"By sending one PS Golay to jail, thousands of PS Golays have been born in the State," he further

wrong, says Dalai Lama BENGALURU, AUG 10 (PTI):

Tibetan spiritual leader the Dalai Lama today apologised for his statement that India's first Prime Minister Jawaharlal Nehru was "self-centred."

On Wednesday, he had said Nehru had a "self-centred attitude" to become India's first prime minister even though Mahatma Gandhi was in favour of Muhammad Ali Jinnah taking the top post at that time. He had also claimed India's par-

tition would not have happened if Mahatma Gandhi's wish of Jinnah becoming the prime minister had materialised.

"My statement has created a controversy. I apologise if I have said something wrong," said the Dalai Lama, when he was asked by reporters to comment on what he meant by calling Nehru selfcentred.

"I felt pity when I heard that Mahatma Gandhi was opposed to partition... There are more Muslims in India than in Pakistan, but past is past," the Dalai Lama said.

Addressing an event at the Goa Institute of Management in Sankhalim town on Wednesday,

he said, "I think it was a little bit self-centred attitude of Pandit Nehru that he should be the prime minister... Mahatma Gandhiji's thinking, if it had materialised, then India, Pakistan would have been united," he said.

"So Pandit Nehru, I know very well, (was a) very experienced person, very wise but sometimes

Addressing a gathering at an event called 'Thank You Karnataka' to commemorate 60 years of Tibetan government in exile here today, the 83-year-old monk said Nehru fully supported creation of

Nehru insisted that they should have separate Tibetan school for preserving the Tibetan issue, he

"Immediately he set up a committee headed by the union education minister...at that time, we wrote to different states for the allocation of some land. The best sort of response came from the Mysore state. One major factor was late Nijalingappa, who ex-traordinarily showed concern for the Tibetan cause. He promised me he will support the Tibetan cause," the Dalai Lama said.

The Elec-tion Commission of India will decide whether I can contest for the elections or not," he said.

Government by Discussion Side-step consultations, and there will only be disinterest, diktats and protests

"Democracy is not just about ballots and votes, but also about public deliberation and reasoning, what - to use an old phrase - is often called 'gov ernment by discussion," writes Amartya Sen in "Identity and Violence: The Illusion of Destiny".

 \mathbf{T}^{he} book is now twelve years old, but even when it came out, this was not really a paradigm-shifting revelation, but with the act of stating the obvious, the Nobel laureate made a strong statement. By devoting an entire chapter to fleshing out this point, he holds up the mirror to the country forcing us to admit that the world's largest democracy appears to have forgotten what democracy is all about. Democracy has meant politics in India for far too long, leading to the aberration of politicians and political commentators wearing their ignorance on their sleeves, and without the slightest hint of embarrassment, holding forth on important issues and claiming to speak for the people of the country without having made any genuine attempt at consultations. The effortlessness with which false narratives are foisted and incomplete information circulated to influence public opinion is worrying. Also worrying is when important decisions are taken without the counsel of experts or consultations with in-terested and affected parties. These should have been standard practices, but have become abandoned courtesies which have reduced democracy to elections. It should hence not surprise that politics itself has been reduced to the segregated equation of those in power and those in the Opposition.

And when politics becomes about being in office and waiting in the wings, debates stop being about ide-ology and get established by positions. Those in office do what suits their interests and the Opposition protests everything. With vote-banks already identified and appropriated, the focus is only on keeping these secure. A sorry state of affairs... When a writer who also presented a case for the 'Argumentative Indian' reminds the same Indians of the need for pubic deliberations and reasoning, the message should become clear – the nation needs to relearn many things. Am-artya Sen's "The Argumentative Indian" was the highest selling book in India in 2005-06. His next, quoted above, should also have been read more widely, and then, maybe, the nation would have invested in some introspection and that might have saved us from the chagrin of watching the political rhetoric of people's representatives mouthing empty platitudes on issues which concern the entire nation and its future. Instead of genuine concern, one is being subjected to pompous self-righteousness and embarrassing self-praise.

