

Sikkim to host North Eastern States **Government Driver's Forum convention**

The third convention of the North Eastern States Government Driver's Forum [NESGDF] is scheduled to held on 20 January here at Chintan Bhawan. The convention is being jointly organised by the All Sikkim Government Drivers' Association [ASGDA] and SNT Drivers' and Conductors' Association. This will be the first time that Sikkim is hosting the convention. More than 100 delegates and participants from the North East ern States and New Delhi

Addressing a press conference here today, ASGDA general secretary Gautam Tamang informed that Sikkim that NESGDF was formed on 28 August in 2016 for the welfare and better coordination between gov-ernment drivers of north eastern States. The organization is headquartered in Guwahati.

Mr Tamang stated that the main objective of the convention was to build good relations and better coordination between government drivers of the north eastern states. He added that the

convention will discuss various issues and grievances faced by govern-ment drivers of the re-gion and work out a solution by consensus.

The convention will have Tourism Minister Ugen T Gyatso Bhutia as chief guest and Chu-jachen Area MLA Bikram Pradhan as guest of honour. President Milan Raj Banshi and secretary general Naren-dra Singh of All India Government Driver's Forum along with the president and general secretary of NESGDF will also be in attendance

SSS wants SDF and NEDA to clarify stand on Sikkim vis a vis Citizenship Bill

SUMMIT REPORT GANGTOK, 19 JAN:

Save Sikkimese Soul, an organization which has protested the Citizenship (Amendment) Bill 2019 believing it to be detrimental to the interests of Sikkim and the Sikkimese, has demanded that Sikkim Democratic Front and the North-East Democratic Alliance clarify their stand on this with respect to Sikkim at the earliest.

An SSS press release states that SDF and BJP should respect the sentiments of Sikkimese

people and uphold the sanctity of Article 371F which guarantees special status to the Sikkimese, an identity, which SSS remains convinced, jeopar-dizes this privilege.

The release draws attention to the recent assurance made by BJP general secretary to the people of Assam and other northeastern states that Assam Accord which assures that the rights and interests of the Assamese people will be respected in letter

and in spirit. The SDF, however, has gone ahead and support-ed the Bill even in the Rajya Sabha, the release adds.

It rues that Mr Madhav's reassurance makes no mention of respecting provisions of Article 371F of the Constitution of India.

The organization is clearly not comfortable with the situation and has demanded that SDF and BJP come clean on their stand on the issue and explain how Sikkim's interests will not be compromised by the amendment.

Golay leads SKM delegation | Health Deptt counters SPYF allegations on health services in West dist

GANGTOK, 18 JAN
The Health Department today responded to allegations leveled by the Sikkim Progressive Youth Forum about the quality of health ser-vices in West district.

SPYF, it may be recalled, has accused the department of not adhering to or implementing the rules and norms set under the Indian Public Health Standards (IPHS). They had complained of lack of proper medical facilities and stated that they would undertake a protest march from Gyalshing to Gangtok on 20 Jan to demand corrective measures.

Commissioner-cum-Secretary, Health Department, Vishal Chauhan, while addressing a press conference today, claimed that considerable improvement has been made so far at the District Hos-pital at Gyalshing in West Sikkim

He further stated that this was a continuing process and that the department has been working hard to provide the best medical facilities to the people of the district.

He asserted that ambiguous allegations lev-eled by SPYF would de-

and other medical personnel who have been serving the people

Mr Chauhan stressed that SPYF should point out exactly what the dis-

trict hospital is lacking.
He added that SPYF appears uncertain and clueless itself.

"SPYF members have accepted that there is improvement in the district hospital at Gyalshing and then claim that the hospital is lacking facilities. They should to tell exactly what the hospital is lacking and make sug-gestions for further improvement," he said.

About the improve-ments at the district hospital, he said work was underway to further improve the facilities. "

The process to install new equipment and fa-cilities is underway and soon the people will able to take the benefit of these facilities," he said.

He informed that a team from Regional Re-source Centre for North East under the Ministry of Health had visited the district hospital in September last year and submitted a report. He added that the department had also called SPYF members to the survey but they did

not turn up. He stated that if the organisation was genuinely interested in im-proving of health services, they should make

specific suggestions.

He also suggested that
SPYF members can become members of the Rogi Kalyan Samiti and to contirbte to the betterment of

the health services.

While detailing the changes and improvements already complete-ly so far at District Hospital, he informed that five additional specialists - orthopaedic, biochemist, dermatologist, anaesthetist and ENT surgeon – have been posted to the district hospital and now the hospital has 15 specialists.

Likewise, three more general duty medical of-

ficers [GDMO] have been posted, which has increased the number of GDMO to six in the hospital.

