The government has deemed its expedient to consider the demands of adhoc teachers of government schools of Sikkim for service regularisation and extension of adhoc services in public interest. Now, therefore, the government is pleased to decide that services of those adhoc teachers who have completed five years of un-interrupted service and are qualified as per NCTE norms will be regularised after the scrutiny of their documents and others formalities as my be required in line with the NCTE norms. The government is further please to extend the adhoc service of existing adhoc teachers for a period of two years and regular appointment whichever is earlier, in public interest and to ensure that the functioning of the school is normal and regular."

### OBITUARY REFERENCE ON LATE CB RAI Sinchona School to be renamed after Late C.B. Rai

SUMMIT REPORT GANGTOK, 18 FEB:

The Seventh Session (Part-VI) of the Ninth Assembly of Sikkim Legislative Assembly began with Obituary Reference on the demise of Late C.B. Rai, former Member of Sikkim Legislative Assembly, who passed away on 02 Feb, 2019 at his residence in Chakhung, West Sikkim at the age of 86 years.

Speaker, Sikkim Leg-

islative Assembly, K.N. Rai, while paying his obeisance to Late Chandra Bahadur Rai remembered him as a dedicated social worker and a successful politician. He informed that Late Rai was born on 21 May, 1933 to parents Chatarman Rai and Hasta Maya Rai. He started his career as a teacher and went on to establish schools, where he contributed as a committee teacher. He also went to Nepal where he worked as a teacher for about five years. After returning to Sikkim, he taught in Sribadam School for a brief period, before taking retirement from his profession and

fully committing himself to social work. Subsequently, the people of Chakhung unanimously elected him as Panchavat. Late C.B. Rai went on to become an MLA under the Rising Sun Party. In recognition of his valuable contribution to the State, the State Government conferred upon him the L.D. Kazi Movement on the occasion of State Day, 2016.

Concluding his obituary reference, Speaker K.N. Rai said that the State has lost one of the most experienced politicians.

The Speaker also expressed deep anguish over the terrorist attack and killing of 43 CRPF jawans of the Indian Army in Pulwama District of Jammu & Kashmir on 14 Feb, 2019. He expressed profound sorrow over the lives lost and offered heartfelt condolences to the families of the martyrs.

Leader of the House, Chief Minister Pawan Chamling in his obituary reference said that late Chandra Bahadur Rai was born at a time when there was no democracy and opportunity in Sik-

The Chief Minister expressed heartfelt condolences to the family of Late C.B. Rai. He stated that late C.B. Rai will be remembered for his enormous contribution in the education and other social sectors in the State. He took education as a service. He has played pivotal role in laying the foundation of education in Sikkim, shared the Chief Minister.

Late C.B. Rai is survived by his three sons. one daughter and four grandchildren.

Later, after overwhelming support from the people of the region, he was elected as a Panchayat and subsequently as an MLA. He also served as the Chairman of Sikkim Bank.

The Chief Minister announced that Sinchona School in West Sikkim will be renamed after Late C.B. Rai. The same was proposed by Minister R.B. Subba in his Obituary reference earlier.

After the long demand finally Ministry of health I Family welfare came up with the plan and budget eliminate viral hepatitis by 2030, India is a signay of WHO resolution 69.22 endorsing WHO Global alth Sector Strategy on viral hepatitis 2016 – 2021, rld health Assemble to achieve Sustainable develnent Goal (SDG) 3.3 and which is discussed in the te legislative assembly to work on the SDG goals. It is estimated that there are 40 million general oulations are infected with chronic Hepatitis B Vi-(HBV) and 6-12 million are people with Hepatitis irus in India

There are several components that exist in the erent program of GoI such as Immunization for patitis B: Swacha Bharat Mission: safety of blood blood product; safe drinking water and sanitan, which are directly or indirectly related to the ponse to viral hepatitis.

The aim to the National Viral Hepatitis Control gram is to "reduce morbidity and mortality due to viral henatitis."

Sikkim State Health and Family welfare has to eslish few components according to the guideline pared by Ministry and Family Health welfare bee testing and treating the people. They are;

- State Program Steering Committee
- District Program Level steering committee State Viral Hepatitis Control Management
- District Viral Hepatitis Control Management t (DVHMU)
- 5. Program Implementation Plan (PIP) which ds to be submitted to MoHFW
- How many Model Treatment Center and atment Center will be established in Sikkim

our willingness to be part of the state steering committee but we haven't got any response from Mission

Again we wrote a letter to State Nodal Officer, Dr. Tara on 28th Jan 2019 requesting for the updates on the Viral Hepatitis Control program in State. She responded our concern over the phone stating that she will share the details once she joined office but she didn't respond to the mail, again we wrote a follow up mail on 7th of Feb 2019 but there is no response from the State Nodal Officer for the viral hepatitis control program.