Let's reflect on Sikkim. Has anyone heard of public deliberations here? No, claims, denials and rejections do not constitute public deliberation since they are dictated by political positions, not built on informed opinion. And that is why in Sikkim there is rarely consensus, only diktats and protests. It is unfortunate that a people who at one time were so enamoured by the idea of democracy that they took on a 300 year old monarchy and even gave up their individuality as a nation state just so that they could have democracy, have, since then, pulled away from public participation in the public domain. Public deliberation does not mean that the people start debating at formal seminars; it is enough for them to become more involved in the process of democracy and its implementation. With their involvement, they will secure accountability – first at the local body level and from there upwards and across to the executive. Their involvement will force the elected representatives to make the right noises at the right places and times and motivate them to get more involved in the decision-making process

The Saudi-Canada spat: Both countries are wrong

The sudden and unexpected diplomatic crisis between Canada and Saudi Arabia has raised questions about their levels of bilateral economic relations, the \$12 billion arms sale signed by the two countries in 2014 and the fate of thousands of Saudi students pursuing higher education at Canadian universities.

This spat was ignited when the Saudi government ordered the expulsion of Canada's ambassador to the kingdom and announced a

halt to "all new business and investment transactions with Canada". This was in response to tweets from Canada's foreign affairs minister, Chrystia Freeland, and her ministry's Twitter account criticizing the arrest of human rights activist Samar Badawi.

But before delving into the repercussions of this crisis, an overall assessment of Canadian-Saudi relations

SUBSTANTIAL TRADE

According to a fact sheet published on the Canadian government's website. Saudi Arabia is Canada's largest trade partner in the Middle East and North Africa. The overall trade value between the two nations fluctuated between C\$3-4 billion between 2011 and 2017, with Canadian exports of about \$1 billion and imports of \$2-3

While not negligible, these numbers don't compare to Canada's twoway trade with the United States, which amounted to US\$673.9 billion in 2017. Nonetheless, Riyadh's move to freeze all business with Ottawa could deprive Canada of tremendous opportunities for collaboration and nvestment in Saudi Arabia.

With the new Vision 2030 launched by Crown Prince Mohammed bin Salman, the kingdom is becoming increasingly open to foreign direct investment. It's diversifying its infrastructure projects and planning a shift to a green economy that is less dependent on fossil fuels. All of these sectors present commercial opportunities for Canadian industries, but Ottawa seems on its way to missing

There is also a \$15 billion deal to sell light armoured vehicles (LAVs) to Saudi Arabia that is now in jeopardy. The deal, if scrapped, could be a blow to Canada's defence industry, which employs 65,000 people and contributes \$6 billion annually to Canada's

David Perry, a senior analyst and fellow with the Canadian Global Affairs Institute, argues that foreign arms' sales ...

... allow Canadian firms to keep plants operating, workforces employed, supply chains intact and engineers busy researching and developing new technology. The Saudi deal will keep the thousands of unionized shop-floor workers and engineers at the GDLS-C plant in London, Ont., employed for years.'

Another area of co-operation that cannot be overlooked is educational exchange and its remarkable contribution to the Canadian economy There are approximately 7,000 Saudi students on government scholarships studying in Canada. Statistics from the Canadian Bureau for Interna-tional Education reveal that students from Saudi Arabia made up two per cent of Canada's 494,525 international students in 2017.

Unfortunately, the fate of these thousands of students remains un-

determined as the kingdom decided to other countries in retaliation of Canada's criticism of its human rights record. This will have a negative im pact on their academic standings and

Canada has made the promotion of human rights, including women's rights and the rights of religious minorities, a top priority of its foreign policy and diplomatic initiatives. It's therefore appropriate to de-

mand Saudi Arabia release political prisoners and abide by human rights standards. As has been widely documented, the human rights situation in Saudi Arabia is abysmal, and the kingdom has been accused of committing war crimes in Yemen.