He informed that there were only three dental surgeons at the hospital earlier, and now five dental surgeons are working in the hospital and the strength of the staff nurses has been increased from 12 to 44.

He added that all seven PHCs in West Dis-trict have 2 MOs each and teams of specialist doc-tors from STNM Hospital have been visiting Gyalshing Hospital on specific dates every week

He informed that the hospital has received 39 more employees under the 'One Family One Job' scheme and 16 Mid Level Health Provider at PHSC.

Mr Chauhan informed

that the process to fill up the post of 53 specialists and nine super-special-ists was under process at SPSC and after appoint-ment, most of the specialists will be sent to the

district hospital.

He informed that advertisements for one radiologist and one gen-eral surgeon, especially for Gyalshing Hospital, have already been issued and civil works for the installation of a CT Scan machine and a blood bank were on the verge of completion.

He further mentioned that provision of dialvsis service has been approved by the gov-ernment for the district hospital and work for a Trauma Centre at the hospital was underway

But, today the most important point is to defeat communalism, to defend the Constitution. to defend secularism and for these reasons for the time being we think there is a necessity to build a powerful anti-BJP nation-wide platform.

BJP," Reddy said. He expressed confidence that the BJP would be defeated in the 2019 general elections and a strong opposition plat-form built across the country.

Reddy flayed Prime

Minister Narendra Modi for his attacks on the Opposition parties and the proposed opposition

Hitting back, he asked Modi "Why did you build a front."

"NDA had 32 par-ties...18 parties have gone out of the NDA in the last five years. When you (Modi) can have the front why cannot the Opposition have a front.

You are having the front to capture power while the Opposition is having power to bring an alternative, secular dem-ocratic government in this country," Reddy told reporters

On Telangana Chief Minister and Telangana Rashtra Samithi (TRS) Chief K Chandrasekhar Rao's plan for forming a federal front at the na-tional-level sans Con-gress and BJP, Reddy said was to divide the anti-BJP front votes.

The CPI leader alleged he (Rao) was doing it on behalf of the BJP.

On the chargesheet filed by Delhi police against former JNUSU president Kanhaiya Ku-mar andothers in a sedi-tion case, Reddy alleged it was concocted.

The chargesheet was filed after over three years, he said.
"It is concocted case.

This is all for election propaganda as if JNU is anti-national and the students and communists are anti-nationals. They want to create an enemy and show we have to fight this," Reddy said.

Delhi govťs free entrance exam coaching scheme attracts over 4,000 students

New Delhi, Jan 18 (PTI): Within a year of its launch, Delhi govern-ment's scheme which provides free entrance coaching for SC/ST . coaching students preparing for competitive exams has attracted over 4000 stu-dents, officials said.

ʻIai Bhim Mukhyamantri Pratibha Vikas Yojana', launched by Delhi Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal on December 9, 2017, was reviewed by Delhi Social Welfare Minister Rajen-dra Pal Gautam along with officials.

The scheme pro-vides free coaching for students preparing for civil services, judicial services, banking, engineering, medicine, and other competitive examinations through known and established coaching institutions.

The minister, who is also the chairperson of the Delhi Scheduled Caste (SC), Scheduled Tribe (ST), Other Backward Class (OBC), Minority and Handicapped Finance and Develop-ment Corporation Ltd, discussed ways to reach out to more students. "Over 4000 students

have enrolled for the coaching facilities for various courses so far out of the targeted 5000 a government statement

The meeting dis-cussed proposals for roping premier coaching institutes for better results, and extending the coaching fee cap to up to Rs 1.5 lakh.

At present, the seal ing of the coaching fee is up to Rs 40,000, while the eligible students are also provided a stipend of Rs 2500 per month, it said. Formation of a moni-

No one is more committed to Indian cricket than Dhoni: Kohli

(PTI): "No one is more committed to Indian cricket" than Mahendra Singh Dhoni and batting at number five is the ideal spot for him, said Virat Kohli in stout defense of the former captain.

Dhoni faced criticism slow batting in the ODI series-opener in Sydney before redeeming his pride and reputation with match-winning contribu-tions in the Adelaide and Melbourne ODIs.

Acknowledging Dho-ni's contribution in the historic series-triumph in Australia, Kohli defended the former captain, say-ing he should be allowed

breathing space.

"I think firstly as a team we are very happy for Dhoni. That he is ngst the runs, becau it is very important to get runs under your belt to get

MELBOURNE, JAN 18 that rhythm and get that confidence back. Especially when you have not been playing so much interna-tional cricket," said the India captain at the postmatch press conference

> 'Many things happen on the outside. People say a lot of things but as an individual we know that there is no one more committed to Indian cricket than Dhoni and people should let him have his space because he has contributed so much for the nation.

