.

"However, the Tripura Pradesh Congress president gave us a condition that I have to resign as the party president and contest as an independent. This is unacceptto us," Hrangkhawl told a press conference.

Hrangkhawl and INPT eneral secretary Jagadish Debbarma would contest from East and West Tripura Lok Sabha constituencies respectively.

The INPT president

said his party had also held dialogues with sev-eral other regional parties.

Reacting to the de velopment, state Con-gress president Pradyot Kishore said the INPT wanted to contest East Tripura (ST) seat, "which is not acceptable to us".

"We offered support to the party if it contests independently. I don't think our poll prospects will be affected if they go it alone," he said.

The Congress, and the ruling BJP, are yet to an-nounce their candidates.

Both the Lok Sabha seats in the Northeastern state are now held by the CPI(M) and the party has declared the sitting MPs as its candidates.

Contesting separately, the IPFT, ally of the ruling BJP, announced candidates including state Revenue Minister NC Debbarma, for the candidates two seats.

Tripura will go to vote in two phases on April 11 and 18 for West Tripura and East Tripura Lok Sabha constituencies respectively.

HYDERABAD, MAR 18 (PTI): CPI General Secretary Suravaram Sudhakar Reddy Monday said the Left Front cannot accept Congress' "unjustified" demand on seat-sharing issue in West Bengal, and it now looks like that the two would fight the Lok Sabha polls in the state separately.

Left Front and the Congress would fight the elections in West Bengal separately, the veteran communist leader said.

"Indeed, it cannot be ruled out that in the present case the victim had suffered an uncivilised and heartless crime committed by the respon-(two convicts) and there is no room for leniency which can be conceived," a bench of Justices A M Khanwilkar and Ajay Rastogi said.

bench further said. "A crime of this nature does not deserve any kind of clemency. This court cannot be oblivious of the situation that the victim must have suffered an emotional distress which cannot be compensated either by sentencing the accused or by grant of any com-

Baby reunited with dad as Indonesia flood death toll hits 77

SENTANI (INDONESIA), MAR 18 (AFP): A baby trapped under rubble after flash flooding destroyed his home in Indonesia has been reunited with his father after the disaster killed the rest of their family, officials said Monday, as the death toll hit 77.

The five-month old was plucked Sunday from debris inside a house where his mother and siblings were found dead in the hard-hit northeastern town of Sentani.

The tot has since been returned to his surviving father.

"We took the baby to the hospital and had him treated," Papua military spokesman Muhammad Aidi told AFP.

"He was in stable condition and has been released. The father was distressed but happy to be reunited with his baby." The news came as Indonesia's disaster agency raised the official death toll from 58, with more than three dozen people still missing.



Scores have been injured in the disaster, triggered by torrential rain and landslides on Satur-

day.

"The death toll could still go up with 43 people unaccounted for," said national disaster agency spokesman Sutopo Purwo Nugroho.

Rescuers battled mud, rocks and fallen trees in the hunt for survivors, as medical personnel treated the

wounded in makeshift tents.

The military said 5,700 people have been evacuated from the hard-hit area

"We have over 1,000 personnel searching for more victims," Aidi said. Indonesia has issued

a 14-day state of emergency in response to the floods.

Papua shares a border with independent Papua New Guinea on an island just north of Australia.

Flooding is common in Indonesia, especially during the rainy season which runs from October to April.

In January, floods and landslides killed at least 70 people on Sulawesi island, while earlier this month hundreds in West Java province were forced to evacuate when torrential rains triggered severe flooding. people were killed -- including two Malaysian tourists -- and some 182 were injured after an earthquake Sunday triggered a landslide on the Indonesian tourist island of Lombok, next to Bali. The 5.5-magnitude

The 5.5-magnitude quake is thought to have caused the landslide at the Tiu Kelep waterfall in the north of the island.

Lombok was rocked by several earthquakes last summer, killing more than 500 people and leaving over 150,000 homeless.

Last September, the country was hit by an earthquake and tsunami in Palu on Sulawesi island which killed around 2,200 people. The Southeast Asian

The Southeast Asian archipelago of some 17,000 islands is one of the most disaster-prone nations on Earth, straddling the Pacific Ring of Fire, where tectonic plates collide. Earthquakes and volcanic eruptions are common.

BEIJING, MAR 18 (PTI): China said Monday it had arrested about 13,000 "terrorists" in a massive crackdown against militants in the volatile Uygur Muslim-majority Xinjiang region since 2014, denying criticism that Beijing is "buying" silence of the Muslim world with heavy investments in Pakistan and other Islamic countries.

China has faced mounting criticism for the detention of thousands of Uygur Muslims in massive "education

camps".
"Since 2014, Xinjiang has destroyed 1,588 violent and terrorist gangs, arrested 12,995 terrorists, seized 2,052 explosive devices, punished 30,645 people for 4,858 illegal religious activities, and confiscated 345,229 copies of illegal religious materials," a white paper released Monday said.

It said that some areas in Xinjiang were severely disturbed by terrorism and the infiltration of religious extremism.

"For this reason, some people cannot speak, read or write in standard Chinese, have a weak understanding of understanding of difficulty finding employment through a lack of employable skills. As a result, such people are more inclined to be incited or coerced into criminality by terrorist and extremist forces," it said.

China has made significant progress in its counterterrorism and de-radicalisation efforts in Xinjiang, it said.

"However, the three forces of terrorism, separatism and extremism are not gone; their influence can still be felt. And the 'East Turkistan' forces are in search of opportunities to create trouble. We still face a severe and complex situation in combating terrorism and extremism in Xinjiang," it said.