But Ottawa has fallen into the trap of "double standards" when dealing with the issue of human rights. When human rights violations are linked to the Israeli/Palestinian conflict, Canada turns a blind eye and refrains from condemning the killings and impris-onments of Palestinian children and young people, the confiscation of Pal-estinian lands and the establishment of illegal settlements.

A consistent and fair approach would see Ottawa either condemning both Israel and Saudi Arabia, or turning a blind eye to both of them
THE SAUDI REACTION

The Saudi reaction to Canada's criticism has been portrayed as "reck-less, impulsive, and aggressive" by Sultan Barakat director of the Center for Conflict and Humanitarian Studies at the Doha Institute. Similarly, Lloyd Axworthy, a former Canadian foreign affairs minister, likens it to a Donald Trump-esque fit of pique marked by intimidation and saber-rattling.

Despite unanimous agreement among political commentators and analysts that the Saudi reaction is exaggerated, Saudi leadership could ex-ploit this crisis to garner domestic support and to thwart all attempts to crit-

icize the kingdom's draconian crackdown on political dissidents.

Foreign relations and foreign policy are often meant to advance national interests. So what did Canadian foreign policy makers want to achieve by going after Saudi Arabia publicly?

If the aim was to alleviate the circumstances of Samar Badawi and her imprisoned brother, Raif, to influence the broader direction of the audi leadership or to rally other like-minded countries to speak up against the human rights violations in the kingdom, then the results were disastrous

Canadian foreign policy makers could have adopted a more profes-sional approach to address the issues of human rights in the kingdom while maintaining strong strategic and economic ties. In other words, it's about finding a way to calibrate what Thomas Juneau, professor at the University of Ottawa, calls the costs of tactical disagreements and the benefits of strategic alignment.

Canada's relationship with Saudi Arabia is actually advantageous on several fronts. There's no doubt navigating the relationship was tricky at times, but the alternative will be seri-ously detrimental to Canada if Saudi Arabia intensifies its aggressive measures against us.

How ancient cultures explained comets and meteors

Comets and meteors have fascinated the human race since they were first spotted in the night sky. But without science and space exploration to aid understanding of what these chunks of rock and ice are, ancient cultures often turned to myth and legend to explain them.

The Greeks and Romans believed that the appearance of comets, meteors and meteor showers were portentous. They were signs that something good or bad had happened or was about to happen. The arrival of a comet could herald the birth of a great figure, and some people have even argued that the star in the sky which the Persian Magi followed to Bethlehem to see the newborn Jesus was actually a comet.

In the spring of 44BC, a comet that appeared was interpreted as a sign of the deification of Julius Caesar, following his murder. Caesar's adopted son Octavian (soon to be the Emperor Augustus) made much of the comet, which burned in the sky during the funerary games held for Caesar. This portentous event was frequently celebrated in the ancient sources. In his epic poem, the Aeneid, Virgil describes how "a star appeared in the daytime, and Augustus persuaded people to believe it was

Augustus celebrated the comet and the deification of his father on coins (it did help to be the son god when trying to rule the Roman Empire), and many examples survive today

METEOR SHOWERS

The Roman historian Cassius Dio referred to "comet stars" occurring in August 30BC. These are mentioned as among the portents witnessed after the death of the Egyptian queen Cleopatra. Experts are not entirely sure what it means when Dio uses the plural term 'comet stars", but some have connected this recorded event to the annual Perseid meteor shower

Though it retains an ancient Greek name, we now know that the arrival of the Perseid meteor shower every August is actually the Earth's orbit passing through debris from the Swift-Tuttle comet.

The meteor shower is named for the Perseidai (Περσείδαι), who were the sons of the ancient Greek hero Perseus. Perseus was a legendary figure with a fine family pedigree – he was the myth-ical son of Zeus and Argive princess Danaë (she of the golden rain). Perseus earned himself a constellation after a number of epic adventures across the Mediterranean and Near East that included the frequently illustrated murder of the Gorgon sister, Another of Perseus's celebrated acts was the rescue of the princess Andromeda. Abandoned by her parents to placate a sea monster, the princess was found by Perseus on a rock by the ocean. He married her and they went on to have seven sons and two daughters. Sky watchers believed that the constellation Perseus, located just beside Andromeda in the night sky, was the origin of the shooting stars they could see every summer, and so the name Perseid stuck.