"They should let him figure out things on his own and what he needs to do. He is one of the most intelligent cricketers and he is not someone who is not aware about what needs to be done. As a team we are totally in sync with what he is doing and we are all very happy for him." said Kohli.

The skipper also reckons that the just-con-cluded Australia series has proved that number five is the most logical spot for Dhoni.

"Dhoni batted at number four in 2016 for a while. But after that he has been pretty happy playing at five and six for the team. We felt that number five was the ideal position for him. And if you saw him bat at Adelaide as well he was pretty comfortable in that position because that allows him to do a bit of both - get some game time as well as finish games off, attacking as and when re-

quired," Kohli said.

Dhoni, batting at number four, played a crucial role in India winning the decisive third ODI with his unbeaten 87-run knock on Friday and at Adelaide too his unbeaten half-century had scripted India's win.

EC may announce Lok Sabha polls schedule in March first week

(PTI): The schedule for Lok Sabha elections is likely to be announced in the first week of March, sources indicat-ed on Friday.

The term of the present Lok Sabha ends on June 3.

The Election Com-

mission is in the process of deciding the number of phases and the months in which polling would be held, they said.

An EC spokesperson, however, said, "No deci-sion has been taken as yet on the date when the elections would be announced."

The charting of the phases would depend on ments, the sources said, adding the announcement of the mega exercise is likely to be made in first week of March.

There is a possibility that the EC may go by precedent and hold assembly elections in Andhra Pradesh, Odisha, Sikkim and Arunachal Pradesh along with the Lok Sabha polls.

Since the Jammu and Kashmir Assembly has been dissolved, the EC is bound to hold fresh polls there within six months.

It was dissolved in
November 2018 and the

upper limit ends in May.

Kashmir along with the Lok Sabha polls as well. But it can be held before that also as much depends on the complex security situation there, they said.

In normal circum-stances, the J-K assembly's six-year term was to end on March 16, 2021. The other state assemblies and Lok Sabha have



Battling the Big-C

Build better defenses. Generate wider awareness

m he}$ World Cancer Day is coming up in a fortnight. Of the many Days that are observed in the State, this is one that should receive wider attention. As the world over, Cancer has been palpably on the rise in Sikkim and even as better healthcare facilities are extended to patients and their families, it is important that wider awareness is generated on this health issue so that infection rates are brought down and detections made earlier. Last year marked the culmination of a three-year resolve taking place under the tagline 'We can. I can.' which was designed to explore how everyone - as a collective or as individuals - can do their part to reduce the global burden of cancer. The idea was clearly to take Cancer beyond the sole purview of doctors and the healthcare systems since just as cancer affects everyone in different ways, all people have the power to take various actions to reduce the impact that cancer has on individuals, families and communities. The World Cancer Day would be a good time for Sikkim to reflect on what it can do, make a pledge and take action. One knows that preventive action, healthier lifestyles and early detection are integral to surviving cancer.

That said, diagnosing cancer is not easy - not all cancers show early signs and symptoms and other warning signs can also appear quite late. Timely treatment is still important nevertheless and it falls on the state, since it provides the widest healthcare network, to provide it. What are also required are more effective public awareness campaigns and workplace health and wellbeing initiatives; time then for Sikkim to evaluate how it has delivered on these counts.

The CATCH programme of the State Government was a welcome step towards institutionalizing annual health check-ups because it is primarily such healthcare habits which will ensure timely and early detection. CATCH, which had unfortunately gone dormant for a while appears to thankfully be back on track, and if it is developed well, could popularize preventive healthcare against the present practice of going to hospitals and doctors only after one takes ill. In cases like Cancer, too often, this stage is too late. And make no mistake, Cancer is a major concern which is only going to loom larger in the years to come. Look around, just about everyone has some experience on the matter, either through a relative who has been diagnosed with "CA" or a friend who has someone in the family with Cancer. Noticeably, one does not meet too many Cancer Survivors. But if it is any consolation. Sikkim is not alone in the nightmare and the increase in Cancer cases here reflects a global trend.

A report of the UN shows that cancer is now the world's biggest killer – with the number of cases set to explode in coming years. A global cancer report compiled by UN agency, The International Agency for Research on Cancer (IARC), shows that as a single entity, Cancer is the biggest cause of mortality worldwide with an estimated 8.2 million deaths from cancer in 2012. Also reflective of the unequal world we live in is a study by Lancet which reveals that while Cancer survival is generally increasing, even for some of the more deadly cancers such as liver and lung, survival trends vary widely, and there are wide and persistent disparities between countries. The first world countries post better cancer survival rates than the less "developed" nations. For example, for women diagnosed with breast cancer in the USA and Australia between 2010 and 2014, 5-year survival is 90%, compared to 66% for women diagnosed in India. That said, it is important to realize here that this is not just because the developed countries have better hospitals; wider awareness plays an as important role.