It has been 8 months from the program being launched but Sikkim State NHM couldn't provide any updates on the National Viral Hepatitis Control Program (NVHCP), this shows how officials being in the position handling the GOI program in the State, it is shameful that people still have to go to Pvt. Diagnostic for the testing and have to buy expensive medicine to treat Hepatitis C Virus (HCV)

We the people living with Hepatitis C expressed strong disappointment toward the State Health Department for not doing enough work to ensure public health is taken care as first priority basis.

We demand if NHM couldn't manage or handle the NVHCP than they should write to the Ministry of Health and Family welfare to seek other option to initiate the NVHCP in Sikkim State.

Our lives are being put on Risk even after the NVHCP has been launched in Jul 2018 and there is no announcement made by the Health department to the general people so that people can come and seek help from the State Health Department.

After the GOI stating alarming burden of the viral hepatitis in the country that State has not taken enough initiate, since Health is the State Subject but not minimum step has been taken by the State Health Department to ensure that people living with viral hepatitis don't have to go for expensive

If concern officer are not working as they are assigned to particular work, they have no right to be in the position, so we demand and urge Mr. A.K Ghatani, Hon'ble Minister and Mr. Chawan, Secretary of Health Department to take right action so that NVHCP program can be roll out in time and people may not die waiting for the test and treatment.

It ollowed soon after that whatever mankind ould not understand, it applied a negative emale force to. Soon, the woman started getng seen as the corruptor.

This image sustained itself through ceniries and at a subconscious level, continues influence many minds, especially when ven the slightest hint of ambition or even elf-preservation creeps in. If we were to look t even the modern Sikkimese history, women ave been painted in very poor light. Take for xample, Pende Ongmu, the half-sister of the nird Chogyal of Sikkim, Chagdor Namgyal, rho, history tells us, schemed his assassinaon. While aspirations for the throne would ave been more acceptable in a man, in Pende ngmu's case, she was reviled as the reincaration of a wicked queen of Tibet because she esired power. Few have ven bothered to give credit where it was due. ope Cooke for example tried to modernise edcation in Sikkim and reinforce Chogyal Palden hondup Namgyal's plans to give the Sikkimese stronger sense of Sikkimeseness. It was her onviction to motivate Sikkim to celebrate s uniqueness that made India suspicious nd her growing prominence must have nade some in Sikkim insecure as well. Simiirly, Kazini was an important support to LD azi's fight for democracy. Neither story nded too well and both have been victims f male prejudice.

It is this prejudice that occasions like the nternational Women's Day should strive to radicate. It has had but limited success and nore often than not, ended up celebrating erectypes instead. This, despite the fact nat women are not demanding much. They on the want to be returned to their original osition of reverence. All they ask for is an

Sledging - unpleasant or personal remarks between players - is one of the less sayoury aspects of cricket. Usually what happens on the field, stays on the field - but in the third test match between the West Indies in St Lucia recently, the England captain Joe Root publicly rebuked West Indies fast-bowler Shannon Gabriel for an ill-judged homophobic sledge by saying: "Don't use that as an insult ... there's nothing wrong with being gay." Gabriel later apologised and received a four-match ban from the ICC for "personal abuse". The exchange between the two

The exchange between the two players is evidence of how matters of equality and diversity vary across the world. Professional sport is, indeed, an international operation, where cultures clash and attitudes differ. While attitudes towards homosexuality in the UK are largely positive and, nowadays, even the norm, this is not always the case in non-Western states.

Research has shown, for example, that the strong influence of religion in the Caribbean, where cricket is such a popular sport, shapes more intolerant attitudes toward homosexuality – and LGBT+ rights more broadly. Perhaps, then, the casual homophobia disguised as "sledging" was an inevitable clash of two different cultures.

But it was Root's reaction which has won him the support of so many — both inside and outside of sport. England rugby union internationals James Haskell and Tom Wood were among the first to praise Root for sending "a really strong message" in fighting homophobia in sport. The UK sports minister, Mims Davies, also praised Root for calling out Gabriel's remarks.

Root, of course, is not the first professional cricketer to be labelled an ally; in 2009, England fast-bowling legend James Anderson was widely praised for appearing on the front cover of gay magazine Attitude. Recent years have also seen numerous other athletes across a range of other sports go on record and pledge their support for various LGBT+ causes.

In Root's case it would have been very easy for the England captain



sponse to unwanted on-field sledging. But he did something positive – something which could, of course, have a significant knock-on effect for younger LGBT+ people seeking a career as a professional athlete. Therefore, unlike psychologist John Amaechi – who wrote in the Independent that Root shouldn't be praised for doing precisely what you would expect from anyone who witnessed homophobia – I think praise for Root sends an important message that homophobia is not acceptable and will not be tolerated in professional sport.