TEARS AND OTHER TRADITIONS

In Christian tradition the Perseid meteor shower has long been connected to the martyrdom of St Lawrence. Laurentius was a deacon in the early church at Rome, martyred in the year 258AD, during the persecutions of the Emperor Valerian. The martyrdom supposedly took place on August 10, when the meteor shower was at its height, and so the shooting stars are equated to the saint's tears.

Detailed records of astronomical events and sky watching can be found in historical texts from the Far East too. Ancient and medieval records from China, Korea and Japan have all been found to contain detailed accounts of meteor showers.
Sometimes these different sources can be correlated, which has allowed astronomers to track, for example, the impact of Halley's comet on ancient so-cieties both east and west. These sources have also been used to find the first recorded observation of the Perseid meteor shower as a specific event, in Han Chinese records of 36AD.

Though the myths and legends may make one think that ancient civilisations had little scientific understanding of what meteors, comets and asteroids could be, this couldn't be farther from the truth. The early astronomers of the Near East, those who created the Babylonian and Egyptian calendars, and astronomical data were – by far – the most advanced in antiquity. And a recent study of ancient cuneiform texts has proven that the Babylonian ability to track comets, planetary movements and sky events as far back as the first millennium BC involved a much more complex geometry than had been previously believed.

NEW DELHI. AUG 10 (PTI): Star javelin throw-er Neeraj Chopra was today named the Indian contingent's flag-bearer for the Asian Games opening ceremony to be held on August 18 in Jakarta.

Indian Olympic Association (IOA) president Narinder Batra made the announcement today during the send-off cer-emony organised for the contingent.

The Games will be held from August 18 to September 2 in the Indonesian cities of Jakarta and Palembang.

The 20-vear-old Neeraj is the reigning Commonwealth Games champion and junior world record holder in javelin. He is one of the bright gold medal prospects in this edition of

the Asian Games. "I am thrilled to be chosen as flag bearer of the Asian Games. It is a huge honour to be leading the Indian contingent in such a big event," Neeraj told PTI from his training base in Finland.
"I did not know this

as I was not told earlier about this. This is going to be my first (to be a flag bearer) and it's happening in the Asian Games," he added.

Former Hockey cap-tain Sardar Singh was India's flag-bearer at the 2014 Asian Games.

Neeraj had won a gold medal in the Asian Athletic championships in 2017 with a throw of 85.23 meters. He had also bagged a gold in the 2016 IAAF World U-20 Championships in Bydgoszcz, Poland.

He said the rebels have "ballistic missiles threatening our national security, Saudi cities and villages on the border. The attack today was a follow-up process to neutralise that threat." Earlier, Ma-liki accused the Huthis of "recruiting child soldiers, throwing them battlefields and using them as

Saudi Arabia shot down a missile fired by the Huthis on Wednes-day, with debris killing a Yemeni man and wounding 11 others, the coalition said.

The missile was fired from the rebel-held Yemeni province of Amran towards the Saudi city of Jizan, the coalition said.

The Huthis have in recent months ramped up missile attacks against Saudi Arabia, which Riyadh

usually says it intercepts.

Wednesday's attack brings
the tally to 167 rebel missiles launched since 2015, according to the coalition.

On August 2, attacks on a hos-

tegic rebel-held port city of Hodeida killed at least 55 civilians and wounded 170, according to the

The coalition denied responsibility for those attacks.

Aid agency CARE International noted that yesterday's strike came a week after the Hodeida bombardment.

"This latest air strike, only a veek after the attacks on Hodeida city, demonstrates a continued disregard for human life and suffer-ing," said Johan Mooij, the agency's country director in Yemen.

