# 44,534 voters to get a second chance at choosing representatives on Monday

N early forty-five thousand voters will receive the chance to vote again to elect representatives from their constituency when by-elections are held at three assembly constituencies in Sikkim on Monday.

Following a last-minute seat sharing alliance with the Bharatiya Janata Party, SKM stepped away from contesting Gangtok and Martam-Rumtek and retained only Poklok-Kamrang, the only general seat going for bypolls for its president, Chief Minister PS Tamang [Golay]

Meanwhile, as per data from the Election Department of Sikkim, the three constituencies have a total of 44,534 voters. The result will be declared on 23 October and the entire election process completed by 27 Oct.

The contest, even though by-elections have traditionally been won by the party in government in Sikkim, is expected to be keen.

Poklok-Kamrang, a seat that SDF has retained since 1994 is also considered an SDF stronghold given that Mr Chamling represented the constituency [even in its pre-delimitation

swathe] through most of his political career.

He had won by a margin of 2,899 votes from the constituency earlier this year. He obviously decided to release this seat to improve the

chances of his party winning the by-elections. His victory-margin in the second constituency he won from - Namchi Singithang - was barely 300 votes, a gap that SKM had better chances of covering now that it has already formed the

government. A difference of nearly 3.000 votes in a constituency of 15,599 voters [12,704 or whom voted in April 2019] is a more challenging difference to cover which perhaps why this is also the only constituency from where

political violence has been reported.

The stakes in this constituency have gone substantially higher also because the SKM president, Mr Tamang, is in the contest as well. Disqualified from contesting elections until the last-minute reprieve given to him by the Election Commission of India, Mr Tamang needs to win an election before November ends to be able to continue as CM. There is no guarantee that the Election Commission will call a by-election within this time-frame even if

an SKM MLA resigns to free a constituency for the Chief Minister to contest from. Victory at Poklok-Kamrang is thus crucial for Mr Tamang and his party which probably explains why he has focused his campaign so intensely there.

Sikkim will know soon enough how much of an influence already being in power has on voters.

The other constituencies have a more crowded field with six candidates each in the fray there. This is expected to play to the benefit of the SKM-BJP combine since the the other candidates. all of whom appear to

## SKM-BJP alliance will sweep bypolls: Chauhan

haratiya Janata Party DSikkim Pradesh president, DB Chauhan, has expressed confidence that his party's alliance with the Sikkim Krantikari Morcha will win all three seats in bypolls with a huge margin.

He claimed that the people have already accepted the alliance and victory will be for the development of Sikkim and its people.

Addressing a press conference here today, Mr Chauhan stated that the by-election was not to form the government but to lead Sikkim on the path of development and prosperity.

He said that SKM was already in government in the State and BJP at the Centre, so now the two parties will work together in the interest of Sikkim and its people.



"We have not taken out a manifesto for the by-polls as both parties are already in government and are already working on their promises and programmes as included in our respective manifestos for the April elections," he said.

On allegations being leveled against the SKM-BJP alliance by the SDF and HSP, Mr Chauhan counter alleged that both these parties had unsuccessfully tried for an alliance with BJP and were now trying to deceive and confuse the people.

Independent candidate from Martam-Rumtek constituency, Passang Sherpa, today argued that even more than the development of the State it was important for the people to protect their identity and rights.

Addressing a press conference here today, Mr Sherpa stressed that the people need to side-step traps laid by political parties and leaders in the name of development.