### FORCING CHANGE

Over the years, sport has rarely been recognised as an industry committed to equality and diversity. Typically, it has been seen as a cultural arena in which dominant forms of masculinity, and heterosexuality, have been both encouraged and celebrated. If we look back at some of sport's first openly gay, lesbian, and bisexual athletes, they were hardly welcomed with open arms. Footballer Justin Fashanu and tennis players Billie Jean King and Martina Navratilova are but some of the examples of sport's seemingly incompatible relationship with "alternative sexualities".

But the industry has undergone remarkable social change over the past two decades – change expertly summarised by the brilliant US academic, Vikki Krane, who in 2016 wrote:

"Sport is entering a new era of inclusion and acceptance. Previously dominated by stereotypes and norms surrounding masculinity and feminity, prejudice and discrimination towards non-conforming attitudes had prevailed ... Yet, as more athletes reveal their gender identity, sexual orientation, and LGBT identities, they are being supported by teammates, coaches, and fans ... This is a whole different landscape from what has occurred in the past."

Sport, then, despite so many claims to the contrary, is, it seems, falling in line with broader social trends across the West; in the UK and the US, for example, social attitude surveys – probably the most effective means to measure cultural attitudes toward homosexuality – have never been as unerringly positive as they are now.

In recent years, this bility has been most evident in the lution of the Rainbow Laces campa With the might of Sky Sn

With the might of Sky Sp backing, this has undoubtedly h positive impact. The most recer these campaigns, in November 2 saw Stonewall FC – the UK's LGBT+ football team – become first club of its kind to play at W bley Stadium, while Altrincham T will don a Rainbow kit on Satur February 16, in support of footb ongoing fight against homophobi

Similarly, the emergence and crease of LGBT+ fan groups at a of knots —including, most rece Manchester United — has proed a welcome environment and haven for LGBT+ fans, especiall football.

Just as effective as this, howe is also the notable increase in het sexual allies in sport-just like R The Warwick Rowers' are perhone of the earliest high-profile exples of heterosexual allies – their nual calendar has, according to I News, "won international acclaim promoting LGBT+ inclusion and a der equality in sports".

In stigmatising homophobia – not homosexuality, as was previo the norm – all this shows us how sport has come. If more professi athletes were as active and bra outspoken as cricket hero Joe F sport would be an even more pos place for LGBT+ people.

# 400,000 African pangolins are hunted for meat every year – why it's time to act

Pangolins, a group of unique African and Asian scaly mammals, are considered to be one of the most heavily trafficked wild mammals in the world. They are hunted and traded for their meat, scales, and other body parts, and used as traditional medicines in parts of Africa and Asia.

Of the eight pangolin species, four are found in Africa. These are the white-bellied, black-bellied, giant, and Temminck's ground pangolin. Three of these species live in Central African forests. The tree-dwelling white-bellied and black-bellied pangolins, weighing approximately 1.5 to 3kg (comparable to a small rabbit), and the ground-dwelling giant pangolin can weigh up to 33kg (the weight of a small Labrador dog).

But little is known about population sizes, mortality rates, and reproductive potential of African pangolins. Mounting evidence suggests that as the availability of Asian pangolins declines, and international trade flows increase, traders increasingly supply the more abundant and less expensive African pangolins to meet demand.

Seizures of pangolins and their scales and skins from Africa, destined for Asia, are increasing with over 53 tons seized in 2013 alone. These estimates likely represent a fraction of all pangolins traded, and an even smaller portion of the number of pangolins hunted.

To better understand how many pangolins are hunted in Central Africa each year, I and a team of researchers collated information on the quanti-



hunted for meat include blue duikers, brush-tailed porcupines and greater cane rats.

For Central African forests in Cameroon, Central African Republic, Equatorial Guinea, Gabon, Democratic Republic of Congo and Republic of Congo, we estimated that at least 400,000 pangolins are hunted annually for most

But we don't yet know whether pangolins can withstand these levels of hunting. This is mainly because we don't yet have reliable pangolin population estimates for any of the species that inhabit Central African forests. Ideally, we would also need population and huntSecondly, increases in the accessibility of renareas to people and extractive industries may lea more pangolin hunting. For example, a recent st showed that Asian industry workers in Gabon quested pangolins from hunters more than any o species.

Finally, the international trafficking of pango over the past decade has boomed. They are one o most trafficked wild mammals in the world. For ample, eight tonnes of pangolin scales trafficked in Nigeria, one of the largest ever hauls of scales, wa tercepted a couple of weeks ago in Hong Kong.

NEW DELHI, FEB 18 (PTI): West Bengal government and its police refuted CBI allegations in the Supreme Court Monday that they obstructed investigation into the Saradha chit fund scam cases, with the state cops asserting the central agency forcefully tried to enter the Kolkata police commissioner's without valid papers.