"It is beyond cruel; innocent children's lives have been lost." The war in impoverished Yemen has left nearly 10,000 people dead and unleashed what the UN describes as the world's worst humanitarian crisis.

The United Nations envoy to

Yemen, Martin Griffiths, last week told the Security Council "a political solution" to Yemen's war was "available" and that the warring sides would be invited to talks on September 6 in Geneva.

UN-brokered negotiations on Yemen broke down in 2016 amid demands for a rebel withdrawal from key cities and power-sharing with the Saudi-backed government.



Malaysia ex-PM Najib to face corruption trial in February

Kuala Lumpur, Aug 10 (AFP): Former Malayian prime minister Najib Razak's trial on corruption charges related to a massive financial scan-dal that led to his shock election defeat will start in February, a court said today.

Naiib. 65. will stand trial for criminal breach of trust, money laundering and power abuse linked to billions of dollars allegedly looted from sovereign wealth fund

former lead-The er, who is free on bail, has been hit with seven charges so far, including three for money launder-ing lodged on Wednesday over claims he pocketed 42 million ringgit (USD 10.3 million) from a former unit of 1MDB.

These are in addition to the charges he faced last month after he was first arrested -- three for criminal breach of trust and a separate count that he abused his position to

take the money.

Najib has denied all the charges.

Malaysia's new gov-

ernment, under Najib's 93-year-old former men-tor Mahathir Mohamad, is probing the corruption allegations involving 1MDB -- which was set up and overseen by Najib in an audacious fraud that spanned the globe.

High Court Judge Mohamad Nazlan Mohamad Ghazali set the trial dates from February 12-28 and from March 4-29.

State prosecutors said they expect to call around 50 witnesses.

Najib is facing a long time behind bars if found guilty -- the money-laundering charges carry maximum jail terms of 15 years each, while the other four charges carry sentences of 20 years

The money-launder-ing charges allege 42 million ringgit stemming from illegal activities was transferred to Najib's bank accounts between December 2014 and February 2015.

All the charges relate fund transfers from SRC International, an energy company that was originally a subsidiary of 1MDB.

The sums involved are just a fraction of the USD 681 million that was mysteriously transferred to Najib's personal bank accounts several years ago, sparking uproar in Malaysia.

Najib, who has consistently denied any wrongdoing, and his allies are accused of using the plundered money to buy everything from US real estate to artworks and a luxury yacht that was recently handed over to Malaysia.

Najib's lawyer Mu-hammad Shafee Abdullah said Wednesday that the toppled leader believed the case was driv-

en by politics.

"I am confident of a fair trial for my client, but my client thinks this is a political prosecu-tion," Muhammad Shafee told reporters.

The US Department

of Justice, which is seeking to recover items allegedly bought with stolen 1MDB cash in America, estimates that 4.5 billion in total was looted from the fund.

Following Najib's election loss in May, police seized a vast trove of items -- including ex-pensive handbags and jewellery -- from properties linked to him with an estimated value of up to USD 273 million.

COLOMBO, AUG 10 (РТІ): Sri Lankan parliament Speaker Karu Jayasuriya today rejected a plea by the loyalists of former president Mahinda Rajapaksa to recognise their group as the main Opposition, replacing the Tamil National Alliance (TNA) led by R Sampanthan.

In a written request to the Speaker, eight members of parliament of the Rajapaksha-backed "Joint Opposition" sought recognition of their group as the largest single oppo-sition in parliament and appoint MP Dinesh Gunawardena as the Leader of the Opposition.

The Rajapaksa loyalists argued that they have the support of 70 MPs as opposed to TNA, which has only 16 legislators. However, the Speaker

countered the argument saying that Rajapaksa and his group had been elected to parliament as members of the (UPFA). The UPFA, whose leader is President Maithripala Sirisena, also acts as part of the unity government

in the island nation.


I have to inform the House that in terms of the constitution and standing orders I have no power to change the leader of the opposition, Jayasuriya said.

He further said there was no ground for the Joint Opposition to claim the leader of the oppo-sition position while remaining in a party that was a constituent on the government.