Separately, the Chinese Foreign Ministry spokesman Geng Shuang has denied China is "buying the silence" of Muslim countries with massive investments through the ambitious Belt and Road Initiative (BRI), of which the USD 60 billion China-Pakistan Economic Corridor (CPEC) is a

flagship project.

Diplomats from Pakistan and several other Muslim countries, who were recently taken on a guided tour of Xinjiang following allegations of detention of over a million Uygurs, said there was no religious and cultural repression.

Asked whether China's was investing heaving in Muslim countries to buy their silence, Geng told the reporters that the BRI investments had nothing to do with Xinjiang related issues.

"China pursues preventive counter terrorism measures. I believe the international community recognises this," he said.

The UN human rights panel said in August last year that it had received many credible reports that about a million ethnic Uygurs in China in "massive internment camp that is shrouded in secrecy".

China defended the

China defended the camps, saying they are re-education camps aimed at de-radicalising sections of the Uygur Muslim population from extremism and separatism.

China hits out at 'abnormal, immoral' attacks on Huawei

BRUSSELS, MAR 18 (AFP): China's foreign minister lashed out Monday at "abnormal, immoral" attacks on Huawei amid growing concern, led by the US, that the telecom giant poses a security risk to the West.

Wang Yi demanded

Wang Yi demanded a "fair and just competition environment" for Chinese firms as he met EU foreign ministers and officials for talks in Brussels.

His call comes as Washington steps up pressure on allies, particularly in Europe, to shut Huawei out of tenders for fast fifth-generation, or 5G, telecom networks, because of the firm's ties to the Chinese government.

"China hopes all countries will create a fair and just competition environment for companies of all countries," Wang told reporters.

Wang told reporters.
"What we oppose is



groundless accusations out of political purposes and attempts to bring down a foreign company. We think such practices are abnormal, immoral and have no support from other countries."

Huawei strenuously denies allegations its equipment could be used for espionage and Chinese Premier Li Keqiang insisted Friday that Beijing would "never" ask its firms to spy on other nations.

A law recently enacted by Beijing obliging Chinese companies to aid the government on national security has added to concerns about Huawei just as

European countries begin planning 5G infrastructure.

The US has said the company poses a "threat" to Europe and last week NATO Secretary General Jens Stoltenberg said the alliance took these concerns seriously.

Several Western countries have followed the US lead in barring Huawei from bidding for 5G tenders but Wang urged Europe not to be swaved by US pressure.

"We hope and we believe European countries and other countries will have independence in making their own choice and their own judgment," he said

Wang also hit back at a new EU policy document published last week outlining a shift to more assertive relations with Beijing.

week outlining a shirt to more assertive relations with Beijing.

The 10-point plan called for more balanced ties, warning that China was a "rival" to the bloc as well as its biggest trading partner.

In response Wang insisted China and the EU were "comprehensive strategic partners" and laid out his own 10-point plan for greater cooperation.

His comments found an echo in EU diplomatic chief Federica Mogherini, who stressed common ground between the two sides and insisted that last week's policy document was primarily aimed at informing interpal debate in Brussels.

One dead in possible terror attack on Dutch tram

THE HAGUE, MAR 18 (AFP): A gunman opened fire on a tram in the Dutch city of Utrecht on Monday, killing at least one person and wounding several in what officials said was a possible terrorist incident.

A body covered in a sheet was reportedly seen on the tracks as armed police and emergency services swarmed around the scene in one of the largest cities in the Netherlands. Police said the attack-

Police said the attacker was still on the run after the incident.

"A shooting occurred on the 24 Oktoberplein in Utrecht... Multiple people have been injured. The surrounding area has been cordoned off and we are investigating the matter," Utrecht police said on Twitter.

"It is a shooting incident in a tram. Several trauma helicopters have been deployed to provide help." Dutch Prime Minister Mark Rutte cancelled a meeting with his ruling coalition and was being briefed on the situation, officials said.



Police later said that "a possible terrorist motive is part of the investigation".

The head of the Dutch

national counter-terrorism service, Pieter-Jaap Aalbersberg, said on Twitter that he was having "crisis consultations" over the incident. "NCTV is monitoring

"NCTV is monitoring the situation in #Utrecht. In close contact with local authorities. We cannot rule out terrorist motive. Crisis team is activated,"

"Offender still fugitive," Aalbersberg said,

adding that the terror threat level had been raised to the maximum of five in Utrecht for the next 18 hours.

Local media showed photographs of masked, armed police and emergency vehicles surrounding a tram that had stopped near a road bridge

Tram traffic in the area was halted, operator Qbuzz was quoted as saying by the ANP news agency.

The Netherlands has been largely spared the kind of attacks which have rocked its closest European neighbours in the past few years, but there has been a series of recent scares. In August, a 19-year-

old Afghan with a German residence permit stabbed and injured two American tourists at Amsterdam's busy Central Station before being shot and wounded.

In September, Dutch investigators said they had arrested seven people and foiled a "major attack" on civilians at a major event in the Netherlands.

They said they had found a large quantity of bomb-making materials including fertiliser likely to be used in a car bomb.

The men were arrested in the cities of Arnhem and Weert.

In June, two terror suspects were arrested while close to carrying out attacks including at an iconic bridge in Rotterdam and in France, prosecutors said.

The men aged 22 and 28, who were of Moroccan origin, made a film at the Erasmus bridge in