Kumar De, DGP Virendera Kumar and Kolkata Police Commissioner Rajeev Kumar filed separate affidavits in the apex court on the contempt petition moved by the CBI in connection with the scam and tendered 'unconditional and unambiguous apology" for alleged disobedience of

The trio maintained however that the West Bengal government and the state police at no point of time obstructed investigation nor any official denied cooperation to CBI.

The officers opposed the contempt petition against in which CBI alleged that they were tampering with evidence and not complying with the apex court's various orders relating to the probe by asserting that there was a need for directions to the probe agency not to make any vague allegations without substantial and co-

Referring to the February 3 incident, Kolkata police commissioner Rajeev Kumar said in his affidavit that CBI forcibly tried to enter his house without valid papers. The contention has been supported by the DGP in

They have claimed that no police officials went on 'dharna manch' where West Bengal Chief Minister Mamta Banerjee sat to protest the CBI action.

The DGP and Kumar said no police officer, in uniform or otherwise at any given point in time, ever sat or joined the dharna along with Banerjee.

Kumar said it was

"very intriguing" as to why a major decision by the CBI was taken to interrogate him on February 3, which was the last day in office of the then interim CBI director M Nageswara Rao. "In this context, it is

also pertinent to mention here that Sunday i.e. February 3, 2019, was the last day in office of the interim CBI Director, who was to be replaced by the present Director, CBI, the very next day i.e. on February 4, 2019," he said in his affidavit. Kumar further said:

"It seems very intriguing as to why such a major decision could not wait even for a single day for the new Director CBI to join, especially when the last notice was issued to the answering respondent, after a gap of more than a year, as noted hereinabove.

"The action taken by the CBI, was also de hors the orders passed by the Calcutta High Court keeping in abevance the notices issued by the CBI under section 160. CrPC to the State Police Officials, in presence of the counsels representing the CBI."

Kumar, against whom CBI has alleged tampering of electronic evidence including call detail records, said he was never in direct possession of evidence, material or

They responded to the notices issued on February 5 by the apex court which had asked them to clarify their stand on the allegation that evidence was tampered with and the state police was not cooperating with the Central Bu-

reau of Investigation. A Bench headed by Chief Justice Ranjan Gogoi had said that after perusing the affidavits, a decision will be taken whether they would required to make personal appearance before it on February 20.

It said the Secretary General of the apex court will inform the trio on February 19 whether they are required to be present on February 20.

The apex court on

February 4 had said that "if the police commissioner is even remotely trying to destroy evidence, we will come down so heavily on him that he will regret". In the backdrop of

the February 4 and 5 hearings, Kumar, who was also accused by the CBI of shielding people close to the ruling Trinamool Congress, said: "He was never in exclusive and direct possession of evidences/ material/ documents as alleged in the instant petition, for him to act contumaciously or subvert any orders passed by this Court.

"Materials have either been in the exclusive custody of the various Investigating Officers as part of the investigative units under their supervisory across the state and/or the appropriate courts in accordance with applicable law.

He said in the Special Investigative Team constituted by the state that "he was a member and not in a supervisory role of investigation units but was discharging function as an administrative &

logistic coordinator". Kumar said there were Assistant Commissioner of Police, Deputy Commissioner of Police and Joint Commissioner of Police rank officers for closer and direct supervision of the investigation of cases in Bidhannagar Police Commissionerate, where the deponent was posted as Commissioner of Police.

While maintaining that 76 cases have been lodged in connection with the chit fund scam, Kumar said that "his presence, adjacent to the site of dharna" was to "discharge his duties" as Director General of Police and Inspector General of Police, West Bengal, had come to the place which had become, for all practical purposes, a makeshift secretar iat/camp office of the chief minister.



Speaking at a hastily arranged press conference in London, the seven attacked party chief Jeremy Corbyn for leading the party to the far left and said they would sit as an independent group in parliament.

The group included Chuka Umunna, who has led a cross-party campaign for a second referendum on Brexit and was once seen as a potential Labour leader.

"If you want an alternative please help us build it," Umunna said.

"Politics is broken. It doesn't have to be this way." Corbyn said he was "disappointed" by the MPs' decision.

"Now more than ever is the time to bring people together to build a better future for us all," he said.

Another MP, Luciana Berger, who has been the victim of anti-Semitic abuse for years, said: "This has been a very difficult, painful but necessary decision." Berger said the party had become "institutionally anti-Semitic", adding: "I have become embarrassed and ashamed to represent the Labour Party.

"I am leaving behind a culture of bullying, bigotry and intimidation," she said.

MP Mike Gapes said: "I am furious that the Labour leadership is complicit in facilitating Brexit".

His colleague Chris Leslie, said he was leaving because of "Labour's betrayal on Europe".


