LTVC reiterates demand to restore ST reservation in govt jobs to 15% **SUMMIT REPORT** GANGTOK, 04 MAR:

↑ delegation of Limboo **A**Tamang Voluntary Committee [LTVC] representatives met Principal Secretary Tenzing Gelek, Special Secretary Tashi Cho Cho, Joint Secretary Samdup Bhutia and Under Secretary Prakash Rai of the Department of Personnel at Tashiling Secretariat here on Wednesday.

LTVC has sought a meeting of all stakeholders to restore reservation for Scheduled Tribes seats in government employment to 15%. This quota, it may be recalled, has been reduced to 13% in Sikkim.

An LTVC press release informs that the delegation submitted a letter requesting a meeting of all stakeholders - BL, SC, ST, OBC, MBC.

The DoP Joint Secretary, the release informs, assured that due process will be followed by the department on the matter.

Also, the department mentioned that they are examining the Law Department recommendations and will do all the needful and send the file to State govt for necessary action within a week, the release adds.

representatives plan to visit DoP in week's time and inform that they will follow up the matter till an official notification restores the ST job reservation to 15%.

This is a gift to the entire LT communities of Sikkim from LTVC once the law is enforced, the release concludes.

Sikkim Democratic celebrated its 28th foundation day in a grand manner here at SDF Bhawan on Wednesday. The party celebrated its foundation day as an opposition party for the

Gangtok needs more parks for children

The Children's Park near Paljor Sta-**▲** dium is the only functioning park for children in the capital and since its renovation a few years ago it has become a popular spot for children to spend time outdoors. With ever increasing urbanization, finding open spaces for kids to safely play in has become a major problem. In such a scenario this Children's Park has become an oasis for children of all ages.

Speaking to Summit Times, father of a 10-year-old, Pema Topgyal, said, "I am very happy that there is a place like this for children in Gangtok. it's built very nicely. My son had been wanting to come here and we have come here today with my nephews, who are from the US, who are visiting Sikkim. It's fantastic that there is a place like this in Gangtok."

He added that Gangtok needs more such parks and centres where children

can play sports like basketball. "This park is more suited for children aged upto 10 years so a place for older children is also needed. Paljor Stadium indoor gymnasium is open only in the mornings and evenings so it would be great if there were other plac-

es where kids could play basketball during the day time," said Mr Topgyal. He also highlighted that children nowadays spend a lot of time indoors, watching TV or playing computer games, so such an outdoor space would encourage them to spend time outdoors.

That the children enjoy being in the park is evident and on weekends the park is packed with kids, which points towards the need for more alternatives.

Another parent also highlighted the need for proper children's libraries in the capital.