Cancer needs to be addressed also because Cancer cases worldwide are forecast to rise by 75% and reach close to 25 million over the next two decades. It is projected that by 2030, there will be 12 million cancer deaths per year!

The exclamation point reinforcing the worry, it is clearly time then that Sikkim also begins addressing this health issue on more levels than just referring Cancer patients to treatment outside the State. When one talks of a War on Cancer at the global level, one refers to the effort to find a cure for cancer by increased research and the development of more effective cancer treatments. These obviously do not apply to Sikkim and the State should consider itself lucky if it gets a good Oncology centre here itself. The multispecialty hospital has an Oncology Centre. Hopefully, the policy makers and the babus will ensure that no corners are cut in establishing the best such facility possible. So while the world works on R&D. Sikkim should focus its energies on prevention, earlier detection/ diagnosis and screening. Sikkim could do even better by institutionalizing some form of health insurance scheme for a wider net of people because even when cure is available, it flies out of reach because of the costs involved.

Why the Indian Ocean region might soon play a lead role in world affairs

n recent days. Australia's foreign minister Marise Payne announced efforts to strengthen Australia's involvement in the Indian Ocean region, and the importance of working with India in defence and other activities. Speaking at the Raisina Dia-logue in Delhi – a geopolitical conference co-hosted by the Indian government - Payne said:

'Our respective futures are intertwined and heavily dependent on how well we cooperate on the challenges and opportunities in the Indian Ocean in the decades ahead."

Among Payne's announcements was A\$25 million for a four-year infrastructure program in South Asia (The South Asia Regional Infrastructure Connectivity initiative, or SARIC). which will primarily focus on the transport and energy sectors.

She also pointed to increasing defence activities in the Indian Ocean, noting that in 2014, Australia and India had conducted 11 defence activities together, with the figure reaching 38

Payne's speech highlights the emergent power of the Indian Ocean region in world affairs. The region comprises the ocean itself and the countries that border it. These include Australia, India, Indonesia, Bangladesh, Madagasmalia, Tanzania, South Africa, the United Arab Emirates and Yemen.

In terms of global political significance, the Atlantic Ocean can be viewed as the ocean of our grandparents and parents; the Pacific Ocean as the ocean of us and our children; and the Indian Ocean as the ocean of our children and grandchildren.

There is an obvious sense in which the region is the future. The average age of people in the region's countries is under 30, compared to 38 in the US and 46 in Japan. The countries bordering the Indian Ocean are home to 2.5 billion people, which is one-third of the world's population

But there is also a strong economic and politi-cal logic to spotlighting the Indian Ocean as a key emerging region in world affairs and strategic priority for Australia.

Some 80% of the world's maritime oil trade

flows through three narrow passages of water, known as choke points, in the Indian Ocean. This includes the Strait of Hormuz – located between the Persian Gulf and the Gulf of Oman – which provides the only sea passage from the Persian Gulf to the open ocean.

The economies of many Indian Ocean countries are expanding rapidly as investors seek new op-portunities. Bangladesh, India, Malaysia and Tanzania witnessed economic growth in excess of 5% India is the fastest growing major economy in the world. With a population expected to become the world's largest in the coming decades, it is also the one with the most potential.

Politically, the Indian Ocean is becoming a pivotal zone of strategic competition. China is investing hundreds of billions of dollars in infrastructure projects across the region as part of its One Belt One Road initiative.

For instance, China gave Kenya a US\$3.2 billion loan to construct a 470 kilometre railway (Kenya's



biggest infrastructure project in over 50 years) linking the capital Nairobi to the Indian Ocean port city of Mombasa

Chinese state-backed firms are also investing in infrastructure and ports in Sri Lanka, the Maldives, and Bangladesh. Western powers, including Australia and the United States, have sought to counter-balance China's growing influence across the region by launching their own infrastructure funds such as the US\$113 million US fund anno last August for digital economy, energy, and infrastructure projects.

In security terms, piracy, unregulated migration,

and the continued presence of extremist groups in Somalia, Bangladesh and parts of Indonesia pose significant threats to Indian ocean countries.

Countries in the region need to collaborate to build economic strength and address geopolitical risks, and there is a logical leadership role for India, being the largest player in the region

Prime Minister Narendra Modi told the Shangri La Dialogue in June, 2008: "The Indo-Pacific is a natural region. It is also

home to a vast array of global opportunities and

challenges. I am increasingly convinced with each passing day that the destinies of those of us who live in the region are linked."

More than previous Indian Prime Ministers, Modi has travelled up and down the east coast of Africa to promote cooperation and strengthen trade and investment ties, and he has articulated strong visions of India-Africa cooperative interest.

Broader groups are also emerging. In 1997, nations bordering the Bay of Bengal established the Bay of Bengal Initiative for Multisectoral Techni-cal and Economic Cooperation (BIMSTEC), which works to promote trade links and is currently negotiating a free trade agreement. Australia, along with 21 other border states, is a member of the Indian Ocean Rim Association (IORA) which seeks to promote sustainable economic growth, trade liberalisation and security.

But, notwithstanding India's energy and this organisational growth, Indian Ocean cooperation is weak relative to Atlantic and Pacific initiatives.

Australia's 2017 Foreign Policy White Paper seeks to support IORA in areas such as maritime security and international law. Private organisations, such as the Minderoo Foundation, are do-ing impressive research – as part of the Flourishing Oceans intiative - on the migration of sea life in an effort to advance environmental sustainability and conservation.

But Australia could focus more on how to promote the Indian Ocean. In Australia's foreign affairs circles, there used to be a sense Asia stopped at Malta. But it seems the current general understanding of the

"Indo-Pacific" extends west only as far as India. What this misses – apart from the historical relevance and contemporary economic and political significance of the Indian Ocean region generously defined - is the importance of the ocean itself

NOT IUST IMPORTANT FOR TRADE AND TIES

If the Ocean was a rainforest, and widely acknowledged as a repository of enormous biodiversity, imagine the uproar at its current contamina-tion and the clamour around collaborating across all countries bordering the ocean to protect it.

The reefs, mangroves, and marine species that live in the Ocean are under imminent threat. According to some estimates, the Indian Ocean is warming three times faster than the Pacific Ocean

Overfishing, coastal degradation, and pollution are also harming the ocean. This could have catastrophic implications for the tens of millions of fishermen dependent on the region's marine resources and the enormous population who rely on the Indian Ocean for their protein.

Australia must continue to strengthen its ties in

the region - such as with India and Indonesia - and also build new connections, particularly in Africa. [the writer is Director and CEO of the Australia

ercise has been found to reduce Estress, increase positive mood, decrease anxiety and alleviate depression. But you may not know that the emotional well-being associated with exercise is also linked to key attri-butes that can help us while we work.

One of the most established of well-being frameworks (PERMA) states that of the many ways to experience happiness, five areas are most important: positive emotions, mental engagement, strong relationships, meaning in life and accomplishing goals. At face value, achieving all five may seem a colossal task. But many activities from tennis to triathlons, squash to swimming, can help us clinch all five at once. Evidence suggests that, as a result, we are more likely to avoid job burnout, sleep more easily and be ore engaged at work.

1. Positive emotions

The "runner's high" is at the peak of positive emotion. While this euphoric feeling is most typically linked to pounding the pavements, it can be experienced via any activity which orks both muscles and heart.

The high comes from endorphins the body's natural painkiller - being made available in the areas of the brain which process mood and emotion. Understood as an evolutionary advantage, the high enables us to keep moving even when our muscles are tired, and even a short burst of this positive feeling can help us feel more energised. So next time you're feeling low, try squeezing in some physical activity around work. It could give you a morning boost or stave off the post-lunch crash

2. Mental engagement

known as "flow", this engagement level is the optimal amount of challenge required for personal growth. The Goldilocks of arousal, flow occurs when a task is sufficiently difficult

cut-throat, the shared pain of limit-busting events can stimulate compassion, and the more we suffer personally, the better we empathise with others. This not only strengthens our social skills, but also manifests in directing greater kindness to ourselves.

studies have found that a stronger sense of purpose is associated with moving more.

5. Accomplishments

The value of feeling competent and successful is well known, but greater attention has recently been devoted to the manner in which

we interpret success. Research into growth and fixed mindsets suggests that whether we believe ability can change (growth) or not (fixed) is central to our well-being.

Those with a growth mindset are more likely to work on developing their skills, embrace feedback as an opportunity to learn, and use setbacks to adapt and thrive. On the other hand, those with a fixed mindset fear failure. take feedback personally, and are discouraged by bumps in the road.

But this can change. Researchers have found that a person's mindset can be influenced by something as simple as great-er self-awareness. All kinds of

physical activities can objectively show us we can achieve goals that at first seemed out of reach. You might think that you'll never be able to lift a certain weight, for example, but persist, and you will see how strong - both mentally and physically - you truly are. You don't need to be super fit, or

even a regular gym-goer to benefit from the well-being perks that come with exercise. Getting active a few times a week can be enough to not only transform your physical fitness, but also boost your mood and performance, in and outside of work

Even better are water-based sports which prevent the use of distracting technology, like sailing, swimming or rowing. Detaching from work in this way gives us time to recharge, meaning we can return with maximum productivity.

Research indicates that self-compas-

sion is a more effective strategy than self-criticism when we face difficulty.

Following an order of the EC, the Mizoram election department in August last year had conducted revision of voters lists of Bru refugees in their camps, despite opposition from the civil societies. Later, enlistment forms duly filled in by inmates of the relief camps were stolen at the election office of Mizoram's Mamit district on August 23, two days before the month-long repatriation of Bru families from Tripura to Mizoram was to start from August 25.

However, out of 5,000 odd refugee families, only 150 members of 42 families returned to Mizoram during the month-long exercise.
Thousands of Bru

refugees from Mizoram fled to Tripura during an ethnic violence in 1997. The clashes broke was killed by Bru National Liberation Front (BNLF) militants.

The Centre, in association with the govern-ments of Mizoram and Tripura, was repatriating the displaced Brus in phases.

Though several Bru families have returned to Mizoram over the years, many refused to leave Tripura citing se-curity reasons and inadequate package.

'Threatened' Ladakh tribe seeks govt help to preserve heritage

(PTI): A tribe of Jammu and Kashmir's Ladakh region has demanded that the Centre make serious interventions to elp it preserve its cultural heritage, which, experts say, is under threat due to rapid "modernisation, migration and religious conversion".

Members of the Dard

Aryan tribe submitted a charter of demands to Minister of State for Tribal Affairs Sudarshan Bhagat on Friday.
The tribe, inhabit-

ing Dha, Hanu, Beema, Darchik and Garkone villages in Leh and Kargil districts, claims to the descendants of "pure Aryan race". Many researchers believe they are the descendants of Alexander, an official of the Indira Gandhi National Centre for the Arts

valley. The people of the region are completely different from those in other parts of Ladakh. The community prohibits marriage with out-siders to keep the gene pool intact. Of late, the Dard men are marrying outside the tribe," the official said.

The tribe is consided "threatened" due to their depleting numbers, which, at present, is around 4,000. They are mainly dependent on agriculture and are "educa-tionally and economically backward", he said.

The Dard Aryans do not document their history and they have carried forward their cultural legacy orally. Most of them have embraced Islam or Buddhism and modernisation has had a negative impact on their traditions, he claimed.

Members of the tribe -- participating in a six-day festival, 'Celebrating here -- claimed that there were only three high schools in their villages and very limited resources of livelihood.

As such, they have no option but to migrate to cities. They demanded that the government set up a tribal hostel in the region and declare the Aryan valley a heritage village.

"So far, the government has not been able to anything for the Dard Arvans. Its policies and programmes have failed to reach them. Not many people in the country know about the tribe, which is considered threatened," Virendra Bangroo, an INGCA scholar, said. "We are making an ef-

fort to help these people preserve their culture and tradition, which is under threat due to modernisation, migration, and conversion." Bang



Standing tall Down Under: Dhoni anchors, Kedar finishes as India win ODI series

CHETAN NARULA MELBOURNE, JAN 18 (PTI): Mahendra Singh Dhoni rekindled his love affair with final flourishes, anchoring India to their maiden bilateral ODI series triumph in Australia for a perfect finish to a historic trip Down Under here Friday.

Virat Kohli's men became

the first country to return from Australia without losing a single series having won the Test series 2-1 and drawn the T20 Internationals 1-1. From a dasher, to a finisher to finally the anchor in the last leg of his career, Dhoni 3.0 was in full flow during India's successful chase of 231 in the third and final ODI on a sluggish Melbourne pitch after Yuzvendra Chahal set it up with a career-best 6 for 42.

'It wasn't an easy wicket to bat on, so it was important to take the game deep," said India skipper Virat Kohli in the postmatch presentation.

"Two set batsmen there who knew what to do and they got the job done. We've been here a long time, it's been an amazing tour. We drew the T20 series, won the Test series and now the ODIs. If you had given me these results before the tour, I would have gladly taken it," he added.

Dhoni's unbeaten 87 off 114 balls was a testimony to his high quality match awareness as the street-smart Kedar Jadhay (61 no. 57 balls) donned the role of a finisher.

The former India skipper's role going into the business end of his illustrious career is that of an anchor, who takes the game deep.

He performed his role to

perfection with world class exhibition of running between the wickets in what could well be his last match on the Austra-



lian soil. Not to forget the 'Man of the Series' award for a hattrick of half-centuries and two coming in winning causes.

While Dhoni was lucky to

be dropped on 0 and 74 but Australian bowling never had the sting to unsettle the Indian batsmen despite skipper Virat Kohli (46) being dismissed with more than 100 runs left.

Chasing 231, India got off to a slow start as well. Australia created some good pressure with the new ball, in particular Jhye Richardson (1-41) who tied down Rohit Sharma (9).

as Peter Handscomb dropped Kohli (on 10) at first slip off Billy Stanlake (0-49) in the 12th over. But things turned around for Australia when Dhawan lobbed a return catch to Marcus Soinis in the 17th over. While Kohli and Dhoni added 54 runs off 82 balls for the third wicket, it was an uncharacteristic partnership. There were two incidents of confusion between the wickKohli was stranded and was saved for a lack of a direct hit.

The Dhoni-Iadhay (121 runs) partnership then took some time in getting going. In the meantime. Dhoni reached his 70th ODI half-century off 74 balls

President Trump cancels Pelosi's foreign trip citing shutdown

(PTI): US President Donald Trump has postponed House Speaker Nancy Pelosi's trip to meet military officials and troops in Afghani-stan and Brussels, saying she was needed here for negotiations to end the partial government shutdown.

Trump's move came Thursday a day after the House Speaker urged him to reschedule his annual State of the Union address slated for January 29, citing security concerns triggered by the shutdown that has entered its 27th day.

"Due to the shutdown, I am sorry to inform you that your trip to Brussels, Egypt, and Afghanistan has been postponed. We will reschedule this seven-day excursion when the Shutdown is over," Trump said in a letter to Pelosi, a copy of which was released to the press.

The president also said postponing this "public relations event" was totally appropriate.

The longest-ever shutdown in US history has rendered over 800,000 federal employees without work, crippling the functioning of several key wings of the government including Security and State department.

In light of the 800,000 great American workers not receiving pay, I am sure you would agree that, Trump said.

Pelosi's However. spokesman Drew Ham-mill said the visit's purpose was to express ap-preciation to US troops and obtain "critical" briefings from them.The trip did not have Egypt as a stop, he said.

The shutdown is a result of the bitter political divide over border security issue as the Democrats who now enjoy majority in the House have refused to approve a legislation approving USD 5.7 billion in federal funding to construct a wall across the US-Mexico border.

"I also feel that, during this period, it would be better if you were in Washington ne gotiating with me and joining the strong border security movement to end the shutdown. Obviously, if you would like to make your journey by flying commercial, that would certainly be your prerogative, Trump said.

Fast Federer celebrates 100 with Fritz blitz at Open



18 MELBOURNE, JAN (AFP): Ageless defending champion Roger Federer marked his 100th match on Rod Laver Arena Friday by storming past American Taylor Fritz 6-2, 7-5, 6-2 in the third round.

The 21-year-old world number 50 had no answer to the precision and finesse of the Swiss master, who extended his Open-era record for the most appearances in the fourth round of a Grand Slam to 63 with an 88-minute demolition.

The 20-time Grand Slam champion will continue his quest for a record seventh Australian Open title against Greek 14th seed Stefanos Tsitsipas in the last 16.

Federer blitzed the young American from the start, barrelling through the first set in just 20 min-utes. It prompted Nick Kyrgios, commentating on Australian TV, to proclaim: The way Federer is moving is scary. This is ridiculous tennis."

Former junior world number one Fritz was bidding to reach the last 16 at a Grand Slam for the first time and put up ond stanza.

He held serve to lead 4-3 and had a glimmer of hope at 0-30 in the next.

But Federer, as he has done so many times in

the 20 years he has been coming to Melbourne. stepped up through the gears and got out of trouble by unleashing a repertoire of great shots including a serve-volley, a forehand winner up the line and ace.
At 5-5, Federer con-

verted the second of two break points and served out for a two-set lead.

"Taylor played really well," said Federer.

"The first dropped up at times, but you can see the upside. He is going to have many more years on tour play-ing at this level. It is pretty cool to watch him play.

Federer was clearly in no mood to hang about and put his foot back down on the gas to race through the third in just 26 minutes. Ominously for his rivals, he is yet to drop a set this year and came into the Australian Open on the back of victory in the mixed teams

Hopman Cup. Federer has won the last two tournaments at Melbourne Park in a late career resurgence and on this form will be hard to stop from extending his all-time record with a 21st major victory. Fed-erer, Novak Djokovic and Roy Emerson have all won six Australian Opens -- although the Australian great's victories all came before the Open era.

Juventus move to next target in Serie A as AC Milan 'lick wounds'

MILAN, JAN 18 (AFP): Gattuso conceded his side will have to lick their wounds and come out fighting after losing the Italian Super Cup trophy to an all-conquering Juventus who turn their focus back to their next target -- an eighth consecutive Serie A title - after the three-week winter break in Italy. Unbeaten Juventus host bottom club Chievo in Turin on Monday, a team they opened their season against with a 3-2 win in Verona, looking to stretch their lead to 12

points after 20 games.

Massimiliano Allegri's side currently have nine-point advantage on second-placed Napo-

li who face a tricky test against Lazio on Sunday. "We've started 2019

on the right foot, Forward to the next target," warned Cristiano Ronaldo, who scored the only goal in Jeddah against Milan in midweek to bring his tally to 16 in all competitions. It was Allegri's tenth trophy as Juventus boss and, after losing two of the last three Super Cup trophies, a boost in his side's assault on all fronts including the Champions League.

AC Milan -- in fifth,

one point behind Lazio are looking for a morale-boosting return to the Champions League places against a Ge-noa side who have just one win in their last 12 league games. "We lick

our wounds," said Gattuso, who will watch the match from the stands after receiving a one-match touchline ban for angrily protesting a refereeing decision in Ieddah.

Chelsea clash vital in Arsenal's need for Champions League cash

London, Jan 18 (AFP): The need for the riches as much as the prestige of a return to Champions League football leaves Arsenal little room for error when Chelsea visit the Emirates on Saturday. A run of three defeats in their last six Premier League games has left the fifth-placed Gunners six points adrift of their London rivals in the battle for a top-four finish.

However, it is Chelsea and not Arsenal who are reinforcing in the January transfer window to ensure they are not forced to cope with the consolation prize of the Europa League for a second consecutive season.

Chelsea boss Maurizio Sarri seems set to finally get the striker he wanted in Gonzalo Higuain on a loan deal from Juventus having worked with the Argentine international during a prolific 38-goal season at Napoli in 2015/16.
Arsenal's problems are at the other

end of the field. No side in the top half of the table have conceded more than the 32 goals Unai Emery's men have in 22 Premier League games.

However, Emery has revealed that Arsenal do not have the funds to make signings this month unless they are on loan. Arsenal ranked sixth in Deloitte's latest Football Money League ahead of the likes of Paris Saint-Germain, Chelsea and Liverpool with a near 500-million-euro (USD570 million) income.

However, while Premier League leaders Liverpool spent big on marquee signings Alisson Becker and Virgil van Dijk to transform their defensive record. Arsenal are paying a heavy price for a series of costly contracts and an imbalanced squad.

The club's highest earner Mesut Ozil penned a new three-and-a-half contract worth a reported 350,000 pounds (USD 450,000) a week last January as Arsenal feared losing one of their prized assets for free. Just days earlier to get some return for Alexis Sanchez, who also wound his contract down into its final months, Arsenal agreed an exchange deal to sign Henrikh Mkhitaryan from Manches-ter United on a deal worth a reported 200,000 a week until 2021.

However, neither player can count on the confidence of Emery. The two creative midfielders have started together just four times in the league this season and Ozil was dropped from the squad entirely for last weekend's defeat at West Ham. - BUDGET DEFENSIVE BUYS EXPOSED -

deadline-day signing Pierre-Emerick Aubameyang last Janhas proved far more successful. The Gabon international is tied with Mohamed Salah and Harry Kane as the Premier League's top scorer with 14 goals this season. But the 56 million paid for Aubameyang broke a club-re-cord transfer fee set by the signing of another striker Alexandre Lacazette just six months earlier.

Emery has also struggled to get both into his starting line-up with Lacazette growing increasingly frustrated at playing second fiddle.

With so much spent on strengthening the forward areas, a limited budget when looking for a new goalkeeper in Bernd Leno and ageing defenders Sokratis Papastathopoulos and Stephan Lichtsteiner in the summer has been exposed. To make matters worse, head of recruitment Seven Mislintat, the man hired to get Arsenal better value in the transfer market just 14 months ago due to a sterling reputation earned at Dortmund, is reportedly set to leave the club after recently seeing his influence diminished.

The one obvious way to ease the economic strain is a return to the Champions League after a two-year absence, making victory this weekend imperative. "We have time to achieve that this season," insisted Emery this week, but the Spaniard believes he will be afford-ed time given the restraints put upon him. "We knew there were going to be difficulties in this process. The most important thing is to be aware that the difficulties will come, and at that moment still be able to make progress.

"That is the idea. The idea is to get Arsenal back to where the club deserves to be, but it needs time.




